

After 15 years as Parish Clerk Sally Evans will be relinquishing the position at the end of April and we need someone to replace her.

The main duties of the clerk are to deal with the general administration of Council business including, in consultation with the Chairman, arranging meetings and agreeing the agendas, taking minutes of the meetings, dealing with correspondence from Wiltshire Council, members of the public etc., and preparing the Parish accounts.

The workload fluctuates but on average will not amount to more than 2-3 hours a week and the current salary is £1100 a year. Any one interested in applying would need to have access to the internet and be prepared to attend evening meetings at the Reading Rooms, usually no more than nine a year.

This is an important position for the functioning of the Parish Council and would be of interest to any one who would like to become more involved in the work of the parish.

Corsley WI January News

the WILLIAM INSPIRING WOMEN

Dairy Farming around the World was the title of the talk given by local dairy farmer David Helliar at the January meeting of Corsley WI.

David's dairy farm started over twenty years ago with a herd of 120 cows which has now grown to 400 and he was fortunate to be given an award last year through the Nuffield Farming Scholarship Trust to go overseas to learn about farming in other countries. Members and visitors enjoyed hearing about David's visits to Wisconsin, Tasmania, New Zealand and Chile during

his educational travels. David told us that in Wisconsin, the average herd consists of 100 cows, bigger units have 400 but some are very large with 2000 cows which are kept inside all year. By using an innovative rotary milking system, 80 cows can be milked at once with very little manpower. In New Zealand where cows are kept outside they may need to walk long distances from their grazing to the milking parlours, up to 1.5km each way, twice a day, so the herd



needs to be no bigger than about 900 with dairy buildings in the centre of the farm for convenience.

Extremes of temperatures are challenging conditions for dairy farmers and mean that cows are usually kept in barns, with or without covered sides, sometimes all year round, under shelter from either burning sun or freezing cold or wet weather depending on the climate. David showed us his pictures of the various farms and surrounding







Three Open Doors

The Rector writes:

February sees the beginning of Lent, the period of the Church's year that leads up to Easter. For many these days, this is of little significance save for the tradition of eating pancakes on Shrove Tuesday, the day before Lent begins. As Lent was a time of penitence and fasting, food that couldn't be stored, had to be used before the season began. It is interesting fact, but one often forgotten, that much of our cultural heritage has its roots in Christianity. How far those connections are recognised or relevant today is a subject worthy of debate!

Lent, so called because of the lengthening of the days, was observed as a time of preparation for the great festival of Easter. There was a deliberately penitential feel to the forty days, which were used by Christians to examine their relationship with God and neighbour and where necessary to do something about any shortcomings. Often, there was an emphasis on 'giving something up' so that others less fortunate might benefit. Alternatively, in recent years, the focus has shifted to 'taking something on' so that others might benefit. The weeks of Lent have traditionally been used to give attention to our relationship with God through study and prayer, either individually or with others.

I encourage you to consider attending the Lent Talks, groups or Lunches that will take place across the benefice. Our shared fellowship on such occasions is an important aspect of our journeying together as we prepare for Easter. You may like to set aside a time for reading or reflection - there is a wealth of helpful material to choose from! It is good to make something about the season of Lent different from the rest of the year.

May the weeks of Lent, however you mark them, be good preparation for Easter!

February fill dyke. Be it black or be it white...

Countryside Matters

"February fill dyke" – a country saying suggesting rain fills up the ditches, but as we seem to have had rain since April/May 2012, I think it's time that the rain stopped!

As I write this on 17th January, we are threatened with up to 10" of snow in the next 24 hours. Certainly some parts of the UK have already had plenty, especially the North East of England. (We didn't have quite that much, but it was enough! Ed).

Most of the cattle are indoors now. Some of the large covered silage bays have been emptied and make comfortable loose housing for cows.

Farmers with sheep due to lamb will also have moved their livestock indoors. Here they can check that the ewes are well and the lambs born where there is light and cover can be cared for much more easily.

Bad weather, especially snow, causes many headaches in the countryside. The safety of children getting to school, people getting to work and shops, and important gatherings such as weddings, funerals and medical appointments are all made more problematic. On farms we need to make sure the diesel is delivered to keep machinery moving; we also need regular deliveries of foodstuffs, sand and sawdust for bedding; and, of course, the daily collection of milk by the tankers.

Keeping the lanes free of snow to enable transport to move reasonably freely is the responsibility of the local Highways Authority, but the task often falls to local farmers to help with clearing lanes when the Authority is looking after the major roads.

February usually brings us the cheer of snowdrops flowering freely on the verges and footpaths. So do get out and enjoy this local spectacle while it lasts.

The wildlife with which we share our countryside suffers greatly in bad weather: snow and ice prevent access to food and water, just at the time when they need to eat more just to keep warm. If you don't already feed the birds, please do consider doing so this winter; water is also needed. In return you'll have the enjoyment of both watching the birds and knowing that you're helping them to survive.

The snow will have brought in Fieldfare and Redwing and the smaller species such as Lesser Redpoll and Siskin alongside the more familiar Greenfinch and Goldfinch. Waterways will attract Goosander, and Kingfisher will be more visible as they hunt all day for fish. However, in bad weather almost anything can turn up, so do watch out for any unusual species.

I am considering starting monthly walks around our two villages again, using public footpaths. If anyone new to the villages enjoys walking and would like to get to know where they can walk safely, do come and join us. We will start in April with walks of between one and 1½ hours. I will welcome suggestions as to which days and times would be most suitable.

Winter was truly upon us at the end of January!

A garden of snow

Helpful tips to ensure your garden isn't ruined by the worst of the winter weather...

With all the snow we had in January our gardens would have taken the full brunt of the weather. This is good news for some plants and bad news for others. Snow protects perennial plants that have retreated underground from harsh temperatures. It suits bulbs too – they generally welcome the snow melt once better weather arrives.

Evergreen plants, although fine under fresh powdery snow, can be damaged by the sheer weight of wet snow once a thaw sets in. You can either knock snow off as soon as it arrives or remove it with a gentle push once you sense a thaw setting in.

Conifers or hedges may become misshapen under the weight of snow, but if you bind them up with garden twine and canes, left in place for three to six months, you can reshape them.

Once the weather improves check all evergreen shrubs and trees and remove any damaged branches.

Flimsy garden structures such as fruit cages often bear the brunt of heavy snowfall. Ideally, overhead nets should have been removed in late autumn - but often aren't. Shake off any accumulated snow and store the nets.

Avoid pruning, watering or feeding plants at this time of year. Dormancy protects them from the elements, so encouraging fresh growth is not helpful.

Research suggests it is no longer necessary to break the ice on many ponds. However, ponds in which fish are kept or that have a large build-up of sediment or leaves do need oxygen. For these, continue to run water features to keep a section ice free and the water circulating.

To avoid bird baths freezing, insulate the bottom with bubble wrap or similar and replace the water regularly.



Rainfall for 2012 in Corsley

The rainfall is read daily at 'Hill Rising' (0900 in winter and 1000 during summer time) and the measurements are forwarded at the end of each month to the Environment Agency (Southwest Region) and on to the Met Office. The Environment Agency uses the readings for flood defence operations and general water resource management. The Met Office uses them to record the climate of the UK for future generations.

2012 has been the second wettest year in Corsley since I started reading the rainfall in 1992. 45.72 inches were recorded in 2000. Corsley lies in a 'Rain Shadow'; you may well find it is sometimes raining in Frome or Warminster but dry here!

Community First has joined together with other Rural Community Councils to form part of an oil buying syndicate across the whole of England.

Are you interested in cheaper heating oil?

Following up the article on page 25 of last month's Bridge, could I remind anyone who might be interested in joining a local group of the Community First oil buying scheme to let me know.

In case you missed it I will briefly repeat the gist of the scheme: Community First has joined together with other Rural Community Councils to form part of an oil buying syndicate across the whole of England. They report that members are currently seeing significant savings on their heating bills. There is an annual membership fee of £20, which you should get back on your first order.

Ordering is simple. Once a month members receive an email from the village organiser reminding them of the next oil order date and the deadline for when orders need to be received at the CF Oil offices. Those not on email receive a telephone call asking if they need to order oil. The CF negotiators negotiate the best possible price



on the given day. Members will then be paying the oil supplier directly after receiving an invoice from them.





Ring the changes with

Campanology News



December was naturally a busy time for the bell ringers with all the carol services and, of course, midnight mass at the Minster Church of St Denys, Warminster, on Christmas Eve, where some of St Margaret's ringers joined the Minster band.

We rang at all the Christmas services at Corsley including, I am thrilled to say, both the early services. There were only 4 of us but we were ringing!

On Friday 30th of November, Corsley ringers rang at the Minster for the service to celebrate the return of the 3rd Battalion, Yorkshire Regiment from Afghanistan, to commemorate those who did not return and to mark the awarding of the Freedom of Warminster to the battalion. No doubt some of you watched the parade through Warminster to the Minster. The service was followed by a peal of 'Yorkshire Surprise Major' rung in honour of the occasion by a band of ringers from the Salisbury Diocesan Guild of Ringers.

A peal consists of a 'method', in this case 'Yorkshire Surprise Major' involving a change in the position of all eight bells in the ringing order 5088 times (in maths terms 8 factorial) without any repeat in the order. A conductor calls the various changes whilst also ringing one of the bells. This peal took 3 hours 20 minutes; a mammoth feat of concentration and dedication by both the conductor and the ringers.

I must also mention the celebration of the 80th birthday and Golden Wedding Anniversary of Dave Marsh. Dave is one of the Minster ringers who has supported St Margaret's tower for well over 30 years and continues to do so for which we are most grateful. Many congratulations Dave and Vera and our good wishes for the future.

A dream coming true

Juba Diocesan Secondary School 2013

From a standing start the Secondary School in Juba, which opened with 70 students in 2007, now has 450 on the roll. People in Corsley and Chapmanslade have played a significant part in this miracle, helping to provide clean water, an electrical generator, microscopes, etc. Margaret Askew recently wrote an article for 'The Bridge' about the 100 bursaries that are provided, giving orphans and children from low-income families the life-changing opportunity of secondary education. Coming bottom of the world league table in education South Sudan has a mountain to climb. At present

only 1,200 boys and 400 girls are taking the School Certificate annually out of a population of 10 million (UNESCO Report June 2011). This new nation desperately needs accomplished men and women to become part of the

professional class; doctors, engineers, lawyers accountants, teachers, etc.

So Hard on the Girls

Young girls in South Sudan face extreme disadvantages. They are less likely to enter school and more likely to drop out. They are three times more likely to die in childbirth than to complete primary education (UNESCO Report). This means that rape and early marriage prevent girls enjoying a wider and more fulfilled life. There are two guiding principles at the school to promote gender equality. One is to have an equal number of girls and boys - 48% girls at

present, nearly achieved. The other is to provide a boarding house for the girls. The students, parents and local community all feel

strongly that this is essential, since girls, many of whom walk over 4 miles to school, are sometimes molested. Furthermore, in a culture where girls do all the chores at home they will be free to concentrate on their studies. (There has yet to have been a girl come top in the School Certificate.)

D-Day for the Boarding House

A two-story building, designed jointly by an architect in Canterbury and one in Juba, will accommodate 50 boarders. Construction

was completed in mid-January this year, in time for the first intake of between 12 and 20 girls on 1st February. A Matron and Cook have been appointed. The only female teacher on the School staff, (due to the lack of qualified females) is a young lady called

Charity – she teaches English and will sleep in the House and be in charge.

Dog Eats Chocolates!

The whole project is costing about £190,000 of which £110,000 has so far been donated in amounts large and small including a generous gift from Australia. Margaret Griffin was in Juba last month helping with the setting-up arrangements. Bunk beds cost £30, 2 sheets and a pillow £10, and a mosquito net £5. Rosalyn and I were given a large box of Thornton's chocolates at Christmas time and one young person in the parish enthusiastically agreed to raffle this box to raise funds for



Counselling – who's the expert?

Caroline Le Vine - Counsellor in Corsley

A client comes to see me because they are unhappy or need help with

something. Why come to me? Because I can fix it for them? We're all very different people with different backgrounds, goals and values. Because of this, I can't know what's right for anyone else and I never claim to.

So what do I do, then? If you've read some of my articles before, you'll probably know that I listen and use all my training and energy to empathise and deeply understand how my client experiences their life and how they feel about it. How does that help? In a number of ways: it allows you time out to really focus on you; just being listened to in this way has a healing and energising power; it can put you in touch with a part of you (likely buried or unheard) that knows what's best for you.

I believe that deep inside every one of us lie all the answers we need. The tricky bit is finding them and, often, acting on them as they can be the answers we least want to hear. Some years ago, I was in a relationship that wasn't healthy for me. I knew in my gut that I had to leave it and I remember vividly dismissing that knowledge which was bubbling up inside me because I was too frightened to act on what I instinctively knew was right. When I finally made the break, I was still afraid but I knew that I'd done the right thing for me and my inner voice was satisfied.

Counselling can help us to make contact with our own expertise and to trust it even when the action it suggests is the terrifying. Being listened to (and really heard) and having someone doing all they can to understand you and to come with you into the heart of who you really are and to discover what you really need can allow you to recognise your own wisdom. The point is that counselling is collaborative. I don't do it to you. We do it together and you find your answers.




