



## What is cancer immunotherapy?

This month sees World Cancer Day and there are reasons to celebrate...



Last October James Allison and Tasuku Honjo were awarded the 2018 Nobel Prize in Physiology or Medicine for their work on using the body's immune system to fight cancer. This is known as cancer immunotherapy.

Most people are aware of how unpleasant the traditional treatments of cancer can be, with radiotherapy and chemotherapy often giving considerable side effects. They damage normal cells as well as cancer cells and may lead to hair loss and severe nausea. These treatments are still necessary, as is surgery for solid tumours, and they work well in many cases, but some cancers are very difficult to treat by these methods.

Simply put, a cancer cell is a normal cell that has undergone a genetic change so that it divides more rapidly and forms a solid tumour or a disseminated cancer. Because it is derived from a normal cell, it may not be recognised by the immune system as 'foreign', in the same way an infecting virus or bacterium would be. Even if its surface properties change, and it could be recognised as foreign, some cancers have mechanisms to evade the immune system.

What cancer immunotherapy does is stimulate the immune system to recognise and kill the cancer cells, but not act on normal cells. It may also 'train' the immune

system to recognise cancer cells in future (in a similar way to immunisation), thus providing long-term protection. Last month a scientific paper suggested that the patients most likely to benefit from immunotherapy are those whose cancers have multiple genetic changes and which are therefore more likely to be recognised as foreign.

There are different types of cancer immunotherapy. Specific antibodies can be injected which bind to the cancer cells and mark them for attack by the immune system. Several types of cancer have been treated in this way and about a dozen such antibodies have been approved for clinical use. In another immunotherapy, white blood cells are taken from a patient, modified to recognise cancer cells and put back into the patient to attack the tumours. A third treatment is to use a class of proteins known as cytokines, to stimulate and coordinate the immune system, enhancing the anti-tumour activity of the immune response. This has been successful in treating melanoma, one of the most common types of cancer.

Cancer immunotherapy is a very promising treatment, and there is a large number of different clinical trials being run at present to identify new therapeutic agents. Some of these will be specific to a few individuals with a certain genetic make-up,

but others should work for most people. Many of the trials are combination therapies of two different drugs.

However, there are some risks. The obvious one is that the treatment does not work – but this applies to all cancer treatments. You may also get a bad reaction to the therapeutic agent and there have been side effects, including kidney failure and luna problems.

Immunotherapy is a promising treatment for cancer. Even if only a small proportion of the current clinical trials are successful they will add considerably to the armoury of treatments for the many types of cancer we could experience. The 2018 Nobel Prize was the first ever given for a cancer treatment and is very well-deserved.

## Campanology News

This last year has been very busy in more ways than one. We have entered Branch and Guild Novice competitions, coming second in both, we have gained six new learners, all of whom are coming along wonderfully, and we have started on the work for the refurbishment. Through everyone's generosity and hard work we now have the money we need for this work to take place. Thank you!

In July, the lightest bell, the treble 0.74m (29") in diameter weighing 249 kg, was removed and sent away to Norfolk for welding. It was found to be more damaged than first believed and almost the whole crown was cut out and rebuilt From 4th February the remaining five bells of varying sizes and weights up to the largest, the tenor, which is 1.07m (42") in diameter and weighs 614 kg, are being removed and transported to Chilcompton for the refurbishment work required and to be retuned and work to the frame carried out. I anticipate that this will take several days, a sight vary rarely to be seen.

That is the good news. The bad news is that we will be without bells for six to eight weeks whilst the work is being carried out. It will, however, give us the opportunity to thoroughly clean the ringing and bell chambers, paint the frame to give long term protection against rust, etc., brighten up the ringing chamber and reorganise the many photographs and certificates therein.

Once the bells are rehuna, a rededication service will be held and we anticipate the bells being easier to ring well and give a much improved sound.



## **Parish Council Briefing**

Chairman, Neil Britten, rounds up the PC's activity in January

As normal, January is a guiet month in the PC calendar with no PC meetings. However, there has been dialogue on two subjects, the potential new Bay Tree Close development and, to a lesser degree, the case for Speedwatch. These are reported below, together with the decisions the more significant planning applications from those considered on 3rd December

#### Planning applications

#### 18/09853/FUL

Change of use from car sales to B1 offices and light industrial at Cavallino Garage, Corslev Heath

Approved with standard conditions.

#### 18/10388/FUL

Retrospective application for change of use to domestic curtilage with vehicle access at Deerleap, 112 The Hollow.

The application was refused. Wiltshire considered that the development would "..represent an unsustainable form of development that does not accord with the settlement strategy and delivery strategy set out on Core Policies 1 and 2 of the Wiltshire Core Strategy (WCS)". Further, it was "..assessed that no sufficient material considerations have been presented by the agent to merit concluding that this is anything other than an unsustainable form of development, contrary to the objectives

of the WCS and National Planning Policy Framework"

#### 18/10870/FUL

Construction of a detached garage to front of property at Birchwood Lodge, Corsley Heath

Approved with standard conditions.

#### **Speedwatch**

I reported last month that the PC had written to the new Deputy Police Commissioner, Jerry Herbert, who had promised, personally, to ensure that our case for a Speedwatch got some attention from the police. The PC has now received his response, by email. Sadly it was not as helpful as it might have been and did not answer the main point of the PC's case. As advised by Wiltshire, this was that the last traffic survey was so close to the trigger point to allow a Speedwatch, i.e. 85th percentile speed of 44.3mph against the requirement of 46.1 mph, that the police were very likely to agree to allow a Speedwatch, particularly when the results were taken together with other factors, such as the continuing increase in traffic volumes. The only direct response from Wiltshire Police was that "..the force was planning to look at Community Speedwatch in the New Year, to ensure that they were targeting the areas most in need "

However, the response did remind the PC that, since 12 months had passed since the last traffic survey, we were eligible for a new 'Metro Count' and this was somethina that the PC could arrange directly with Wiltshire. A suitable response to Wiltshire Police will be agreed at the next PC meeting (see below) pressing, once again, our case for Speedwatch, with a separate approach to Wiltshire on a new traffic survey. Careful consideration will be given to the location of the recording devices for such a count.

#### **Bay Tree Close further development**

Representatives of the PC (Chair and Clerk) had a very productive and informative meeting with Wiltshire officers responsible for the new affordable housing initiative in Wiltshire. As is now well known, the Bay Tree site is Wiltshire owned and is classified as a "Rural Exception Site", just outside the Corslev settlement boundary, i.e. the area within which there is a very small planned housing development allocation under Wiltshire's core policies. Planning policy for exception sites allows Wiltshire to build "affordable" housing (Council rented) on such sites, occupancy controlled by the rules of the Housing Register and Homes4Witshire. As a result of the recent Government announcements, Wiltshire plan to build 49 such homes spread over their 16 sites in Wiltshire, including Bay Tree. Two key conditions of the associated policy and any plan to build on these sites are that there must be clear support from the local community and that there must be a genuine local need.

To fulfil these requirements two initiatives are planned, subject to PC approval at the next meeting. First, two officers from Wiltshire have gareed to come to the APM to explain the proposals and gauge village support, Second, there will be a new Housing Needs Survey commissioned this

spring. The latter will address the needs for both affordable (Council rented) housing and open market housing.

#### **Annual Parish Meeting**

The APM will be held at a date yet to be confirmed, in the first two weeks of March. As indicated above, Project Officers for the Affordable Housing project will attend to present the new Bay Tree proposals and should also be able to field more general questions on planning development in Corsley. In addition, we have invited Longleat to field their new CEO, or at least a Senior Manager, to give us an update on their plans now that the previous CEO has moved on. They have accepted the invitation but, at the time of writing, Viscount Weymouth has not been available to confirm names/dates. As soon as this is known, a notice will be put up on The Bridge website and village noticeboards.

## **Seven Open Doors**

Dear Friends,

I can't believe I am writing the February letter already!

I spent this last weekend on a wonderful course called 'Guts and Gaia' exploring the healthy connections between the bacteria within our bodies and the bacteria within the earth. I had great fun learning simple fermentation techniques to make foods that promote good gut health and overall wellbeing. It was an incredibly joyous and inspiring time and I now have a jar of sauerkraut and a jar of kimchi fermenting away in my kitchen, two beautiful sour dough loaves in the bread bin, and some very pungent sour dough starter in the fridge. I have to be very careful in opening the sauerkraut jar as you can literally see the contents bubbling as the bacteria do their amazing work of fermentation. I've known for a long while how important it is for our own gut health to eat fermented foods but I've not made them before; I must say nature is so very clever at providing us with the means to nurture our own health with something so mysteriously alive and active

I'm no scientist but we did have some theoretical input about bacteria and how vital it is in maintaining balance within the earth and within out bodies. And this remarkable and mysterious biological process has been happening since the birth of time and still goes on unnoticed and largely unacknowledged; like so much of the working of the natural world we are oblivious to that which we cannot see or quantify. The first miraculous snowdrops are emerging as I write, we marvel at them because it seems almost impossible that in the dead of winter such delicate and beautiful plants can emerge out of the cold dark earth. Of course nature has been doing her work under the soil, life and change and growth have never stopped it's just that we cannot see it.

Looking at hugely magnified slides of bacteria I was humbled and awestruck at the interconnectedness of all things and how the natural world works in harmony for the good of the created order. Tragically, it is we human beings who have come along and broken this harmony with our greed and self - centeredness. But more than this, I felt a deep sense of wonder at the mystery of life and the mystery of the divine presence who is at the heart of all things and who is not disconnected from our world but rather animates every living thing; all time, all life, all the mysterious 'being' of the universe, all the complex patterns in nature are held within the beating heart of God.

So, wrap up warm and go and find some snowdrops and give thanks for the gifts, seen and unseen, that Mother Nature so generously and wonderfully shares with us.





## **Chapmanslade Parish Council**

## Parish Council Briefing

Notes from the Parish Council meeting held on 10th January

This meeting transpired to be one of our longest meetings. The meeting was opened to the public for discussions on any matter of concern and the following issues were raised:

#### Planning applications

The ATT gasification incinerator planning application at Northacre Park in Westbury.

A passionate discussion but the major concern for Chapmanslade residents was that the emissions from the 75m high stack are in a direct line and a similar elevation to housing in Short Street. Other concerns with this project were raised.

## A36 road safety

Following the tragic fatal accident at Black Dog Hill there was a discussion about the A36 and safety. The meeting was asked by the Chairman to be cautious in discussing this accident as we are not party to any details as to the cause of this awful accident.

## Speed control

Praise was offered for the installation of the Speed Indication Device following the grant from Wiltshire Council for 50% of the cost. It was suggested that the 30mph speed limit should be extended at the west end of the village so that all the housing in Chapmanslade was covered by the 30mph limit

#### Website

The new village website is now available but there is development work still to be do.

#### Communication

There was a guestion about communication but this was referred to the agenda item on the Parish Plan.

#### Closed session

The meeting went into the closed session and approved the minutes of the last PC meeting. The PC then discussed the following issues:-

#### **Parish Plan**

There was a lengthy presentation and discussion of the draft of the Parish Plan. It was gareed that it was essential to keep up the momentum on this subject and agreed that the PC will agree the draft at the next meeting and then the Parish Plan can be put into the public domain. There will then be a village meeting to present the Parish Plan as soon as can be arranged.

## **Church activity**

It was noted that Ian Buick on behalf of the Parochial Church Council wished to address the PC about the activity of the church within the community. It was agreed that this would now take place at the next PC meeting.

#### **PC** finance

There was a discussion on the PC finances and it was gareed that there would be an increase in the precept for 2019/20. It was agreed that prior to discussions for the 2020/21 precept we would arrange for a meeting to discuss the financial requirements in more detail. As part of these discussions there was some concern about the regulations for the use of the SID and it was agreed to raise our concerns with our WC councillor

#### Correspondence

In correspondence there were three items. The first was a request to approve the request for double yellow lines in the section of High Street by the two new houses in the Old Orchard. It was pointed out that the PC had objected most strongly to the planning application for the two houses on the basis that the access was quite unsatisfactory. There was no support for double yellow lines as all this would do would move the problem of parked cars to somewhere else in the village. The regulations for yellow lines would sterilise a quite unacceptable length of High Street for parking. It was also pointed out that many other locations in the village experienced serious difficulties with egressing side roads onto the High Street. The council agreed not to proceed with the application for double yellow lines.

The next item was the gasification plant in Westbury. After much discussion it was agreed that the PC would object to plans having been made aware of the many concerns.

Lastly there was discussion about the A36 in the Black Dog Hill area. There are genuine concerns about this section of three lane highway and its poor accident record. It was agreed to await the outcome of the investigation into the latest fatal accident so that any request for review will be an informed request.

There was a discussion on the consultation for the Spatial Plan for Housing. As there are many documents to review it was gareed that councillors would send in their comments to the Clerk for onward submission to WC.

The PC felt unable to discuss planning application 18/11455/FUL as some councillors had been unable to view the documents on the Wiltshire Council website The Clerk was to seek an extension to the deadline for comment

#### **Next meeting**

The next meeting of the PC is scheduled for 7th February and will again be held in the church as the village pantomine will be in full swing!!

Using this data we can predict what figure is the average that should be reported in a specific month, and what are the higher and lower parameters that we may expect. Figures outside of these parameters are classed as 'Crime Exceptions'.

#### December 2018 data

December 2018 showed a total of 126 crimes for the whole Warminster Area Board region against the average of 116.6 for this same month over the last 2 years. This is within the parameters we would reasonably expect. There are no exceptions within the data.

## **Warminster Rural and Villages Beat**

December 2018 showed a total of 39 crimes for the ER12 area against the average of 39 for this same month over the last 2 years. There are no exceptions within the data

The 5 largest crime groups accounted for 92% of this recorded crime as follows;

- Violence Against the person showed 11 crimes compared to the average of 9.1
- Burglary showed 8 crimes compared to the average of 6.1
- Theft showed 6 crimes compared to the average of 9.2
- Criminal damage showed 4 crimes compared to the average of 4.8
- Vehicle offences showed 3 crimes compared to the average of 6

#### Crimes of note

Theft – The Stalls, Corslev Overnight on the 24th December, a suspect stole 60 litres of oil from an oil tank located in the aarden.

Cyber crime affects all areas of our society and can be very damaging and upsetting for victims. Whether you're a business or an individual, we are all vulnerable to cyber crime. However, it is estimated that 80% of all cyber crime is preventable, which means there are some basic steps that you can take to protect yourself.

You don't need to be a computer expert to avoid becoming a victim of online crime. Using good online habits drastically reduces the chances of becoming a victim of cybercrime and will allow you to reduce your vulnerability and surf the web safely.

#### Online shopping

The internet has transformed the way in which we shop for the products and services we want. Makina purchases and bankina online makes our lives easier, although shopping online doesn't come without its dangers.

- Do not enter personal or payment information on a website that has no padlock in the address bar or https://at the beginning of the address
- Use reputable companies when shopping online. Research them if you are unsure and establish a physical address and telephone contact details
- Do not pay for items when using an unsecured Wi-Fi connection
- Do not click on links or reply to unsolicited emails from companies you don't recognise.

#### Advice for victims

If you suspect you've been a victim of fraud involving credit or debit cards, online banking or cheques, you should report it to your bank or card company. They are responsible for undertaking further investigation and reporting criminal activity to us where appropriate.

Fraud that doesn't involve your bank or card company should be reported to the business or organisation concerned. Depending on their advice, you may then need to report this to us on 101.

Where an additional crime has been committed with the fraud, for example, you have had your wallet or purse stolen or the card used fraudulently was taken as a result of a burglary, then this should still be reported to us on 101. Some steps you can take to protect yourself:

- Make sure you keep a record of all communications.
- Get a copy of your personal credit report from one of the credit reference agencies -Experian, Equifax and Call Credit. A paper version of your report is available from £2. If applications for credit have been made in your name you can ask to have any incorrect information removed.
- Consider contacting CIFAS the UK's Fraud Prevention Service, to apply for protective registration. Once you have registered, CIFAS members will carry out extra checks whenever anyone applies for a financial service using your address.
- If you suspect mail theft, contact the Royal Mail Customer Enquiry Number on 08457 740740 or visit their website

# **Countryside Matters**

When you live and work in the country the early months of the year are all about the weather

If the weather takes a turn for the worse, have you:

- Stocked up on groceries and medicines?
- Arranged alternative heating if the electricity fails?
- Make sure you have working batteries in torches. Candles may not give much light, but can give a little romance to a miserable dark evening.
- Make sure that you have plenty of sand or salt readily available to clear your doorway, path and drive if you really need to go outside if it snows or becomes icy.
- Charge up computers and mobile phones for keeping in touch with the outside world
- If you have a drain or water inlet that is exposed, lag it now before it can freeze
- Keep curtains pulled 24hrs a day in unused rooms to prevent loss of heat
- Make sure your oil tank has sufficient oil to take you through at least until end of March (if you have a tank that will take that much)
- Do check on neighbours to see if they have any needs
- Knowing that only the A roads are to be gritted this winter, make arrangements either to work from home if possible or arrange to stay with colleagues near your place of work.

On the farm, care of livestock is all important so buildings are made secure from wind, driving rain or snow. The milking parlour has overhead heaters to keep water ice-free and available for cattle to drink, to keep pipelines clean and, for those members of staff milking the cows, an acceptable working temperature. Water in drinking tanks both inside and outside has to be available 24 hours a day – a cow will drink around 30-50 gallons of water a day!

Tractors are used at least 12 hours a day cleaning the yards, walkways and collecting areas for the cattle as well as carrying feedstuffs to feed troughs, mixing wagons and animals in fields away from the farm. Cattle staying out through the winter months need checking daily for any health problems, new arazina is released each day by moving fences on grazing or root crops whilst cutting open the silage bales placed around the fields provides additional food.

From the very first cut of silgae in May. all our efforts go into making provision for good home-produced food for the animals in our care. This year, with lighter crops due to the dry weather last summer, we know that our barns will not be full enough to feed the stock we have on the farm this winter. All we can do is manage the situation as best we can, knowing that nearly every farm in the country is in the same situation (but still nowhere near as bad as some other countries around the world).

2019 will bring whatever weather it will and, with each day bringing us nearer to spring, fresh hope will come for a happy and healthy year ahead for all those living in the countryside.
