

Lockdown Madness





Science: changing the world

Are we doing enough physical exercise?

Keeping fit and healthy has been emphasised repeatedly during the COVID-19 lockdown, but how much should we do?

In September 2019, the Chief Medical Officers of the four constituent countries of the UK issued evidence-based guidelines for physical activity for different age groups. Their report also emphasised the positive effects on health and the management of pre-existing conditions that exercise can have and addressed the impact of different types of exercise on muscle function, bone health and balance, for example. Special recommendations were made for people with disabilities, during pregnancy and after childbirth, and the specific benefits of exercise for these individuals were indicated.

Infants and toddlers should take exercise appropriate to their stage of development. Infants not yet mobile should be put on their tummy for 30 minutes in total throughout the day and encouraged to reach, grasp, pull, push, and roll over. Mobile infants should crawl several times a day and toddlers and pre-school children should spend at least three hours a day in suitable physical activity, usually games, preferably spread throughout the day.

Between the ages of 5 and 18 there should ideally be 60 minutes a day of moderate or vigorous physical activity, such as walking, cycling, running, ball games, or swimming. These help in muscle fitness, bone strength and the control of balance and movement.

Adults (from 19 to 64) should be physically active every day. Developing and maintaining strength is important and heavy gardening, carrying heavy shopping, or resistance exercises greatly help in achieving this, and should be done on at least two days each week. Cumulative activity of 150 hours a week of moderate activity (such as brisk walking or cycling) or 75 minutes of vigorous activity (e.g. running) or a combination of such activities is recommended.

Daily physical activity for those 65 and over is helpful in maintaining physical and mental health. Even light activity is beneficial. This group should aim to have 150 minutes of moderate aerobic activity a week, building up from existing levels if necessary. A shorter period of vigorous activities can be done instead. Weight-bearing activity will help maintain bone health.

For all ages from five upwards, long periods of being sedentary should be broken-up by light activity. I am not convinced that getting up from the TV to pour yourself another drink counts!

The benefits of physical activity have been known and widely reported for a considerable time, but most adults and many children in the UK are insufficiently active. This has impacts on the current and future health of such individuals.



One of the side benefits of the lockdown period is that more people have been walking or cycling for exercise as a means of getting out of the house. The roads have been quieter, making such activities safer. Let us hope that the interest in physical exercise is maintained once restrictions are lifted, protecting our current and future health and wellbeing.

To quote the CMOs' report on exercise: "Some is good, more is better".

syndicate is part of a large buying group across several Rural Community Councils.

The Community First oil buying scheme offers a way to keep heating costs down. It is run by Oil Fuel Poverty Solutions Ltd (OFPS), a social enterprise running the scheme on behalf of Community First Wiltshire.

Anyone who is interested in joining the Wiltshire Community First oil buying scheme should contact organiser, Marion Lathar on info@ofps.co.uk, or you can ring her on 01993 225011.

There is an annual domestic membership charge of £24 but there can be significant savings on central heating oil bills.

Once a month members are contacted by both Marion, and - if you live in Corsley - by the village organiser (me). The ordering deadline for **July deliveries** is Monday 29th June. Community First negotiators then obtain the best possible price. Members pay the oil supplier directly.

To give you an idea of prices: CF Oil cost in May 2020 was a staggering, probably never-to-be-repeated 19 pence per litre + 5% VAT; that's less than the price of milk!

Corsley Parish Council

Parish Council Briefing

Chairman, Neil Britten, rounds up the PC's recent activity

There have been no 'remote' PC meetings in the past month but one or two routine administrative matters have been dealt with and two planning applications received.

New planning applications

20/03523/FUL & 20/0404/LBC - Proposed change use of office suite to studio space and estate worker's flat at Corsley House, Deep Lane.

This application proposes conversion and change of use of part of an existing single storey outbuilding, separate from the main house. The external appearance of the building would be unchanged, with three existing access stable type doors fixed shut. The supporting documents for both applications are identical.

The deadline for comments is 19th June and the documents are available on the Wiltshire planning website. Notice of these two applications has been placed on the two village noticeboards and public comments are invited, to be forwarded to the PC Clerk or placed directly on the Wiltshire Planning website. The PC will collate it own comments through email exchange.

Footpaths

It is very evident that the excellent network of public footpaths and bridleways in and around Corsley have been very well used and enjoyed during the weeks of CV-19 lockdown. The sunny weather has allowed un-precedented, almost continuous, access and the annual

springtime burst of flowering and greening of trees, hedges and fields has been a wonderful antidote to the strictures of lockdown. Gill Parking, the PC Footpaths representative, has asked that I raise a couple of issues which are both worth bearing in mind when enjoying the local footpaths.

The first is that of respect, both to the landowners through whose properties the paths pass and to others using the paths during this period of social distancing. Most paths are easily followed over stiles and routes marked by the passage of many feet, others are less so and often unofficial routes are created. The latter are tolerated and we are very lucky to have very wide access the Longleat woods around Corsley along routes which are certainly not public rights of way. Such access should not be taken for granted and the freedom not abused. It is also key to this tolerance that livestock, crops and field boundaries are not disturbed or damaged. Unruly dogs off the lead are a particular nightmare for farmers.

The second issue also relates to dogs. Poo bags are regarded as a necessary adjunct to dog walking nowadays and have their place where there is heavy human traffic and habitation, particularly where children play. However, there seems to be a widespread belief that used bags can be left hanging on stiles, hedges and banks, etc. Please take them home or dispose of them in your bin.

A362 road safety improvements at the Heath

The details of this project were included in last moth's brief and we have now received notice that the current plan is for the work to start on 25th June, with an expected duration of two weeks. The precise details of interruptions to access and road closure have not yet been published but will be put on The Bridge website as soon as they are known.

Campanology News

Since I wrote last month I have discovered that we should not have even been going into the church to wind the clock or change the flag but, fortunately, we have now been given permission to continue this so, although lately you have not heard the clock, you will from

I joined the virtual ringing on the Saturday I mentioned last month and found it great fun. Not easy, as although I could hear and see the others, they could not see or hear me with no webcam or mic making replies to them rather slow when having to be typed. It improved greatly once I acquired some!

Generally, when learning something new it can be a great help to stand behind someone experienced and follow the path (the blue line as it is called) of that bell without having the responsibility of actually handling the bell. Virtual ringing is midway between ringing and standing behind. You ring the bell yourself by hitting either the 'H' key for handstroke or 'B' key for backstroke. The bonus is that if you ring at the wrong time you can join in at the next stroke, whenever is the correct time, without trying to manhandle a rather large and heavy lump of metal. This is just not possible when actually ringing as mistakes often result in total chaos!

I found that at first I could fudge my way through several new methods without completely destroying the whole performance and having rung quite a few times now with much more experienced ringers I have gradually started learning methods which I would never have been able to attempt on actual bells. Some of the more basic ones (on six bells), I hope to not only be able to try ringing on actual bells but also pass on to the rest of the band. Those on eight, ten and twelve bells I may not get the opportunity to try but I hope I may one day.

Virtual ringing is not for everyone. Some really do hate it especially a lot of the more experienced ringers who have rung for many, many years, rely on things such as ropesight, watching which bells ring in which place and where they pass the treble. These are all hints as to where you are in the blue line and not possible on the computer.

On more mundane things I am still struggling to get permission to paint the Ringing Chamber but hope this will come through in the near future. In the meantime keep digging, weeding, pruning and now watering and please, take care.

Household Recycling Centres



reopen with postcode entry system

All of Wiltshire's household recycling centres (HRCs) are now open with an easy-to-use postcode entry system to help limit the number of people on site at any time and ensure social distancing. We expect the sites to be extremely busy during this initial phase of reopening, so please consider whether you really need to visit the sites during the first week or so.

You should only visit HRCs on the days that correspond to the first part of your postcode. For example, if your postcode starts in BA12, you can only visit the sites on Monday 1st June, Wednesday 3rd June, etc - see table opposite.

You can visit any Wiltshire site you choose, so while you are limited by the days you can attend, you can attend any Wiltshire household recycling centre on these days - though please be sure to check the latest opening times before you set off, as many sites will need to operate very differently to previous arrangements. You may be asked to provide a proof of address in order to use the household recycling centre, so please bring it with you. Here are just a few frequently asked questions to help, the full list is available on the Wiltshire Council website.

Is there a limit on how many people can travel in a car?

In order to ensure social distancing is adhered to, we're currently only permitting one person per vehicle. We'll review this after the initial opening period. Blue Badge holders can bring another person with them in their vehicle to unload waste - please display your Blue Badge clearly in your vehicle front window.

What are the guidelines to visit the HRCs?

You should wear your own gloves when you visit a HRC and dispose of your gloves after your visit responsibly. Please stay at least 2m away from everyone at all times. You must not attend a HRC if you are symptomatic with COVID-19 or at home shielding.

How long are the queues likely to be?

We are expecting queues to be long, potentially with waits of several hours. Please check our website and social media channels before travelling for updates.

I've seen your postcode entry system, does this mean I will need to bring proof of address to the site?

Yes. Please make sure your proof of address is clearly visible in your vehicle window. Acceptable examples include - driver's licence, council tax bill, utility bill (paper and electronic are acceptable) or your van permit if you are travelling in one of those.

Can someone on site help me dispose of my waste?

No. Staff cannot help you move your waste so we kindly ask that you do not ask them to.



Six Open Doors

Dear Friends,

I am writing this letter as the first tentative steps are being made to ease the lockdown restrictions so I don't know where we will have got to by the time you read it. I am enjoying video calling my baby grandchildren, who are now laughing and smiling; it's no substitute for actually holding them but I'm trying to remain thankful for small mercies.

I fear I am going to repeat myself a bit, but the view out of my study window is such that I feel compelled to make my letter a kind of ode to the glories of our surroundings. I write on a beautiful day of bright sunshine; the garden and the countryside are an explosion of green loveliness that gladdens the heart and reminds me that despite the uncertainty of these worrying times, the natural world is going about its business as usual. The earth continues to gently turn and the seasons come and go as they always have done as spring unfolds into summer. I cannot believe that the end of this month it will be the Summer Solstice, the longest day of the year in the Northern Hemisphere. Of course this year there will be no gathering at Stonehenge; for the first time in history the solstice celebration will be live streamed instead. These long light days means that our chickens enjoy a very late bedtime indeed and they are scrabbling to be let out of their house very early in the morning as soon as the sun is up. If I am a bit late getting up they make terrible racket and fall over one another in their eagerness to get out of their quarters and find their breakfast.

As I said, I feel like I'm always banging on about the countryside, but I really think when we are anxious and there is no certainty to be found anywhere, consciously focusing our attention on the natural world has a very calming effect. Julian of Norwich, a 14th century anchorite famous for her visions encapsulated in her book 'Revelations of Divine Love' wrote 'All shall be well and all shall be well and all manner of things shall be well.' When I really give my attention fully to the landscape around me, to the trees and the hedgerows, the wind and the birds, the earth speaks deeply to me of our creator and of his all encompassing love and faithfulness, and that yes, all shall be well.

This morning at Morning Prayer we had one of my most favourite psalms in which the psalmist writes:

'May the pastures of the wilderness flow with goodness and the hills be girded with joy. May the meadows be clothed with flocks of sheep and the valleys stand so thick with corn that they shall laugh and sing.'

The psalm paints a wonderful inclusive picture of the whole universe praising God together; virus or no virus, the whole of the created order is held in the beating heart of God.

I leave you with a few words from another of my favourite poets T S Elliot:

'At the still point of the turning world. Neither flesh nor fleshless; Neither from nor towards; at the still point, there the dance is, But neither arrest nor movement. And do not call it fixity, Where past and future are gathered. Neither movement from nor towards,

Neither accent nor decline. Except for the point, the still point.'

May you find your still point in this turning world, and may the peace of God, which passes all understanding, be yours now and always.

We have recently seen a spate of thefts of Land Rovers and Quad Bikes across the county and we would like to make you aware so you can consider extra security to protect your property.



- Photograph your quad bike from all sides, mark it with your postcode, make it easily identifiable and list the serial/chassis number
- Fit with a tracker system from a reputable company
- If possible, install alarms in the unit where it is stored. CCTV systems, beam alarms and wildlife cameras should also be considered where possible
- Use wheel clamps, anchor bolts and high quality padlocks
- Immobilise It when not in use and keep out of sight consider blocking in with other heavy items
- Always remove the key!
- Report any suspicious activity. Often areas are scouted out a few weeks prior to a theft - alert your neighbours on who should or should not be on your premises
- Join local social media groups where possible that can make you aware
 of current issues

If you see anything suspicious dial 101. Always ring 999 in an emergency or if a crime is in progress.





Trevor Brain, one of our regular preachers, is the Regional Coordinator for Operation Mobilisation. They have a large ship which is a floating bookshop and were visiting Central America when lockdown hit. They are currently tied up in the harbour of a

Cement Factory in Jamaica which is closed down. There are four hundred crew and staff on board and supplies come in a container, which is dropped on the harbourside and they form a human chain and load all their supplies on the ship by hand. All forthcoming visits to European ports are cancelled but it's hoped the ship will visit London, Edinburgh, Belfast, Liverpool and Cardiff, arriving 22nd December 2020 in Cardiff. A man in Brazil walked for two days to visit the ship to get a Bible in his own language, and was shown a rack of Bibles to choose from.





For those working from home, or maybe no longer working but still trying to keep a semblance of normality for the sake of children and young adults now back home, suddenly our outside space is so important to our mental and physical wellbeing,

Our gardens have become our classrooms for learning, our outside gym, our relaxing space and our escape from the hourly worries of the outside world.

News from the farm

After our very wet winter, spring came just as the seriousness of the pandemic hit us and so the chance for animals to be let out of winter housing into the sunshine and fresh nutritional natural pastures changed the workload on the farm.

COV-ID19 is having little impact on the day-to-day work on the farm, farmers and food producers have been identified as key workers and we continue to produce milk to honour our supermarket contract with Sainsbury's. Sadly those producing milk for the catering trade found the market for their milk disappeared almost overnight. Their milk has had to be destroyed, causing a real financial headache for those dairy farmers

Essential deliveries to the farm have caused some headaches – with supplies of machinery spares, seeds, fertiliser, oil, etc., dependant on the rules of each of the companies.

Thankfully, our contractors who undertake our fieldwork, silage making, manure spreading, ploughing or spraying have all done sterling work, working within government rulings on hygiene and personal distancing.

Management of the staff and their welfare is all-important as they work in close proximity to one another. We have been very grateful to Mandy Bain and Kate Holland for making face masks for the staff in the milking parlour.

Some of our staff decided to isolate to protect their or their family's health; again we have been most fortunate in being able to employ a couple of local people who were no longer able to work in the catering industry, who had good knowledge of food production and hygiene standards.

Our most recent Polish employee has now arrived on farm and is sitting it out in the confines of a caravan for two weeks' quarantine.

We are pleased to be tuberculosis-free for the first time in five years with clear tests in October, January and March, allowing us to sell surplus stock at market, taking the pressure off staff, housing and feed.

My nature notes this month must include the joy of hearing and seeing so many lovely sound and sights of spring. My highlights so



far are seeing a live hedgehog in our garden (it is many years since I've seen one) could it be due to less traffic on the roads or the fact that the population of badgers has decreased!

Longleat woods have been host to an absolutely beautiful show of bluebells, wild garlic, honeysuckle and marigolds; the cuckoo was heard near Cley Hill on the 12th April, and regularly since in Roddenbury Wood; the return of swallows and house martins in profusion after their safe crossing from Africa to Europe during the lockdown (with no mass shooting of birds in Mediterranean countries.)

Some good things must come from this pandemic, we must appreciate the fabulous local countryside, the regular delivery of newspapers, post, milk to our doorstep, kind neighbours and friends willing to collect prescriptions and groceries, Jon and Jo at the Cross Keys for hosting the HUB, the pop-up shop and takeaways available two nights a week (and the collection point for the Food Bank) and especially the people in our villages working on the front line in hospitals, caring services and all the other 'front-line' jobs.

A special mention to Hayley, the caterer at Heywood House, who cooked and delivered over 80 meals to celebrate VE Day, with contributions going to the British Legion.
