Temporary Closure of A362 (part) Warminster to Corsley

(Ref: TTRO 4213)

Notice is hereby given that the Wiltshire Council has made an Order to close temporarily to all traffic the A362 (Part) Warminster and Corsley; from its junction with A36 Warminster Bypass to its junction with Picket Post.

To enable Wiltshire Council to carry out kerbing, carriageway patching work, road marking and adjustment of ironworks.

Alternative route: via A362 (unaffected length) – A361 – A36 and vice versa. The closure and diversion route will be clearly indicated by traffic signs.

This Order will come into operation on 18 April 2016 and it is anticipated that the closure will be required nightly between the hours of 7 pm and 6 am until 25 April 2016. It is anticipated that the works will take the stated duration to complete depending upon weather conditions. Access will be maintained for residents and businesses, although delays are likely due to the nature of the works.



Biology: changing the world

Does your body contain more human or bacterial cells?

It's a surprise to most people that the human body is claimed to contain up to ten times as many bacterial cells as human ones

Recent work suggests that this may be an overestimate, but the numbers are at least equal and, anyway, human cells are much bigger than bacteria. Of course, bacteria are rarely found in tissues, unless you have an infection. They occur on the internal and external surfaces of the body – on your skin, in your mouth, airways and gut, and on all moist surfaces. The vast majority are found in the lower gut - in the small intestine and colon. In addition to bacteria, your gut also contains some funai, viruses and other microbes. This is called the 'aut microbiome'.

It has been known for some time that the aut microbiome differs between individuals and that it can affect health. Recent work has shown that it may influence obesity, for example. A number of companies sell drinks or yoghurt that have live bacteria in them – known as probiotics. These harmless bacteria are intended to reproduce in your gut and work with the microbes already present to help in digestive processes. There is some evidence that probiotic drinks and yoghurts can help people who have digestive problems and this is a relatively benign way of helping to



generate a healthy internal population of socalled 'good bacteria'.

However, when the normal gut microbiome is disrupted - such as by antibiotics, which kill both beneficial and disease-causing bacteria alike - problems can ensue. Elderly patients on long courses of antibiotics sometimes suffer from Clostridium difficile infections. 'C. diff', as this bacterium is frequently called, may colonise the gut replacing the beneficial bacteria that have been killed by antibiotics. C. diff produces

toxins that can cause serious and potentially fatal illness.

There are now more extreme ways of replacing an abnormal aut microbiome, which is sometimes used for people who have had major antibiotic or surgical treatment. This is the "faecal transplant" or 'poo pill' where faeces from a healthy individual (maybe the same patient before treatment) are given in a pill to repopulate the gut with a normal healthy microbial population. Do not try this at home!

AMAZING ACHIEVERS


Congratulations to David Terrett, of Brimhill Rise, Chapmanslade, who has just celebrated 50 years of working in the oil industry!



Parish Council Briefing

Neil Britten reports on the parish council's activities in March

The main Parish Council (PC) event in March was the Annual Parish Meeting (APM) which was followed by brief PC meeting to discuss a planning application.

Annual Parish Meeting Broadband

The major topic was the so-called 'superfast' broadband prospects for Corsley. Hugh Deed and Neil Carpenter gave a joint presentation covering the work that they have done to establish what level of service Corsley currently receives, the capability of the existing infrastructure and the results of the village survey indicating how residents use broadband now and the limitations of the service provided to Corsley. These presentations will be available on The Bridge website.

I reported last month the news that BT did in fact have plans to link part of Corsley to the fibre connection which is available at the Chapmanslade telephone exchange, contrary to earlier statements that we were definitely not in the Phase 2 roll out plan. BT have now completed their survey work in support of this initiative and the outline details, provided verbally, are:

• Fibre will be run from Chapmanslade, past the green cabinet at St Margaret's Church and up Deep Lane terminating at a new cabinet to be located just north of the junction between Cley Hill and Deep lane

 Approximately 150 properties in the Corslev Heath area will be connected to 'superfast' broadband, i.e. at least 24Mbps, with possibly some households in Temple also benefiting.

However, two things should be stressed. First, this plan has been developed to meet the Wiltshire target of 91% of the County to receive at least 24Mbps. Whilst the plan clearly benefits a good chunk of Corsley residents, any improvement for the remainder, about 140 houses, could provide better speeds but would not sit within this target and is therefore not in the plan. We are still working on this issue and BT have been conducting further investigative feasibility and cost modelling to look at options based on a connection to the fibre at the St Margaret's green box to improve the speeds in other areas of Corsley, BT have said that there would be a 'node' at the St Margaret's box which could allow such a connection. The results of this work are due at the time of writing and, once received and digested, the intention is to put on a public meeting to allow the options to be debated.

Second, the information above was the result of a telephone conversation. We have not received any formal commitment from either Wiltshire Online or BT, but this has been sought.

However, BT were clear that their next step would be to issue the appropriate road

closure notice, for the statutory 13-week consultation period, with a view to a 7-10day closure at the end of this period, i.e. sometime in June, to allow installation of the new box on Deep Lane. The exact timescale for the improved service to come online was not disclosed. The impact of a road closure was explained to BT and they have agreed that the parish would be given the opportunity to discuss the details with the installation team.

Corsley Reading Rooms

Hugh Deed, the new Chairman of the Reading Rooms Committee (CRR) gave a brief presentation on the Reading Rooms and plans for the immediate future. He warmly congratulated the previous management, under Dick and Rosemary Collins, for their many years of dedicated and imaginative involvement.

Under the new management, continuing work has been undertaken on a number of aspects of safety and security. In addition several new areas of material improvement have been identified including improvements to the kitchen (provision of catering-type washing up facilities), refurbishment of the main room floor and the ceiling/roof space (insulation).

These were longer term projects, with significant financial implications and the CRR would work with the PC and others to develop a plan for their execution.

Annual PC report

The PC annual report covering the activities of the PC – the council, streetscene, planning, finance, OSPF and footpaths and fracking. The presentation is available on the Bridge website.

The last item, fracking, was a 'heads-up' that Corslev sits within a block of four 10km by 10km sites for which a coal bed methane type drilling exploration licence has been issued by the Department of Energy and Climate Control (DECC) to a company called South Western (in partnership with South Western Energy Ltd). It should be noted that Wiltshire objected to these licences

Any activity on these sites in pursuance of the licences would be subject to planning and regulatory approvals and the PC has not been made aware of any such applications at the present time. However, there could be potential for the latter at any time in the near future and the PC is looking further at the implications with a view to providing better information to the village in due course.

Planning application

16/01228/FUL - Erection of agricultural workers dwelling at Chipp's Farm.

This application was a re-submission of 15/09455/FUL, which had been refused by Wiltshire on two grounds, first that the case had not been made for a dwelling for a third agricultural worker and second that the proposed dwelling in that location was not appropriate for the character if the local area.

Since the previous application, Mr G Dyke had decided to retire and exercise a right to continue occupying his current dwelling. This left two active farm workers with the second still requiring accommodation. The new application was thus for a smaller agricultural dwelling, for the second of the two full-time farm workers, in a more



Three Open Doors

Dear Friends,

I write on a glorious day of bright sunshine and clear blue sky. I have just returned from taking Alfie for a walk and marvel at the shiny yellow beauty of the wild flowers that adorn grass verges and the extraordinarily weightless appearance of several buzzards gliding and hanging in the air.

By the time you read this Easter Day will probably have come and gone as it was so very early this year, but we continue with an Easter theme in the church for 6 weeks until we come to Pentecost on May 15th. Easter is the time when we fill the church with flowers and sing celebratory hymns and songs that proclaim the wonder of new life, that announce that death has no more dominion and such like. I often wonder at these time what it is like for those who haven't reached Easter Day yet and who are forced by circumstances to remain in the darkness of Good Friday.

Being the Priest in Charge here I am privileged and humbled to be able to accompany those who are struggling with life, whether it be bereavement, terminal illness or relationship breakdown to name but a few of the situations I encounter. How does the Easter story intersect with occasions like this, with the terrible plight of the thousands of refugees who have nowhere to call home, with those who suffer at the hands of others, those who go to sleep day after day hungry? I don't have a neatly worked out answer, and I cry out with others at the injustice and suffering that is so much part of human life. But I believe that Good Friday and Easter Day show us that God is with us in our deepest darkness, in life and in death and beyond, that love is stronger than evil, and that there is no place that God is not. That's not to say that I can just sit back and relax because God has it all in hand, far from it. When we pray in the Lord's Prayer 'Thy Kingdom come, thy will be done.' we are not asking God to do it all, we are pledging our time and energy to the task of bringing about that kingdom of justice and peace; we know in this life that God's kingdom has yet to be realised fully, but we need to be doing our bit even if it is only a tiny spark of light in the darkness.

To return to the image of those buzzards hanging in the air the bible tells us that 'Those who wait for the Lord shall renew their strength, they shall mount up with wings like eagles, they shall run and not be weary, they shall walk and not be faint.' (Isaiah 40: 31) and from the book of Deuteronomy we hear that God is 'Like an eagle that stirs up its nest and hovers over its young, that spreads its wings to catch them and carries them aloft.' (Deuteronomy 32:11)

If your wings are bit broken at the moment and you long for the freedom of flight, allow God to catch you and carry you on his wings, to be with you in your Good Friday so that you can hold on to the hope of Easter Day when all things are made new.

Now spring has arrived, your garden will be starting to come back to life

Bottle your garden

This year, I'd like to encourage you to plant a fruit plant, or two; they have a lot more to offer than meets the eye!

Planting a fruit bush is a great way to fill in any gaps in shrub beds or borders. They offer colour when in flower and will reward you with delicious fruit later on in the year. My personal favourites are raspberries and redcurrants.

These days, we are always hearing about the need to eat and live healthy. Whilst at a trade show, I heard a talk by James Wong, an ethnobotanist, who told us that antioxidants are very good for us - helping to protect our body's cells from damage from exposure to chemicals and radiation as well as being good for the heart and even lowering the risk of some infections and cancer.

Antioxidant levels are much higher in fruit grown at home compared to that from a supermarket because it isn't processed or subject to the demand for 'big' fruit. Blueberries are a perfect example, homegrown, they may be slightly smaller than the big blueberries brought from a supermarket, but they are a lot better for us and provide more long-term benefits.

Finally, after eating healthily and getting out and about planting fruit trees or shrubs in your garden, it's time to have a little bit of fun: take a clear glass bottle and, very carefully, put an immature fruit (keeping it on the tree!) into the bottle. Secure the bottle to the tree. As the fruit matures inside the bottle, keep an eye out for any bugs and



ensure the bottle doesn't fill up with rain. It's probably a good idea to do a few just in case some don't quite work out. When the time comes, you can harvest both the fruit and the bottle!

Your fruit in a bottle would be perfect as a gift, so you could either add some ribbon and leave it as it is, or add some vodka to fill the bottle. The taste of the fruit will infuse into the vodka and you will have a lovely fruity-tasting vodka to drink.

So now you have three brilliant reasons as to why you should plant some fruit trees/plants in your garden this spring.

Fracking, a moral issue?

Fracking licences have been granted to UK Methane to cover areas that surround Chapmanslade and Westbury

What would it mean to have fracking come to our village and surrounding areas?

There is growing concern for fracking (hydralic fracturing), as many communities in America and Australia are now reporting severe environmental damage and serious health impacts on communities that live on or near a frack site. In America and Australia, fracking has caused pollution to around water and rivers with radioactive and carcinogenic chemicals and methane leaking into the water table. All wells leak eventually. According to research by oil services company Schlumberger, around 50% of wells leak within 15 years, which poses a massive threat to local people and the surrounding landscape.

Fracking has also been shown to contaminate the air with methane aas and creates heavy industrialisation to the roads as just one frack needs between 2-8 million gallons of water. This water is brought to the site by large articulated lorries driving in and out of the area every day. Earthquakes in Lancashire have been reported after a test drill in 2011. And in America house prices have plummeted for those who live near to a frack site.

The government seems dead set on pushing ahead with fracking despite rising opposition from local communities in this country. Due to the new legislation being pushed through, planning applications from fracking companies will be sent straight to central government which means that local councils and local people, like you and I, may not have a say in whether this will happen here. The first we know about this beautiful area being fracked is when around 400 tankers turn up to bring our precious water to the aas well.

Chapmanslade Parish Council

Parish Council Briefing

Phil Jefferson reports on the parish council's activities in March

The parish council meet twice last month, on 10th and 23rd March. A report on the 23rd March meeting will appear in next month's Bridge. About 20 residents attended the 10th March meeting.

Planning applications

16/01065/FUL ThouIstone Park James Hughes-Hallett, the owner of Thoulstone Park, and his agent Jeremy Smalley, have visited the parish council several times in recent years to consult us about his plans to develop the site. The last time was in September last year when we were consulted on a plan to build an employment hub. On that occasion, council members and residents present at the meeting averied need for such a development and expressed concern about its proposed location – the field between the A36 and the old road fronting the former golf club building.

Mr Hughes-Hallett has nonetheless decided to proceed with the application. He and Mr Smallev attended our meeting to give us a further explanation of his plans. He confirmed that he is still hoping to build a 54-bed hotel on the Thoulstone site, having received planning consent for this some time ago, and he is currently in discussion with potential developers.

We spent over an hour discussing the employment hub proposal, which if implemented would produce a workspace for up to 170 workers, with parking spaces for 80 cars; a smaller number than originally suaaested. We were told that there is a significant demand for owner-managed work spaces in rural locations and that a developer based in Frome, Forward Space, is currently in discussion with Mr Hughes-Hallett

Whilst not wishing to be negative about an opportunity to create new employment in our parish we were profoundly sceptical about the proposal. We couldn't see that it would actually create new employment; rather it would be more likely to redistribute existing employment to a new location.

The main concerns of residents and the parish council relate to traffic issues and the impact of the proposed office block on our rural landscape. A third concern is about drainage issues. We all know just how often that field has flooded in past years.

We were assured that detailed information

contained in the application about traffic flow takes into account both the proposed hotel and the proposed office development. We couldn't find any evidence of this. We were concerned that the combined effect of traffic generated by two enterprises in that location would be auite substantial. creating great danger at a point on the A36 which is currently dangerous enough. As we all know, traffic comes up Black Doa Hill at a tremendous speed and extra traffic generated at the A3098 sliproads and the access to Thoulstone would produce a highly dangerous situation. We were not convinced, either, that people working at the proposed hub would be likely to get there on foot or by bicycle.

We were concerned that the proposed development would be an unnecessary and unwelcome urban intrusion into a cherished rural location, one which the community had fought hard to protect two years ago at the time of the wind turbine proposals! We couldn't understand why, if it must go ahead, it couldn't be positioned inside the main part of Thoulstone Park. We pointed out industrial parks in Frome Warminster and Trowbridge which we considered might be more suitable locations; the response being that a rural location was the prime consideration for potential clients.

Finally, we felt that the application was inadequate because it lacked a holistic approach. We might have been more impressed if the application had considered the site as a whole and considered the likely impact of not just the employment hub but the hotel as well and any other potential development proposals.

As a consequence we resolved unanimously to object to the application and we have asked Fleur de Rhé-Philipe, our Wiltshire councillor, to call in the application should the planning officers recommend approval. This would mean that matter would then be considered by elected members at a public meeting. Fleur has agreed to do this. We will keep you in touch.

16/00494/FUL

Wiltshire Council has given planning consent to the owners of Chapel Cottage, 77 Wood Lane, to erect a first floor side extension and a single storey rear extension at their property.

15/12310/FUL and 15/12471/LBC

The owners of Short Street Farm, 160 Short Street, which is a listed building, have also been given consent to convert an existing outbuilding, including internal alterations, replacement garaging and landscaping.

14/09400/FUL Sienna's Valley

The appeals concerning the static caravan at Sienna's Valley in Huntenhull Lane were considered by a Government planning inspector at a hearing held at the Civic Centre in Trowbridge on Tuesday 15th March, Dennis Barnard, Francis Morland and I attended to represent the parish council. A number of residents were also present. We learned that the number of alpacas on the site had fallen owing to an outbreak of TB. The hearing lasted almost five hours and was followed by a site visit, which only the inspector and Wiltshire Council's planning officer were allowed to attend. The inspector will announce his decision in a month or two's time and I will keep you fully informed in due course.

Road Safety

The working group set up to come up with ideas to improve road safety in the village continues to meet. At our March meeting, due to be held after the time of writing, we

will study an analysis of questionnaires kindly completed by parents of children attending the school and Busy Bees. Hopefully that will provide us with much useful information and suggestions.

I mention each month that Speedwatch is an important part of our determination to make our High Street safer for all of us. We carry out up to ten sessions, each of them lasting an hour, in the weeks we have the camera, normally one week each month. Volunteers normally offer one or two hours each week and we all enjoy the experience. Several of our volunteers will be moving from the village shortly so we really do need some more residents to come along and offer their help. The police provide training and equipment as well as support by being alongside us whenever they get the opportunity. So, if you are concerned about speeding vehicles in the village, why not join the team? Do get in touch if you can.

Highways

There have been several complaints about excessive mud on some of our roads

following the damp winter, which have been reported to Wiltshire Highways. We are also requesting Wiltshire to resurface those parts of the A3098 through the parish which are looking very tired and to refresh the white lines and road markings throughout the parish.

Future meetings

Our next scheduled parish council meeting is on Thursday 14th April at the school. It will follow the Annual Parish Meeting, which starts at 7.30 pm. The Annual Parish meeting, which I chair but which is not a parish council meeting, provides you with the opportunity to give us your views on village issues and how we have performed as a parish council over the past twelve months. We also intend to present our annual report at this meeting. In May we will meet on the 12th and this will be our Annual General Meeting, at which we elect our officers for the coming year.





A view from over the hedge...

Countryside Matters

While I deduce, from the first note the hollow cuckoo sings, the symphony of spring

Easter was so early this year, but thankfully there were daffodils a-plenty to decorate our churches. The good news is that the Parish Council and the Elizabethan Committee are jointly funding the purchase of daffodil bulbs for planting this coming autumn. We'll be looking for volunteers to plant them throughout the village, in public areas and verges.

Already the longer daylight hours are helping on the farm, with field work such as muck-spreading followed by chain harrowing (to spread the manure around), then heavy rolling to flatten the ground. Hopefully, a good April shower will make the grass grow so that six to eight weeks later we can take the first cut of silage or hay. Both winter and spring-sown cereals are watched carefully by our agronomist; checking for mineral deficiencies, airborne infections and insect and bird damage.

The cows are now grazing in the fields during the day, enjoying the fresh grass and the opportunity to stretch their legs. However, they are quite pleased to come in for milking, and then to stay in their comfortable stalls through the nights until the night-time temperatures are higher.

What a joy to see the lambs out skipping and dancing in the sunshine! Once again can I please ask dog owners to keep dogs on leads when walking on farmland and

woodlands? There was a recent serious report of dogs worrying sheep, and many ewes died; fortunately, it wasn't local! Wildlife is also at risk from dogs: ground nesting birds such as partridge and skylark are easily disturbed and will not return to care for their eggs or young. Fawns (young deer) will be hidden by their mother but, once frightened and separated, the youngsters probably won't survive.

April really is a beautiful month of fresh colours in fields, hedges and woodland. By the end of the month we will hear the full dawn chorus as all our summer migrants arrive. Listen and watch out for the first swallows, chiffchaffs, willow warblers and many others. Violets, primroses, wood anemones and bluebells will be brightening up our verges and woodlands whilst the trees become alive with sticky buds and beautiful blossom.

Enjoy spring in our countryside.

Unhappy child, unhealthy adult

There's been a lot of media interest in mental health and emotional wellbeing in recent months - and hurrah for that. The BBC Radio 4 programme 'Unhappy Child. Unhealthy Adult' was, for me, particularly interesting. In case you didn't catch it, it explored the link between emotional distress in childhood and physical ill health in adulthood and it seems that the evidence is piling up - our chances of developing serious conditions including diabetes and heart problems are significantly raised by trauma and unhappiness in our early years. And the medical profession are acknowledging it - another hurrah.

I've long been an advocate of the idea that this connection exists and, along with many other practitioners, I use the idea of the physical-emotional connection in my practice. Our bodies tell us about what we're feeling emotionally all the time. We aren't encouraged to notice this often subtle information, though. We're all aware of tears signalling sadness or joy, of a churning stomach indicating anxiety and the association of stress with hunched shoulders and tensed neck muscles. What we often miss are the smaller signs of disguiet: the unconscious twiddling of our hair, the jogging of a leg while sitting. Or, more subtle still: changes in our breathing. Next time you feel under pressure, check out how you're breathing. Maybe your breath

becomes more shallow; maybe you stop breathing altogether briefly. I know I do.

It's my experience that, if we process painful feelings, physical symptoms often diminish or even disappear. I'm not, of course, suggesting that therapy promises a cure for serious illness. It doesn't. But, if we put less stress on the body by sorting out the emotional stuff, we're reducing the harmful chemicals produced by that stress - particularly adrenaline and cortisol, both of which are toxic in large and sustained amounts

So, the conclusions seem clear: help stressed children by whatever means necessary to preserve their health into adulthood and listen to your body and do what you can to reduce any physical discomfort by relieving emotional discomfort.
