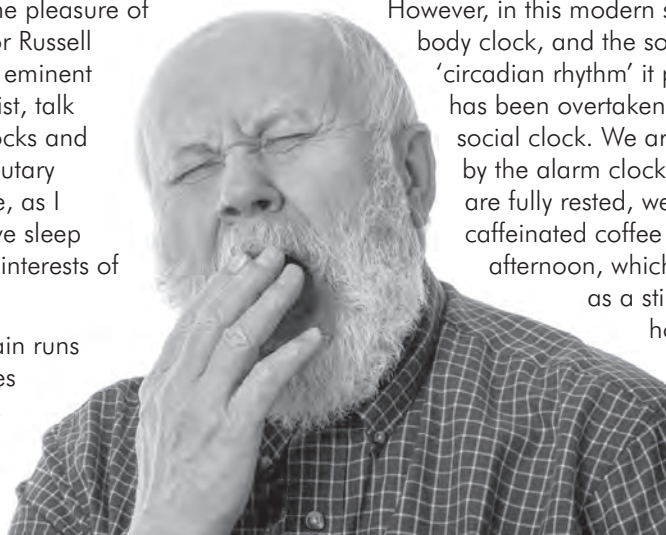
Sleep: are we getting enough?

Sleep, perchance to dream...

Last month, I had the pleasure of listening to Professor Russell Foster CBE FRS, an eminent Oxford neuroscientist, talk on "Sleep, body clocks and health". It was a salutary personal experience, as I certainly do not have sleep patterns in the best interests of my health.

One part of our brain runs a clock that operates on a 24 hour cycle, partly regulated by perception of light. You will have experienced the re-setting of the clock if you have suffered from jet-lag. It takes a few days for your body clock to change to the new time zone in response to the light-dark daily cycle.

This body clock also does other things. It increases your blood pressure and increases metabolic activity in the early hours of the morning, getting ready for activity during the day. Conversely, it decreases blood pressure, alertness and body temperature in the late afternoon preparing for lower activity and sleep. This is why you should take blood pressure medication in the morning and why you may feel tired in the afternoon.



However, in this modern society our body clock, and the so-called 'circadian rhythm' it produces, has been overtaken by the social clock. We are woken by the alarm clock before we are fully rested, we may take caffeinated coffee in the late afternoon, which is still acting as a stimulant up to 9 hours later, and we may eat late and stay up watching TV. We may well get less than the eight hours we should

have (or nine hours for a teenager!).

So what is the harm in this? Surely, just being a bit tired does not cause any harm? On the contrary, short-term sleep disruption causes attention failure, impulsivity and loss of empathy, failure to process information, loss of creativity, reduced cognition, and increases stress, among other things. One wonders about decisions made in late sittings of parliament or all-night negotiations between employers and trades unions, for example! So, don't talk with your spouse about finances, or make other

important decisions, in the evening! Leave it to a morning at the weekend.

Lack of sleep can also have devastating consequences. It is estimated that there are about 100,000 car accidents a year in the USA caused by sleep deprivation, and if you drive a car between 3 and 8 am, your cognitive impairment may be greater than if you were above the drink-drive limit. The 1986 accident at Chernobyl was due to sleep deprivation causing individuals to be impulsive and not recognise the risks, and the 2010 Air India crash was due to the pilot falling asleep. Long-term sleep deprivation caused by shift work can increase the risk of cancer, diabetes and cardiovascular disease. Have no doubts, sleep is an important part of living well.

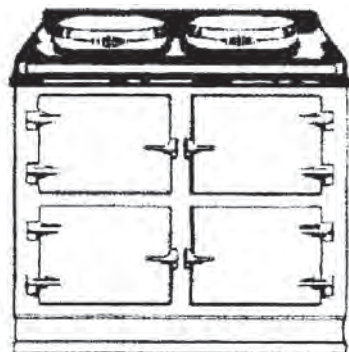

Parish Council Briefing

Neil Britten reports on the parish council's activities in March

March is the month of the Annual Parish Meeting: this year it was held on Monday 13th and was preceded on 28th February by an occasional meeting to consider the planning application by Longleat Enterprises Ltd (LEL) for a hotel resort on the boundary of our Parish at the site known as Tascroft Court. The Parish Council has also received notification of the planning application for the new houses on the Bay Tree site which will be the subject of a meeting early in April, details of which, as far as they are known at the time of writing, are also included below.

Planning applications

17/01124/OUT

This is an outline planning application by LEL (with all matters reserved except for access) for a new hotel resort comprising:

- 240 bedroom hotel and business conference facility
- Water park
- Immersive animal experience

Associated works including landscaping, highways infrastructure (pedestrian and vehicular access, car parking, servicing arrangements, plant, stopping-up, creation and improvement of footpaths, improvements to bridleways, site clearance

works, the installation of new services and infrastructure, earthworks and engineering works, and other ancillary works and activities.

The site is on the west side of the A36, south of the A362 between the Cley Hill A362/A36 and Picket Post roundabouts on land entirely owned by the Longleat Estate. The south eastern edge of the development site borders the Parish boundary and the development will be visible from Cley Hill. The development area totals 52 Ha (128 acres) and affects four public rights of way (PROW), two of which have lengths inside the Parish boundary. It is proposed that one of these (WARM66), which crosses development site be 'stopped-up', i.e. closed over part of its length, with a new permissive path created to provide a connection with an existing PROW (WARM1) and the rump of WARM66. Cannimore road, a bridleway through Cannimore Woods (CORY49), connecting with the western section of Folly Lane and WARM 66, will be upgraded to provide pedestrian and cycle access to the south eastern edge of the site.

The planning assumption is that the hotel will open in 2019 and will eventually directly provide 300 direct full time equivalent jobs and a further 260 by "indirect and induced expenditure".

There were fifteen documents associated with the application, covering all aspects of the application. However, it should be noted that the application was 'outline' and all matters except access were reserved for later full planning applications. The PC had extensive discussions on the plans, particularly the traffic analyses and the visual aspects.

The setting of the proposed hotel was not deemed to be a problem and members of the PC had walked the site and viewed it from Cley Hill. Based on the current proposals, particularly in light of the extensive plans for screen planting and the use of the topology of the site, the development would not be visible, except from the top of Cley Hill and even from there it will not be intrusive. The effective height of the new buildings would be of the same scale as the existing Tascroft Court buildings. The PC was also in favour of the footpath changes that are being proposed.

However, there was considerable concern about the traffic implications. The traffic analysis indicated the additional number of vehicles anticipated in peak periods, both at the outset and after ten years, using analyses and assumptions which took into account other planned and proposed developments in Warminster and extreme rates of usage for the hotel resort. The output indicated a fairly modest increase in vehicle numbers, but significant queues at the Cleyhill roundabouts at peak bank holidays periods in the long term. Highways England had expressed concern and suggested that some planning restrictions might be appropriate.

The PC was not convinced that the traffic analysis had taken sufficient cognisance of the existing queuing problems routinely created by Center Parcs on their entry and exit days. These regularly backup to and onto the A36, blocking A362 through

traffic and the entrance to Folly Lane, that proposed to be used for the new Hotel Resort. The PC thus resolved to register an objection to the application with the following comments:

"The Parish Council (PC) have considered the application in some detail and in principle strongly support this development. However, the PC objects on the grounds that there are major concerns about the traffic implications were the scheme as detailed to be approved.

Traffic congestion, including regular queuing traffic, already exists on the A362, between the Picket Post roundabout and the Cley Hill roundabout and this development will only add to it. There does not seem to be any recognition of the current situation and the potential for a worsening one. The PC would urge that Wiltshire Council insist on a realistic traffic management plan be put in place that will be able to cope with the existing situation and deal with the growing traffic volumes from, the proposed development, the Longleat Estate and Center Parcs (both of which are forecast to grow) and, in due course, the Western Warminster Development."

The PC has now written to the Planning Authority, the Highways Authority, to Longleat and Center Parcs, detailing their objections and to seek a meeting of interested parties to try and achieve some resolution to the issues. Copies of the letter have also been circulated to our County Councillor and to the portfolio holder for roads, Councillor Whitehead. The Parish Councils of Horningsham and Chapmanslade and Warminster Town Council have been advised of the PC's decision.

Construction of five, two-bedroomed, three-person bungalows together with associated car parking and landscaping at Bay Tree Close.

This planning application has been in the pipeline for some time now and has been the subject of briefs in previous editions of The Bridge. There will be a Festival of Light this year, with a new theme and, for the first time, will

include animatronic exhibits

A food festival is being planned for the summer, centred on the TV Chef James Martin.

Longleat are in negotiations with the Caravan and Motorhome Club with a view to bringing their occupation to an end.

Streetscene

Parish Steward: Simon Jasper developed a priority list across the village covering the following general areas:

- Clear verges/bus shelter at Whitbourne Springs
- Minor potholes at Junction A362/ Whitbourne Springs
- Minor potholes across the village,

Seven Open Doors

Dear Friends,

I have thought a lot about what on earth I am going to say in this Easter edition of my letter. Easter, as we know, is about resurrection is it not, about hope and the promise of something beyond the darkness of suffering and death. As I write the people of East Africa are facing imminent starvation; the news is full of terrible images of the effects of hunger. In Iraq and Syria ordinary people suffer as war devastates their countries and many people continue to risk their lives to escape that devastation, thousands of people languish in refugee camps. Where is resurrection and hope for these people? I just can't sit here and glibly write about Easter hope without reference to the above and to be honest I don't know the answer to my question.

We live in such a ridiculous world really don't we? Everyday it seems there is another article in the newspapers about how the obesity epidemic is killing us. We are surrounded by a plethora of food, too much food, and we waste an absolutely colossal amount. You don't need me to tell you that something is wrong somewhere.

The Christian message is that Jesus came and lived among us to share what it means to be human and died and rose again so that we might have eternal life. What actually does that mean? What do we think eternal life is? Is it life after death, a nice cosy home with God in heaven when we die, and what or where is heaven? To be honest I don't know the answer to these questions either. I do believe that when we die in some mysterious way we are united with God but I wouldn't presume to know what that looks like.

So is that it do you think, is the idea of eternal life only about the hereafter, doesn't it have something to do with the now as well? In the Old Testament there is a very powerful imperative to care for the orphan and the stranger, to see that justice for the poor is upheld, essentially to love God and neighbour. Jesus took this one step further and blew apart the prevailing understanding of justice, which we find difficult to live by anyway because we are human and innately selfish. The stories that Jesus told and the way he lived show us that eternal life is very much about the here and now, it's about life in all its fullness for all people. Resurrection isn't just something that happened two thousand years ago, it needs to happen now and we all have a part to play in trying to bring about the possibility of resurrection for those who are in such dire need. Yes, it's easy to feel overwhelmed and disengage from what is happening but we who live such privileged lives surely have a part to play in bringing hope to those for whom all hope seems lost.

Sorry not to write about eggs and chocolate etc, of course there is a place for them too, and we should enjoy the good gifts God gives us, but let's not forget that Easter is for all of God's children and not just for us.

Chapmanslade Parish Council

Parish Council Briefing

Phil Jefferson reports on the parish council's activities in March

The parish council met on 9th March. Eight members of the public were present. As we approach the end of another busy year for the council, our agenda was lighter than usual.

Overweight lorries and 7.5 tonne weight limit

We are still waiting for a response from Dr Murrison, our MP, following our request that the use of car satnavs in heavy goods vehicles should be made illegal. We have seen a spate of overweight lorries in the High Street recently (i.e. lorries with three or more axles), perhaps because of the housing development currently going ahead near Asda in Frome, and volunteers are conducting an unofficial lorry watch. If you spot a large vehicle which shouldn't be in the village please report it via the village website or the Facebook page. Its registration number, the firm's name and the date and time of the incident would be helpful.

Village Voice initiative

Adam reported on the progress being made in our village planning exercise. He told us that sponsorship has been found to support the plan and in particular the questionnaire. We expect the questionnaire will be issued

very shortly and we look forward to a good response: when we carried out a similar exercise 15 years ago the response was over 80%.

The Great British Litter Pick on 4th March was a great success, despite the horrendous weather and was favourably reported in the Wiltshire Times and Warminster Journal. 20 volunteers braved the downpour and we tidied up the whole village in the space of an hour. Ben at The Three Horseshoes provided us with a welcome cup of tea or coffee afterwards and some stayed on to sample the pub's other liquid delights!

Details of the consultation evening concerning mains gas, due to be held on 23rd March, were discussed. We hoped for a good attendance and that residents would find the meeting helpful. Wales and West Utilities have written to residents outlining the possibilities. Perhaps this time we will achieve the number required to make the project viable (although we noted the company is now asking for 62 householders to sign up). We will report back to you next month.

The village Facebook page is now regularly used by about 60 residents for sharing news, information and comment. Concern

Sienna's Valley

You will recall that last March a Government Planning Inspector gave the owners of the mobile home 12 months to remove the building and all its paraphernalia and to restore the land to its original profile. The 12 months come to an end on 6th April. It was reported that the mobile home may be on the market.

St Philip and St James' Church

A reminder that our village church will be celebrating its 150th anniversary on Monday 1st May. Our village school, next door, will be 150 years old in five years' time. The Parochial Church Council is planning an afternoon "Songs of Praise" service, starting at 2 pm, which will be led by the Bishop of Ramsbury and followed by a tea party. The PCC hopes all the village will join in this celebration. Do you have any treasured memories of the church that you could share with us, or photographs of Sunday School outings, weddings or christenings? The history group is planning an exhibition and anything you could lend the PCC will be much appreciated. Please contact me or Ian

Buick, our churchwarden, if you can help.

Highways

Keith reported that he was hoping to meet with the Parish Steward shortly to discuss a number of issues including when the gullies will be cleared. It was noted that the white lines at the telephone kiosk have been refurbished and that the tarmac by New Rylands farm has been repaired. The poor state of the cobblestones in Southcroft and the need to refurbish road markings elsewhere in the village, especially those connected with traffic calming were noted.

Speedwatch

Phil Holihead reported that he has asked the police for permission for two new sites in the village to be considered.

And Finally...

That Dead Badger. I mentioned last month that Wiltshire Council, after it had been approached several times finally removed the dead badger which was outside the school. However, it seems there may be another explanation. It may have been that a well-wisher closely connected to the village carried out the removal before Wiltshire's contractors arrived! I will say no more, except thank you!

Annual Parish Meeting

Our Annual Parish Meeting will be held on **Thursday 13th April at 7 pm** (please note the time) in the Village Hall. This is your opportunity to raise issues that concern you about Chapmanslade and to tell the parish council what we have done well, or badly, or perhaps failed to do, over the past twelve months. Fleur de Rhe Philippe, our Wiltshire councillor, will also be present to answer your questions on the services Wiltshire provides and parish councillors will

present the council's annual report. We will be focussing on traffic issues – congestion outside the school, overweight lorries, weight restrictions generally, road maintenance – so we will welcome your input, whether you are a resident or a parent. Representatives of the police and school governors will be present to give us their take on these issues.

Next Parish Council Meeting

This will follow immediately after the Annual Parish Meeting. It will be our last before we stand down at the end of our four-year term. It will be my last as a parish councillor but, more importantly, it will be Dennis's last meeting, too. He was first appointed in 1958 and, with a few breaks in service, has served a total of 42 years: a very impressive record. Please do come along as we say thank you for all that he has contributed to the work of the council over so many years. And if you are considering offering yourself as one of our next parish councillors remember you only have until 4th April to submit the necessary forms. So do please hurry!

Countryside Matters

Our verges were brightened up with a show of spring flowers which luckily withstood temperatures up to 17°C and down to 3°C, with wind, rain, sunshine and showers

Daffodils, primroses, aconites and violets all in abundance and, before the month of April is over, our woodlands will put on a real show of bluebells. Hedgerows and trees are now bursting with life; catkins and willow buds, wild cherry and thorns with blossom and sticky buds on the chestnuts opening to those lovely candle flowers.

The birds are busy from dawn to dusk singing and displaying their feathers to attract a mate, building nests and sourcing food for their young. Don't forget to put out suitable food for wild birds, remembering that whole peanuts can choke young birds.

The milking cows scented spring in the air in early March and by the 16th the ground was dry enough for them to go out to the fresh grass for a few hours each day. It is quite

tricky managing their diet at this time as their winter rations are closely monitored and adjusted to suit their needs.

Young stock of 12-18 months of age have been out all winter grazing winter kale and roots on a strip grazing system with bales of silage to feed on. Each day the fence is moved and the metal ring feeders rolled over the freshly opened bagged silage. This method of feeding keeps the cattle well exercised rather than being housed and also means they have a health check by a herdsman/woman as daily routine.

As the ground conditions improve, slurry and manures are put on pastures before they're ploughed. Manure and bagged fertiliser is put on grass pastures for grazing and silage.

In fact, it's all 'go' throughout April, but with the longer daylight hours and the kinder warmer weather, the farm work becomes more of a pleasure.
