

Notice of Road Closure in Corsley

Wiltshire Council

Section 14(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984

Temporary Closure of: C274 Deep Lane (part), Corsley (Ref: TTRO 3375)

Notice is hereby given that Wiltshire Council has made an Order to close temporarily to all traffic: C274 Deep Lane (part), Corsley; from its junction with A362 Corsley to its junction with Cley Hill Lane.

To enable: Wessex Water to carry out Water Main replacement.

Alternative Route: via A362 Corsley – Corsley Heath – Heathway – The Hollow – C275 Lyes Green – C274 Deep Lane (unaffected length) and vice versa.

The closure will be clearly indicated by traffic signs throughout. The Order will come into force on **22nd April 2014** and it is anticipated the **works will take 9** weeks to complete. The Order will have a maximum duration of 18 months.


STOP PRESS!



Your chance to air your views on...

Traffic chaos in Corsley

It is undoubtedly true to state that the volume of traffic running through the Parish's lanes has increased significantly over the last couple of years.

The cause can be clearly identified with the combined effect of the recent commercial development of Lonaleat and the arrival of the Steiner Academy to Corsley School in 2012.

To a certain extent Longleat has always had an influence over our roads and it seems only to be concerns over caravan movements that have prompted action from those directly affected including our Parish Council Chairman, Neil Britten, who happens to be one of those living on the affected route.

It's also important that residents of Corsley, whether affected directly or indirectly, express their views on the effect the 'fall out' the Steiner Academy has caused to the village with those living in the hamlets directly affected; Huntenhull Lane, Deep Lane, Lyes Green, The Hollow and Heathway/Corsley Heath experiencing a number of issues including, unfriendly behaviour, aggressive driving, excess speed, destruction of verges with consequential impact for soil wash off to block road drains and the dumping of litter from vehicles.

Sadly the Traffic Plan that the SAF proposed as part of their planning campaign never came to fruition and now with two full years in occupation, the number of individual

vehicle movements has never been so high. No surprise when virtually all of the 150 odd pupils travel in from outside the village to attend a school which was geared for no more than 120 children at its peak, many of whom would have happily walked to school in safety. Today's pedestrian can be greeted with no more than danger, anger, mud and worst of all - sadness. Where has our lovely village gone?

Those relying on the SAF vacating the site this summer at the end of the stated twoyear programme should think carefully before relying on this happening. With so little progress so far converting the Victoria Road hospital site to the main SAF School. are we expecting a third year to take up occupancy – perhaps in more 'temporary' wig-wams just to fit the extra numbers in? Why not fit 225 cars down our lanes?

The Parish Meeting in March is a chance for you to raise your concerns to the Parish Council who do have an influence over this matter. They hold the long lease on the adjoining land and their duty is to serve and protect the Parishioners first and foremost.



World War One

The Great War?

In this centenary year since the start of World War One I am reminded that my grandmother, Anne Eagles Garrett, wrote about accompanying her husband to the battlefields in France shortly after the Armistice.

They were newly married and she was in her early twenties. He was involved in the 'clearing up' operations. She wrote...

"On rare occasions James would allow me to go with him and another officer to some devastated battlefield

I saw what had been the town of Albert. There was, quite literally, not one single building, or part of any building, still

standina. Everythina completely flattened like a aigantic rubbish dump. We must have walked miles without seeing any vegetation. No grass, no tree, iust the scorched brown earth.

We met two horse drawn carts: three British soldiers walking beside each cart. James

told me these soldiers were lifting the hurriedly buried dead of the battlefields, and taking them in these rough carts to the newly acquired cemeteries for decent burial. James stooped to chat cheerfully with the soldiers. It seemed to me like stopping a funeral procession for trivial talk. I could not bear it – I could not believe my ears; this casual unnecessary banter in the actual presence of the dead. I walked on ahead shocked and horrified, I thought among these sacking covered shapes could be one of the much loved boys from home.

Presently we heard bitter crying and found an aged peasant woman staggering about among the debris, obviously looking for something. I understood very little of her story, but managed to gather she had returned to Albert on foot from some

> faraway place to which she had fled; and actually

hoped to find her cat amonast the rubble.

It was tragic. We could not comfort her. She had nothing left in this world but the rags she wore. Home. sons, friends – all had gone. I prayed through that night that at least she might find the

poor lost cat. I could not for

many weeks sleep without hearing all over again that terrible crying. One could imagine she might well stay in that desolate place, starved and utterly alone, her previous past torn from her."

Does anyone else have memoirs/memories to share?



Since then her flock has grown to 50 hens and she has learnt over the years that chickens thrive and lay best when they live outside in open fields. They eat mostly grass but also nearly anything green and like to perch off the around and have dust baths. They also need hen houses with perches and nestboxes, to keep them safe from foxes and other predators. Charlotte showed us slides of the many different breeds, each with their own characteristics and distinctive colourings and markings. Charlotte explained that it depends on the breed as to whether they lay large or small, brown or white, or even blue eggs! If you want to keep hens at home, Charlotte suggested starting with either 3

Not so 'sterling moss'

Rob offers some practical help to deal with pesky moss in your lawn...

With all the rain and flooding we have had over the last few months, lawns will be showing signs of moss and other winter damage; now is a brilliant time to start improving it. There are a few stages to go through in order to turn an old, established lawn into a lush revitalised one. If the lawn is more than 4 years old you may start to see weeds which have self-seeded such as dandelions, clover, etc., and if the lawn is poorly drained or flooded you may see moss

There are lots of products on the market to help improve your lawn either by conditioning it or by removing problematic weeds. A great place to start is with a 'Weed, Feed and Moss killer', which does exactly what it says, handling all 3 tasks in one go. However, sometimes this 3-in-1 application can fail to deal with the most persistent weeds. My tip is to use the 'Weed, Feed and Moss killer' initially, to kill off the moss and the less established weeds, as well as feed the lawn followed by an application of Verdone Lawn Weed Killer to kill off those more troublesome weeds.

If your lawn is very old and has more than 1/3 of moss then I would recommend using lawn sand. Spread it over the mossy areas and after a few days the moss will turn black and die; then, using a scarifier you can pull out all the unwanted dead moss. Once the lawn has been scarified, rake up the moss

and clear it from the lawn. By scarifying you also help aeration of the lawn, it also lifts the grass sward that has grown horizontally, encouraging upright growth which can be chopped back when you next mow.

Repairing your lawn

If your Lawn has become patchy and bare in places, then you may consider re-sowing with grass seed or, for instant results, turfing.

To seed a bare patch you need to lightly dig over the area, rake flat and remove any stones. Lightly consolidate and rake again to loosen the surface, broadcast sow good auality lawn seed followed by Growmore fertiliser and water well. The seed should aerminate within a week – keep the area moist for best results.

To turf a bare patch or disused piece of ground carry out the same level of preparation, unroll and lay turf in strips, staggering the joints. Use planks to walk on the turf which will aid good root to soil contact, ensuring quick rooting. Water well and prevent from drying out, keep everybody off for up to 3 weeks to prevent damage to the newly rooted turf.

With any new lawn ensure that the grass is mowed slightly longer than normal so that the new grass can shade itself and prevent it from drying out.



Corsley Parish Council

Parish Council Briefing

The Chairman presents a round-up of a busy meeting held in February

There was one Occasional PC meeting in February, convened at short notice to consider three planning applications and take reports on the ongoing discussions about Lonaleat Caravan traffic and plans for the Annual Parish Meeting (APM) on 10th March in the Reading Rooms. There was also a Community Area Transport Group meeting (CATG) at which a couple of Corsley related items were discussed.

Planning Applications

The three planning applications were:

Memorial Playing Field

An application to remove dead branches from three trees on the north east side of the field, supported by a full tree survey. There was no objection to this proposal

Gloworm Cottage

The new barn on the north side of the property had not been built in accordance with the original plans and an application for retrospective approval was turned down last year after the PC had pointed this out to Wiltshire. The latest application was to alter the external cladding on the north and west elevations to the original plans and introduce a screening in the form of a hedge and trees on the northern boundary of the property. There was no objection this proposal.

Squires Coal Yard

A revised outline planning application had been submitted reducing the number of

houses from three to two and re-positioning them across the south western end. with one right up against the vard south eastern boundary. Comments had been received from neighbours in Roddenbury View concerning the ridge height and proximity of the proposed houses to their rear gardens, which, together, represented significant intrusion on their privacy. The PC agreed with their concerns and registered objections to the plans on these grounds.

Longleat Caravan Traffic

A further meeting was held on 24th January with Wiltshire Highways, the Caravan Club and Lonaleat to continue discussions on alternative caravan traffic routes into Longleat to mitigate the problems reported in last month's brief, namely to:

- Improve safety by reducing the probability of queuing on a dangerous junction with the A362 at Lane End.
- Reduce the risk of collision at the A362 junction and other critical points in the present route.
- Lessen the likelihood of log jams and damage to private property.

The proposal developed at the earlier meetings, to separate entry and exit traffic, was accepted by Wiltshire Highways as feasible. In general terms the preferred solution is to direct entry traffic into Longleat via Whitbourne Springs, Longhedge and Knapp's Gate and exit traffic via Lane End, as now. A final decision, at the APM,

will be subject to the results of a public consultation with the affected residents. Details of this proposal and the letter sent on 17th February to all those on the 2012/13 Electoral Roll in the affected areas will be published on the Bridge website (www. corsleyandthebridge.co.uk).

Annual Parish Meeting

The main theme of the APM has now been settled and will be a presentation and public discussion about the opportunities presented to Corslev through the concept of Neighbourhood Plans. These are intended to allow Parish and Town Councils to construct and "own" their development plans as joint ventures with other Parish bodies and professional assistance and finance from local authorities. A local referendum is a key part on the process of acceptance of a plan, which would cover such issues as where and how (or not) to develop Corsley, open space and community facilities and local design policies.

At the APM, a presentation will be given by James Proyer, a Spatial Planning Officer and a leading light in the County's promotion of Neighbourhood Plans (there is a full page advert elsewhere in this edition of the Bridge). The desire is to have the largest possible public audience for the presentation, to allow all to ask questions, offer views on what a Neighbourhood plan could do for Corsley and who might wish to be involved in its development. The PC needs to come to an informed view of how it should proceed in this matter.

I have put a Wiltshire guidance document on the PC part of the Bridge website, plus a Powerpoint presentation that I used at the December PC meeting on the subject. I would urge you to look at these before the meeting. The APM agenda will be on the usual public noticeboards (Cross Keys

and triangle bus shelter), the Bridge website (www.corslevandthebridge.co.uk) and on posters dotted around the village.

Streetscene

As last month, the streetscene has been dominated by the weather, both wind and rain and the consequences for floods, silting up of road drains and fallen trees. Again, my thanks to those stalwarts who have been out and about poking out drains, towing cars out of lakes and cutting away the results of fallen trees. This whole area was the subject of heated debate at the last CATG and two things became very clear from the discussions.

First, is the most obvious, that we are just one of a multitude of areas affected and priorities have to be carefully exercised. Threats to life and flooded homes are top of the list and the crisis management teams in Salisbury are working very long hours to put limited resources where they are most needed. There was a clear message that self help is a vital part of the equation.

The second clear message was that the new contract and system put in place last year for "Community Stewarding", with Balfour Beatty (BB) doing the work on the ground, got off to a very shaky start: BB were underresourced in terms of vital equipment at the start of the contract. This meant that normal Autumn maintenance work didn't always get done, e.g. clearance of road-side debris.

This situation was compounded for us in that we were without a Community Steward for about three months and the replacement has only just been appointed. Simon Jasper has now taken her around the Lanes and our problems have been well exposed. High on this list are the state of Deep Lane and the Chatter Alley/Temple/Sturford areas. Wiltshire are signed up to ditch clearance (Temple) gully blowing (Temple Sturford and

Chatter Allev) and the removal of packed mud at the bottom of Sturford Lane and Temple. The land drain at the back of the Dve House has been cleared (thanks to Clare Bayman) which has reduced the flooding by about 75% and Simon is trying and get Wiltshire to clear the mud at the eastern end of Sturford.

My thanks also go to the Steiner School (SAF) whose Staff were very active on 12th February helping to cut off the branches of the tree which blocked the road at Divers Bridge, with assistance from Phil Jefferson and Shane McKee, and with unblocking drains around Pool Farm. The sight of the SAF Headmaster, Trevor Mepham, poking out a drain with a delicate white and pink spotted parasol, knee deep in the pouring rain and mud, will live in my memory!

CATG

There were three items of interest to Corsley. First, budget was allocated from Community funds as a contribution to the additional signage required if the new Lonaleat caravan traffic entry route goes ahead. Second, Highways agreed to look at providing a proper passing place at the bottom of Gey's Hill. Lastly, the position of the speed limit review of the route from Lane End to the Corslev Chapmanslade boundary was consolidated in the priority list.

Footpaths

Wiltshire council have recently been checking the public footpaths in the parish and where necessary clearing and tidying them up, but there are some still to be sorted out. The kissing gate in the Hollow has been repaired and fitted and is a great improvement. Gill Parkinson is now getting together a list of local people interested in walking who will keep an eye on nominated paths and report any problems, which, if they are minor, we will sort out, but, if are more serious, will be reported to Wiltshire County Council for them to deal with, Gill has asked that walkers keep an eve open during their perambulations and contact her on corslevfootpaths@btinternet.com if they spot any problems.

Here's hoping for an improvement in the weather and see you at the APM. Don't forget to use CLARENCE in the mean-time for streetscene issues.

Potholes and other nasty surprises...

Road defects? Report it!

In June 2013 the existing Parish Steward service was folded and replaced by a contracted out arrangement based on 16 teams of 4 tasked through an IT-based reporting system. The contract is run by Balfour-Beatty and covers the whole of the County, In addition, a Council employed Steward Co-ordinator was provided on the basis of approximately one per 15 parishes (based on Community Area Transport Group areas of responsibility). The latter's task is to provide a conduit for Parish Councils through a nominated councillor to allow considered input to the Stewards work.

What is the impact?

- The ground level knowledge of a dedicated Parish Steward has been lost.
- We are now in direct competition with other Town and Parish Councils for a limited resource.
- The routine assessment of work required has been largely lost; one Steward Coordinator for 15 parishes is too little, covering too much. They do their best.
- More reliance is placed on internet and telephone reporting.
- Arguably, assurance on work quality and delivery is weaker.

What we can do?

 Make sure we report potholes, floods, blocked drains, blocked culverts and obstructions. Get our neighbours to do the same; two reports have more impact than one, and so on. Be realistic about

- what the Stewards can do (they are about maintenance, not road improvement, that's another chapter.)
- Follow up if no action is taken or it is inadeauate.
- Some self-help: kick mud off drain covers when out walking, make sure drains on your land are kept clear of debris and mud, rod drains and unblock culverts where it is possible to do so in the area around your own property.

How to report problems

- By telephone CLARENCE 0800 232323
- Through the website allowing photographic evidence: www.wiltshire. gov.uk/parkingtransportandstreets/ roadshighwaysstreetcare (you will need to open a reporting account; straightforward).
- Use the 'My Wiltshire' App for Android and IPhone (allows photographic evidence and location information from any embedded GPS (available on Google Play).

Lastly, let me know of your reports if you have the time. A quick note giving the problem, the location (nearest address, Ordnance Survey map reference or description) and the allocated Council report number, will help the Parish Council in follow-ups with the Steward Coordinator. Bus Fare Consultation

Local residents across the West of England are being asked what they think of bus services in their area in a major consultation exercise being run by bus company, First.



The latest review will look at all First's bus services covering the West of England areas outside of Bristol's inner zone. The consultation follows a similar major review of bus fares in and around Bristol last year. which led to significant changes being implemented with children and young people getting much bigger discounts on travel and the whole structure of fares in the city changed.

Under the banner 'Fairer Fares for All', people will be asked to fill in either hard copy or online questionnaires regarding their use of buses, sharing their opinions regarding the fares charged. The results of the questionnaires will then be analysed by independent transport consultants before decisions regarding any subsequent changes are made.

Hard copy questionnaires will be available on buses. in libraries, in council onestop-shops and in First's own travel shops to further aid people's ability to feed back their thoughts. A number of customer-facing road shows around the region are also being arranged. Separate consultation events will be

Phil Jefferson reports on the February meeting of Chapmanslade Parish Council and on other parish matters

Planning

We are only offered a few days by Wiltshire Council to comment on planning applications and invariably this means we are unable to discuss them at our scheduled monthly meetings. Where we feel a meeting is necessary to look at particular applications, or residents affected by the proposals ask us for their support, we do meet. Otherwise, we inform Wiltshire that we have no objections. Last month an application was submitted concerning a proposal to build a 3 bedroom detached house at the vacant plot at 102A High Street. Although this was for a two-storey building, and an earlier application that had been approved was for a bungalow, we raised no objection so on this occasion a meeting was not necessary.

We understand that the application to extend the barn currently under construction at Sienna's Valley in Huntenhull Lane has been withdrawn. Apparently the building had been constructed in the wrong position. We await developments.

Highways

Our road surfaces have been badly affected during the past few months because of the appalling weather. Wiltshire Highways are aware of all the faults as we send them a monthly report on highway maintenance issues. Please make a particular point of ensuring that your visitors, or tradesmen working at your property, are aware of our concerns.

Crime

Happily, crime is not a major problem in our village although from time to time incidents do occur. Unfortunately, a motor mower was recently stolen from the shed at a vacant property in the centre of the village so do take care at all times and make sure all outdoor buildings are secure.

Also, a few weeks ago, a rug was stolen from a local stable in Chapmanslade, and it appears that a few similar items have also gone missing in and around the local area. More worrying, some horses have had their manes plaited, which is an indication that they may be targets for theft in the future. We hope there will not be any reoccurrence of these incidents but it is most important that the police are informed whenever something like this occurs. Also, they are not able to bid for resources for the area if they are not made aware of what is happening. 

Many other similar comments and selfish road sense confirming they were going to be a menace to all made me really wish I had booted them out of the car rather than try to instil some good sense into them. I could go on, but you will have already ascertained that they were both immature idiots.

Then I had Toni. A lovely lady of 32, but statemented with a mental age of 11. Unfortunately, her mother wanted Toni to learn to drive. Initially when I took Toni on, I was able to get her physical ability to control the car and perform set routines up to a reasonable standard, but it then swiftly became clear that her ability to see danger, analyse what was happening and then make a sensible decision was never going to happen; her mental processing was too slow. A great shame because she had a lovely attitude and tried really hard. I gently got the conversation round to her deciding that perhaps driving was a bit too scary and continuing to ride her bike would be far healthier. Unfortunately this did not go down too well with her mother. So Toni was told to go with another instructor, who happily took her money, and 3 years and 6 tests later, somehow, Toni passed. Hooray? No, very much no. Toni did not have the capacity to understand her limitations nor predict danger. After she had written off three Minis, all ending upside down in ditches, (fortunately Toni wasn't hurt), her mother finally decided that maybe Toni should not be driving after all. Lets be glad no one else was hurt each time Toni crashed.

Life can be so unfair: the first two lads, fully equipped to drive sensibly, were purposely intending to be dangerous. Yet Toni, really determined to do her best, had been dealt a bad hand that prevented her from being as safe as she undoubtedly would have liked to have been.

Neither of the two lads realise that if they continue driving as they do, both could end up far more incapacitated than Toni.

A view from over the hedge...

Countryside Matters

March can so often be the real beginning of Spring. The snowdrops should be giving way to daffodils and, provided the temperatures are sufficiently high, hedges can start to green up. There might even be some early birds nesting.

What will it be like this year?

We have seen winter rains far in excess of anything experienced in over 100 years. huge areas of the West Country have been flooded, battered by coastal storms, and experienced tree-felling gales. At the time of writing there is no news of a change in the weather.

Our thoughts must be with the people who have experienced the flooding first-hand. Having filthy water rushing into your house, soaking all your possessions and wrecking your well-ordered life must be horrendous. Whole villages have been without 'normal' services for many weeks and the debate continues to rage over how to prevent such widespread damage in the future.

So, what does flooding mean for farmers? It can mean disaster.

Firstly animals have to be moved to higher ground where they can be fed and kept healthy: particularly difficult with sheep, which are now lambing. Generally stock is being moved to auction sheds where they have to be given winter feeds. If nowhere is available then the animals go to slaughter, with the related financial losses

Flood meadows are a traditional means of providing a spring flush for grazing followed

by good summer grass, but for this to work the flooding has to be controlled carefully. Grass will survive for about three weeks under water: it's tough. However, most grass on the Somerset Levels has been underwater. for much longer and will be dead. When the waters recede, the sodden fields will have to dry out before being re-seeded. Most farmers take their first silage cut in May: it is very unlikely that the new grass will even be growing by then, leading to further hardship in the flooded areas.

We must keep all these people in our minds now and over the long-term.

What do the floods mean for our wildlife? The response to this is more varied: some species appreciate more water - the ducks are happy! However, the majority are suffering from too much water covering their winter feeding-grounds. There will also be a knock-on effect with a lack of insect and small mammal life in the flooded areas: species that feed on these will be hungry through the coming months. Please keep feeding in your gardens: it all helps our wildlife to survive in these extraordinary times.

Meanwhile, we must hope that the rain will stop and that Spring will be with us all very soon.



Exhaustion

Feel like you're dragaina yourself around? No longer excited about life? Fantasisina about aettina

more time to yourself in order to rest? Run down? Prey to cold after cold? If you recognise any of this, you might be exhausted. Sometimes, we have to work a little harder to keep all the plates spinning and, short term, we can manage; ensuring we get as much sleep as we can, eating well and perhaps sharing responsibilities with others can relieve the pressure. But if that exhausted feeling persists, maybe we need to take a closer look.

It could be that you're expending a lot of energy psychologically on keeping something at bay – is there some unacknowledged pain within you? It's easy to underestimate how tiring it can be keeping that pain under control. Equally exhausting can be not expressing your feelings to someone else – do you need to say something important but feel unable to? It may feel terribly risky to look at such issues but, if they are ignored, they don't just vanish; they grow. And then they become even more difficult to suppress, take more energy and exhaust you further.

What to do? Well, if it was easily tackled, you'd have done it by now! I've often turned to writing if I can't express or even identify what's going on for me. You could try the same. It's not for anyone else to read – just to help you begin to unravel the problem. Making sense isn't immediately important

 just try putting down on paper what you feel or what your questions are. Trust that something useful will emerge. Or, if you feel that talking it through might help, find someone who will listen. It might be me but it could equally be a friend or colleague you trust not to judge and not to tell you what to do. Getting the words out there, in whatever form, can really start to clarify what you feel and what you need to do to resolve things. And when you do, you may well find your energy levels rising again.
