Help create the new

Orchard Arboretum

at Corsley Old School Field

Corsley traditionally had many orchards, with the Ordnance Survey map of 1926 showing nearly 20 separate orchards across the village. Today, with the exception of individual trees in some gardens they have all disappeared.

As many of you know, when Corsley School closed the Parish Council leased the school field from Wiltshire Council. The village joined together to plant half the field with a native wood. This wood has been slowly growing since then, but the rest of the field has remained unused. Corsley is famous for the Corsley Pippin, originally planted at the school by Headmaster Mr Latham so it seems fitting that the Old School Field be the site of a new orchard arboretum. The Parish Council has agreed to the proposal to plant a community mixed orchard (arboretum), at the school end of the field between the native wood and the school.

Our plan is to bring back an orchard to the village with a range of heritage varieties that will create a valuable ecosystem and be available for the community to harvest and use. There will be between 20 and 30 trees. All the trees will be protected from rabbits and deer for their first years.

We plan to start this autumn and are looking for suggestions and support as to which



trees we should plant. If anyone has fruit or nut trees they wish to donate please let us know. We would like to include the Corsley Pippin if anyone has one.

We hope that villagers may want to contribute towards funding a tree (or two) and have a plague on the tree if desired. We will also be applying for a number of grants.

If you would like to help and support in any other way with ideas, planting or donating a tree please let me know.




Biology: changing the world

Should you have your DNA analysed?

There are several companies which will, in exchange for a significant amount of money, test your DNA for genes which put you at risk of certain diseases. They can also test your genetic ancestry through genes that have been conserved historically in geographic regions. Is it worth it and should you do it?

As I had worked on different aspects of DNA for most of my professional career, to celebrate a special occasion my wife bought me a "DNA portrait". I had to take a swab of cells from my cheek and send the swab to the United States. I got back the large framed print shown in the figure. This is just an artwork, it is unique and its main value is as a thoughtful present. The company has the strapline "From life comes art".

Other companies can use a similar swab of cheek cells or saliva for more serious purposes. This is genetic testing. Although human DNA is approximately 99.9% identical from person to person (and 60% similar to chickens!) the small differences between individuals are purported to tell you about your genetic ancestry in percentage terms. This can give interesting results. The American white supremacist, Craig Cobb, hoping to prove he was a "pure-blood white man" on a live daytime TV show, discovered his ancestry was 86% European and 14% Sub-Saharan African – much to the audience's amusement. Those who are



concerned about their 'racial purity' have criticised the tests as being inaccurate, but some scientists also have worries about the validity of the data and assumptions on which the tests are based. These tests can have serious outcomes when they feed racial intolerance.

A major use of DNA testing is to determine whether you are at risk of developing certain diseases. Many genetically-determined diseases are not the result of a single gene, but a combination of different genes. However, certain variants of the BRCA1 and BRCA2 genes are known to predispose towards breast cancer. Angelina Jolie raised public awareness of these genes by choosing to have a double mastectomy in response to her DNA test. However, some variants of these genes are harmless, and it is vitally important that the results of a DNA test alone are not used as the basis for a

decision, but that consultation with a genetic counsellor occurs. The chance of developing breast cancer will differ depending on other aspects of an individual's genetics, lifestyle and environment. The NHS has just announced that from October DNA tests will routinely be available for cancer patients to optimise their treatment.

Other genetic diseases can also be tested, such as blood clotting disorders, Gaucher disease and coeliac disease, all of which are relatively rare and can be managed clinically. Tests have recently become publicly available for Parkinson's disease and inherited Alzheimer's disease. Previously these were only available through a medical practitioner. However, the company concerned strongly advises that a genetic counsellor should be consulted before applying for these tests.

So, should you have your DNA tested? If you are wanting some amusement concerning your "DNA portrait" or your genetic ancestry, there is little harm. But, if you are concerned about inherited disease or risks of developing a certain condition, do this through your medical adviser who will take into account your lifestyle and your environment



Parish Council Briefing

Chairman, Neil Britten, rounds up the PC's activity in July

The Parish Council (PC) met once in July for a short meeting to consider a planning application and ratify decisions on the development of the OSPF. The next planned meeting is the September quarterly and the next Bridge brief will be thus be in the October edition.

New planning applications

18/05169/FUL

Extension and conversion of existing garage to provide a holiday let and gym to existing building at Lane End Cottage, 72 Lane End Corsley.

The PC had no fundamental objection to the proposed changes to the garage, which was within the existing footprint area and in materials which match the existing house. The roof ridge height would increase by about 1.7m. However, the PC had reservations about the proposed number of parking spaces. There is inconsistency in the application between the three spaces shown on the plans and four quoted in the application. The proposal reduces the garage space to one vehicle and the driveway parking appears to be too small for cars to turn and exit forwards if four vehicles are present. The corner at Lane End is narrow, blind and notorious for caravan and

agricultural traffic being unable to pass and the possibility of cars having to reverse out of Lane End Cottage into this traffic flow is considered to be unsafe. The PC registered comments to this end and requested also be added to ensure that the garage remained ancillary to the main house.

Previous applications

18/04155/FUL

Removal of Condition 7 to allow Lavender Lodge, 40 Temple, Corsley to allow use as a permanent separate residency.

This was a re-application of a previous identical one, which was refused by Wiltshire on the grounds that it breached planning policy, and for which the PC had registered an objection on the grounds that there was "no evidence presented to suggest that its continued use as a commercial holiday let was no longer viable. The PC concluded that Lavender Lodge could not be classified as a "redundant" building and re-affirmed its original objection. The application was once again rejected by Wiltshire on the arounds that "No special circumstances have been demonstrated in terms of Local or National Policy to justify the use of the building for permanent residential purposes."

Plans to create a new entrance between the old tennis court and the boundary of the old school were also ratified and it is anticipated that this work will be completed by September. The OSPF will remain open to the public during all these works, but there will be periods when machinery is in use and access may be limited



Dear Friends,

It's good to be back! I had such a wonderfully creative and fruitful time during my three months' sabbatical and I am deeply grateful to all those who made it possible, not least our superb churchwardens and our wonderful retired clergy who were so willing to help by taking Sunday services, weddings, baptisms and funerals. I should also mention my husband I think, who looked after dogs, chickens and parrot whilst I was gallivanting off to varying wonderful life-giving places. Mind you, the dogs were a bit sniffy every time I reappeared; they do have a way of letting you know they are not impressed by your absence!

So what did I learn from these three months? What was I looking for in this time I was so generously given? 

'Alternative Packaging' was the subject of the talk by Prof. Nigel Brown at the meeting of Corsley WI held in July. Professor Brown began by explaining that the use of microplastic beads, the minute particles which have now infiltrated the oceans, has now been banned from use in cosmetics and toothpaste. The beads are shed from synthetic materials like fleeces in every wash but they have been used in the production of many other household items.

Plastic was invented towards the end of the 19th Century and many people will remember Bakelite, the first totally synthetic plastic, which was very heavy and difficult to convert to anything else. Many foods require plastic packaging for hygienic reasons, but the bases and covers are made from different kinds of plastic. Although the bases are recyclable, the plastic film cover is not. Bio-plastics are degradable but longlife shopping bags need to be used about 50 times to offset the environmental cost of production, unless they are recyclable. Anything made from plant material is wholly recyclable. With pollution becoming such a problem, we are all urged to reduce our use of plastic in all its forms. The vote of thanks was given by Pauline Scott.

The competition for a re-usable shopping bag was won by Mary Purchase, with Di Dowling second and Jean White third.

Future Federation events include a Whist Lunch and a Christmas Crafts workshop. Full details are available at the meetings. New members are always very welcome.

Chapmanslade Parish Council

Parish Council Briefing

Notes from the Parish Council meeting held on 5th July

The Chairman opened the meeting by reporting that at the last Wiltshire Council Planning Committee the following decisions were reached:-

- The planning application regarding a temporary rural workers dwelling at Sienna's Valley was rejected.
- The planning application for one singlestorey dwelling on the site behind 102 High Street was approved but with stringent conditions.

A major item for public discussion was the offer from Lochailort (re the development of Barters Farm) to provide £120k for either getting mains gas into the village or for traffic management. After lengthy discussion it was apparent that those present supported traffic management. The next item for public discussion was the planning application from Natural Retreats to develop Thoulstone Park as a holiday destination. It was apparent from the ensuing discussion that those present generally supported the application with some concerns about the A36 and access to the site.

The meeting then entered into closed session. The discussion as to either gas or traffic management was the choice was quickly decided with agreement that the

Parish Council would ask for the money offered to be used for a traffic management scheme. The Councillors then discussed Thoulstone Park and the decision was that the Parish Council supported the application. The only query was the future footpath/cycleway/bridleway from the site towards Chapmanslade which is not shown on the application. (Since the meeting the Chairman has sought clarification from Natural Retreats and has been assured that it was important that such a bridleway from Thoulstone towards Chapmanslade was created. This was to ensure that holidaymakers could get from the site to the village amenities safely and easily.)

The Chairman reported that a new planning application from Lochailort in respect of Barters Farm was expected imminently. (The application has now been received and as an early decision is required a special Parish Council meeting took place on July 26th.)



A view from over the hedge...

Countryside Matters

As I write this on the 19th July we are experiencing the driest and hottest weather since 1976. Parts of the country already have a hosepipe ban for gardens and the shortage of grass for grazing on the farm is causing much concern.

Hay made a month ago intended for special feed in the winter months has already been fed to hungry in-calf cows, due to give birth to their calves toward the end of August These cows must be given a good diet, whatever the cost, to keep both them and their unborn calves in good health.

Many cows that would normally still be going through the milking parlour and giving milk have been dried off and are now resting up on fairly barren grass fields, with access to silage if necessary. It is essential that they have unlimited access to fresh water at all times and are, of course, checked for any health problems at least once a day.

Due to the high temperatures, some of the grain crops are being harvested early; the wheat has been harvested while the seed is still milky and both seed and stem(straw) is chopped finely and put into the silage clamp. This is called 'whole crop wheat' and will be mixed with other home-produced feed for the cattle during the winter months.

This does mean that the straw we need for feed and bedding will now be bought in, with most of the straw coming from Salisbury



Plain being harvested at least three weeks early.

This last month has shown the devastation of Dutch Elm Disease, horse chestnut leaf miner and Ash Dieback affecting trees in our woods and hedgerows. There is great concern that infected plants are being brought into the country by amateurs, where as professionals would follow the rigorous rules that horticultural and tree importers must follow.

Many young birds, mammals and woodland animals are now on the loose in our woods and fields without their parents; please be aware when you are out on your walks. Please do not pick them up unless they are injured – ground-nesting birds and hares will lie low until you have passed by.

Please also be careful with bonfires in gardens, open ground and woodland as they could quickly get out of control now the undergrowth is so dry.

Do check your dog and yourself for ticks regularly and beware of adders who are enjoying this warm weather. Enjoy the weather and the countryside, but do consider the dangers lurking in the countryside.

Help us tackle 'County Lines'

Young and vulnerable people living in our communities are being exploited by drugs gangs. It's happening right now and we need your help to protect them.

'County Lines' is a term used to describe gangs and organised criminal networks involved in exporting illegal drugs into one or more importing areas in the UK, using dedicated mobile phone lines or other form of 'deal line'. They are likely to exploit children and vulnerable adults to move and store the drugs and money using coercion, intimidation, violence and weapons. Gangs are targeting the most vulnerable people in small towns across the country to sell class A drugs on their behalf.

This type of behaviour is a significant threat to our communities and will not be tolerated but we need your help to spot the signs and act on your concerns. Your voice will be heard and will make a difference

Director of Intelligence Sonja Leith said: "County Lines is everyone's responsibility and I would urge members of the public to be vigilant and look out for some of the most visible signs that county lines drugs gangs are operating in neighbourhoods and to report this to police. Our intelligence teams work hard to identify where county lines are exploiting vulnerable children and adults, and to proactively disrupt these networks. The intelligence we receive from communities is crucial in helping us, our partner agencies and neighbouring forces in tackling county lines and safeguarding

people. By raising awareness of the issue, I hope more people will be able to spot the signs, and feel comfortable in reporting information to the police. Your call could save lives "

Signs to look out for:

- Has a child or young person gone missing from school or home?
- Are they meeting with unfamiliar adults?
- Have you noticed a change in their behaviour?
- Are they using drugs and alcohol?
- Has there been a breakdown in relationships with family and friends?

These could be signs that they are being coerced and controlled to commit crime. Call 101 to report signs of coercion and con
