



Dear Friends,

As you read this we will be well and truly in the season of Lent. Lent is a funny season as many people have heard about giving up something as we enter into the Easter story, yet do not really understand why we do it. We associate Lent with fasting. In the Bible we are told that we might fast in order to try and get closer to God, it helps focus our hearts and minds as we allow other distractions to fall away.

It is common practice to give up chocolate – especially for those who hate the stuff! Some choose to give up alcohol, or meat, others go without a meal one day each week, some will give up screen time or in particular their TV. It is incredible how much time you regain when you switch off the TV!

As a Christian I have practiced fasting through Lent giving up an hour of sleep each day to start my day with prayer instead, I have indeed given up things like the TV, and meat. Rather than focusing on what I am missing I tend to focus on something more positive for example my time with God, and how I love my neighbour. The 40 days of kindness challenge recently released to our local schools pick up on this idea, that each day through Lent try do something extraordinarily kind. We are being selfless in the act yet practising what Jesus taught us exactly – love thy neighbour. Can you incorporate one selfless act each day into your daily schedule? It will involve sacrifice, thoughtfulness, love, and careful listening as you discover the needs of those around you.

Through Lent we remember the passage that tells the story of how Jesus was flung into the desert by the Holy Spirit. We must remember this is not a punishment, it is an opportunity to grow and to understand God's purposes within the world. This is what happened to Jesus. He was able to focus on God's will and not give into the temptation to be relevant i.e. feeding the world, to be spectacular, as he resisted throwing himself off a high place, and to be powerful, by resisting the temptation to take control of the world. Jesus chose instead to follow his Father's footsteps to humbly serve the world through love, mercy and grace. This Lent what will your focus be?

Chapmanslade Parish Council

Parish Council Briefing

A well-attended public meeting was held on Thursday 8th February to discuss the perceived pro's and cons of a report received from the Taking Actions on School Journeys team at Wilts Council (TAOSJ). The report was the culmination of several years' work by the village school and the PC to improve road safety in the vicinity of the school. Many valid issues were highlighted during the meeting, and all will be forwarded to Wiltshire Council as part of the consultation process. Thank you to all who participated in the meeting and to Chapmanslade Primary School for canvassing parents on this matter as well as its ongoing work to improve road safety in the vicinity of the school. There still remains a small window of opportunity to email your views. If you want to do so, please email using the subject TAOSJ CHAPMANSLADE to either: chapmansladepc@yahoo.co.uk or travelplanning@wiltshire.gov.uk

After the public meeting there was a Parish Council meeting, a summary of which is below.

An update was given on the Resilience Plan which is now taking shape after a meeting of the core team. Planning will be done on the K.I.S.S. principle with significant reality checks in place regarding the capability of the village team to deal with events during a major crisis and an emphasis on communication in adversity.

The proposed paint lines to mark the entrance to the Village Hall were agreed with Wiltshire Council and, with funding in place, work will start in due course.

The updated Village Plan was agreed to allow further work to go ahead on the 'what's next' agenda. It was requested that a short piece be added to reflect Chapmanslade now

coming into the extended Great Western Community Forest area. Many thanks must go to Terry Rose for all of his work updating the Plan.

Planning applications

PL/2024/00784: Householder planning at 63 High Street. for conversion of an existing garage to a granny annex to house a coresident family member. There were no objections.

PL/2024/00328: Full planning permission for a bat barn with office and store at Thoulstone Park Golf Club. The PC objected to this on a number of grounds based around a lack of clarity in the application and uncertainty where the building would actually be based. Other concerns were that what was being applied for was far in excess of a previous condition outlined in a planning permission and with the additional ground floor amenities of kitchen, office and store gave the impression of a small dwelling rather than just a dwelling for bats.

Councillors also discussed the School Journeys Report to date, whilst the PC has supported the process, it had not met to discuss the detail. There were a number of points of concern some of which echoed residents' concerns outlined in the earlier public meeting. The PC wants to look at options but is mindful not to cut across the public consultation process which must run its course.

2024 marks the Parish's 90th birthday with 6th April 1934 being the date of the first PC meeting. We are looking forward to an article in the April edition of The Bridge by Terry Rose and the History Group about some of the history of the Parish and the PC.

February news

Patricia Sharrocks rounds up the February meeting



The guest speaker at our last meeting was Alice Moore from the Garston Veterinary Group. The Group was declared 'Green Veterinary Practice of the Year 'in 2023 at the Webinar Vet's Virtual Congress. Winning the award was the result of several years' careful thought and changes brought about within the practice, and was one of several awards the Group have won recently.

It began in 2019 when a group of colleagues set up a sustainability team with the aim of reducing their carbon footprint and the carbon pawprint of their clients. As a focus they started working towards bronze accreditation with iiE, investors in the environment, which is a national scheme to help businesses reduce their impact on the environment. The Garston Group achieved the bronze award in August 2022, the first of three levels – bronze, silver and green. They have since gained the silver award, and were also declared the 'Best Carbon Reduction' Winner last year.

The team began by focusing on easy wins; remembering to turn appliances off, switching to LED lights and promoting efficient use of heating and air conditioning. They reduced the use of disposable items such as antiseptic wipes, switching to smaller pads and reusable wipes. The amount of paper used was reduced by moving towards online billing and using both sides of the paper when printing. They moved on to using bamboo toothbrushes and paper bags, rather than plastic ones. The staff use the Ecosia search engine, which uses the majority of it's profits

to plant trees around the world.

The practice now uses washable theatre caps and aprons rather than disposable ones, and bedding used for in-patient care is also washable, as the evidence is that this is more sustainable, even allowing for the washing process. Medical procedures have a big carbon footprint so recyclable drip bags and sustainable anaesthesia are used.

The Garston Group have considered the outside of their surgeries too. Areas have been planted with bee friendly plants and some plants their patients might enjoy - fresh parsley for rabbits!

The Group promotes welfare friendly agriculture and sustainable pet ownership. They encourage owners to reduce the carbon pawprint of their pet; for example by buying products that are in recyclable packaging and considering the materials used to make toys and where they come from.

The talk was very informative, the awards won by the Garston Group are well deserved and Alice's presentation clearly highlighted areas of sustainability we may not have thought about before.

Corsley WI will meet at the Reading Room in March when we will hold our Annual Meeting. This will be followed by a workshop to make a living wreath of spring flowers. We normally welcome guests at our meetings but spaces are limited for this event and all the available guest spaces have been taken.

This month's walk included two surprises in the making. I've been catching buses everywhere since March 2023, and thought I knew all the local choices. But another passenger on the main Salisbury bus told me about a 'Wylye Valley' Service, a surprising meander alongside water meadows to Salisbury on Tuesday, Friday and Saturday at 9.15am; I can alight in a village

For this walk, though, I used Beeline Service 24 and got off near the railway station, where I found Surprise Number Two. By the station entrance, a green bus pulled in – a private service to Stonehenge and Old Sarum. The journey isn't cheap, but it gives me more possibilities for 'Wonderful Walks'! I can pay the fare only (£,18.50) or pay entry

fees, too. Thrilled with that discovery, I set off on this walk, finding the far end of the station car park (for those needing it!) and turning left, towards an exit onto Churchfields Road. Cross the road here and turn left again, turning right into Mill Road. Along

> here you'll find Fisherton Island - a private estate - and maybe swans,

> 'Walk on By' (who sang that?) and ahead, on your right, you'll find a pretty mini-garden with a path first, leading right onto a wooden footbridge and Harnham Water Meadows. These meadows

are awash with man-made channels and ditches, remains of a 17th century farming initiative that allowed the warmer waters of upland streams to heat the cold, flat pastures here. This provided early grazing for

and walk until the bus returns!

sheep – essential for local weaving industries. The meadows are an 84-acre site bounded by the Nadder and Avon rivers. Wander the wide tarmac path and Salisbury Cathedral is away to your left. After some distance, you'll cross a tarmac footbridge with sluice gates and find you're approaching West Harnham. The Old

Mill Inn, on your right, looks out on a former mill pond and I was glad the doors opened at 11am, when I did this walk! I stopped for facilities and a cuppa, but if you do this trip and wish to eat here, ring and book a table



enter the field and walk diagonally across, to where you can see traffic on a busy road away to your right. I kept with the drier lane instead, walking out to Lower Street, which is where you'll arrive walking the field way.

> There's a long trek on that street, then, to reach the traffic on the A3094, Harnham Road, which has a pavement, fortunately. Turn left and keep walking, until you pass All Saints Church on your right. Take the next turning left, still Harnham Road, walk past the Rose and Crown on your left and on again, till you find the Harnham Local shop on your right. At the T-junction, go left into St Nicholas Road until it splits at a Y-junction, then turn left along pretty De Vaux Place, which eventually goes through the Harnham Gate arched

first, because the place became busy as soon as the doors opened.

de Vaux Place

When you leave, turn right and head to the end of the Mill Pond, where there's another water meadow; this is Harnham Meadow and Cricket Ground and it's where John Constable set up his easel, etc, for his famous painting of the Cathedral. There's no hard path through this area, but if the ground's dry,



gateway in the Cathedral Close walls.

The Cathedral is away on your right, so use the tarmac path to pass it and reach the busy road round the Close, North Walk. Go right again, then left at the parking attendant's booth and you'll see another gated archway to your left, past almshouses on the right. Through the arch you're on Salisbury High Street, walking to crossroads, where there's a pedestrianised section of the High Street ahead. If your car's at the station, go left round Prezzo Italian Restaurant granddaughter Jess and I have wonderful memories of pasta dishes in there! - and pass Rechabite House, named after a family in Jeremiah 35, who didn't drink wine. The Rechabites here were a teetotal Benefit Society, founded 1835. Walk on and you'll eventually recognise Mill Road; on your left will be Queen Elizabeth Gardens, then Fisherton Island; your car isn't too far away! If you parked at the Cattle Market (Central



Car Park), walk through the pedestrian High Street and turn second right, onto Silver Street, then left on Minster Street. Use the walkway beside Salisbury Library and you should recognise where you are and where your car is, after a good three miles of exercise..!


