

Corsley Memorial Playing Field

Over the last 12 months the playing field has been completely transformed. Yes, it was only last March when the teams from Acres and Dave Lucey started installing the new equipment and building the car park. What a transformation it has been.

It has also been a hectic winter for the playing field. The pavilion has been fully refurbished with a new kitchen, disabled toilets and a wheelchair ramp added and all the electrics and plumbing replaced. This was paid for thanks to a lottery grant, support from the Corsley Show and the Woodlanders. There are also new cricket nets thanks to the support of the Elizabethan Evening and the Warminster Area Board. We have also planted nearly 1,000 bulbs from Acres Garden Supply and Andy Joynt has just finished planting the hedge under the oaks at the bottom of the field.

I did want to thank all those trustees and other volunteers who over the last 12 months have given their time and skills to help transform the field. Special mention must go to Roy Pearce, Mark Aryton, Simon Bloomer and Adam Fairfield, without whom we would not have been able to refurbish the pavilion.

It is worth pointing out that whilst Marion and I have been very successful in winning grants (over £80,000), these grants are only for capital items (such as the zipwire, swings etc). The actual day to day running of the field costs around £3,000 a year, which we have to raise through normal fundraising. This figure would be a lot higher if we didn't have Dave Johnson mowing the

field and all the other helpers giving their time for free.

February saw our first fund-raiser, a fashion show at M&Co in Warminster. It was a great success raising nearly £500. I wanted to thank all our models, who were in my opinion, much better than those girls seen in London fashion week, and the ladies from the tennis club, who turned out in such numbers to support the event. We are now looking for models for the autumn show. There is a rumour that John White or Malcolm Holley may be modelling a onesey, so it will be worth coming along!

Finally, I just wanted to mention the jubilee celebrations. We are delighted the lunch will take place in the playing field on Sunday 3 June and on Monday Corsley will be taking on Chapmanslade at cricket. We will be running a bar but are happy for villagers to bring their own drinks. Can we just ask that you do not bring glass glasses as we do not want risk broken glass on the field? Thanks for your understanding.

Countryside Matters

Cuckoo

The Cuckoo comes in April
He sings his song in May
In the middle of June he changes his tune
And in July he flies away

In April we welcome back the Cuckoo, whose call is becoming more rare with each year. Their journey to and from Africa is

obviously becoming more hazardous each year. Last year the British Trust for Ornithology was able to put transmitters on four Cuckoos and have tracked their migration to Africa and, now their return journeys – all of them having survived the "winter": take a look

on www.bto.org to see where they have been!

We also see, and hear, Chiffchaffs, Blackcaps, House Martins, Swallows and a host of other migrants returning to our county in April to breed. Meanwhile the Redwings, Fieldfares and many species of geese travel north to breed, most of them leaving the UK for the Arctic.

The lack of rainfall (as I write on 15th March) brings hosepipe bans to many parts of mid and eastern England, where there has been so little rain over the last two years. Farmers in some areas have decided against cropping some fields as they have now experienced sowing crops and then having very little to harvest. The autumnsown crops in out part of Wiltshire are looking good at present. The early maize

will go in this month, as soon as the soil temperature reaches 8°C.

We would hope that by early April the cows would be grazing out in the fields, at least during the daytime. They so enjoy the fresh grass and the opportunity to kick their heels in the fresh air. We welcomed members

of Wiltshire W.I. to the farm whilst the cows were still in winter housing; we were interested to hear their comments. Many were surprised at the comfort and size of the cows' cubicles, and the care taken to keep passageways and "loafing areas" clean

and safe 24 hours a day. We give our cows plenty of natural and electric lights, and buildings with good ventilation at all times. There is an especially high level of care and attention given to any sick animals. Good animal welfare is something we and our farm staff are proud to show to anyone.

Spring flowers are in abundance now: primroses, violets, aconites and blackthorn hedges are bursting with blossom. Hazel and willow catkins (pussy willows) come alive with colour and pollen, offering essential food to early bees and butterflies.

The early mornings bring an increasing dawn chorus, and hopefully winter's grey days are now behind us.



Three Open Doors

The Rector writes:

Friday 16th March saw local people turn out in support of the 3 Yorkshire Regiment, as four hundred young soldiers marched through the town on the way to the Minster Church for a predeployment service. The occasion had taken on a different feel because of the deaths of their colleagues already in Afghanistan as part of the advance party. The padre preached a 'cracking good sermon' and it was obvious to see the special relationship he had with the men.

One of the most moving parts of the service was the lighting of a lantern which was lit, with the promise that it would burn day and night until the return of the regiment, as a sign of the prayers of the town which would accompany the regiment.

As I reflected on the service, I was struck by its significance. In Lent, we journey towards the passion and death of Christ on Good Friday and his resurrection at Easter. The symbolism of 'light' is so strong within our Christian tradition, and it is embodied in our Easter celebrations. When we live in the light of the risen Jesus, we discover the possibility of transformation. God's love revealed in the outstretched arms of Christ on the cross has the power to move us into a place of hope that things can and will be different. After the darkness of Good Friday, new hope and life comes as Easter dawns.

May that hope and life be real for all who have lost friends and colleagues. May it be real for the families who wait for the safe return of those they love. May it be real for us as we celebrate the great festival and season of Easter.



Final School Report

Many of you will have heard that I am retiring as Headteacher of Chapmanslade Church of England Primary School in July. I have decided that, having been 'in school' since I was almost five, I would rather like to try something else — maybe learning upholstery, making a more exciting garden, just enjoying seeing friends or going to the seaside on a sunny 'school day' in November!

I have loved being a teacher and began my career in Sussex at St Andrews CE Primary School in Nuthurst, a small village near Horsham, where I taught Class 2. There weren't many children in the village but they were 'bused in' from neighbouring villages and we had a number of children from a Church of England Children's Home in nearby Mannings Heath.

After a couple of years I moved to the Thomas a Becket Primary School in Worthing It was an enormous schoool with 700 children on a split site. The Glebe Road site was built around an old Bishop's palace and the school only had use of it in the mornings for assembly and PE. In the afternoons there were parish meetings held there. During the very hot summer of 1976, school finished at 1 pm for the children and their parents used to pick them up on their bike seats and cycle down to the beach for the afternoon! Mv

class was Class 22 and was physically the biggest classroom so I had the most children – 43 in total by the end of the year and a TA each Thursday morning!

Since moving to Wiltshire in 1978 I have taught at schools in Trowbridge, Winsley, West Ashton and Chirton before being appointed to my second Headship here in 2002.

I have thoroughly enjoyed my ten years at Chapmanslade and am proud to have had a part in its history! We have grown in numbers and facilities over the years. In 2002 we were a three class school of 68 pupils in two mobiles and one permanent classroom with a classroom in the old building as a hall, only used in the afternoons as the pre-school used it each morning! We now have four permanent classrooms and a beautiful hall and 106 pupils with 'Busy Bees' using the remaining mobile each day as a pre-school and after school club!

Chapmanslade will always hold lots of happy memories for me and, as I have already said to the children, I will know and remember the people I have taught and worked with here – just as I do when I meet an ex pupil Chapmanslade who I taught in 1978 in Trowbridge!!

Somerset Community Barn Owl Project Launched

Somerset Wildlife Trust is launching the Community Barn Owl Project to get a barn owl nest box in each of the county's 335 parishes and give breeding barn owl numbers a boost.

Once common sights, these icons of the open countryside declined by 70 per cent

in just 50 years, due to loss of habitat. With up to 80 per cent of barn owls now nesting in man-made boxes. Somerset Wildlife Trust is teaming up with local communities to get a barn owl box in every parish. As well as tackling loss of traditional nesting sites, the project will create more of the rough grassland hunting habitat barn owls need.

The three-year project will be launched on Friday, March 30 at an event in Bruton,

east Somerset. It is funded by Viridor Credits Environmental Company; a charity that distributes money from the Landfill Communities Fund, and is a collaboration with the Hawk and Owl Trust; a national charity dedicated to conserving wild birds of prey and owls and their habitats.

Simon Nash, Somerset Wildlife Trust's Chief Executive said: "The sight of a barn owl is one of those wildlife experiences that leave you with a great sense of privilege. By providing a free barn owl box for every

parish in Somerset we will be helping ensure they remain part of the Somerset countryside for generations to come."

The Trust is looking for landowners, across the county, who may be able to host a nest box and manage some of their land for wildlife. Volunteer barn owl surveys will

be taking place and residents are being asked to report their barn owl sightings online. Along with family events and free public talks, the Trust is visiting 60 primary schools where children will be building nest boxes

A national barn owl survey published by the Hawk and Owl Trust in 1987, recorded a 70 per cent drop in the number of pairs since the 1930s. In 1932 there was an estimated 12,000 pairs in England

and Wales but by the mid-80s numbers had dropped to less than 3,800 pairs, with just 200 in Somerset.

The Somerset Community Barn Owl Project will address two key causes of decline:
Loss of traditional nesting sites within farm buildings and tree cavities and; loss of long, rough, grassland hunting habitat, due to intensification of agriculture.

Further development of the work

The small Baptist community then began to confront local social issues - the caste system, infant sacrifice, the place of women in Indian society. Wellesley, the Governor-General, appointed Carey as professor of Bengali at Fort William College which had been set up to educate civil servants. While there he began a translation of the Bible into Sanskrit. His wife, Dorothy Carey died in 1807. She had long since ceased to be a useful member of the mission, and had become a hindrance to its work. His biographer wrote that Carey worked away on studies and translations, "while an insane wife, frequently wrought up to a state of most distressing excitement, was in the next room". In 1808 Carey re-married; his new wife was, unlike Dorothy, Carey's intellectual equal. They were married for 13 years until her death.

April is a brilliant time to improve your lawn and with the Easter bank holiday just around the corner, there's no reason not to get out into the garden and give your lawn some love and attention.

There are many stages to go through in order to turn an old established lawn into a lush revitalised lawn. If the lawn is more than 4 years old, you may start to see weeds which have self germinated, such as dandelions, clover, etc. In poorly drained areas of the lawn you may see also moss.

There are lots of products on the market to help improve your lawn either by conditioning it or by removing problematic weeds. A great place to start is with a Wee, Feed and Moss Killer, which does exactly what it says – handling all three tasks in one go. However, sometimes this 3-in-1 application can fail to deal with persistent weeds. My tip would be to use the Weed, Feed and Moss Killer initially to kill off the moss and less well established weeds, as well as feed the lawn, followed by an application of Verdone Lawn Weed Killer to kill back those more troublesome weeds

If your lawn is very old and has more than 1/3 of moss then I would recommend hiriing a scarifier which will pull up all the unwanted moss. Once the lawn has been scarified, rake up the moss and clear it from the lawn. By scarifying you also help

aeration of the lawn; it also lifts grass that has grown horizontally, encouraging upright growth which can be chopped back when you next mow.

Repairing your lawn

If you lawn has become patchy and bare in places then you may consider re-sowing with grass seed or, for instant results, turfing.

To seed a bare patch, you need to lightly dig over the area, rake flat and remove any stones. Lightly consolidate and rake again to loosen the surface, broadcast sow good quality lawn seed followed by Growmore fertiliser, and water well. The seed should germinate within a week, keep it moist for best results.

To turf a bare patch or disused piece of ground, carry out the same level of preparation, unroll and lay turf in strips, staggering the joins. Use planks to walk on the turf with will aid good root to soil contact, ensuring quick rooting. Water well and prevent from drying out – keep everybody off for up to 3 weeks to prevent damage to the newly rooted turf.

With any new lawn, ensure that the grass is moved slightly longer than normal so the new grass can shade itslef and prevent it from drying out.

Septic tank registration explained

In the spring of 2011 many householders with private drainage systems became aware of the government's plans to make the registration of septic tanks and small packaged sewage treatment plants compulsory. This was not well publicised at all, in fact some people only knew of this when it was casually dropped into an unrelated conversation amongst friends and colleagues. The Environment Agency (EA) recognised that it could have been implemented more effectively and consequently suspended the registration requirement pending a review. This is only a temporary reprieve and it will become necessary to register all private drainage systems in the coming months. However, for some properties, including properties in Wales and those falling within a Zone 1 Groundwater Source Protection area. registration is now overdue.

These changes have come about as a result of the second phase of the Environmental Permitting Programme (EPP2) that came into effect on 6 April 2010. This combines a number of Environmental Permitting procedures to include, discharge consenting, groundwater authorisations and radioactive substances regulation. Its purpose is to modernise and improve the many regulations that protect our environment and health and is designed to not only improve environmental safeguards but to reduce administrative burdens and cost.

The first question on most people's lips when confronted by this extra bureaucracy is, "I am not on mains drainage so does this apply to me?" The answer is most definitely - Yes! But even if it does, do not be too disheartened, it may be easier than

you think to get your system registered. As a general rule, if you own a domestic property that houses up to 9 people and you have a septic tank or packaged sewage treatment plant that discharges into the ground through a soakaway, or, your single domestic property houses up to 31 people and has a packaged sewage treatment plant that discharges into a river, stream or estuary, you may well be able to register as exempt from an environmental permit. If your system uses any other permutation then it is likely that you will need to apply for a permit. Registering for an exemption is free and can all be done online from the Environment Agency's website: www. environment-agency.gov.uk. If you need to apply for a permit the forms are all available on the same website. If you do not have access to the internet you can telephone the EA on 0370 8506506. There is currently a reduced one-off fee of £125 to pay if your permit is for domestic sewage only. If your sewage system is currently subject to an existing discharge permit that is relevant to you no further action is needed.

It is important to remember that simply getting a discharge permit or permit exemption in your hand does not suddenly make everything perfect. EPP2 requires you to maintain your drainage system to an acceptable standard to allow the permit exemption to continue. EPP2 also requires that sewage tanks and associated equipment must be regularly inspected and maintained by a competent wastewater professional (holding industry training certification) even within the first year of service. Service and maintenance records must be kept for a rolling period of five years and be presentable on request. Properties that are

either exempt or hold a permit will also be logged with the Environment Agency's own database, listed by address and map grid reference.


