Ring the changes!


Ever thought of learning to ring the bells of St Margaret's?

Most of us like to hear church bells ringing and even those living fairly near to the church are happy to hear ringing for weddings or services and even the less tuneful 'practice night' on a Wednesday evening. I don't believe that there is anyone in Corsley or Chapmanslade who would like to call a close to this skill that started way back in the early Middle Ages.

At St Margaret's we have six bells, the heaviest being just over 10 hundredweight or ½ ton and so are known as a 'light six'. We are one of the few towers in the area that ring regularly and are always looking for new learners who would like to try ringing and many do stay on as result of 'having a go'.

I don't think anyone has any idea what ringing church bells actually entails and until you come and have a look at what goes on you will be none the wiser. Once you have learnt to ring and are able to control a bell you will always be made very welcome at any of the 5,000 or so towers up and down the country. You can make good friends and enjoy the skill which you can take to more and more complicated levels.

To learn to ring you need to be reasonably fit, have a sense of rhythm and good ear always helps. You do not need to be strong as ringing is a skill that does not rely on strength. Learning to ring in a simple scale with five other ringers is an achievement and controlling a bell swinging through 360



degrees which may weigh 1/2 ton and has been cast more than 300 years ago is fascinating.

If you are interested, you are very welcome to come up to practice night for a few minutes and see what we do. If you would like to try ringing or would like to visit the ringers practising please contact me at:



Road Closure Notice

Temporary Closure of C275 (Part), Corsley (Ref: TTRO 8210)

Notice is hereby given that the Wiltshire Council has made an Order to close temporarily to all traffic: C275 (Part), Corsley; for a distance of approximately 50m either side of the property known as Rowan Cottage, to enable Wessex Water to carry out repair service and associated works.

Alternative route: via C275 (unaffected length) – The Hollow – Heathway – A362 – C275 (unaffected length) and vice versa.

The closure and diversion route will be clearly indicated by traffic signs.

This Order will come into operation on 24 August 2022 and the closure will be required for three days. It is anticipated that the works will take the stated duration to complete depending upon weather conditions. Access will be maintained for residents and businesses where possible, although delays are likely due to the nature of the works.

Chapmanslade Parish Council

Parish Council Briefing

The Parish Council (PC) met on the 14th July 2022. Four of the Parish Councillors were present. One member of the public attended and the meeting was also joined by PC Mike Obern and PCSO Leigh Holcombe from the Warminster Area Community Policing Team. PC Obern gave us some detail on the changes in the Police team and how they intend to be more proactive. He also said they would be trying to attend more of the PC meetings and would when time allowed support our Community Speed Watch team as well as requesting that PC roads unit add support.

Dog bin

After a request from a resident, the PC considered moving the dog litter bin a short distance away from buildings at the top of Wood Lane. Providing that Wiltshire Council are still able to empty it in the new position then it is hoped to move the bin shortly with volunteer labour from the village.

Village Hall parking

Recently the hall car park and toilet facilities have been used by people attending another local venue and this has caused issues with parking for users of the hall. Following a letter requesting guidance from the Village Hall Management Committee, the PC (Village Hall custodian trustees) considered the implications and possible solutions. A decision was made as a first step to review and update the signage to make it clear what the car park is for and who can use it. Hopefully this will avoid potential for confrontation in the future.

Finance

Our Clerk reported that we have received

the last payment of CIL (Community Infrastructure Levy) money from the Honey Glade development. The council has to decide how this money will be best spent. At the next meeting there will be discussion about spending some of it on a topographical study that will be necessary for improvements to the A3098 road to be carried out and the Village Voice steering group will hopefully meet before then to advise the council on other projects that may benefit.

Planning applications

PL/2022/04014 Proposed change of use of garden room to hair salon a 2 Pedlars Grove. Decision – No objections were raised.

PL/2022/03844. Change the Existing Use of a Golf driving range building to 5no. Dwelling houses. The Driving range at Thoulstone Golf Club. (This was a Notification for Prior Approval under Class MA). Following discussion it was agreed to object to this application.

PL/2022/04679 Erection of rural workers dwelling house at Sienna Valley Farm, Huntenhull Lane. Following extensive discussion it was agreed to object to this application.

Also considered were the various revisions made to the proposed Solar Farm at Lodge Hill 2021/2191/FUL (MENDIP). Following discussion it was unanimously agreed to continue to object to this application.

The next Parish Council Meeting is planned for Thursday 11th August in the Village Hall at 7.30 pm.

In Ecclesiastes 3 v 1 he says there is a time for everything, and a season for every activity under heaven and gives 14 examples of opposites in couplets such as a time to weep and a time to laugh or a time to be silent and a time to speak. We may recoil from calling some things in this list of couplets 'beautiful' - things such as 'hate' and 'war' - yet we long for their opposites - 'love' and 'peace'.

Our life 'under the sun' is a mixture, the ugliness of quarrels, industrial disputes, war, humanitarian disasters, famine, disease and death; and there is the beauty of creation, new babies, celebrations, enjoying our children and grandchildren. The Bible is honest: we live in a fallen, sinful world; and we know too, that there is a world of sin in our hearts (see Mark 7 vv 20-23).

But every now and then, the writer of Ecclesiastes directs our gaze 'above the sun'. It is there in the second part of the verse: 'He has set eternity in our hearts'. We were made for a relationship with our Creator and Ecclesiastes teaches us that life apart

> from Him is meaningless and ends in eternal separation from God. The One greater than Solomon, the Lord Jesus Christ, said: I have come that they may have life,

and have it to the full (John 10 v 10b). George Wade Robinson

speaks of this relationship in his hymn 'Loved with Everlasting

Love':

Heaven above is softer blue, earth around is sweeter green; something lives in every hue Christless eyes have never seen; birds with gladder songs o'erflow, flowers with deeper beauties shine, since I know, as now I know, I am His and He is mine.

Six Open Doors

Dear Friends,

My husband and I are sitting in a café in Frome on one of the hottest days the UK has ever experienced and tomorrow it is going to be even hotter. The world is in a mess and the weather with it, and it's all down to human beings' extraordinary gift of living as if they owned the place (the earth, the cosmos, etc), with total disregard for the damage they are inflicting on themselves, other species and the delicate eco system we inhabit; you could be forgiven for feeling rather downcast at this scenario.

Added to the above, I arrived home from taking a service this morning with my back screaming in protest at the necessity of standing up for a while. Several painkillers and a hot water bottle later it's grumbling but not quite as bad. As I ate my lunch feeling rather sorry for myself, I thought about the usual things I do to try to cheer myself up. If I tell you that cleaning the fridge out cheers me up no end, (properly mind, shelves taken out and washed, salad draw likewise) you'll probably think I'm mad. Cleaning out the larder is even more pleasing, but that's perhaps too big a job for such a hot day.

But when things are bad, and despair sets in, I seek solace elsewhere. Some of you will never have set foot in St Mary's Kingston Deverill. It is a beautiful little church, much altered by the Victorians but in a very restrained way. Up in the chancel on a plinth on the wall, is a carved 14th century statue of the Madonna and child. Once she was brightly painted, now there is the merest hint of colour here and there. She is weathered and worn and one hand is missing, a mere stump. But it is her brokenness that speaks to me so powerfully of beauty and pain; she holds the Christ child almost as if she is offering him to us, she seems to be gazing into the future and saying, 'here is suffering and pain, this is what it means to be human, this is the reality we live with.'

I can't quite explain why I find this statue so calming, I think it's because gazing at this battered Madonna I feel but a tiny, tiny part of something much bigger and deeper than myself. I feel drawn into another perspective in which myself, this world, this suffering, this despair is held by something I cannot understand nor articulate. T.S Elliot wrote...

"Here or there does not matter We must be still and still moving Into another intensity For a further union, a deeper communion".

Do go and visit this beautiful Madonna and child, I hope she speaks to you and brings you peace.





Wonderful Walks

A truly 'open' walk



We're walking in open country this month and our destination is Southwick Country Park, this side of Trowbridge. Don't use the entrance car park, but go through the gate ahead, pass the 'running man' statue on the right and glide left, uphill to the Hope Nature Reserve and Café car park. I've tried twice to lunch here and failed, because they don't book tables, so do what I did last time and have a second breakfast before you walk! This place is for youngsters with special needs; those who are able can progress here, in the café or as zoo keepers, perhaps earning a living and having some independence. A Reserve tour isn't cheap, but it's enjoyable and, again, your money could give a young person a better future.

For the walk, step through the car-parking spaces beside the animal enclosure and follow the grass path ahead. Look at the size of the field you're in - and it's the first of many! Using the grass track, pass a lone tree on your right and join a gravel track, turning left where the bin is; the track winds its way right and then left. There's a low wooden rail on your left, then two tall slender trees with lovely red bark, just where the bench is, plus a marker stating '3 KM'. Stay with the hedge and the animal reserve at your left, until you reach a cross-paths. Use the narrower path straight ahead, which becomes a mud track when you reach a field. On your right should be a round wooden 'sculpture', but keep going ahead.

Should you get lost at any time – downhill takes you away from the reserve and café car park, while uphill gets you to a spot where you

should see them! The grassy track you're on now passes trees on the left, but take the one meandering across the field at an angle, arriving at the distant hedge; I lost count of the butterfly varieties I saw here. Turn left at the hedge and nearby, on your right, will be a gap in the hedge and a mud path through, useful if the sun's out and the day's hot. The path's wide, with tree roots to avoid falling over. You'll find tall and beautiful trees here, bird song to identify and, later, emerge into open air and another field! Ahead of you now should be a single tree again, but turn left on the grass track, following the hedge and then an 'embankment' on the left, as the field edge curves right. Another single tree should

appear on your right and beyond it will be a wide 'gap' into a new field. This really is 'open' country!

This 'gap' is a bridge, with water running under it when we get enough rain. A gravel track's ahead of you now; turn left on that, round the bend, pass the bin and ignore the part-hidden narrow bridge across another dry watercourse; I've never ventured beyond the park, but let me know if you do! When you see a lone tree, in a low rail enclosure, turn left and stay on the snaking gravel track. It rounds the field corner, passes a bench





and reaches a bigger footbridge on your left, with metal decorations of different creatures. Cross the bridge and you're in yet another field, but on your left, now, will be a wood-bark track through more trees; go that way. Almost at once the track splits, but stay with the right side, where the tree stump is. Each time the track branches, use the right one, UNTIL the left track looks like a tunnel; use that one, into a new field.

There's a wooden seat at the right. Follow the mud track curving along the left hedge, which becomes a gravel track and eventually crosses a narrow footbridge, with a bin away to your right. The gravel track you're on splits, but take the left turn into yet another field and way ahead of you, now, will be houses. Stick with the left fork here and the gravel track becomes a grass one, once you pass the footbridge to the houses. You're walking alongside Wid Brook, I think. Stay with the waterway round the field, to where the Park's entrance car park is, then join the gravel track left, going uphill to the reserve and café car park.

Need sustenance and facilities? Drive out of the park, turn right towards Warminster and try The Bell Inn at Standerwick, where I've enjoyed good food and excellent service lately.

Cranborne Chase International

Dark Sky Reserve

Councillor Bill Parks sheds some light on a dark matter

Many of our villages and much of the surrounding area lie within the Cranborne Chase Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty (ANOB).

Recently, I attended a seminar given by the Cranborne Chase ANOB regarding the designation as an International Dark Sky Reserve (IDSR). Being only the world's 14th IDSR in October 2019, this was achieved after a rigorous assessment process, but the designation was 'provisional' only and requires improvements in reducing the amount of spilled light, which has a detrimental impact on the darkness of the sky as well as on the wellbeing of nocturnal fauna and human health.

The international assessors of the IDSR require that 67% of all domestic and business outside lighting must meet Dark Sky criteria. The sad fact is that the current level is assessed at between 15-20%.

If this is not addressed as a priority over the next 18 months, the Area could lose its Reserve status.

Reducing lighting is not just important to see the stars for those of us privileged to live in the AONB; it benefits astro-tourism, attracting more visitors into the area and boosting the local economy. Reduced lighting protects insects and their predators, including bats. Too much blue light affects our circadian rhythms, may affect our own health and it kills insects.

The AONB officers can give businesses, farms and residents help in advising them on how to reduce light spill. You might want to think about the purpose of your lighting, timing of the lighting (does it need to be on all the time, and would a motion sensor be more appropriate?), character of the light provided, switching and controls. Feel free to contact them at info@cranbornechase.org.uk

There are often very simple and cheap ways to reduce light spill, so don't be put off doing your bit to protect the IDSR.

Please do not hesitate to contact me if I can help with local issues.

A view from over the hedge...

Countryside Matters

Hot, hot, hot!

I'm writing this up to the deadline as usual, on 19th July, with the temperature in our two villages registering over 30°C. The previous two days were the hottest ever on record with Heathrow Airport registering 40°C, it certainly was exhausting just doing nothing!

My sympathy went out to those who had to work in that weather and to those who found it hard such as the very young and very old keeping their body temperature at 38.2°C.

Care with pets, farm animals and those in zoos and safari parks all needed exceptional care in those temperatures.

Our milking cows, who are usually out grazing day and night this time of year, were given access to the covered yards, where cooler air was circulating, there were high roofs to protect them from the suns rays and they had easy access to fresh cold spring water

Thankfully, the sheep in this area will have been shorn a few months ago so they do have a thin coat of wool to protect their skin, but they appreciated the shelter afforded by trees and hedges.

Most hedges are trimmed during the winter months but, legally, they can be cut back from mid July if it is to improve road safety, or to prepare hedges before winter planting of crops.

I think I have mentioned before the importance of hedges for shelter for small and large animals but, particularly during those few weeks, birds were moulting and as they

lose their feathers it was nearly impossible for them to fly, to avoid predators and to get food on the wing, so hedges keep them safe and nourished.

The few cuckoos who came to the UK earlier in the year have now left our shores and the birds that were tagged have been traced to south of the Sahara.

Voles and moles were working deeper in the ground until the rain hopefully comes to dampen the topsoil when the worms will rise.

There were signs of hedgehogs back in my garden searching for food and water, so the dish of water and some easily digested dog food put out for their nocturnal wandering was probably appreciated.

Although fairly battered by the storms in May, the winter wheat has been harvested, with fairly good results in weight of wheat seed which is now in store.

On my recent journey down the A303 I was aware that the harvest was in full swing with many lorries travelling from the eastern counties down to Somerset, Devon and Cornwall with large straw bales for winter feed and bedding.

Hopefully the extreme heat we just experienced will soon give way to our usual summer temperatures in the lower or middle 20°C and we can again enjoy our gardens, our countryside and holidays


