Three Open Doors

The Rector writes:

On the penultimate morning of the school term, there was a wonderful service to say thank you to Mrs Wade and Mrs Tewell and to wish them well in retirement. The service, led by Rev Di Britten (the ex-officio governor at Chapmanslade), was attended by a great number of people. It is a real testament to the regard in which Mrs Jewell is held, that parents, staff and children, governors past and present, head teachers from other local schools, friends from the village and representatives from church and diocese gathered to pay tribute to her leadership and devotion during her years as head. The children's contribution was particularly moving; two year six leavers spoke with confidence and affection about Mrs Jewell and all that she has contributed to their time at this lovely school. Dennis Barnard recalled his attending the school some seventy four years ago; he mentioned his involvement as a school 'manager' and how the school has blossomed in recent years under the leadership of Mrs Jewell with excellent Ofsted and Diocesan Inspection Reports to prove it. The links which have been fostered between the church and the school were celebrated as a splendid example of good practice in 'growing' community.

Whenever I attend worship at Chapmanslade School, I am always impressed with the quality of the children's singing. The hymns chosen were wonderfully appropriate and beautifully sung. Although there was a sense of sadness that this chapter of the school's life was drawing to a close with the departure of Mrs Wade and Mrs Jewell, there was also great joy for all that had been achieved in the last ten years. We wish these two special people a happy retirement and thank them both for their love, expertise and care of our children.

A new chapter in the life of the school will open in September. In the meantime, a happy holiday to you all.

Countryside Matters

On the 18th July, as I write my contribution to The Bridge, we continue to have strong winds and regular heavy downpours of rain. There was another 1" of rain last night. However, there is the promise that the Jet Stream is moving north and that summer will arrive!

So far this year, we have seen the cancellation of so many summer events. Many homes within a few miles of our villages have been flooded, and there has been loss of life in collapsed tunnels. The weather has a huge impact on all our lives.

This has been the worst summer in living memory for farmers. Crops are spoiling in the fields, either becoming unsuitable for silage or simply rotting. Cattle that should be lazing around enjoying the sunshine on their backs are sheltering from the rain under the trees, and converting grass paddocks into something more reminiscent of paddy fields. With root crops devastated, vegetables and fruit spoiling in the fields, it is no wonder those rain clouds are causing severe depression and worries. How will we feed both humans and animals through the rest of the year?

As schools break up for the summer holidays, we hope the weather improves. Indoor entertainments for children are so much more expensive if they cannot use the beach or the countryside for their entertainment.

Our wildlife has suffered greatly with migratory birds moving south earlier than normal. For those of you lucky enough to have heard a Cuckoo, you will have noticed they left a couple of weeks early. The size of Swallow broads is much lower than normal, but if the weather improves they may have another go before returning to Africa for their eternal summer.

The flip side of all this is that the hedgerows and verges are very green and continuing to grow; they should be slowing down due to lack of water by now! This has been a very good year for orchids; Cley Hill has been particularly impressive with Common Spotted, Fragrant, Pyramidal and Bee orchids all seen in a few hours.

Let's hope august comes bringing sunshine into our lives.

Our President, Judith Helliar, welcomed members to the July meeting of Corsley WI on a wet and miserable night. Judith then introduced our speaker for the evening, Mr David Giles, who is the co-President of the Red Cross for the area covering Avon, Wiltshire and Dorset. David had been invited to give a talk on the work of the Red Cross in memory of one of our members, Peggotty Jesse, who had been a Red Cross volunteer for over 50 years and had received a Volunteers Service Medal for her work.

David told us that in 1863 a Swiss businessman, Henry Dunant, appalled by the suffering in the Battle of Solferino, was the inspiration for the Red Cross and the Red Crescent movement. Societies made up of volunteers were formed in various countries, including Britain, who in 1870 formed the British National Society for Aid to the Sick and Wounded in War, to give aid and relief to wounded soldiers. In 1905, the name was changed to the British Red Cross. During the First World War, members were organized into Voluntary Aid Detachments, trained in First Aid and with the new 'motorized' ambulances were able to help more effectively in the battlefields.

The Red Cross today has in the region of 35,000 volunteers in this country and as well as giving and teaching first aid, it helps people in times of crisis, from helping in

the community, assisting with refugees, tracing



missing persons and much more. It is the biggest non-governmental organization in the world and is entirely funded by voluntary donations. Caroline Higham thanked David for his extremely interesting talk.

Carbon Monoxide Awareness

Time for the annual 'spring clean' for your central heating boiler or your chimneys.

We may not have even turned our central heating off completely this year yet, but I expect that we will get a summer at some time and when we do what better time to ask the chimney sweep to clean your chimney or get your central heating boiler serviced. By taking simple precautionary measures such as regular servicing by registered engineers/chimney sweeps and having smoke and carbon monoxide alarms fitted, you are helping to ensure that you will be safe from either smoke inhalation or carbon monoxide poisoning.

If you do not already have detectors or alarms fitted, it is relatively inexpensive to do so and they are easily installed. If you do have alarms, ensure that batteries are correctly fitted, and that the appliance is in date – yes, they do have an expiry date!

How aware are you about Carbon Monoxide poisoning?

What is carbon monoxide- why is it a problem?

Carbon monoxide (CO) is a colourless, odourless, tasteless, poisonous gas produced by incomplete burning of carbonbased fuels, including gas, oil, wood and coal. Carbon-based fuels are safe to use. It is only when the fuel does not burn properly that excess CO is produced, which is poisonous. When CO enters the body, it prevents the blood from bringing oxygen to cells, tissues, and organs.

You can't see it, taste it or smell it but CO can kill quickly without warning. According

to the Health and Safety Executive (HSE) statistics, around 15 people die each year from CO poisoning caused by gas appliances and flues that have not been properly installed, maintained or that are poorly ventilated. Levels that do not kill can cause serious harm to health if breathed in over a long period. In extreme cases paralysis and brain damage can be caused as a result of prolonged exposure to CO. Increasing public understanding of the risks of CO poisoning and taking sensible precautions could dramatically reduce this risk.

What preventative measures can I take against carbon monoxide exposure?

Ensure that any work carried out in relation to gas appliances in domestic or commercial premises is to be undertaken by a Gas Safe Registered engineer, competent in that area of work

The HSE strongly advises that gas appliances and/or flues are installed and serviced regularly for safety by a Gas Safe Registered engineer. If you live in tenanted accommodation, your landlord has a legal duty to carry out an annual gas safety check and maintain gas appliances. They must provide you with a copy of the completed gas safety check certificate.

Always make sure there is enough fresh air in the room containing your gas appliance. If you have a chimney or a flue, ensure it is not blocked up and also ensure that vents are not covered.

If you plan to install a gas fire in a bedroom, use a Gas Safe Registered engineer; do not

use unflued appliances like paraffin heaters and cabinet heaters.

Get your chimney swept from top to bottom at least once a year by a qualified sweep. If you have appliances that use other fossil fuels, make sure they are serviced and maintained by a competent person. For information on competent persons' schemes, visit the Communities and Local Government website

The HSE strongly recommends the use of audible carbon monoxide (CO) alarms as a useful back-up precaution but they must not be regarded as a substitute for proper installation and maintenance of gas appliances by a Gas Safe Registered engineer. Before purchasing a CO alarm,

always ensure it complies with British Standard EN 50291 and carries a British or European approval mark, such as a Kitemark. CO alarms should be installed, checked and serviced in line with the manufacturer's instructions. You can be particularly at risk from CO poisoning when you are asleep, because you may not be aware of early CO symptoms until it is too late. Having an audible CO alarm could wake you and save your life.


