# Little Cuckoo's Pre-School Textile Collection



Wednesday 9th May, 2pm

We are pleased to announce that the school has organised a textile collection with **Bag2School** in order to raise funds for **Little Cuckoo's Pre-School**.

**Bag2School** are the UK's leading textile recycler and fundraiser working with schools and since its inception in 2001 they have now paid out over £8 million.

As well as raising vitally needed funds for our school, it also helps the environment by helping to divert unwanted textiles away from landfill. A recent DEFRA report has shown that textile collection schemes are helping to reduce the volume of textiles discarded as municipal solid waste. However it is a fact that as a nation we still send 1,081,000 tonnes of textiles to landfill every year.

By getting involved in our **Bag2School** collection, you have an opportunity to sort through your cupboards and wardrobes and donate unwanted textiles in the bag provided – this can include adults' and children's clothes, shoes (tied together

please), hats, belts, bags, soft toys, curtains and bedding (not duvets or pillows). We will receive £500 per tonne or £0.50/kg which will be a great boost for our fundraising. In addition it will also raise awareness amongst the children of the benefits of recycling and reuse.

If you fill the donation bag and still have more then you can use any other bag to donate your items and don't forget to ask grandparents, friends and neighbours to have a sort out as well!







# **Three Open Doors**

#### The Rector writes:

The spring has been wonderful this year. Most people have enjoyed the dry weather and sunny days, in spite of knowing that the lack of rain was problematic. The weather is always crucial in farming and gardening, and already having hose-pipe bans in place, this year will be no exception.

In May, the church marks Rogation-tide with prayers for the land, those who farm it and animals and crops raised on it. This year, special rogation services will be held in Horningsham and in Corsley (details elsewhere in the magazines). The services will give an important opportunity for the community to come together to ask God's blessing on our local farms and all whose livelihoods depend on the land.

In spite of the problems of rain or lack of it, most people enjoy a good standard of living, a varied diet, shelter and warmth. As we think about our own farmers, it is right that we should remember those less fortunate than we are, and Christian Aid week which falls this month, gives us the chance to do that. Christian Aid's philosophy is not just to offer hand-outs but to educate and enable people to stand on their own feet, establish their own businesses and support their own families by the efforts they make. Christian Aid envelopes will be available in the churches of the Benefice if you wish to make a donation.

Against this background, it is salutary to realise that there are people locally who find themselves unable to cope because of illness or redundancy, and that is where the local Foodbank comes into its own. So perhaps, during May by way of thanksgiving for all the good things we enjoy, we could donate an item or two to the Foodbank. This can be done when we shop in Morrisons, Warminster – they keep a large box for the spare BOGOF items we care to donate. Or put donations in the boxes in one of the Benefice churches.

Enjoy the spring and all that is seasonal. Remember those who produce our food and those who go without through no fault of their own.



# **Countryside Matters**

Hedge-laying is a resurgent countryside craft which I have taken up since retirement. It involves the thinning out of the hedge and then the cutting of the remaining stems so

that they can be bent over whilst remaining alive. This allows the hedge to grow back from the bottom to produce a stockproof hedge. It is usually quiet when you are working on a hedge with only pheasants, rabbits and sheep for company. This allows time for contemplation of what is happening around you.

Unfortunately, often the first sign of the disease on a farm is the birth of deformed offspring as the virus only causes mild signs of illness in adult animals that are easily



Recently, I have been able to watch the young lambs with their mothers while working on a hedge in Corsley and this got me thinking about Schmallenberg disease. This is a virus infection which effects sheep, cattle and goats causing the lambs, calves or kids to be stillborn or born deformed. This can very disheartening for the farmer as well as causing financial problems as the deformed lambs or calves have to be put down, or the mother has to have a caesarean operation to deliver the lamb or calf

Like any virus infection there is no treatment for the disease and it appears that it is transmitted by biting insects such as midges. It is a disease that was first diagnosed during the summer of 2011 in the small German town of Schmallenberg after which the disease was named. It has subsequently been diagnosed in most European countries and has steadily spread through the southern counties of this country. Because it is transmitted by midges the disease probably reached this country in late autumn last year via midges blown on the wind from the continent.

missed and from which the animal quickly recovers. As there is no vaccine available yet the only way of controlling the spread of the disease is by controlling the midges that transmit the disease. This is usually done by the application of chemicals to the livestock during the summer months to kill or repel the midges.

As far as we know this virus has no effect on humans, but there are other infections that are transmitted to humans by biting insects that are active at this time of year. Ticks which are, in fact, members of the spider family transmit Lyme disease to dogs and humans and many other diseases to cattle, sheep, deer and cats. Ticks are blood suckers and need to feed at this time of year as the weather warms up. They sit in long grass and undergrowth waiting for any warm blooded animal to pass by. They then crawl onto the animal and start sucking blood and it is during this process that they will transmit the bacteria that can cause disease. The most widely known disease is "Lyme disease" which can be very nasty in both humans and doas. Cattle can suffer from several diseases transmitted by ticks

one of which is known as "Red Water Fever" because the cattle will produce red urine while they are suffering from the disease which is often fatal to them.

At this time of year and through the summer you should be regularly checking your dog [also your cat, cows and sheep] for ticks and removing them as quickly as possible with special forceps. [You should not do this by just pulling them off as this can leave the tick's head burying in the animal's skin where it will cause infection.] Alternatively,

you can use various chemical products and collars to stop the ticks getting on the animal in the first place.

After all this talk of various animal diseases I am pleased to report that the lambs that triggered the thoughts all looked fit and well as they gambolled about and the hedge is greening up nicely as the new leaves appear.



# The Olympic Torch comes to Frome!

#### Where is the Olympic Flame going?

The Olympic Flame will come within 10 miles of 95% of people in the UK, Isle of Man, Guernsey and Jersey. It will enable local communities to shine a light on the best their area has to offer – including celebrations of local culture, breathtaking landscapes and dynamic urban areas.

On the morning of **Tuesday 22nd May**, the torch will depart Taunton and head through Ilminster, Yeovil, Ilchester and Somerton on its way to Street and Glastonbury.

# **Whitbourne Chapel**

**May Speakers:** 6th Mr R Stone – oldest member of the congregation, at 93

One of our preachers last month was Dr Mansfield from the Gideons. 'The Gideons International' dates back to 1899 when three men met in Janesville, Wisconsin, and decided to promote God's word without charge to others. Most of the early Gideons were commercial travellers, which led to the idea of providing Bibles in hotel rooms. They also provide thousands of New Testaments to school children every year.

Dr Mansfield told us that, following the death of six British soldiers in Afghanistan recently, the army allowed the Gideons to provide all soldiers from that regiment with Bibles before they were deployed in Afghanistan. These Bibles are special with camouflage covers and a gilded regimental badge.

When I go away, I always look for the Gideon Bible in my hotel room and ask for one, if I can't find it. The same is true of hospitals and surgery visits – reading the Bible while I wait keeps me calm and allows me to remember what's right in my life, not what's wrong.

At the beginning of Lent, one of the Chapel members suggested we choose to save a specific amount of money each day until Easter and donate the final amount to a charity of our choice. #### Chapter 5

Setback and Success

At just about the time of the founding of Whitbourne Chapel, God's work was progressing well in India. From the printing press at the Baptist mission came translations of the Bible in Bengali, Sanskrit, and other major languages and dialects. Many of these languages had never been printed before. The printer had to create the scripts for the type by hand. In March 1812, a fire in the print shop caused £10,000 in damages and lost work. Amongst the losses were many irreplaceable manuscripts. However, the press itself and the punches were saved, and the mission was able to continue printing within six months. In Carey's lifetime, the mission printed and distributed the Bible in whole or part in 44 languages and dialects.

# **Neighbourhood Watch - Corsley**

## Watch out, watch out the robbers are about!

There has been a break-in to a garage in Corsley recently. The 2 locks were forced and the intruders gained access to the garage. Fortunately the owner had removed the battery to his ride-on mower the previous night so the machine could not be moved easily. No other equipment was taken.

This is a timely reminder to us all: do not leave your garden equipment on view inside your shed or garage when in your garden or washing your car. You will never know whether someone has decided to break in until it happens. If it is a petrol driven lawn mower, leaf blower, strimmer, chain saw, etc, mark it in such a way that it has no value to the thief because it is easily identifiable.

Have you considered painting your equipment in a vibrant colour so that the thief cannot sell it on easily without spending his money or time on it cleaning it up before moving it on? If you have a ride-on mower have you thought about fitting a tracker to your machine? How about fitting an alarm in your shed or extending your house alarm to your garage. Of course there is a cost, but it will possibly be less than the combined cost of the replacement machinery, policy excess and an alteration to your premium for your home insurance policy for loss of any 'no claims bonus' when you next renew your home insurance policy the following year.

Beauty spot thefts are still a problem in the area. People park their vehicles and usually leave them unattended for a couple of hours while they head off on their walk. Thieves

take advantage of this and windows are often smashed to gain access to sat navs, incar DVD players, CD players and, in some cases, laptops and handbags that have been stored under seats. Do not lock bags or anything of value in the boot as someone near by or in another car could be watching.



Please do not leave anything of value in your car – either carry it, leave it at home or lose it!

Wendy was thanked for her organisation in the kitchen at social events.

Tim Humphreys, treasurer, reported a successful year financially. Income from regular user group has increased slightly, and casual hire was up 50%. # Myth #2 – you have to be in crisis to seek therapy

It's true that many people wait until they reach crisis point before coming into therapy and that this is a crucial time to be getting the help you need, but counselling can help in other ways as well as offering emergency support. Some people become aware, for example, that there is something in their past which troubles them and which they've never addressed, having assumed that everyone else feels the same. As they grow older and make contact with other people, they realise that perhaps their experience might be having an ongoing detrimental effect albeit at a low level. Others find themelves stuck in a bit of a rut and feeling restless without

knowing why and still others find certain aspects of themselves puzzling and want to explore. All of these are good reasons to seek the help of a therapist – personal development is as legitimate a motivation as crisis.


