


### **New Year Resolution dilemma** Or is it? Why not take up yoga?





## Do you have an unused mobile phone?

Over half of UK households are thought to have one or more unused electronic devices

In August 2019 the Royal Society of Chemistry (RSC) commissioned a survey which showed that there may be 40 million old electronic devices sitting unused in the UK. Of the sampled households 51% had at least one unused item, and 45% had two or more, including mobile phones, computers, tablets, smart TVs, MP3 players and e-readers. Young people own most items, and over half of households with 16- to 24-yearolds contain 10 or more devices. Less than 1/5 of the households have any plans to recycle or sell their unused devices.

Why is this a problem? Quite simply, modern electronic devices depend on extremely rare chemical elements to function. These include ones you rarely hear about, such as indium, yttrium, tantalum and

gallium. They also include better-known elements, such as arsenic and silver, which may be totally mined out within the next 100 years. The RSC ran its survey under the heading "Elements in danger" to highlight the issue as part of the International Year of the Periodic Table.

Chemists are working to find alternatives to these rare elements in microchips, transistors, touch screens and LEDs. However, further uses for these elements are continually being found as new devices are developed. The immediate solution is to recycle unused devices or the components they contain.

This is where the 3Rs of recycling come into play:

• **Reduce** – put off upgrading your device. Do you really need the marginal



improvement that the new phone offers?

- **Reuse** pass your old phone (or tablet or TV) to a relative, donate it to a charity or sell it to a company dealing in second-hand devices.
- **Recycle** send it to the local recycling centre.

However, concern about theft of personal data appears to be one reason why people do not reuse or recycle their phones. Doing a factory reset is usually a good first step, and recycling centres are obliged to recycle electronic devices securely. If in doubt, check with the retailer of your new or old phone.

Not only do mobile phones contain about 30 different elements, with 6 of these set to run out within the next 100 years, but some are mined in battle areas, often by child labour, Such "conflict elements" include tin, gold, tungsten and tantalum. Some manufacturers, such as Fairphone, endeavour to source their components without using conflict minerals, obtaining them from other mining areas or from recycled components. Fairphone also allows the user to upgrade or repair individual components, such as the camera or screen, avoiding the need to buy a new phone.

I am not perfect. I have an unused phone – as a spare in case my fairly reliable phone goes on the blink. I also have an old TV I hardly ever watch. However, I have recycled the old phones that I had sitting in a desk drawer – they went to Barnardo's charity shop after a factory reset to delete my personal details.

If you received a new phone, tablet, TV or other electronic device for Christmas – please recycle or reuse your old one.

### **Seven Open Doors**

Dear Friends,

I know I probably have said this before but it's really weird to have to write this letter for the New Year when we are still in Advent! I get muddled enough already with the plethora of services and events that are going on now without thinking of next year's 'stuff' as well!

So here we are in January, I wonder what lies ahead? This morning I have been sitting with someone whom I see regularly who has just moved house; a very significant and psychologically impactful move as she has moved from a house to a flat into what is effectively sheltered accommodation in anticipation of future needs. The flat is in the centre of the city so the route to my house is a new one that is unfamiliar; the way was unknown which brings with it it's own anxieties and challenges.

I wonder what new journeys we will be called upon to make this coming year and will we know the way? Will those journeys be ones that we have already marked in our diaries and planned for, or will they be ones that come totally out of the blue and which throw us into confusion and panic? Life of course, holds both possibilities and some years we will experience what we perceive to be a very unfair dollop of the latter, some rather more of the former. We'll be thinking about three people who had to make a very difficult and unplanned for journey in dangerous circumstances at our service for Epiphany on Sunday January 5th 10.30am at Longbridge Deverill church; the wise men's gift of gold (chocolate coins) will be shared after the service. I don't suppose they had THAT journey in their diaries, and I don't suppose they were ever the same after they made it. Another lovely event involving the story of a journey to the temple, is our annual Christingle and Candlemas service at Chapmanslade church on Sunday February 2nd. It's at 3.15pm for the making of the Christingles followed by a short service starting at 4pm. I think it's very special to have this lovely service involving lots of candles in what is often a very dark and dreary month.

There is no doubt that this past year has been difficult for all of us in so many different ways and it's easy to fall prey to cynicism and despair. But as we begin a new decade let us hold onto the hope of a better way, and let us think about how we can be part of making the world a better place for everyone.





### **Corsley Parish Council**

## **Parish Council Briefing**

Chairman, Neil Britten, rounds up the PCs activities in December

Because of the timing of the December PC meeting, in relation to The Bridge publishing timetable, I included a fairly full description of the intended agenda in the December brief, so as to encourage public attendance to hear all about the Corsley House bund plans. I am glad to report that about 25 people attended the pre-meeting briefing by Angus Cunningham, the Project Manager for the project, and were able to put their question and concerns. The application was considered by the PC at the subsequent quarterly meeting and the discussion is summarised below.

Two more planning applications were also on the agenda, as was the annual financial review, updates on the Streetscene and Bay tree (already detailed in the December edition of The Bridge) and the agenda of the 2020 Annual Parish Meeting (APM).

#### Planning applications 19/10108/WCM

Creation of a landscape and amenity bund with ancillary native tree planting to enhance residential amenity, biodiversity, drainage and the overall setting of a Grade II Listed Building with the ancillary diversion of an existing public right of way at land to the north of the A362, Corsley, at Corsley House, Deep Lane, Corsley, BA12 7OH

Discussion centred around the three main aspects of the application, the bund itself and its impact on landscape and setting, the traffic load during construction and the possibility of reflected noise. In general, the PC believed that the construction of such a large feature was a somewhat extreme solution to any noise issues that might exist at Corsley House, but that in the long term it provided a benefit in terms of the enhanced ecology and extensive tree planting planned and would have no detrimental effect on the setting of the Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty or views from Cley Hill in the long term.

However, a major concern was the impending imposition of some 6,330 additional lorry trips over a 198 day period, at the rate of 32 per day in an easterly direction, to achieve delivery of some 90,000 tonnes of earth. A detailed traffic survey had been undertaken in preparation for the planning application and this showed a modest increase (7%) on the A362 over the measured flows of HGVs. However, strong views were expressed that this increase was on top of an already well nigh intolerable volume of HGVs through the village and would represent in an increased road safety risk at the Heath at just the time when the PC was attempting to introduce risk reduction measures. The site entry would be at the top end of Deep Lane, resulting in a very heavy increase in vehicle movements over a short distance (about 60m) which could interfere with and delay normal movements, particularly school traffic.

Two letters had been received directly by the PC, both covering similar points about the disproportionality of the plan in relation to the perceived noise hazard at Corsley House, but one of these also raised the issue of potential reflected noise in a southerly direction. A noise study had been completed as one of the application documents but this concentrated on the benefits of the bund for Corslev House and did not consider the potential for reflection. The PC felt that this was a failing in the application and should be addressed.

After some discussion, and a contribution from a member of the public, it was proposed that the application be supported provided that two conditions were applied:

- 1. That no residential properties should be affected by increased noise resulting from the building of the bund because of noise being reflected south across the A362. Evidence should be provided of existing noise levels along the base of the proposed bund and predictions made, based on a credible modelling exercise, of the post bund situation, particularly the extent to which properties on the south of the A362 might be affected. In addition, if the application is approved, post build measurements should be undertaken and if the predictions are found to be incorrect and the properties referred to are adversely affected remedial actions should be enforced.
- 2. That the traffic plan governing the delivery of the material to the site is rigidly adhered to and actively managed.

The results of a vote were three for, one against and two abstentions (one as a result of an expressed interest). Two Councillors were absent. The proposal was carried.

#### Post meeting note

The sub contractors for the project, SLR Consulting, have now conducted and supplied to the PC an

analysis of the possibility of reflections from the bund, with the conclusion that "....any reflected noise would be minimal and would not give rise to any increased levels of noise which would be perceptible." This analysis has been accepted by the PC as meeting the first part of condition 1.

#### 19/10356/FUL

Proposed creation of new animal housing (giraffe and zebra) and ancillary buildings. Removal of existing animal housing. Creation of additional retail floor space adjacent to existing shop, Longleat Safari and Adventure Park, Longleat, BA12 7NW

It was unanimously agreed that the PC have no objection to this application.

#### 19/10513/ADV

One threshold sign to be located at ST 83768844265, X 383768 Y144265.

One 'welcome' and 'orientation' sign located at ST 8377444295, X383774 Y144295. The signs will be made from fibreglass with aluminium fixings attached to oak posts, at Cley Hill, Corsley, BA12 7QU. (These are new signs proposed by the National Trust for erection in the car park adjacent to the A362, at the base of Cley Hill.

It was unanimously agreed that the PC have No Objection to this application

#### Streetscene

#### Whitbourne Springs/A362 junction

Unfortunately this proposal was not selected for the Wiltshire Council major projects scheme, which means the proposed re-design and reconstruction of the junction will not happen. However, it remains a Category One CATG scheme and some small improvements to slowing traffic may be possible with the very limited funds available.

#### **Corsley Heath**

The Corsley Heath road safety measures are still in the programme including the proposed crossing point by the bus stop. It is anticipated that there could be some movement on this project in the New Year.

#### **Finance**

#### Finance In-year statement

The precept for 2018/19, i.e. Corsley's share of your Council tax, was £,9275, which represents £,16.30 per elector. Additional income was derived from Little Cuckoos, for their sub-lease of an area of the Old School Playing Field. The spending plan for FY 18/19, in percentage terms, is:

Other than grants/donations, all other items have been spent or committed. The amount available for grants and donations is around £3500 and is traditionally used to support community organisations and projects. There is a notice on the opposite page seeking bids, with details on how to apply.

### Future Plans/Precept bid for 2019/20

The future projections for the next two years carry on with the same pattern of expenditure with two key exceptions. First, the PC is now having to face the expectation of regular contributions to any CATG projects in the village at 25% of cost. This year this amount

was £214. Prediction of future costs is an inexact art, particularly as there is always uncertainty in which FY the payments will fall. For next year, the working assumption is that the PC will need to contribute approximately f,5k to the improvements at the Heath and nothing towards Whitbourne Springs. Second, the Heath bus stop is in a poor material state and has been temporarily repaired. Early in the New Year the PC will be looking at replacement options and this will have to be absorbed in the budget for 2020/21, probably from a combination of use of underspend and reserves. It is anticipated that these expectations can be met by holding the precept bid for 2020/21 in line with inflation. The bid for next year will thus be £,9763, an increase of 2% over the current FY, representing f, 17.10 per elector.

#### Annual Parish Meeting (APM) 2020

As already mentioned in previous briefs, all Parish Councils in England are required by law to hold an Annual Parish Meeting. It is not a PC meeting, but a village gathering, with the PC providing the Chair. The meeting is intended to allow the PC to explain what they have been doing over the last year and local community organisations, if they so wish. It is also the occasion for electors to have their say on anything which they consider is important to the people of the Parish.

The meeting will take place early in March 2020 on a date yet to be finalised, but in the first two weeks of the month. A notice was placed in last month's edition of The Bridge seeking input on possible topics, with no response to-date. The PC has offered one slot to Hugh Deed to talk about Reading Room refurbishment plans, which he has accepted. Longleat have also been invited to give us their annual talk, but so far have not responded. I have repeated the notice in this edition of The Bridge and all ideas are welcome.
