A big thank you to everyone who so generously gave shoe boxes full of gifts for the children in needy countries and to the people who knitted the hand puppets.

On Sunday 23rd October we gathered all the shoe boxes together and Chris Rodgers blessed them before sending them on their way. This year we took 54 shoeboxes, to the Samaritans Purse depot in Melksham, where they are made ready for distribution – primarily to countries in Eastern Europe.

Each box is checked to ensure that all items included are suitable, and any that are not

are re-distributed to other charities. The boxes are then sealed and packed into large cartons which are stacked onto pallets before being loaded on to lorries. Each

vehicle will transport between 10,000 and 13,000 boxes, which at this time of year travel out almost weekly.

Once again, thank you Corsley, Chapmanslade and Little Cuckoos Pre School for giving not just the gifts but

also your time and thought in putting the boxes together





Victoria Bridge, Bath Connection with Corsley and Chapmanslade

You may have seen on the news that the Victoria Bridge in Bath has been completely closed both to foot traffic and river traffic because of its condition but did you know that the bridge has connections to Corsley and Chapmanslade?

The bridge was designed by James Dredge who was born in the parish of Greater Corsley in 1794 and was married to Ann Vine of Trowbridge in Corsley Parish Church on 16 May 1820. He moved to Bath in 1822 and became the owner of the Norfolk Brewery and Malthouse on the Upper Bristol Road. The design principle of the bridge was patented by Dredge and it is neither a true suspension bridge (like the first Severn Crossing) nor a true cable stayed bridge (like the second Severn Crossing). The design required less weight of materials than a conventional suspension bridge, shortening the construction time and was therefore cheaper. James' younger brother Abel was a blacksmith in Chapmanslade and would no doubt have provided the practical knowledge for the working details.

The Victoria Bridge was his first, built in 1836 to join the Upper Bristol Road with Twerton across the river Avon at a cost of £1760. Over 50 of these bridges were built both in the UK and overseas in place from Jamaica to India. Another of Dredge's bridges survives across the Kennet and Avon Canal at Stowell Park in Wiltshire.

Countryside Matters

The winter so far has been somewhat better for us here in Wiltshire, especially after 2009 and 2010 when we experienced snow in November and December to depths not known here for over 20 years.

The cold frosty days of December brought in the flocks of fieldfares to devour the holly berries just before Christmas. Now the less palatable berries on Pyracantha and Cotoneaster are being enjoyed by the Blackbirds and other thrushes.

January is a great month for country sports, which allow vermin such as grey squirrels, magpies, wood pigeons and rabbits to be controlled before the breeding season. The organised hunting of deer and shoots for duck, partridge and peasants will also come to end in the next month or so, to allow for regeneration in the spring and summer months.



From the shortest day on 21st December, we all look forward to more daylight hours, but know that we still have two to three months of 'winter' left to face.

Already the first signs of spring are showing, with snowdrops poking up their shorts in the hedgerows. Shepherds are looking at and caring for their flocks as the ewes are brought in for temporary shelter and feeding, or at least folded near the farm buildings. The lambs will start arriving this month, so their mothers need some extra care at this time.

Last year's lambs will be weighed and marketed so that we shall have a continual flow of English lamb for the Sunday lunch table.

Traditional hedge-laying will be carried out on the farm. Tall saplings will be cleverly spliced and bent so that the new growth will come up from close to the ground to form a protective screen for mammals, a nesting place for birds, and a natural fence to keep stock in the field. The craft of hedge-laying is becoming quite rare, so encouragement must be given to young people to learn this craft.

January is a time to recoup after the Christmas rush. Get outside when you can to see the winter countryside. Enjoy the jams, jellies and jars of preserved fruits that were prepared last autumn. Sit by the log fire and plan your year ahead.

A Year of Excellent Progress

Juba Diocesan Secondary School - 2011

What has been accomplished at Juba School during the past year will stir your hearts. We have seen God's hand at work in some wonderful ways.

When I first went out to Juba in 2005 Archbishop Marona made a strong plea for help in establishing a secondary school. I don't think he fully understood the magnitude of the task. However he was a man of exceptional faith, and often, when we parted, he would say: 'With God all things are possible' – just six words, but the secret of success in any great work of faith.

A new block with three classrooms has been built. At just the right time God put us in touch with the Diocese of Adelaide, Australia. The estimate for the cost of the building was £60,000, and Adelaide agreed to pay two thirds of this sum. In January 2011 the Archbishop of Adelaide laid the foundation stone and the building was completed by the end of April. These classrooms were therefore ready in time for the new intake of 140 students on 1 May.

Day-to-day expenditure now matches income. The extra classrooms enabled the School roll up to increase to 370, and, with this number, the 'gap' between expenditure on running costs and income from fees has been closed. Since 2007 we have had to send out over £50,000 to 'Plug the Gap'. The situation was akin to that of a space craft, which requires a booster rocket on take off and until it has reached a critical point away from the Earth's gravitational pull, after which it travels on its own. The School has now reached a self-supporting, critical point in its operational budget. However, the School Governors will still

look for help to find funding for capital development.

Physics, chemistry and biology - from rocket science to ordinary science!

The results in these subjects previously had been hugely disappointing. In the 2010 School Certificate only 30% of students taking science, passed. This wasn't surprising considering the lack of any practical, scientific equipment for demonstration or laboratory work. But, critically, there will be no training of doctors, engineers and scientists, all vital for the development of South Sudan, without a good foundation at school in science. Two things to improve the situation have happened.

Science Teacher training. All the science teachers have been trained in the use of practical equipment. We got the advice to 'think big', to consider the needs of other schools as well. And so, with an invitation from the South Sudan Minister of Education, and with the help of charities and Salisbury Diocese, we took 4 science teachers out from England in July to run a Training Workshop. 26 teachers from 14 secondary schools across South Sudan attended. It was an outstanding success.

Improved science facilities. The School urgently required a science laboratory with proper equipment. During our visits to Juba, each morning around the breakfast table, we pray together, asking God that He will specifically 'direct our steps' during the day. One day, about a year ago, this prayer led us to some funding for a laboratory. Providentially we met the Sudan Representative for 'Christian Aid', Robert Hayward from Sherborne, who happened to be in Juba at that time. We invited him

to come and see the School, where we told him about the need for a laboratory. He told us that, unfortunately, funding of secondary schools in South Sudan was outside Christian Aid's current remit. Three months later, however, early in 2011, Robert contacted us to say that 'Christian Aid' had received a special gift of £22,000 which could be used for the Laboratory! The Head of Science at Frome College advised us on the design.

The Laboratory was built in four months and officially opened by the Bishop of Salisbury on 15 November 2011. Our prayers had been answered.

Amazingly, in the 2011 School Certificate all the students taking science passed! What an improvement from 30% in 2010 to 100% last year! The Governors expectation, that Juba School will become a 'beacon school' for science, is moving ahead

Infrastructure at the School.

Two other giant steps forward were made in 2011.

Drinking water. Many of you have been concerned that there should be a supply of pure drinking water. Thanks to the kindness of a number of people in Corsley and Chapmanslade this is now a reality. The School was connected to mains water in May and students have pure water 'on tap' outside each classroom, a huge benefit in a very hot climate. Water from the well, which was of suspect purity, is a thing of the past.

6 Electricity. The School is at last fully connected to mains electricity, and all the classrooms have lights and overhead fans. Winsley Parish church near Bradford-on-Avon has contributed to this. In addition, in view of frequent power cuts in Juba, an emergency

generator has been installed to ensure a constant power supply.

Altogether, as you can see, some wonderful progress has been made in 2011. None of this would have been possible without the generous support and the prayers of many of you. We are deeply grateful. In a future article for 'The Bridge' I would like to tell you about some further plans for the School.



The faith of the students. School assembly, or parade as they call it, is held each morning at 8.15. Some have walked an hour and a half to school. The majority of these students are committed Christians. One of them will be invited out to the front each day to lead worship songs and prayers. These young people are motivated to work hard, and they have a strong desire to serve their country. They will undoubtedly be amongst the future leaders of South Sudan, which gained its independence on 9 July 2011. The new nation faces mountainous difficulties, but the faith of these young people, combined with the first-class education they are now receiving at Juba Secondary School, can move mountains.

'With God all things are possible'.

A great Christian

William Carey 1761-1834

The early years

Carey, the eldest of five children, was born to Edmund and Elizabeth Carey, who were weavers by trade in a village in Northamptonshire. As a child he was naturally inquisitive and keenly interested in botany and accounts of explorers. He possessed a natural gift for languages, teaching himself Latin. At the age of 14, he was apprenticed to a shoemaker in a nearby village and at about this time he surrendered his life to Christ. While apprenticed there he taught himself Greek.

In 1781 he married Dorothy Plackett. Unlike William, Dorothy was illiterate; her signature in the marriage register is a crude cross. William and Dorothy Carey had seven children, five sons and two daughters; both girls died in infancy, as well as their son Peter, who died at the age of 5. In course of time, Carey took over the business, during which time he taught himself Hebrew, Italian, Dutch, and French, often reading while working on his shoes.


