





Police and Crime Commissioner seeks residents' views on investment required to improve policing services

Residents are being urged to use their voice and tell the Police and Crime Commissioner how they feel about policing in their communities, what Wiltshire Police should be prioritising and how the policing budget should be spent next year.

Respondents will be asked whether their household would be prepared to invest more in policing through the police precept part of their council tax.

Wiltshire Police's budget is set by the PCC, based upon the operational policing advice from the Chief Constable, and informed by consultation with residents and stakeholders.

The budget is made up of centralised government funding from the Home Office and locally from the police precept part of your council tax. Wiltshire Police is one of the lowest-funded Forces nationally, per head of population, and the PCC continues to push for change and for review of the national funding formula.

Baytree Development

Latest update from Wiltshire Council

I have recently taken over from Christine Brown as the Project Manager for the Council house building programme next to Baytree Close, Corsley Heath.

I am writing to update the Parish Council regarding progress on site. As you may have seen, a section of the hedge on the main road has been cut back in preparation for forming the vehicle entrance. Some security fencing has also been delivered.

We were hoping that work would have started now to clear the site, however, there is an electrical cable which runs across the proposed entrance which will need to be relocated before work can start. Our groundworks contractors, Fisher and Dean, have asked SSE to reroute the cable. SSE will attend on site in early January and the ground works will start on site in earnest thereafter. Our contractors will aim to keep disruption to a minimum. However, there may be some traffic disruption whilst the new entrance is being formed. Temporary traffic lights may be in place for a time to allow the operatives to work safely. The contractors may also need to use the gated entrance in Baytree close for a short period, to allow a limited number of vehicles to get onto the site whilst work is taking place on the new entrance. Road Closure Notice

Temporary Closure of C274 (Part), Chapmanslade (Ref: TTRO 9155)

Notice is hereby given that the Wiltshire Council has made an Order to close temporarily to all traffic: C274 (Part), Chapmanslade; from its junction with Drivers Bridge Road for a distance of approximately 100m in a north westerly direction, to enable Wessex Water to carry out permanent reinstatement and associated works.

Alternative route: via C274 (unaffected length) – A3098 – A362 – C275 – C274 (unaffected length) and vice versa.

The closure and diversion route will be clearly indicated by traffic signs and will come into operation on 22nd January between the hours of 8 am and 5 pm for 2 days. It is anticipated that the works will take the stated duration to complete, depending upon weather conditions. Access will be maintained for residents and businesses where possible, although delays are likely due to the nature of the works.





Allow me to introduce myself, I am Revd Caroline Husband, currently Team Vicar with the White Horse Team Ministry, based in Dilton Marsh with Brokerswood. I am also the Rural Dean for Heytesbury.

Part of the role of Rural Dean is to support parishes that are in vacancy, this support takes many forms often unseen in the public eye. New beginnings in the Church Parish

December saw the Church year begin with Advent and 2024 has now arrived starting another calendar new year. This time round, there is more than usual for the parish to think about as a result of the retirement of the Cley Hill Churches Rector, Pauline, in October, in addition to the progression of ongoing plans for regeneration in our community and both churches. It's all about sowing seeds for the future.

So what are these new beginnings?

Firstly, there is the ongoing work by a dedicated team with fresh plans to reach out to younger generations in different ways. This involves looking at ways to bring God's message to everyone. The beginning of December saw the first Messy Church directly after school, with families avoiding having to make a special trip out, and providing an activity involving both parents and children. Pizzas cooked in the school kitchen by the Head Teacher helped make it a great occasion. Chapmanslade Church School, brilliantly led, continues doing a great job with our children, helped by parish volunteers leading assemblies and providing dramatic Bible stories with what is called Open the Book. Foundation Governors provided by the parish are supporting the Christian message in the school, working together with the rest of the Board of Governors and staff, as they manage the school's present and future.

Secondly, there is a fresh discussion within the Heytesbury Deanery. This is the group of parishes centred around Westbury and Warminster, where around half of the parishes are in the process of looking for new priests. This is with a view to enabling parishes to operate more smoothly, and allow parish priests to be more effective. Talks may involve discussion around parish grouping adjustments and the shortage of priests nationally will be a factor. Rural parishes like Corsley and Chapmanslade will feature in this, so Sue Fear, the PCC Secretary, has newly joined the deanery meetings and will be representing local interests.

Thirdly, the PCC are looking at ways to bring the church buildings back into everyone's focus. The recent Christmas Tree Festival is a good example where those who might not have been in one of our churches had a great opportunity to see what is going on. While the Chapmanslade Church development project has been in preparation for some time, St Margaret's is also newly in focus with volunteers across Corsley taking a look at how it can serve the community better.

Finally, there are possibilities for some adjustments to our regular services to make them more appealing. Rural Dean Caroline Husband has written a letter of introduction, which appears in the centre pages, as well as providing details of a fresh type of service. It's very informative, so please have a look after reading this.

As these new beginnings develop in all areas, articles like this in The Bridge and other communication outlets will continue to keep everyone informed.

Wonderful Walks


Old and New!



I hope you enjoyed the Venice 'Dream Walk' last month and your festive season, too! Let's begin the 2024 walking season by looking at Trowbridge's past, because the weekly wait for buses there gives me time to visit the FREE Museum (it's closed Mondays, but is beside Specsavers, in The Shires). Did you know that one baron forcing King John to sign the Magna Carta, held the Manor of Trowbridge? There's a fetching statue of Baron Henry de Bohun in the museum.

Trowbridge headed the local mechanised weaving industry in Georgian and Victorian times and the cloth produced here was so specialised, it made the town very wealthy. I've looked for different signs of that wealth on this walk, so park in The Shires car park, go through there and out onto Castle Street. Turn left and pass the Town Hall redevelopment, into Silver Street. Cross to the old closed Post Office and, where Silver Street becomes Roundstone Street, there's an impressive stone-built edifice, a solicitors' business. This is Rodney House, built 1790 for a clothier – and described as 'noble' by Sir Nicholas Pevsner, in his 'Buildings of England' series. Look back over your shoulder, though, and there's another amazing sight behind you, a blank wall painted to resemble a house, with windows and people looking out of them! This was done for the 25th anniversary of Trowbridge Civic Society in October 2003.

Pass Rodney House and the junction with Polebarn Road is next. Opposite is Polebarn



the early 1700s and reminding Pevsner of Genoa; it's generally considered to be the finest clothier's house in Wiltshire.

Continue ahead, into Wicker Hill and you'll pass the houses of The Parade, built for the Houlton family and including central Parade House (around 1730); these dwellings were described by Pevsner as 'palaces'. Stop outside Parade House and look down; you're standing on cobbles, known locally as a 'pitched pavement' and possibly the longest one in the country. Further down Wicker Hill is the 'blind house' or lock-up, possibly built when the Town Bridge was, in 1777. Cross the bridge, looking left at the strange building for sale on a further bridge along; it's a Handle House, the only certain one in the West Country. Teasels were dried out here, after

House (the word 'HOTEL' is high on the frontage). This was built in 1789 for John Clark, a Church Minister and clothier. The grounds here were magnificent and, originally, there was a belvedere on the house roof. Cross Polebarn Road and continue a bit along

Roundstone Street, to find another clothier's home opposite, Lovemead House, though Pevsner moaned about the quality of stonework here. Sorry, but retrace your steps a bit now, back to turn right into Church Street and then left, bringing you out into Fore Street. There are three banks here; the HSBC was built in 1730, for a local man who made his money in Portugal, before returning home. Further left is the Nat West, built as a bank in 1851, with Lloyds Bank next door, built in



being used to lift the nap on new cloth. The used teasels needed removing, cleaning and drying before being used again; the Museum has a Teasel Gig on display. Across the river, outstanding red-brick Studley Mills was built in 1860; ignore the carbuncle on the







roof!

Cross Stallard Road at the traffic lights, go right and cross the twolane road, heading left for Trowbridge railway station. Walk through the car park and use the overbridge. I did this and a train appeared, BUT the overbridge has sides so tall, I couldn't get a photo. A young couple asked if I was all right, so I explained and the man said. "I'll do it," before rushing off with my camera! When he reappeared, he'd taken several photos, asked if I could cross the overbridge all right, listened to my thanks and early Christmas wishes and disappeared with his lady! Once over the



bridge, find the station exit back onto Stallard Street, passing the small red-brick and stone building (original ticket office?), climb Wicker Hill and go left into Conigre

Square. The stone façade of one building away to your right belongs to Conigre Parsonage, built around 1700 for the Minister of Conigre Chapel, while the brick building next door is Westcroft House, built in 1784. Retrace your steps again, from The Conigre into Manvers Street and Fore Street. Find WH Smith's near HSBC, because the alley next door passes Leykers café, where I had yummy cheesy chips for lunch..!
