

# **Playing Field update**

Winter is nearly over and we have just cut the cricket square for the first time. In the next few weeks we will be planting a new hedge of wild harvest trees (hazel, blackthorn, crab apple, elder, dog rose, rowan) which we were gifted as part of the Queen's green canopy.

We also have our first pavilion booking in the next few weeks, a sure sign that spring is coming.

As you know the Playing Field is looked after by a team volunteers who work hard to ensure it is available for villagers to use all year round. This is a big task and starts with our spring tidy to get the field looking great for everyone to use through the summer.

This year, the field spring clean will happen on the 1st April between 10 am and 3 pm as part of Cricket England's Get Set weekend.

#### Dear Friends,

# **Parish Council Briefing**

Councillor Adam Oakley rounds up the PC's February meeting

The parish Council meeting on 9th February opened with an announcement that the planning application for a new house on land behind 92 High Street (Item 9 on the agenda) would be deferred to the next meeting because new drawings and detail had been submitted that same day and neither councilors or members of the public had had the opportunity to consider them.

Several questions were asked by members of the public regarding the previous meeting and the planning application mentioned above. Councilors, the clerk and members of the public clarified the situation and explained procedures.

#### **Highways progress**

A request for funding for a topographical survey to be carried out on the High Street in the area of the school was approved by the Warminster Local Highway and Footpath Improvement Group (LHFIG) and the parish council agreed to fund 25% of the £2000 cost.

#### **Gore Lane flooding**

The wet weather this winter had seen areas of the bridle path, Gore Lane, with a considerable amount of water flowing along it. Efforts are underway to try to reduce this problem by diverting some of the flow away from the sunken lane.

#### Planning

The application PL/2022/09808 Land south of 92 High Street, Demolition of stables and

construction of new house, has been deferred until the next parish council meeting on 9th March.

The council considered an appeal to the refusal decision for application PL/2022/05649 for demolition of existing agricultural building and erection of two residential dwellings and garage at Thoulstone Farm. The parish council decided to stand by its original comments and objections and added further objections against the appeal arguments.

#### Next meeting

The next Parish Council meeting is on Thursday **9th March** at Chapmanslade Village Hall.

# **February news**

Patricia Sharrocks and Liz Garret round up the February meeting and announces some forthcoming events

# INSPIRING WOL

The meeting this month was held in the Reading Room and the speaker was Jen Gale, who described herself as a 'knackered Mum of two' who has become an expert in living a more sustainable(ish) life.

About ten years ago Jen and her family decided to live a whole year without buying anything new. She kept a blog throughout the year and has since written two books on how all of our actions can make a difference.

She began by saying only 10% of people are taking steps to stem the climate crisis and suggested we should all do one thing to help.

Most people realise the world is warming and Jen said it is only possible to limit that warming by bringing about unprecedented change.

Pushing the planet beyond the temperature range it can deal with results in damage to ecosystems. As evidence of this she pointed out that we no longer have to remove the bodies of insects from our windscreens after a journey because there are now fewer of them than there were twenty years ago.

She told us that as citizens and consumers we have influence over Government and institutions as well as our neighbours and friends, suggesting for example, that we use our voice to ask retailers what they are doing to reduce their negative impact on the planet.

Using 'The Buyerarchy of Needs' diagram, by Sarah Lazorovic, Jen talked about the actions we could consider before buying

anything new.

She told the meeting about a zero waste shop in Frome called Denude (Bath Street) where you can refill your own containers. She also recommended using community hire shops, websites like Freecycle, Olio and Vinted and, of course, charity shops.

Another idea was to leave things in the basket when shopping online. Coming back later can often make you realise the purchase is not necessary.

Talking about waste, Jen told us that half of all food waste occurs in the home. She suggested a shelf in the fridge labelled 'Eat Me First' for leftovers and half used packs of food. HRIFT

Food packaging should be recycled whenever possible and supermarkets are now offering recycling facilities for flexible plastic.

Jen told the meeting that changing your bank to one whose investments are more sustainable has more influence than reducing the number of flights

we make.

## Wonderful Walks

#### A watery walkabout



You won't get wet unless it rains, or you fall into the Kennet and Avon canal or River Avon! This walk at Bradford on Avon uses the canal towpath, so park along Moulton Drive because it's free, checking you aren't on double yellow lines. Cross the grass where cars are parked; descend onto the towpath and turn right.

You'll pass a war-time 'pillbox' on your right, then go under a road bridge, and walk till a boatyard appears on your left. The first turf for the Kennet and Avon canal was cut here, in 1794. This area is Bradford Wharf, which had a gauging lock for boats to be weighed. Tolls were worked out and paid for in Canal Cottage, now Kennet and Avon Canal Trust's café. Walk past the lock, cross this busy road on the crossing and turn left, then go right alongside the Lock Inn, where I have my second (yummy!) breakfast!

Past the Lock Inn, the wide muddy path returns you to the towpath. Walk on, passing

the 14th century Tithe Barn, where local people's church tithes were stored before Henry VIII's Dissolution of Monasteries. Now walk a mile or so, to a modern swing bridge and footbridge over the canal. The swing bridge is for Water Board vehicles needing the far side of the canal, but its Chief Engineer, John Rennie, designed the original swing bridges used on this waterway; there's still one near Dundas Aqueduct and the Limpley Stoke Canal Centre.

If you want a wilder walk (in boots, mind!), use the footbridge and go right, through woods and fields, to a road downhill to Avoncliff Viaduct, an awesome piece of engineering! John Rennie designed this, too, an aqueduct with right-angled bends at each end. Avoncliff had its own railway station, built in 1854 and necessitating a fourth span addition to the aqueduct; hopefully, the station and the canalside pub near the towpath, survived the pandemic. When you've explored, re-join the towpath and go left, back to the footbridge.

Exit the towpath here, using the tarmacked road downhill into Barton Farm Country Park. Turn right on the road and head towards town, watching out for occasional traffic. Where the river's close to the path, look for kingfishers in the trees, waiting for fish to catch! The path curves left and you'll see Canoe Club buildings across the water, plus a packhorse bridge. The Tithe Barn complex is on your right, but stay on track and head under the ugly railway bridge. When the path splits, stay left, alongside the river. You'll see the Parish Church tower and an old boating launch 'pad', across the river, and pass the town's swimming pool and buildings on your right. Next comes 'Timbrell's Yard' restaurant: where their patio ends, go right, into a car park with public toilets.





Looping left round the car park, you'll reach the riverside and ahead is the McKeever footbridge, named after a local gold medallist kayaker at the 2012 Olympics. Go right before that, on the Jazz Carlin path,



across the road (more yummy!). The station's a rare, complete example of Isambard Kingdom Brunel's station style, built in 1848. Enter the platform and use the footbridge over the tracks, then the path with yellow safety railings, into a new estate. Follow the road left to its end, then go left

named for another local winner, of two silver swimming medals at the 2016 Olympics. This path passes through an old wall 'doorway' into gardens, where an iron-fenced archway has a plaque recording the flood level here in October 1882. Stay on track, with the town bridge ahead, and the 'blind house' or lock-up at its righthand end. Finally, you'll emerge

onto the town's main road, turn right and head for Westbury House, built in 1720 for a clothier and the site, in 1791, of a riot against scribbling machines, by local workers fearing for their jobs. Charles Timbrell, a dyer by trade, bought everything here in the mid-1800s.

Pass the house and traffic lights, take the right-hand turn into the station car park, with Harlees excellent fish and chip restaurant



and right to the main road;

turn right here. Past the recreation ground, turn right again into Pound Lane and look out for the Red Man! Back on the towpath, walk to the main road and cross it, go right, cross again and turn left beside the bridge. You should recognise where you are now, after a good three-mile walk (more if you visited Avoncliff)..!

## Whitbourne Chapel

It is God who arms me with strength... 2 Samuel 22, v33

### Benaiah and a snowy day (2 Samuel 23:20-23)

Benaiah is only known because "he went down into a pit on a snowy day and killed a lion". The name Benaiah means 'God has built' and if ever a man was 'built' well and 'armed with strength', it's this little-known warrior. I wondered, "why, how and what does this tell me"?

### Be supportive and encourage people

Benaiah was a contemporary of King David, leader of his bodyguard and one of his 'Mighty Men', the only one who killed a lion in a pit on a snowy day. David also killed a lion and a bear before he killed Goliath, so Benaiah's mentor believed and challenged him, earned respect and inspired his men.

#### Look at problems as challenges

A man-eating lion was terrorizing Israel. They could hold a meeting and brainstorm for solutions, form a lion task force, discuss how to protect themselves from the lion. Benaiah acted; he pursued the lion. There's no indication anyone else was with him. Had he failed we wouldn't know about Benaiah, but he took a chance, and is today just one hero in the most-read book in history.

### Take on challenges and build on success

Before the lion, Benaiah killed two fierce warriors at the same time, odds of 2:1. He

already had a reputation, as he once killed an Egyptian giant, using a spear wrenched from the giant's own hands. He didn't jump into the lion pit without previous training, experience, and success. Success breeds success.

#### Do not be afraid to fail

What would be more tragic at the end of your life, regrets for things you tried and failed, or for things you never tried? Benaiah chased opportunities; success was huge. It not only put him in the Bible, he achieved the highest position in his profession, general of the nation's army.

#### Jump into the pit

The Bible doesn't tell us Benaiah was afraid, but I'm sure he was. Fear's natural, but nothing indicates that he hesitated.

My belief is, he never thought he'd lose. **Do not wait until it stops snowing** Don't wait till everything's perfect in your life. Momentum is defined as the impetus gained by a moving object. Move and kick-start other things to move, or do nothing and nothing happens.

Benaiah is so understated. Overshadowed by King David, and by David's son, Solomon, Benaiah lived to serve both kings. My final thought? Live a life worth remembering, and worth others telling stories about.

## Recycling let's sort it!



#### A view from over the hedge...

# **Countryside Matters**

As I write this on the 18th of February, I am aware that the countryside is waking up from its winter sleep. Already the hazel catkins are blowing in the wind (it's so obvious why they are called lambs tails!) they readily spread their pollen attracting and feeding early bees.

Down by the river the willow trees are showing their sticky buds and the moles who have been buried down low during the cold and wet weather are now rising in search of the worms now closer to the earth's surface. For gardeners this is a blessing and a scourge – mole hills on your lawn is a sign of healthy worm movement and the hills make wonderful seed potting soil, but they do rather spoil the appearance of the lawn.

In the next month or two the silage and hay fields will be harrowed and rolled so that the mole hills are scattered and will not get into the silage or hay crops and make them unpalatable.

We have enjoyed seeing flocks of birds on the recently harvested fodder beet fields, the harvester has obviously just turned over the good sandy soil removing the beet and leaving lots of worms and insects on or near the surface for hungry birds and mammals.

The cock pheasants are attracting the hen pheasants in numbers, their plumage looking very attractive to the rather plain hen pheasants; I wonder they know that the shooting season is over?

It's too early for blackbirds to be mating, but there is a lot of activity in the hedgerows, I do hope this is not a false spring especially since the winter hedge trimming is still being carried out,

This last week we have been able to let the

cows out for some exercise – they have been smelling the spring air as they are confined to their warm covered yards. Their joy of running to the fields to taste the fresh grass and feeling the sun on their backs is quickly forgotten when the temperature drops and the wind and showers come and, after just a few hours, they are glad to be back in the covered yards! As the weeks push further into spring they will enjoy longer daytime hours in the fields.

Cattle have been responsible for a number of deaths to dog walkers; cows may now be in fields that have been empty all winter, so please check if it is safe to enter a field and make sure that dogs are on leads (unless you are being chased in which case you should let your dog off the lead). Dogs enjoy smelling newborn calves and lambs and their mothers will be very defensive of their young. Pheasants, partridge and ground nesting birds will soon be laying eggs and hatching their young, dogs and people can easily frighten them causing the birds to abandon their nests and chicks.

Frogs and toads will be migrating to their spawning wetlands and ponds so do take care on the roads if you see a group trying to cross.

For those who missed my rainfall records last month, I recorded 33.67" in 2022 and 33.39" in 2021. Nature has its ways of balancing out our rainfall, we just have to adapt to new wetter and hotter weather in the months that we are not accustomed to.

Enjoy the coming months with the late snowdrops and early daffodils brightening up our verges.
