



You'll never walk alone

World Cup Footballs for Juba School

Globalisation is nowhere more evident than in football. Last year the Bishop of Bradford visited Khartoum, whilst being driven out of the city in the dark to a distant Church congregation, the car was stopped by the police. His passport was taken whilst another man with a big red stick poked his head through the car window and asked him where he was from. "England", the Bishop said, "and which football team do you support?" asked the policeman, "Liverpool" replied the Bishop – with a smile the policeman said "you'll never walk alone, drive on!".

On the Saturday before Christmas, Rosalyn and I were kindly invited by Vicky Oakham to her wedding in St.Margaret's





church, Corsley. The approach roads were flooded on that day but all the guests made it. At the reception I had a really good chat with the bridegroom's elder brother. He told me he worked for Adidas, the international sportswear company, and that he headed up their operation in the Far East. He had come from Hona Kona for the wedding. We talked football for a while – he is an ardent Notts Forest supporter whilst I support their arch rivals, Derby County. He told me that Adidas had the contract to supply all the official footballs for the World Cup in Brazil in June. I told him about my interest in Juba School where the School team wears blue shirts donated by a student at Loughborough University. In the New Year, with not a little cheek, I sent an email to Hong Kong asking whether two world cup footballs could

possibly be donated for Juba School The students would be 'over the moon' to receive such a present. The reply came "I'll see what I can do, I'm sure we can manage something".

Time went by but I heard in April that some footballs were on their way. The balls needed to be transported in an inflated state so as to maintain their quality and shape. One morning a DHL van drew up outside our house in Lyes Green and the driver walked up the drive with a very large package. "I'm afraid you've got some customs duty to pay on this" he said. "At my last delivery it was £238, but I think yours will be less'. He studied the delivery note and said "Oh Yes! only £12". The driver told me he was also a keen supporter of Liverpool.

Inside the package were 12 footballs! – 2 actual world cup footballs and 10 replicas – the sort that will be on sale across the world in June. Two of us are going out to Juba on 25th May and we shall be taking the 2 real balls, and 5 of the replicas. I shall present these footballs to schools where we have links because of the bursaries that people here are kindly providing.

For a few weeks before and after Christmas South Sudan was in the news as civil war and genocide spread through the Country. Before long however the media moved on to other things, Crimea, Ukraine and a vanished aircraft. We might be forgiven for thinking that the issues in South Sudan are resolved. They are not. They are merely forgotten. Our ongoing support and friendship is very highly valued. These footballs are a tangible sign to the children out there that they will 'never walk alone'.



Costing the earth

Not in my back yard!

Do you turn off your TV when you've finished watching it? Do you switch your computer off instead of sending it to 'sleep' or 'hibernate'? Do you switch off your lights when not in use? Do you use energy efficient bulbs? Do you give a hoot how and where your electricity is produced?

No? Then you are contributing to our ever increasing demand for electricity at the flick of a switch, with absolutely no regard for how it's produced. Fancy having a nuclear, gas or coal-fired power station at the bottom of your garden? No? Well they're in someone's back yard. Those

protesting against the wind turbine should consider that when moaning about the 'beautiful landscape' being ruined by a windmill. They criticise the plans on the grounds of it not being carbonneutral, the 'damage'

done whilst building the turbine and the infrastructure to accompany it – seriously? How much long-term damage is there in an exit/entrance on the A36, a track, and a moled cable to plug it into the National Grid? Hardly on the scale of a power station is it?

And what about those subsidies - really? We subsidise banks, railways and soon we'll be coughing up for the 3rd runway at Heathrow, the Gatwick expansion, the list goes on... Oh, and I nearly forgot – farmers. We don't put a stop to those subsidies –

why? Because they're visible (and we can get abroad on cheap holidays). What about the cost of electricity? The Government have given the go-ahead to a new nuclear power station (Hinkley Point C) in our neighbouring county, Somerset. The power station is the first to be built without money from the

> UK taxpayer – it will be funded by EDF Group (Électricité de France) and Chinese investors. The agreed 'strike price' will be £92.50 per megawatt hour, (MWH) almost TWICE the price of current wholesale cost of electricity. This will

fall to £89.50 per MWH if EDF Group goes ahead with it's plans to build a new nuclear power station at Sizewell in Suffolk, Thank heavens they'll not be in my back yard.

When considering your position in the debate, don't listen to chit-chat, check the facts presented by BOTH sides to come to an informed decision. The long-term effects of how we produce our electricity will affect generations to come; we owe it to them to make responsible, reasoned decisions, not emotively based on the view from out of the window



Chapmanslade Parish Council

Parish Council Briefing

Phil Jefferson reports on the May meeting of Chapmanslade Parish Council and on other parish matters

In fact we had two meetings in May, the first on the 13th and then again on the 15th: the earlier meeting was necessary because we had to meet a planning deadline.

Proposed Wind Turbine

At our April meeting we invited parishioners to let us know their views on the proposed wind turbine after they had visited the consultation event held in the village at the end of the month. As a result, we received between 30 and 40 emails and letters. about three quarters of them from parish residents, almost all of them opposing the proposed development. Over 60 members of the public, about two thirds of them Chapmanslade residents, turned up at our 15th May meeting to tell us their views. The great majority of those who attended were opposed to the development. A small number were in favour.

So, first of all, a word of thanks to those of you who took the trouble to contact us or to come to our meeting. You have told us loudly and clearly that you do not wish to see a wind turbine at Thoulstone (a reminder, by the way, that the proposed site is in Upton Scudamore parish). Wiltshire Council has assured us that the parish council will be consulted if and when a planning application is made and we are well aware of the responsibility we have to represent your views. I am sure that the

wind turbine issue will be on the agenda for parish council meetings for the foreseeable future. When the final plans are published we will need to consider whether we need to come back to you for your views on the actual plans – possibly they will be different from those we have seen so far. We will keep you in touch.

Planning

On 13th May we considered an application to extend the barn, currently under construction, at Sienna's Valley in Huntenhull Lane. We resolved to object to the application, as we were concerned about the harm the extension would cause to the amenity of the immediate neighbours. We also questioned the need for a barn of the proposed size. We have asked Fleur de Rhe Philipe to "call in" the application should the planning officer at Wiltshire Council recommend consent, in which case, if Fleur agrees, the application will be considered by elected councillors.

The pre-planning application to build two houses in Southcroft has been turned down by Wiltshire Council. The planners were concerned that "the development would give rise to an unacceptable lack of privacy harmful to the amenity of existing occupants and any future occupants of the proposed dwellings". A second reason was that insufficient information had been given by the developers relating to access, specifically in relation to land differentials, to the proposed gradient and to visibility splays. And third, the use of the proposed access to the development "would be likely to increase the conflict of traffic movements close to an existing junction resulting in additional hazard and inconvenience to all users of the road".

Highways

Wiltshire Council has been very busy clearing out the gullies at Dead Maids. The work took several days to complete. We are reminding Wiltshire of the need to carry out this type of work elsewhere in the parish, especially Huntenhull Lane as far as the old Rectory. We have also reminded them of their promise to paint a white line in the High Street near to the exit from Wood Lane so that visibility can be improved for motorists joining the High Street at that point. We have been assured that the work will be carried out soon. However, the good news is that we have been told that Southcroft is to be resurfaced in the current financial year and repairing the section of the A3098 towards Westbury is also one of the highway authority's priorities. Wiltshire Council plans to spend £21 million a vear on road maintenance over the next few years, a considerable investment. Mains Gas

Speedwatch co-ordinator. Keith Muston was confirmed as our link with Wiltshire Council's highway maintenance officers. Finally, Adam Oakley was confirmed as our representative on the Village Hall committee and as our link with Wiltshire Council's public footpath officers

At the meeting we agreed our annual payment of £3,100 to the village hall. Our normal expenditure each year also includes £150 to the Parochial Church Council towards the cost of grass cutting, and £105 to the Earl Haig Fund. We also have to pay for our insurance cover (approximately £150) and for membership of the Wiltshire Association of Local Councils (£235). In addition, we recently agreed to make a grant of £120 to The Bridge to help defray expenditure. And that's about the sum total of our expenditure for the year.

And finally...

The Parish Council has agreed to give its support to a request from Mr Basinger-Adams, Head Teacher at Chapmanslade School, for the community to work with pupils from the school to enhance the entry to our village by the provision and maintenance of planters – or possibly a 'Chapmanslade in Bloom' area or perhaps even a shared herb garden area. This is part of the school's Global Green Fingers Gardening project. We'll tell you more about how you can help in future newsletters.

The next scheduled meeting of the parish council is on Thursday 12th June, 7.30pm at the school. Our meetings are public meetings and everyone is invited to attend – to speak or to listen.



"The NFWI notes that three people die every day whilst waiting for an organ transplant and calls upon every member of the WI to make their wishes about organ donation known and to encourage their families and friends and members of their local community to do likewise".

Before a transplant can go ahead, the consent of the donor's family is required even when the person has joined the NHS Organ Donor Register. However, when a loved one's wishes are not known, families can be faced with very difficult decisions at a time when they are feeling vulnerable and distressed and may refuse their consent. The resolution seeks to encourage WI members to make a choice and make it known to their families so that their wishes would be respected. The gift of organs by just one donor can help transform up to nine other people's lives. Members fully approved the resolution.

Sandy Parrish then began her demonstration of 'Canapes' by saying that presentation and colour should first be considered when deciding which canapés to make. Sandy showed us how to make a tomato rose as the centerpiece and surrounded this by little salami stacks, duck pancakes with cucumber and spring onion and bite-sized blinis with crème fraiche and smoked salmon. The final treats were the small individual chocolate cases filled with tiramisu and decorated with cream and grated chocolate. Cath Fricker gave the vote of thanks and we all then enjoyed sampling the canapes.

A view from over the hedge...

Countryside Matters

At the time of writing this in the middle of May it is a fantastic spring day with the English countryside looking at its best with all the fresh green leaves and colourful flowers and a clear blue sky.

It is amazing how it has recovered after the awful wet and windy weather of the winter. It is noticeable that the ash trees are very late in leaf this year while the oak trees are well leafed up; it will be interesting to see if the old adage "Oak before Ash we're in for a splash, Ash before the Oak we're in for a soak!" is correct. The good weather encourages everybody to be out enjoying the countryside, but there are a couple of points worth remembering...

First, at this time of year there are lots of young animals out in the fields - lambs, calves if it is a beef farm, deer and young birds. These young animals, particularly calves, are easily disturbed and usually protected, sometimes quite aggressively, by the parent animals. When out enjoying the countryside try not to get between any young animals and their mothers; keep dogs under close control as they can upset the parents even more. It should also be remembered that dogs can carry several diseases that can be transmitted to other animals, particularly cattle and sheep, through their faeces.

Second, long grass in this part of the country can be the home of ticks. These little creatures will suck blood from any warm blooded animal that they manage to attach themselves on, including cattle, deer, sheep, dogs, cats and humans. They can carry a nasty disease that infects humans and dogs

called Lyme Disease. These members of the spider family tend to be most active in late spring and early summer so whenever you return from a walk in long grass at this time of year it is worthwhile checking that you and your pets have not picked up any unwelcome auests.

May and June are very busy times down on the farm with silage and hay making, the planting and tending of crops and the movement of animals for grazing, milking, etc. This means that you can meet some unexpected hazards on our country lanes – a herd of cows, a very large tractor and trailer, a combine harvester or a milk tanker – so please bear this in mind when driving, riding or walking and take appropriate care. It is also the time when we see more people out horse riding and it should be remembered that any horse you meet on the road should be passed slowly, quietly and given plenty of room as these are often big animals that can be easily scared.

Finally, what has happened to the cuckoo? I have not heard or seen the cuckoo in this part of the country for several years. This was brought home to me recently when staying with friends in a town in France where we were woken every morning by the cuckoo calling in the garden reminding me of a missing sound of spring in Wiltshire.

Hot Chilli

Follow Rob's tips for growing a bumper crop of beautiful chillies

Chilli plants do well in warm, sunny places so a greenhouse or conservatory is the ideal place for them. They can also be placed outside on a sheltered spot or warm patio but acclimatise them slowly, bringing them in at night for the first week or whenever the temperature threatens to drop. Use a cane to support the plants as they grow.

Feed your chillies with a dedicated chilli feed or seaweed extract at the suggested rate. Never exceed the suggested rate as this can actually have a detrimental effect on your plants.

Encouraging fruit

Your chilli plants will produce flowers and then chillies on each of its side stems so the more side stems you have, the more fruit your plant will produce. If you want to increase the number of chillies your plant produces, you need to increase the number of side stems.

You can do this by tipping your plant onto its side once it is a substantial size. The chilli plant will try to grow upright by throwing out a number of side stems.

Once it has done this, turn the pot around so that the new side stems are facing down and it will throw out another series of side stems, reaching for the light.



Give the pot a quarter turn and once another set of side stems have been started. turn another half turn. You can then return your plant to an upright position and wait for a bumper harvest of chillies. Chillies can be pollinated by bees but failing that, they are also self-pollinating so a gentle shake of flowers will help ensure that they set. Once your chillies start to flower, start to feed with a tomato feed at the rate suggested by manufacturers to encourage fruit to set.

Overwintering Chilli plants are perennials and are generally more productive in their second year than their first although most people grow them as half-hardy annuals. It is worth overwintering them if you have the space on a sunny windowsill or heated greenhouse, but don't let the temperature fall below 10°C. Don't be too concerned if your plants start losing leaves as low light levels can cause chilli plants to go into dormancy, looking for all intents and purposes dead but, come spring, they will burst back into life again.



Parish Council Briefing

The Annual General Meeting (AGM) was held on 12th May, the main purpose of which was to elect the Chairman and Vice Chairman for the coming year. In addition one planning application was considered and updates were presented on several other matters

Election

John Willcox, Parish Clerk, took the Chair. There was one nomination for Chairman, Neil Britten and one for Vice Chairman, Robin Chapman. Both were elected unanimously.

Planning Application

69 Lane End – a single storey extension at the rear of the house to replace an existing lean-to and Marley concrete shed. Because of the Chairman's personal interest, the Vice Chairman, Robin Chapman took the Chair for this application. The PC had no objection to the proposal.

Streetscene

Stalls Farm

The road has been repaired, a lot sooner than originally anticipated, thanks to a cooperative and committed approach between Wiltshire and all those affected. Thanks go, particularly, to the Helliars for their efforts to manage the traffic caused by all those who still ignored the road closed signs! The sett has been filled in and the badgers disbursed to start a new life elsewhere. Lane End traffic is now back to normal.

Deep Lane

Wessex Water are getting on with the repair, albeit slowly, and, as promised, the local

residents, farmers and the Steiner School (SAF) are able to gain access/egress around the works. The work was originally scheduled to take 6 weeks from 22nd April, i.e. to complete on 30th May, with an expectation that this timescale would be reduced because of the working method to be used. However, some problems have been experienced and today's (19th May) estimated completion date for all the Deep Lane works, including re-connection of individual properties is 13th June. The work will then carry on off-road across fields.

County Liaison

Our community Steward, Imogen Dallimore, will be in the Parish on two dates May and June to discuss and agree priorities with Simon Jasper. The outcome will be published on the Bridge website (www.corsleyandthebridge.co.uk).

Longleat Traffic

Now that the Stalls Farm road has been fixed, the Longleat traffic is now back to its usual levels in Lane End with all the unchanged attendant frustrations and safety concerns. Unfortunately there is no change since the last Bridge edition in so far as the Caravan Club have still not come forward with any offers of dates for a meeting. The PC agreed that this issue should be pursued

and once again have appealed to the Caravan Club to offer dates for a meeting. with a request that we escalate the issue higher up their management tree if they are unable to co-operate at regional level.

One interesting outcome from the Stalls Farm road closure was the exposure of the numbers of cars using Lane End to gain access to the Safari Park, even when signs made it perfectly clear that the road was closed. The Helliars recorded traffic volume for two periods on consecutive days, while they were manning the barricades to allow farm traffic through. For these periods, during two days in the week before Easter, they recorded about 150 cars. What this number would be for a normal busy summer day, with no road closure signs in place, can only be imagined and only adds to the Lane End traffic problems. Clearly concentration on satnay takes precedence over reading brown road signs.

Thoulstone Wind Turbine

This was discussed again the meeting to decide Corsley PC's approach. Fleur de Rhé Philipe joined us for this item.

No planning application has yet been received for the ThouIstone wind turbine, but Wiltshire have assured us that Corsley PC will be invited to consider this application. along with Chapmanslade, who are most affected, and Upton Scudamore, in whose Parish the turbine is located. When we know that the application has been registered with Wiltshire, we will schedule a single issue meeting to consider our views. This will be a public meeting at which we will seek input from the Village. However, since it is not possible to give advance warning of the date, we will ensure that it is publicised on the Bridge website (www. corslevandthebirdae.co.uk) and on the village notice boards and through word of mouth.

Any individual immediate views would be welcome.

Join the proposed wind turbine debate...

A giant that is neither green, no jolly!

Wind Turbine Proposal Part 2

This article is the second in a series addressing the proposal to construct a single 285 feet high wind turbine on Thoulstone Farm at the edge of Chapmanslade (opposite Barters Plant Centre). Of grave concern, since last month we have discovered, from a Land Registry search, that the developers have acquired two sites (not one) from the current owner of Thoulstone Farm for the erection of two wind turbines

Last month we reported on how wind turbines are financed almost entirely by complex subsidies which are passed on to customers through higher electricity bills. This is making the landowners huge profits (by 2030 it is estimated the consumer bill for wind subsidies will be £130 billion), while at the same time driving many of the nation's most disadvantaged population into fuel poverty.

This month we look at the claims by the wind power companies that the construction of wind turbines, in some of our most treasured countryside locations, is justified because it reduces carbon generation.

Wind power is not free

The argument in favour of wind power is that wind is free and does not generate carbon emissions. This is misleading as it doesn't take into account all the carbon costs

associated with constructing, transporting and operating wind turbines.

On-shore wind in our area blows efficiently around just 20% of the time. This means that when the wind isn't blowing then turbines stop producing electricity. If we relied totally on wind power the lights would go out! This is obviously unacceptable and therefore an alternative back-up power source is required for the remaining 80% of the time.

This back-up is provided by fossil-fuelled power stations which maintain the consistent energy required by the National Grid. What many people fail to realise is that this back up is running all the time, often at below its most carbon efficient energy levels, in order to step in when the wind drops.

In other words, wind turbines require 100% back-up by conventional fossil fuels. Wind farms cannot be backed up by nuclear plants for technical reasons and therefore. if wind power continues to proliferate, there will be a need for even more fossil fuel nower stations.

Eminent academics believe that on-shore wind farms actually produce more carbon emissions than the comparable use of gas fired turbines because of this requirement for conventional back-up capacity. "Wind generation does not provide an escape

route from fossil fuel use, but embeds the need for it. It is clear that wind power does not offer a decent alternative to fossil fuels." (Why Wind Power is so Expensive: The Global Warming Policy Foundation 2012)

Building wind turbines generates extra carbon

The wind energy industry neglects to advertise the very significant carbon costs of manufacture, transport, and construction of wind turbines. The wind turbine(s) proposed at Thoulstone will be manufactured abroad and transported hundreds of miles by sea and road to Chapmanslade. There is no benefit to our local economy from this process and, nationally, imports such as wind turbines, increase our trade deficit.

The materials used in the manufacture. and the transport costs, generate huge amounts of extra carbon. For example, there is a carbon cost to: the manufacture of the turbine, and transportation to site and construction; upgrading highways for access; soil displacement of hundreds of tons per turbine, as well as massive reinforced concrete foundations for turbine bases, crane pads, sub-stations and access roads: construction of on-site sub-stations: connection to the National Grid; running, maintenance and repair; dismantling (hopefully!) at the end of 25 year life, and disposal and reinstatement of site.

The UK does not require any more on-shore wind turbines

The Renewable Energy Foundation reported on 5th May 2014 that investments in renewable energy which have already received planning approval are sufficient to meet, and may exceed, government targets to 2020.

Any overshoot resulting from approving additional applications would cause a

breach of the Treasury's "Levy Control Framework" that caps the cost to consumers of subsidising renewable energy. Subsidies were reduced earlier this year, and David Cameron has stated that he will abolish wind farm subsidies if re-elected. Wind farms are not financially viable without subsidies.

Allowing one turbine will set a precedent for more

There is little doubt that if the current proposal proceeds then applications for many more will follow. The developers have already acquired sites for two turbines, and it is common knowledge that wind turbine companies have been approaching farmers to erect wind farms in Corsley and Upton Scudamore.

This is a David and Goliath situation. The wind turbine industry employs a powerful lobby to promote their case. We do know that without subsidies wind turbines would not exist. This is not a wind farming industry, it is a subsidy farming industry enriching big business and land owners at our expense!

We don't have the financial resources or contacts to compete with the wind turbine industry. This makes it even more important that, as a local community, we make sure that our voice is heard by our elected representatives, and the planners.

Next month, we will explore the harm which wind turbines cause to the natural environment and to the health and well being of those who live in the neighbourhood.



Tales from the passenger seat



Does confidence, or showing you are confident help when learning to drive or taking the test? Well, if one is genuinely competent, then confidence matching that competence is a natural and good thing. But false confidence can be a bad thing. Probably the worst is the young lad brimming with confidence who is totally incompetent. It isn't wise to ask a pupil to "be confident", or "show you are confident", because that sometimes manifests itself in the pupil driving faster than normal on the test in order to show the examiner just how confident they are, and then they fail for approaching danger too fast. The examiners do not worry about nerves – they allow for them: what they are interested in is a person's ability to drive competently. I have at any one time a number of particularly nervous pupils, and I tell them that as they become more competent, so they will become more confident.

It is not uncommon for a pupil to start off fairly slow in progress, but as they get the hang of driving, they realise that they can do it, and guite suddenly their progress climbs far more rapidly than we may have initially thought. Conversely, at times a pupil will start off with amazing progress physically. I tell them to do this and that, and they do it. Car control skills and therefore manoeuvres are no problem. Fine, until we get to the stage where the pupil has to start reading the road and thinking for themselves. So the initially very nervous pupil, can perhaps find themselves taking the test before their overconfident friend who started learning at the same time.

Sometimes a personal lack of self confidence will hold a person back. Sharon was a very accomplished driver. Her ability to read the road and control the car was extremely good. But her upbringing had left her totally lacking in self confidence. She had more lessons than she physically needed in order to pass the test, but she specifically asked for extra lessons so that she could feel totally happy within herself.

Sue had always been told she was useless at everything. In fact, as a driver, she was also very good. But she was racked with so much self doubt that despite knowing what to do at roundabouts, she would always do the opposite to what she knew was correct, because she had a deep-seated belief that whatever she did would be wrong, therefore best to do the opposite. It took a lot of hard work, cajoling, persuading and so on to get her mentally able to take the test.

Phillip was 32 years old, and had been involved in an accident when he was 17. It took him 15 years to gain the confidence to ring and book a driving lesson. Initially he was petrified and we made gentle progress avoiding anything too busy or narrow. Only when he felt he was more in control did he gradually become more relaxed and able to deal with other drivers doing things they shouldn't be doing. He had a young family so getting his licence was a seriously useful achievement for him.

All three passed and are just some of the examples I give to any current particularly nervous pupils I am teaching.

Neighbourhood Watch

Corsley's Neighbourhood Watch Coordinator brings us some sensible tips before we go on holiday

Everyone needs a holiday some time and however much we like our homes, there is nothing like a change of scenery. But we all want to come home and find everything as we left it.

Almost half of all burglaries happen when a flat or house is empty. You can help make your home more secure while you are away by planning ahead using the following tips.

- Make sure your home looks occupied. Ideally ask a trusted neighbour or a friend to look after it (collecting mail, watering plants, feeding your pets, etc.) Let them have a spare set keys but don't put your name and address on the keys.
- Don't leave curtains closed in the daytime as this shows the house is empty.
- Use automatic timer switches to turn your lights on when it gets dark.
- Cancel any regular deliveries such as newspapers or milk. Make sure the rubbish bin is not left outside for the duration of your holiday.
- Avoid discussing holiday plans where strangers may hear details of your absence from home
- Cut the lawn before you go and trim back any plants that burglars could hide behind. If possible arrange to get your

grass cut again if it needs cutting before you get home.

- Uncollected mail is a sure sign that you are away. Royal Mail's Keepsafe service will keep your mail for up to two months while you are away.
- Consider leaving important documents and valuable items with family members or a bank or lock them in a safe.
- Do not put your home address on your luggage when you are travelling to your holiday destination.
- If you normally leave valuable pedal cycles or similar items in your shed, consider putting them inside your house.
- Finally don't forget to lock all external doors and windows. If you have a burglar alarm, make sure it is set.

Just before you set off it's worth spending a couple of minutes checking that you've done all you had to do and taken everything you need with you. If you are travelling overseas don't forget your ticket and passport.

Finally for those of you who are going on holiday, don't worry - have a great time and enjoy your break away from home.

When someone cries

Caroline Le Vine, Counsellor in Corsley

You're with a friend. having a chat. Suddenly, your companion's eves fill with

tears. They begin to weep. What do you do?

It will depend partly, of course, on how well you know the person and the source of their sadness; on how close you are. But your reaction is likely also to be dictated by your own beliefs about crying and your attitude to your own tears, when they come.

Some people long to embrace a crying person: to comfort them and tell them not to cry. Others stiffen, panicking and horrified by such a display. A few will even leave the room altogether. Still others will begin crying, too. And there are some who will simply sit quietly, witnessing the tears. At most, they will lay a hand on their friend's arm, reassuring them of their continued presence.

For me, these vastly different responses tell us a lot about the person witnessing their friend's distress. The one who seeks to comfort may genuinely wish to nurture but are they also demonstrating their own unconscious desire to be physically close and to have their own inner pain soothed away? Do they tell the other not to cry to prevent their own pain being awoken? Furthermore, being told not to cry might seem like a comfort but it also denies a person the validity of their own feelings; it can easily shut them down as the message they hear is that crying isn't OK.

People horrified by emotional release probably aren't heartless but they do seem alienated from all feelings, their own included. What is it in their history that created feelings so unbegrable that they were forced to hide them away and made them unable to tolerate the feelings of others?

And if the companion cries alongside their distressed friend? It could simply be deep empathy or it could be that their own personal unhappiness is so close to the surface that it takes only a small trigger for that pain to be expressed.

The quiet witness might seem rather distant or even voyeuristic but you'll have guessed that this is how I sit with distressed people. I do this because I believe that unhappiness needs to be expressed unhindered. I witness and take seriously their grief and sadness and I don't attempt to stem their emotional outpouring either with words or with physical contact. It's important that the people I see know that I don't need protecting from the emotions that overwhelm them. This may be the first time that a client has experienced this kind of gentle strength and the freedom it can bring to them.
