



Corsley Parish Council

Parish Council Briefing

John Willcox, Parish Clerk, rounds up the PC's activity in September and November

Since the last report the Parish Council (PC) have met twice; on the 5th September and 7th November.

Planning

At the meeting on the 5th September the PC considered five planning applications:

PL/2022/05035 Replacement dwelling at Rose Cottage, Lyes Green, Corsley

It was agreed that the PC have no objection to the application but concern was expressed at the visual impact caused by the increased height and the significant amount of timber cladding on the road side of the dwelling.

PL/2022/05739 Proposed replacement of detached garage roof and addition of solar panels. (Resubmission of 20/09969/FUL) at Mews Cottage, 2 Knapps Gate, Corsley.

It was agreed that the PC support the application.

PL/2022/05948 Proposed Rear Extension & Alterations at 3, Birchwood Close, Corsley

It was agreed that the PC support the application.

PL//2022/06055 Proposed dormer extension, car port and workshop, driveway extension with associated works at 67A Lane End, Corsley

It was agreed that the PC support the application.

PL/2021/05441 Proposed Extension

(amended plans/additional information) at 1 Heathway, Corsley

It was agreed that the Parish Council have no objection providing that the back elevation is as described in Drawing No: 003_GA_018 of the revised plans dated 23rd August 2022.

It was reported that planning application **PL/2022/00665** – Longleat Safari Park, had been approved with conditions. The PC had objected to this application. Following discussion it was agreed that a representative of Longleat Estates be invited to attend the next meeting of the PC.

At the meeting on 7th November the PC considered two applications:

PL/2022/06522 Installation of 12 all-black solar photovoltaic (PV) panels to the south-facing roof of the garage at Temple Farm Barn, Temple, Corsley

The PC confirmed the recommendation that had been agreed following email consultation – No Objection.

PL/2022/07299 Proposed rear dormer windows to dwelling at 55 Dertford, Corsley The PC raised no objection to this application

It was reported that application **PL/022/01934**, land next to the development at Baytree Close, had been approved by Wiltshire Council. The Clerk reported that

the PC had the opportunity, if it so chose, to make a recommendation on the name of the development. It was agreed that the village should be made aware and suggestions sought. It was agreed that the village Facebook page be used to circulate the opportunity.

Villagers will know that there have been a number of meetings along with representatives of the villages of Maiden Bradley and Chapmanslade with officers of Wiltshire Council and Dr Andrew Murrison, our MP, to try and relieve the increasing levels of HGV traffic through the villages. The latest of the meetings took place on 2nd September, following a number of postponements of meetings since May. Unfortunately, and disappointingly from our perspective, the representatives were told that nothing had been done and it was unlikely that anything would happen before the next meeting, scheduled for December. Both our County Councillor and MP expressed their disappointment at the apparent lack of activity by the County Officials on what is an area of significant concern to the villages communities involved.

Following the meeting in September the representatives of the villages met to discuss how best to move the issue forward and agreed to write to Wiltshire Council to suggest that a Temporary Traffic Order (TRO) be implemented imposing 'temporary' lower weight limits on the three village roads in question with a view to measuring the impact of this. To date, no response has been received from Wiltshire Council. However, with the support of our Councillor (Bill Parks). The concerns of the villagers and suggested way forward was presented to the Warminster Area Board and the Council Leader on the 10th November. The TRO was fully supported by the Area Board and the Council Leader confirmed that he could see no problem with the suggestion and would

go back to his officials to understand why this could not be implemented quickly.

It was also reported that the seeming reluctance of Wiltshire Council to address traffic issues extended to their continued refusal to consider the proposed solution of a 40 mph limit throughout the length of the village on the A362, despite the sound arguments that have been put forward.

In addition, despite having approved funding for the installation of sockets for the Speed Indicator Devices (SIDs) at the White Hart and the Old Piggeries, Wiltshire officials have now advised that Road Traffic Speed surveys were required before installation could take place (on highways land) and these surveys were unlikely to be carried out before 2023. The Parish Council is speaking to land owners about installation on private land (as we have done in Corsley Heath) to get over this potential delay.

Rights of Way

An updated report on the Rights of Way throughout the parish was discussed. The state of the paths and bridleways and the kissing gates and styles was discussed and the recommendations for maintenance, repair and/or renewal approved.

Finance

The PC confirmed that they would continue the practice of making donations/grants to village-based organisations. See page 17 in this edition of The Bridge for details of the procedure to be followed and the deadline.

Notification was received from the external auditors, PKF Littlejohns that the accounts were approved.

At the meeting on 7th November the PC were pleased to welcome Jon Timney and Ben Short from Longleat. They explained that COVID and Storm Eunice had made for a very difficult few years for Longleat both commercially and environmentally. As a result they were reviewing their business *continued...* model which could mean that local residents would notice some changes e.g. one of the aims would be to try and 'flatten out' the visitor numbers, spread the numbers over more months. One of the things that had 'slid' was the ongoing contact with the PC, which they were keen to maintain and, which had probably contributed to the concerns about the planning application for the safari 'tents' at Knapps Gate. Also, they were going to review the parking arrangements at Heavens Gate and Shearwater.

Bus Stop

Villagers will not have failed to notice the new bus stop at Corsley Heath. It has been commented that it is a considerable improvement over the previous incarnation, which needed to be removed as it was unsafe due to tree root damage.

The building itself is considerably more robust being double thickness and now has seating at both ends (made with ash from Corsley School). The shelter also now benefits from having solar powered lighting, which we hope will make people feel safer during the dark winter months. We have also designed and built the shelter to be bird and bat friendly.

Whilst the Parish Council has paid for the new shelter we wanted to thank a number of businesses and individuals who have supported us. Firstly, thank you to both Graham and Roy (aka Ped) for doing such an amazing job building it, John White and Acres for all their help with demolition as well as providing and storage of materials. Olly Hares for the amazing roof tiles and Jason at Premier Installations for the windows and finally Garth at Nunney Saw mills for providing the oak.

November news

Patricia Sharrocks rounds up the November meeting

thew INSPIRING WOMEN

In November, members of Corsley WI took to the road, headed over the border into Somerset, and met in Frome! We visited The Still Sisters Gin Distillery to learn a little about how the business began and how gin is produced. Some members and their guests enjoyed sampling the end product, while others stuck to the more traditional WI tipples – tea and coffee!

The roots of Still Sisters gin goes back to 1996 when four local businessmen set up Friary drinks at Witham Friary, producing liqueurs. That business continues with the daughters of one of them: Hannah is the mistress distiller while Tori focuses on creating their logos and marketing the brand. Still Sisters Gin has developed as a secondary business. In early 2020, they moved to designated premises in Frome where the gin is made, bottled and sold.

The key ingredient in gin is juniper to which other base ingredients such as coriander, orange peel, cloves or lemongrass are added. Less common base ingredients include angelica and liquorice root. These are steeped in alcohol for 24-48 hours to produce a London Dry Gin which is used as the basis of the gins produced by the Still Sisters.

Any herb or flavouring can be added to the London Dry Gin. The Still Sisters use local botanicals to create their gins. The first gin they produced was watercress gin which is made using watercress grown at Longbridge Deverill. Besides this signature gin they also make lavender gin using Whitbourne lavender, rose and hibiscus, watercress and citrus flow, Somerset cider apple gin and a Christmas gin. All the botanicals used are sourced locally.

At the heart of the business is a gleaming 50 litre still. Apparently all stills have a name, and this one is called 'Storm'. From this still 150-250 litres of gin can be produced at one time, although Storm was having the night off when we visited. The process begins with 96% proof alcohol to which reversed (pure) water is added. The base botanicals are steeped in this liquid before it is heated and the alcohol begins to evaporate, then cooled, resulting in a very concentrated gin which is later diluted.

After adding the local botanicals the gin is bottled on site in beautifully-designed bottles with artwork by Louise Collis. The Still Sisters are currently very busy producing gin for the Christmas season as they prepare for stalls at various Christmas Markets, including Bath. They are also topping up their in-house supplies for those who may pop along to their premises in Frome as part of their local Christmas shopping.

All in all, it was a thoroughly enjoyable and informative evening, and I'm sure many of us will head back there for gifts, or just to treat ourselves, in the future.

Wonderful Walks

Destination – Dorset!



Let's change counties for December's walk! Use the A350 from Warminster towards Shaftesbury and look for the right turn to Motcombe, after the East Knoyle bypass. The village is two or three miles off the A350, but once there, find the village Post Office and Stores on the right of the main street and park somewhere near; I turn on a side street and park near the shop. From there, walk the

pavement a few yards right and find a lane on your right, with the sign: 'Shorts Green Lane, leading to Frog Lane and Shorts Green Courtyard'. Head that way, past a railed path on the right to houses, beside a black bin. There's no pavement from here and regular vehicles use the lane, but I was safe. Shorts Green Courtyard is next on your left and then there are redbrick houses on both sides of the road. I suspect these are, or were, 'estate' houses, as the design is uniform, semidetached gabled fronts with a small stone date-block set high up the wall; I managed to decipher the year 1924.

Eventually, there's a bend in the road and the houses cease; you're out in the country now, though the landscape still has that 'estate' feel. Keep walking and a big farm will come into view on the left, though I couldn't find a name-plate for it. Between the red-brick farm buildings, there's a concreted yard – and a bridlepath sign points that way. Stay with

the road, however, and on the right side, plonked against a hedge, is a 'Welcome to Motcombe' sign-board, a strange place for such important information! It seems the village is one of the largest parishes in North Dorset and has twenty miles of public footpaths and bridleways. At one time, most of Motcombe was owned by the Dukes of Westminster and a Lord Stalbridge



owned Motcombe House, now a private school at the far end of the village, towards Gillngham.

Walking on, you'll pass a new red-brick house on the right, Sir Sidney Brooke House and, after that and a gentle climb uphill, emerge from Frog Lane onto something approaching a main road. Traffic becomes more frequent and faster here, despite the speed-notifying machine and a definite 30 mph speed

limit, with a sign stating 'Caught? No excuses'. Along the right-hand side of the road is a row of red-brick-and-stone houses; these may be houses mentioned on the earlier sign-board as belonging to the Dukes of Westminster. Keep walking, past cream-coloured Brook House and a black sign, high on the wall of a house on the left side of the road, stating that there's no footpath through to the field beyond the house.

You should soon reach a three-way junction; turn right here, where a sign in the hedge opposite points the way to the village shop. Cross this road carefully, as 30mph didn't feel like the speed most traffic did as it passed me!

You're heading for the village shop now, but somewhere on this left-hand side of the road you'll soon see a tarmacked footpath, called 'Church Walk'. Go that way and visit the church; see if you can spot the Dukes of Westminster graves; churches are always worth a visit, anyway! When you've explored both church and grounds, look at the lovely school



building next door and the sign on the wall for motorists – no idling! After that, use Church Walk and return to Motcombe's main thoroughfare, called 'The Street'. Turn left, keep walking and the Village Hall and War Memorial are on the right, with a play park beyond. In the hedge here on the left, there's a milepost for Shaftesbury, two miles, and Mere, five-and-a-half miles.

Pass Forge Cottage on your left and the Village Shop and Post Office come into view ahead. After three miles walking, I needed facilities and sustenance and was allowed to use the facilities here, as I declared a need for food and drink! There's an under-cover area in front of the shop, with tables and chairs, so I sat there and enjoyed a snack lunch and mug of tea. Looking round the shop later, I found a range of vegan offerings, perfect for my grand-daughter, whose nine-monthold daughter has a milk allergy; Mum's become vegan, to cure the baby's problem! Here



I found 'Free and Easy' vegan cake mixes, intended for big brother and sister to 'cook' when they're bored, but Mum tells me she and Daddy cooked the Brownies version last night and scoffed half themselves!

They are raising money to provide state of the art radio therapy equipment that will revolutionise the treatment of patients at the Bath RUH Cancer Unit.

The idea for this jolly fundraiser originated with the Corsley Book Club. As one of their members, Lisa Tolson, the Radiotherapy Service Manager at the RUH, explained "The current challenge is for this charity to raise £580,000 to purchase surface guided radiotherapy technology (SGRT) systems. Surface-guided radiotherapy can track a patient's position with pinpoint accuracy during treatment. This helps to ensure that radiation reaches exactly the right place while avoiding vital organs."

Countryside Matters

Here we are the end of another year, with the weather and war in Ukraine affecting us all in so many ways

Due to the mild weather in Europe in the autumn we are still seeing birds flying in from Scandinavia, Iceland and Russia, where the freezing conditions push the birds south to warmer climes and better feeding conditions. Redwings, fieldfares, bramblings, snowbuntings, snipe,woodcock, gold crests and short eared owls are still arriving. Since developers began planting trees and shrubs on new roads, motorways and even supermarket car parks; rowan, hawthorn, blackthorn, fruit trees and wild roses all produce food in the form of berries for hungry wax wings, siskins and crimson tipped redpolls which we would have rarely seen in such public areas 20 years ago. Sadly, the joy of seeing these migrating birds has also increased the losses of our own native birds through Avian Influenza. It is now compulsory that all domestic fowl, ducks, geese and turkeys are kept indoors but, sadly, our own wild birds in some areas have been decimated in numbers and poultry farmers are having to slaughter thousands of stock if they become infected.

Poultry farmers are also finding the cost of foodstuffs imported from Ukraine is pushing up their costs, so your Christmas dinner of chicken, turkey or goose is likely to cost more. The price and availability of eggs is also a concern, due to the increased cost of feed stuffs when housed indoors, along with the extra heating and lighting costs. Sadly, the supermarkets are once again increasing prices of these products over and above what they are paying the producers and even buying in eggs from countries such as Italy where animal husbandry in some cases is nowhere near the standard of care as here in the UK - and what about the air miles? Please do check where your fresh, farm produced food is coming from.

If you fancy a change from poultry, why not treat your family to beef this year? The Christmas Fatstock Show at Frome Market will be selling the finest animals, produced by West Country farmers and bought by local butchers for you to enjoy at this festive time.

In the last few weeks our weather has changed back to the norm of grey, windy and wet weather; thankfully the storms in our area have been far less disruptive than some parts of the UK.

With Christmas drawing near, do remember that stock farmers, producers of fresh dairy products, vegetables growers, etc., are working all hours to supply us with our fabulous UKproduced food that we take for granted.

If you want to use holly with berries to decorate your homes, cut it early and keep it in a shed before the wild birds descend and devour the lot – this year there are plenty of berries for us all to share!
