





Annual parish meeting

Neil writes his précis of the meeting held on 13th March

March is the month of the Annual Parish Meeting (APM). This meeting provides an opportunity for the Village to listen to the Chairman's report of the year's Parish Council business and, usually, an invited speaker. It was on 12th March.

This year's APM was Malcolm Holley's last as Chairman, after 11 years in charge, and he recounted the highlights of his tenure, amongst which were the provision of low cost housing in Corsley Heath, the successful campaign to persuade the County Council that Corslev did not have a suitable travellers site, the long lease of the old school playing field for the Village and last year's Jubilee celebrations on Cley Hill. He paid particular tribute to Sally Evans, Parish Clerk, for her many years of patient, wise and tolerant service to the Council and to the Elizabethan Evening Committee for their generous donations towards the playing field lease costs. I would like publicly to add the Parish Council's thanks to Malcolm for his long and determined contribution to Council and Village affairs.

Unfortunately we were unable to get Mr Bradley, Longleat CEO, to provide an up-date on Longleat and its interfaces with the village – he was away on business - nor a suitable substitute. Instead, Longleat provided a statement on traffic management. Two points are worth emphasising. First, Longleat believe that

current arrangements mean that <u>all</u> (their underscore) traffic to the Safari park will now enter via the main entrance; second, we should now feel and see a reduction in traffic through the Corsley lanes as a result; third "Most drivers towing caravans are well-used to country lanes...." (their words). The PC would welcome any photographic or video evidence to the contrary - last year's experiences were not good.

Just a quick reminder that the PC election is on 2nd May and nominations have to be in by 5th April. Contact me or Sally if you are interested – the last time a PC member was elected to the Council was some years ago!

Longleat Traffic Management Summary... March 2013

In 2012 Longleat implemented new security and access procedures to the Estate, on the advice of the police and our insurers, in order for us to be able to better protect Longleat House and its contents, our world class animal collection, our staff and our visitors. This means that access to the Estate has been tightened and is only permitted when Longleat is formally open to the public; access via the secondary entrances in Horningsham, Corsley and East Woodlands is now strictly limited to authorised vehicles

only (controlled by blockers with number plate recognition) and not for general visitor access to the Estate which was the case in the past. At Easter 2012 Longleat opened its new entrance kiosks at the main entrance by Picket Post roundabout which enables us now to process all visitor traffic to the Safari & Adventure Park through this one main entrance, thereby alleviating the traffic around other secondary entrances and local roads. This has significantly reduced the amount of visitor traffic that used to find its way into Longleat via Corsley (which includes Whitbourne Springs) throughout the whole season.


At the meeting last year attended by Longleat management, concerns were expressed about people arriving at Longleat via the back roads due to their satnav directions. We continue to be actively engaged with all of the satnav companies to ensure that the postcode of the Longleat main entrance is used in their systems but unfortunately we have no control over how often they update their systems or how often users update the software on their devices. However, whenever we can we advise visitors to switch off their satnay once they get close to us and follow the brown signs instead. Moreover, we are in the process of adding further brown signs to route traffic through our main entrance.

The Caravan Club site is leased to and operated by the Caravan Club. Longleat management are not involved in the day to day running of the site. Due to the new security and access arrangements for the Estate and the development of new

attractions in the Main Square area, there is no longer an accessible route through the Estate from the main entrance to the caravan club site and therefore caravans now enter and exit the site via Lane End. Corsley. Historically all caravan have exited that way and a number of arrivals also used to enter via Lane End. To ease traffic congestion, arrival and departures have been staggered to avoid vehicles meeting. This operates in much the same way as Center Parcs, Longleat Forest. Furthermore, as mentioned above, the residents of that area should experience a reduction in the overall amount of traffic as all visitor traffic to the Safari & Adventure Park is now routed to the main entrance; the back entrances, which were previously used to access the Estate as a cut-through, are now closed. Most drivers towing caravans are wellused to country lanes along which most caravan sites are located and accessed. We are aware that the junction of Lane End requires care on entering/exiting but that is the case for all vehicles, not just caravans. However, preventing day visitors to Longleat from using this lane will help considerably in reducing instances where caravans may meet oncoming traffic.

Following the meeting last year, Longleat offered Corsley residents the resident's grounds pass for Longleat so that they may enjoy the grounds and gardens during formal opening hours. We are not aware of anything else we can do to reduce traffic to the Caravan Club as Longleat has now become more pedestrianised to accommodate it's visitors to the Safari & Adventure Park.

Monumental art in public places - a storm in a Z-cup?

You've all no doubt heard of the Antony Gormleys 'Angel of the North' or his plinth people and possibly the Dublin Spire. Not to be outdone, and more importantly due to the release of a large pot of sponsored funding, Corsley have decide to enter the Public Arts movement.

Using a natural form in the contextual ideal of nature reflecting naturalism, we have looked back at the pseudo-realism movement of the early 20th Century to commission a peace of enormous significance and importance from the well-known French academician artist, Lipool FRA.

The site of the work will be Cley Hill as its shape almost perfectly fits Lipool's ideal form.

The work will consist of a single brassiere cup covering the entire hill. It will be supported off the ground on 3m high poles

to enable sheep and visitors to still enjoy walking on the Hill and due to its delicate, light, lacy, near diaphanous nature plenty of light will still pass through the material to the ground beneath.

The Corsley public Art committee have liaised closely with English Heritage, Natural England, the National Trust and Arts Council in moving this project forward once funding had been agreed. It is expected to take a year to finish the work and for installation to take place. So please put the 1st April down in your diary in 2014 for the great unveiling, or should that be covering up?!

Watch out, watch out, there's thieves about...

It has been a long slow and cold winter. No doubt readers are noticing that there are signs of spring around in the garden and hedgerows and it is time to get out do something energetic like walking or gardening. If you thinking of walking and want to use some of our beauty spots to drive to, park and walk, then I need to remind you of a familiar warning from last year wherever you park. Beauty spot thefts are still a problem in the area. People park their vehicles and usually leave them unattended for a couple of hours while they head off on their walk. Thieves take advantage of this and windows are often smashed to gain access to satnays, in-car DVD players, CD players and, in some cases, laptops and handbags that have been stored under seats. Do not lock bags or anything of value in the boot as someone near by or in another car could be watching. Please do not leave anything of value in your car – either carry it, leave it at home or lose it! In case you think I am being a little dramatic and, perhaps, over the top I received the following email from PC Vicky Howick, our Community Beat Manager which confirms that you do need to be vigilant...

"The following vehicle M595 YCR Green VW Polo, is actively involved in thefts from vehicles at beauty spots and the local area to Warminster. If seen please contact 101, or if a crime is in the process of being committed please call 999. Please do not approach the occupants."

I recently received another 2 emails from PC Vicky Howick and PCSO Caroline Wright that I have reproduced below for you to read.

"Over the last few weeks we have seen an increase in rural crime within Wiltshire. More closer to home we have had thefts of tractors, 4x4s and thefts from sheds and outbuildings.

Could I please ask you all to be on the look out for any suspicious vehicles or persons in the area; where possible could you try to obtain number-plates of any vehicles and full descriptions if safe to do so, and pass these on to us. Our email address is nptwarminster@wiltshire.pnn. police.uk even if it is nothing we can soon start to build up a picture of who is where and when. If you feel that it's an urgent matter then call the incident in to us via 101 or in an emergency 999.

To try to slow down and prevent crime occurring, we are able to

offer crime prevention advice and information on products that could help deter these criminals, if this is something you would be interested in then please contact the team via the above email address.



The team will also be sending out (via text message) the number-plates of vehicles that may be of some interest to us — alerting members of Farm Watch and Neighbourhood Watch to be on the look out, as these vehicles are involved in the commission of crime. Please do not approach the occupants or the vehicles, just let us know where they have been seen, as this will be a great help to us."

And finally

"We had 'Nottingham Knockers' in the area yesterday. This is the name given to the door-to-door salesmen who sell (overpriced) household goods door to door. They are usually transported from area to area via minibus and are dropped off in pairs to sell their goods and are recognisable by the large holdall they carry their goods in. They often have paperwork, which states they are ex-offenders trying to go straight and work for a living.

To carry out this type of selling they need to have a current 'Peddlers Licence'; usually they don't have such a licence, so are committing an offence.

We have often noticed an increase in crime following their visits, so it is possible they use the selling activities to look for criminal opportunities.

Due to lots of calls from members of the public, we were able to locate and arrest two of these individuals - one in Chitterne and one in Codford - for not having the required licence. This is great news for us and would like to thank all those who took the time to give us a call that resulted in the arrests. Hopefully this will send out a clear message to them not to come to this area again. If you have any further visits from these people, please do not hesitate to contact us on 101 to report them."

Countryside Matters

April showers? Let's hope not!

During March we experienced high winds, torrential rainfall, snow, frosts, and some very low temperatures during the daytime as well as night; although there were the occasional few hours of sunshine. Sadly the water table is still so high that even the lightest rain means the soil will no longer absorb it, and so run-off occurs constantly.

Over the winter months dirty yard water and slurry is stored in large lagoons, it is then spread on the arable land in the spring as a natural fertiliser. Although the lagoons have been full to capacity it has been incredibly difficult to find suitably dry fields onto which we can spread the slurry.

We knew that last year's harvests of grass, grain and straw were far less than we would need to take us through a long winter and so we have had to buy in more concentrates than normal to keep the cattle healthy and contented.

The sheep farmers have had it no easier. Sheep and their lambs just do not like wet ground on which to walk or lie and a great number of shepherds are reporting that the disease *Schmallenberg* is in flocks in the South West of England.

On a walk just before dusk tonight I was pleased to hear the Blackbirds singing,

Starlings swarming overhead, and the Great Spotted Woodpecker drumming away. Our summer visitors should soon be with us, so the countryside will be full of bird song.

The primroses are now taking over the verges as the snowdrops disappear for another year. We are fortunate to still enjoy the daffodils planted to celebrate the Millennium in many parts of the villages.

Let's hope that Spring
will really come in April
brightening us all up: then the

farmers will not know which job to do first.



Go organic and become eco-friendly this spring!

Compost

Compost is one of nature's best mulches and soil improvers, but it's also means you can use it instead of commercial fertilizers. Best of all compost is cheap because you can make it without spending any money.

Nearly everything that was once alive is a candidate for the compost heap, that includes old news papers, coffee grounds, tea bags, eggshells, spoilt fruit and vegetables, sawdust, cold fireplace ashes, wool, cow and horse manure, grass cuttings, wasted cut flowers, and pruning materials. Some forms of composting allow you to use leftover meat products however it can attract unwelcome visitors to your garden so I find it is best to avoid using them. Pieces of wood, leaves, and chopped pine needles can also be added to the mix giving it an even volume of decomposing materials.

A compost heap requires a ration of about 30 parts carbon to 1 part nitrogen. If you use too much carbon the pile will take forever to decompose, if you use too much nitrogen it will make it smell. Carbon materials are things like sawdust, woody plant materials, fireplace ashes, newspaper and fallen leaves. Nitrogen materials are grass clippings, cut flowers, fruit and vegetables and other green plant materials.

The more diverse you pile, the more beneficial microorganisms you will attract and the faster your material will decompose, this does however depend on if you decide



to leave your compost pile to decompose without touching it or if you decide to turn the pile. By turning the pile regularly you allow oxygen into the heap meaning it will decompose much faster.

For the standard leave alone method start building your compost heap in one bin and have a secondary to start running when you fill up the first. Because organic materials shrink to less than five percent its original volume during decomposition, you will need to be adding layers to your heap over several weeks. Remember to layer in carbon and nitrogen materials to ensure the right ratio.

It takes between six and nine months for your compost to become fully decomposed but feel free to use some of the rougher courser compost for some of your tough plants. If you can't wait and you want to get it going quicker, pop to your local garden centre and pick up some Garotta compost maker.



Chris Andrews was our preacher for Mothering Sunday in March and his reading came from Paul's second letter to Timothy, Chapter 1:v1-14, written from prison in Rome.

In his letter, Paul mentions Timothy's mother and grandmother and their faith in Jesus, which they had shown as an example to him. Chris reminded us, though, that his grandmother and mother being believers didn't automatically make Timothy a Christian. He had to confess his sinfulness and accept the Lord for himself. 

Feel the fear and do it anyway

Caroline Le Vine - Counsellor in Corsley

That's pretty much the definition of courage – doing something in spite of being terrified by it. It's also the title of a book on courage by Susan Jeffers. And there are lots of books on the subject out there. I'm reading one myself at the moment: "Daring Greatly" by Brené Brown and I thoroughly recommend it.

But what do we imagine courage is? I think a lot of us see it as something other people exhibit especially when they do big, dramatic things like climbing mountains or risking their own safety to help others. Clearly, these are acts of great courage and they are relatively easy to recognise. But what about the everyday acts of courage that aren't so easily noticed? A person afraid of needles having an injection, for example, taking an exam when you feel anything but confident, asking for a payrise. Or a really tough one for so many of us – asking for help. Asking for help means admitting we can't do everything ourselves, that we aren't perfect, that things aren't going how we'd like them to. It means admitting we're vulnerable. This is central to the book I mentioned, "Daring Greatly". Being vulnerable and asking for help are acts of great daring.

When someone contacts me asking if I can help them, I am delighted because they have taken the first and most courageous step towards changing their life. And 'all' they've done is sent me an email or picked up the phone. It's not a big, visible action. But is it courageous. What will I be like to speak to? Will I be able to understand what you need and why you're asking for help? Will I be able to help? What if we meet and you don't want to work with me? Will you be able to say so honestly?

I'm sure all of these questions and more run through a person's mind before they make contact with me. It's natural that they should. Bear in mind that coming to meet me obliges you to nothing. You don't have to come back if you don't want to or you can come back in a few months or even a few years if that's what you want to do. If you get through the door into my room in the church, I will welcome you and be with you for as little or as long a time as you choose and I will celebrate your courage for having arrived.
