## **Playing Field update**

Neil and Marion round up the activities at the field this year...

As I write this, autumn has arrived, the leaves are finally changing colour and dropping onto the playing field. The grass has slowed up growing a little and the flowers around the pavilion are in their final blooms for the year.

It has been a bit of a year for everyone and that includes the playing field. Whilst we were all coping with COVID-19, the field had to cope with being attacked, first by badgers and then crows, leaving large areas looking like a ploughed field. Worse still, the frosts we had during most of April meant that the repairs the cricket club did just didn't grow. Thankfully, with the relatively moist summer the field has managed to recover in most areas.

The field has been used a lot this year with the cricket club having a full season of games and people from the village and further afield using it as a safe space to exercise or just sit on one of our many benches and relax. This includes the new Andy Joynt bench, the cost of which was met by the generous donations of the villagers. Andy would have been humbled by the number of villagers who contributed and the kind words they spoke when they did so. Indeed, we had so many donations we were also able to put in a new kissing gate to replace the spring gate onto Heathway. This should provide even greater protection to stop children being able to run out into road.

We also had a wonderful show of wild

flowers this year, which was the reason we left areas uncut. We have been trying to make the field more wildlife friendly by not cutting the edges more than 2-3 times a year. Whilst this is a little frustrating if you have lost a cricket or tennis ball, it has increased biodiversity.

Finally, with regard to the last year, we have had a number of thefts including fence posts being taken and the loss of our new skittles and balls. It is a very frustrating that we have to keep things locked all the time to stop this kind of thing happening but sadly it is the world we seem to be living in as I am sure many of you will testify based on your own losses from garages, sheds and gardens.

Looking forward, for those who have been at the field recently, you will have seen we have the badger fence up early. It is on a timer and only goes on overnight, so there is no chance of being electrocuted during the day, when the field is in use. We appreciate it is a potential trip hazard but unfortunately without it we will once again have badgers digging up the field and then crows making further damage with all the work that would entail during the spring for those that keep the field looking so wonderful for us all to use. For the badger lovers out there, a fence is the

DEFRA recommended way of keeping them out and the voltage we have does not harm them just stops them crossing over the wires.

Over the winter you will see some changes at the field. Our new piece of play equipment, the Flying Carpet, is due to arrive in December. It will be the first new play equipment in over 10 years and we are sure be enjoyed by all.

We are also planning to plant some more trees along the western boundary (far side of the cricket pitch) this winter. These will be slow growing hardwood species such as walnut so will not affect cricket or homes. We will speak to the residents before fixing the exact locations of each tree.

I also wanted to mention that we are keen to hold a village event (as we did for the Queen's diamond jubilee) for her Platinum Jubilee

bank holidays (2-3 June). If anyone has any ideas what we can do or would like to help organise please let us know.

Finally, I just wanted to reiterate that the Playing Field is no dogs allowed. Whilst we appreciate this is frustrating for dog lovers who behave responsibly, we are having repeated incidents of dog poo on the field which is not pleasant for anyone but particularly dangerous for children, who can catch diseases from it.



## Fly-tipping

Bill Parks has some tips to help stop fly-tipping

Tipping a mattress, building material, electrical items, or bin bags full of rubbish by thoughtless individuals is sadly all too commonly seen around our beautiful countryside. Not only does it cause a local nuisance, especially if it contains toxic material like asbestos, but it often encourages further dumping if left unattended. There is often a risk of damage to watercourses and harm to wildlife.

Fly-tipping is a serious criminal offence which can lead to prosecution. The courts have various powers available to them to tackle fly-tipping, including imprisonment, unlimited fines and an order to deprive rights to a vehicle used to commit the offence.

I am pleased to report that the dedicated team of Environmental Enforcement Officers working closely with Wiltshire Police, the Environment Agency, and other local

authorities continue to work hard to identify those responsible for offences in the Wiltshire Council area. Most recently a Wiltshire resident has been ordered to pay £440 in fines at a Magistrates Court after giving her household waste to an unlicensed waste collector, who then fly-tipped on a highway verge in the north of the county.

Wiltshire Council has secured 27 successful prosecutions for environmental offences since 2018 and have also seized two vehicles involved in fly-tipping and issued Fixed Penalty Notices to both fly-tippers and householders who give their waste to unlicensed waste carriers.

People should be wary about using a 'man with a van' or similar adverts on social media sites to dispose of waste without making all the necessary checks, writing down the waste carrier's licence number and the registration



number of the vehicle taking the waste.

To prevent waste being fly-tipped, people should:

- Check that the person they pass their waste to is an authorised carrier at https:// environment.data.gov.uk/public-register/ view/search-waste-carriers-brokers, or by calling the Environment Agency on 03708 506506.
- · Note the make, model, colour, and registration number of any vehicle taking the waste away and note a description of the person(s) removing the waste.
- Ask for a receipt detailing where the waste is going and the waste carrier's licence number.
- If it involves scrap metal collection, check that the person who is taking the waste has an upper tier waste carrier's licence and a scrap metal collector's licence issued by Wiltshire Council.

Anyone can report fly-tipping at www.wiltshire.gov.uk/ mywiltshire-online-reporting or by calling **0300 456 0100**.

Together let's stamp out this practice out.

Well here we are again in December and my mind is filled with a chaotic mishmash of thoughts about all the stuff going on at church and all the stuff going on at home, not least the production of epic quantities of food to squirrel away in the freezer ready for when the family arrives. As I put the second chocolate roulade in the freezer basket a terrible thought occurred to me; what if the freezer broke down with all the Christmas goodies in it? It doesn't bear thinking about really.

At this time of year I always feel conflicted about the whole Christmas shebang, clearly not about the actual event we are supposed to be celebrating, namely, the birth of Christ, but about the whole business of over consumption. I feel uneasy not just in terms of excessive food and presents, but in the crazy myth of the perfect Christmas with a perfect turkey, perfect table settings, perfectly curated matching decorations and a perfect, always-smiling family to enjoy it all.

In the light of all the restrictions we were living with last Christmas, maybe we've realised that perfection doesn't matter – being with the people we love is what matters. But no family is perfect, and all will have areas of conflict and tension that might well emerge when people spend a great deal of time together, mine included; someone is bound to go off in a huff, lose their temper or take exception to something or someone at some point or another.

Please spare a thought for all those who have no family to speak of or whose experience of family life is very broken and sad, and for those who have no home to decorate or friends to celebrate with; I must say this Christmas I am acutely aware of just how privileged I am; I mean, if all I've got to worry about is my freezer breaking down then I am lucky indeed. I've been thinking a lot about how I can hold that beautiful, essentially simple story of Emmanuel, God with us, being born to share our human life in all its joy and terrible brokenness, in tandem with the reality of the darkness and pain that is so in evident in our world today. It's only a very little thing but like many of you I suspect, I've tried to buy my Christmas crackers, cards, etc., from charities I support so at least the money is contributing to something worthwhile. I did moot the idea of not having crackers but it didn't go down very well.

So I think what I'm trying to say is that Christmas is wonderful but let's not forget that we are immensely privileged in being able to enjoy it in the way we do. As I make my mince pies I will be praying for you and especially for those for whom the season is particularly difficult this year. I pray that whether you are busy looking after those you love or with us in church, that the light of God's loving presence will be real for you this Christmas.

May the peace and joy of Christmas be yours Love and prayers, Pauline

#### An important plea to you all

Dear Readers

Late in November we had one of our routine Parochial Church Council (PCC) meetings and looked at all the things on our 'to do' list. Every five years we have our two churches inspected by our architect and, as with any old buildings, the list of repairs grows continually. We have just over a year until our next inspection and need to work out what needs to be done and how to do it.

Two obstacles stand in the way of achieving this. Firstly, St Margaret's Church is without a Church Warden. Rev Gay Maynard who was already a very busy person has been holding the fort, along with a group of others who have been looking after essentials. This, however, will neither get the building repaired or achieve the fundraising for the approximately £80,000 which is outstanding.

Secondly, the situation at St Philip and St James' is different in that, although there is a backlog of repair work, currently standing at around £35,000, there is a Church Warden, namely me. So why is little being achieved? The answer is rather straightforward. Apart from other essential charity fundraising work supporting the most vulnerable members of our community in Frome, I am also having to edit this newsletter, edit The Bridge Church news pages, as well as acting as joint PCC Treasurer with my wife, who is also similarly overworked.

Pleas for someone to take on one or more of these jobs which have been going out quite regularly over the past 18 months have had absolutely no response.

There are bright rays of sunshine, in that the wonderful event at Corsley House has helped us begin to get a foot on the fundraising ladder for our development work which will also involve the repairs to both buildings, however, there is so much more still to do.

This is absolutely not a request to all the wonderful volunteers we have in this parish who have done their bit over the years and are now fully retired. I am, however, asking all of you readers, to think about what you might be able to contribute, in particular the vital role of Church Warden at St Margaret's if it is to survive in the long term.

I am going to stop doing the two editor's tasks in the new year. The parish can only operate properly if information is shared. Please consider volunteering to do this relatively small job, or you will find that these centre pages in The Bridge and the monthly newsletter will no longer appear.

## Walking through lockdown



Warminster has a 'dome' of hills guarding the town. From west to east, in a not-quite-semicircle, they are: Cley Hill on its own, Arn, Cradle and Copheap Hills next, Battlesbury, Middle and Scratchbury Hills after, and Cotley Hill last of all. There's also another hill between Arn and Copheap,

Drive up Portway and, on the bend towards Westbury, go ahead into dead-end Elm Hill, parking just past the West Wilts Golf Club entrance. Although it isn't part of the Cradle Hill walk, park here another time and cross the road, into the fields around Elm Hill. Wear wellies, as

called Elm Hill.

sheep graze here, follow the footpath signs in different directions and see if you can find your way to the Copheap Memorial, a War

Memorial built 1949-50. It's an interesting site off Copheap Lane; return to your car by following the lane and then climbing the Elm Hill road.

For this month's walk, take the very narrow path to the right of the Golf Club's entrance, which passes someone's

> garage. Be warned, the path is muddy and uneven for some distance, but once you're past the golf course grounds, it opens up to tractor-width and your choice of direction improves. There are wideopen fields to explore, by turning left at the end of the golf course, or by going straight

ahead. In late August, I found several

varieties of wild flowers and plants here I didn't know – and saw quite a few blue butterflies, too, but you won't see those in December! At one point a vole scurried away ahead of me.

Stay on the wide track, straight ahead of you from the end of the golf course, and you'll reach a large barn or whatever. There's a tarmacked road before it going right, down to the dead-end road of Elm Hill; when my husband and I brought the dogs here for walks - before 2003 - this road was

open and we parked beside the barn itself. The army closed the lane because people parked at the barn and let their dogs out of cars, to do their business – on what is army land, used for exercises. When we came here, army tents would sometimes be up and breakfasts cooking as we arrived. The dogs never understood why, however patiently they sat and waited, breakfast never came their way!

The views from Cradle Hill are wonderful. across to Battlesbury, Middle and Scratchbury Hills in the Salisbury direction, ahead to Westbury on the tractor-width track and, by walking left across the field from the barn, there are views to Upton Scudamore, Dilton Marsh and beyond. As the land is open, so is your choice of direction, making this a wonderful spot to wander. On Sunday mornings, my husband and the dogs would



park at the barn and walk to Westbury and back! I preferred to come here on clear and dry evenings and watch the sun set; it was a magical experience.

As with any walk on army land, obey all instructions such as red flags, cones and barriers. This is a walk I can't put a time or distance limit on – both are entirely up to you. Even if the army's firing on distant ranges,

this walk should leave you relaxed and at one with nature; it was always so with me. I lost count of the number of times I'd suddenly realise I was due at work in Frome in an hour!

When you've had your fill of mooching about, return to the barn - you should be able to find it easily enough, whatever way you go – and walk the bit of closed road beside it, down onto Elm Hill itself. Turn right there and follow the road, back to where your car should be. If you're doing this walk during the day and need facilities and sustenance (I always do!), when you're in your car, why not head for Warminster itself? I used a little French café by Cordens one day and thoroughly enjoyed a meal of mushroom stroganoff and basmati rice, a pot of tea and a plate of bread pudding with clotted cream. Oh yes, I cleared every dish!

## **Parish Council Briefing**

Councillor Tim Humphreys reports on the PC's latest activities

The Parish Council met at the village hall on 11th November with the following key points tabled and discussed.

An update is being prepared by the Parish Plan steering group against the initial draft of a community Emergency Plan, as presented at the October meeting.

The recently-issued joint letter with Maiden Bradley and Corsley Parish Councils concerning traffic weight limit through our respective villages has succeeded in securing a joint consultation meeting on 17th December with the Wiltshire Council cabinet member for Transport, Dr Mark McClelland.

The Wiltshire Council climate change and natural environment plan consultation period has now closed; Councillor Oakley will liaise with Wiltshire Council to seek their support in facilitating a community engagement session for practical measures to reduce our carbon footprint.

A draft letter by the PC has been discussed with Newland Homes, the developer at Barters Farm, expressing concerns over construction traffic travelling through the village from Frome direction - as opposed to directly off the A36 as pledged during the original planning consultation process. Mark Kurton has agreed to discuss concerns and possible solutions with the Newland Homes team.

With the first tranche of Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL) monies received in respect of the Barters Farm development, the Clerk will investigate further to establish the required protocol for project identification

Mark Kurton from Newland Homes joined the meeting to present an outline concept plan for a potential further (smaller) housing development at Barters Farm, to the eastern edge of the current site. They have been approached direct at this draft stage with the objective of holding an initial consultation to discuss the principle and opportunity for this brownfield site with the PC and community. In acknowledging this proactive approach by Newland Homes, there is some reservation over the potential for a creeping development going forward across the wider Barters Farm site.

The PC noted the consultation period was open until 14th November for the Wiltshire Council PCC survey, being advised as a major survey and consultation to shape the future of policing in Wiltshire.

Further to recent flooding concerns by a Clearwood view resident, Barters Farm were approached by the PC and were advised this had been a "one off" event due to exceptional rainfall, and that a culvert had been dug to prevent any future recurrence.

#### **Planning Applications**

PL2021/06379 Thoulstone Farm Conversion of existing farm outbuilding to create single residential (extended) dwelling.

This application was approved in full by Wiltshire Council, with the condition that Listed Building Consent would be required

since the outbuilding was deemed to fall within the curtilage of the grade II listed farmhouse complex.

#### Next meeting

The next PC meeting is scheduled for 7.30 pm on 9th December at the village hall (subject to any COVID-19 guidance/restrictions).

## **Xmas waste and recycling**

Waste and recycling collection dates will not change over the Christmas and New Year period, as waste collection crews will be working as normal on Bank Holidays Monday 27, Tuesday 28 December 2021, and Monday 3 January 2022.

Garden waste collections will stop for two weeks over this period as normal. The last collections will take place on Friday 24 December and they will restart on Monday 10 January 2022.

Residents can check their waste, recycling and garden waste collection online at wiltshire.gov.uk/WasteCollectionDays

Household recycling centre (HRC) opening times and dates will change over the Christmas and New Year period and residents are advised to check online before visiting an HRC at wiltshire.gov.uk/household-recyclingcentres

HRCs that normally open on Fridays will be open on Christmas Eve, 24 December from 10am but will close at 1pm. All HRCs will be closed on Saturday 25, Sunday 26 December and Saturday 1 January 2022. Other than on these dates, the centres will open as normal on their specified opening days.

#### Christmas recycling messages:

At Christmas time, many of us generate more waste than usual. We would like everyone to do their bit by recycling as much of their waste as possible. Our kerbside recycling collection service helps make this easy to do.

In addition to the everyday items people tend to recycle in their blue lidded bin and black box, people can add items including wrapping paper, providing it scrunches into a ball; cardboard packaging, plastic sweet tubs (up to 5 litres), mince pie foil cases, drinks cans, glass bottles, and Christmas cards without glitter. Local charity shops may be happy to receive donations of unwanted Christmas presents.

It is important that people do not place batteries or electrical items into any of their bins. These items can cause fires in collection vehicles or at waste processing and sorting facilities; please dispose of them at HRCs instead.

Households with extra recyclable materials such as cans, cardboard and paper can place these in suitable alternative containers alongside their bin for collection. Flatten cardboard and wash and squash plastic bottles and cartons and put the lids back on as this will help make more room in your blue-lidded bin.

#### Collection of real Christmas trees

People who pay to have their garden waste collected can put their real Christmas tree, alongside their garden waste bin on their first collection in January. We will collect your tree for composting, or they can support local charities by paying a small donation to have your tree collected via the Just Helping scheme at https://charityxmastreecollection. com/.





## **Countryside Matters**

From jabs to jolly japes on the footpaths

Well here we are at the end of a year when our biggest concern was how soon can we get our first then second and finally our booster jab! How grateful we should be to live in a country where the availability of our healthcare is free to all.

We mustn't forget that using the open countryside around us for exercise and leisure is also an important part of keeping ourselves physically and mentally fit. For the less able, there are signposted footpaths with kissing gates on level ground on a circular walk in Corsley, with wonderful extensive views.

Both our villages have many miles of footpaths which need to be used, or they'll become overgrown and no longer usable.

Sensible footwear and weatherproof clothing is necessary during the winter months, but the joy of getting away from busy lanes and roadways makes up for those extra minutes spent putting on suitable clothes. There's real joy in seeing children and dogs splashing in puddles and enjoying the rustle of leaves as they run and roll over in the woodlands.

Now that the leaves are no longer on the trees, the birds, squirrels, pheasants and deer are more easily seen and heard; the sheer beauty of the early morning mists rising opening up the countryside that surrounds us is astounding.

The farm work is mostly confined to caring for the cattle that are housed in the large barns; slurry removed from yards and walkways once or twice a day, feedstuffs weighed and mixed to suit their diet and wellbeing, and their medical needs seeing to.

Young stock wintering outside will be checked daily and moved onto fresh grass and silage or root crops.

The markets will be busy selling lambs for slaughter and fatstock and poultry prepared for Christmas livestock sales in time for the butchers to prepare your Christmas dinner.

If possible, do buy local fresh meat and vegetables whenever possible, this helps local producers and tradespeople and helps reduce our carbon footprint.

Have a wonderful Christmas with friends and family and do give a thought to those working and living in our countryside who will be working everyday over Christmas and New Year.


