The Vice-Chairman's update on the forthcoming PC elections

The most important news this month is that nominations for election of Parish Councillors on Thursday 2nd May are now all in. Disappointingly, these numbered only seven for the nine seats and the Returning Officer has issued formal notice that all nominated are elected to the Parish Council unopposed. There will thus be no election for Corsley Parish Council on 2nd of May. (I hasten to add that there will be a contest for our West Wiltshire Council representative, so please don't forget to vote on 2nd May in this election).

Those now elected to the Parish Council are myself, Mike Butler, Robin Chapman, Olly Hares, Judith Helliar, Gill Parkinson and John White, subject to formal declarations of acceptance of office. Malcolm Holley has retired and Michael Clarke did not seek re-election.

The Parish Council can and will continue to exercise its role with the numbers elected. but we are duty bound to try and fill the two vacancies. The process that will be followed is that the Parish Council will coopt new members selected from those who express an interest. Any of you who wish to be involved in local affairs and help to influence what happens in Corsley please apply to me by 12th May, applications to be accompanied by a personal statement giving your reasons for wishing to become

a Parish Councillor and a brief CV all on one side of A4. These will be considered at the AGM on 13th May.

Also at the AGM, the new Chair and Vice Chair will be elected.

Our Parish Clerk, Sally Evans, will be standing down at the end of April and we hope to have a new Clerk in post by the date of the AGM. I would like to publicly record our huge thanks to Sally for fifteen years of service to the PC and her enormous contribution to the supporting administration, without which we could not have functioned.

Since last month, there has been one occasional PC meeting, primarily to consider three planning application, the new elephant 'retirement' compound in Longleat, a garage/workshop re-build in Dertford and an extension replacement in Sturford Lane. The PC recorded no objections to any of them.

Corsley WI May News

At the open meeting on 11 April 2013, Julie James gave a talk about 'Seafarers Tales' to members and visitors. Julie is a 'Ships Visitor' and works at both Southampton and Poole Docks in a voluntary capacity, welcoming sailors arriving on container ships from abroad after many months at sea.

The crews often come from warmer climes such as India or the Philippines, have never been to England, do not speak English and are completely unprepared for our freezing cold winter weather and the bitter winds on the high decks. Wearing hard hats and high visibility jackets in a dangerous dock environment, Julie works with other volunteers and takes woolly hats and neck warmers for the seafarers, giving out as many as a thousand hats in a week! Over a million seafarers come in every year but they have barely any time ashore and the ships are usually docked quite a distance from the town centre. However, a Southampton based charity for sailors' welfare has a minibus which can take the men to a room provided in the security office, where they have access to the internet, are able to call home and rest and relax for a while from their tough, lonely and dangerous jobs.

Once the men understand that she is offering them hats, treats and church

Three Open Doors

The Rector writes:

In April, our parish held its Annual Parochial Church Meeting. This is like the annual meeting of any organisation. It gives an opportunity to review the past year, to look at the organisation's finances, to look forward to the events of the current year and very importantly to thank 'supporters' for their continuing commitment.

The present financial climate is challenging for us all. Most people find themselves 'watching the pennies' a little more than in the past as they try to find ways to economise. This is true domestically. It is true for our churches. It is quite right that the members of any organisation support it financially. However, not many organisations with relatively small membership have the responsibility of maintaining listed buildings of which our parish has three.

There are frequent misconceptions about church finance. Many people assume that churches are supported from central funds. This is NOT the case. Congregations all over the country are expected to contribute to their respective dioceses, [in our case - Salisbury] in order that clergy stipends, housing and pensions can be paid. This payment is known as 'the Share' and calculated annually, and is based on the number of worshippers/members. That cost is in addition to the general running costs incurred keeping our churches open and in use. There is a significant and increasing shortfall between income and expenditure, particularly noticeable for upkeep of fabric.

It is sometimes frustrating when financial matters take so much time and energy. However, given the size of the challenge with which congregations are faced, it is not so surprising. In the meantime, enjoy the rich heritage that our churches are, and rejoice that they continue to be valued and available!

Alarming increase in cold-callers targeting local residents

There has been a spate of nuisance telephone calls recently by a company called Direct Response Systems attempting to sell alarm systems. I am aware of a number of residents, including me, who have been contacted by this company. I received the email below from our PCSO, which explains the Police response to this type of direct selling. If you are considering installing an alarm or upgrading an existing system, you should contact a NACOSS registered installer, your home insurance company, or if you have a neighbour who has one ask who they used.

"I have received a couple of emails today from local residents who have received cold calls from a company trading under the name of "Direct Response Systems". The callers are offering very cheap or free alarms in return for an appointment to survey your property with a view to installing an alarm system. There is intimation in the sales script that this is part of a Crime Prevention Initiative, which is being run in conjunction with local Police. The calls are originating from the number 0121 270 0730

Wiltshire Police do not work in conjunction with this company or

with any other companies selling alarm systems.

If you wish to purchase this type of product I would recommend that you do not buy from companies that cold call to make an appointment with you, as you simply do not know who they are. Trading Standards and Age Concern both have schemes where you can find or verify legitimate companies (Buy with Confidence/Approved Traders).I have spoken with Trading Standards today and they would like to hear from anyone who has an appointment with this company. If you have please let me know and I will forward details to them.

Another email arrived in my inbox from our PCSO, which I have copied below for you for you to read containing, amongst other things, useful information about the Telephone Preference Service.

"I have just received the information below from our Community Safety Team as we have had a few of these calls in and around the area. Cold Calling is on the increase and some heavy

pressure sales tactics are being used to sell products, especially in the area of Home Alarms. Trading Standards and the 'Op Liberal' National Team are looking at a number of companies who are acting fraudulently in this area. Reducing the number of cold calls will inevitably reduce the number of offences.

Unsolicited (cold) calls and mail are not only a nuisance, but can also lead to pressured sales and sub-standard goods being sold at premium prices. To avoid unsolicited sales calls and mail in the future you should remove your personal details from any sales lists. This can be done by registering with the Telephone Preference Service (a free service)

Electoral registers

Electoral registers are updated each autumn and are lists of all the names and addresses

There are two editions of the registers; a full register which is used for elections, preventing and detecting crime and checking applications for loans or credit and the edited register which is publicly available for marketing and any other commercial activities. When renewal notices arrive, consider only registering for the full register by opting out of the edited register. Spring in full swing

Filling in the gaps...

At this time of year everything is just coming into its own, the perennials are poking up and the spring growth is making everything look like it's flourishing.

There are jobs to be doing, bedding to be planted out and, as summer is just around the corner, some plants are flowering already. So now May is here, you can see what you've got, where the gaps are and what didn't survive all that frost and snow in January's big freeze... Maybe it's time to think about a few additions to your garden?

Herbaceous perennials are a fantastic way to add height, fill in the gaps and add colour to your garden so here are a few good additions to any garden.

Penstemon - Bright, colourful flowers that add a little height even in tubs.

Dahlia - Blooms continuously throughout the summer and there are hundreds of varieties to choose from.

Heuchera - Vivid foliage of lime greens, apricots and purples. The feather-like flower spikes appear in summer and it keeps its leaves year round. A perfect plant to fill in and add contrast between all those showy blooms.

Lupin - A plant which adds a splash of colour in any border, and fills in the gaps between low growing and tall perennials.

Delphinium - Beautiful bushy plants with tall flower spikes in blues, purples and

pinks – makes a great background for lower planting schemes.

Hosta - Great ground cover plants – the foliage comes in silvery blues, greens of all shades and variegated varieties, adding interest to any boarder. The flowers are not often desired however they are very pretty in their own right.

Foxglove - The epitome of cottage style gardens, will self seed (meaning every year you'll see them spring up somewhere else in the garden), giving it a more natural, less regimented feel.

And if herbaceous perennials aren't for you why not try out some summer bedding schemes or plant some shrubs to transform your garden this summer. Your local garden centre will be more than happy to point you in the right direction.

I will never identify pupils and I do not ever mean to mock, but it is incredible how varied people are in their ability to learn to drive. You can have one pupil who has 2 lessons, who is safer and more in control than one who has had 20 lessons. What one pupil can grasp and do in one go round a roundabout can take another pupil 10 or more goes, and even then they are still at the deadly dangerous stage.

When finally settled and we've got up and running, her regular quote was 'I knew something was wrong when the car started bouncina '.

Parked cars were a nuisance that should not be parked where they were because 'they should have known she was having a lesson, and anyway hitting them would teach them a lesson not to park in inconvenient places '.

Other traffic should always make way because 'we had L plates on the car and other traffic should always give way to learners', Hmm...

Cyclists didn't matter because 'they did not pay road tax and therefore should not be on the road'. So naturally she ignored all cyclists regardless of their innocence and existence.

I had to admire her determination to learn to drive, and so long as I saw progress, i.e. that she would achieve getting a licence, then I felt morally OK with continuing her lessons. She knew she would take longer than her friends I had taught, but finally she did pass.

Cheers all round. Her daughter then decided to learn, and a brisk 19 lessons and 4 months later, she passed. Now Doreen's daughter drives her mother everywhere and Doreen's driving is confined to commentary from the passenger seat, which I am sure is a great relief to readers, although probably not so well received by her daughter...



When were you last disappointed? What was it that disappointed you? The cold start to spring? A friend letting you down? The team you support losing a match? We do love to plan ahead, to know what's going to happen, to get what we want. We hope, we anticipate, we expect. There are times when hope can keep us going through the tough patches so it can be a force for good. Very easily, though, we can get stuck in anticipating the future and expecting a particular outcome. And, regardless of how we may see ourselves sometimes, we can't control everything. In fact, when it comes right down to it, the only thing we can control is...ourselves. Not the weather, not our friends, not the team we support and so on. And that's when I gently remind myself to be here, now. It works. Have a go! Enjoy the match for itself regardless of the final score; love your friends for who they are not what they do for you; appreciate the sun when it shines and the warmth and dryness of your home when it doesn't. Just for a minute.

A view from over the hedge...

Countryside Matters

"April is a promise that May is bound to keep"

May is the month that most farmers and country lovers enjoy. The daylight hours are longer, the soil temperature is such that germination and growth of plant life is inevitable, whilst animals and birds start to show off their young.

We have experienced 15 months of quite extraordinary weather, drought in the early months of 2012, exceptionally wet weather during the summer and autumn, and then some of the coldest months in living memory from November – March. We hope that Spring is just around the corner, and that the cows and young stock will soon be seen enjoying grazing the fresh-grown grass, that lambs will be seen frolicking in the fields and crops, including potatoes and maize, can be planted.

The first cut of grass should be harvested in mid May and put into a silage clamp: an essential feed for cattle next winter. First there will have to be rolling, harrowing and fertilising for at least six weeks before there is any chance of harvesting the grass. This Spring we seem to have an incredible number of mole heaps, which must be flattened and the soil re-distributed so that the soil is not dragged up into the grass silage damaging the machinery and making the silage buterric (rancid). So when you see those lovely striped grass fields, it's not just to look pretty.

It has been a real treat to see a hedge in the village being traditionally laid: sadly some work on farm hedgerows was not completed before the cut-off date of March 1st. Birds and small wild animals need the hedges for nesting, feeding and cover.

Most of our winter-visiting birds have moved on now, although the Fieldfares, Redwings and Bramblings were very late leaving this year. Now we can look out for our summer visitors: Swallows, Martins, Whitethroats, Chiffchaffs, Willow Warblers, Blackcaps and Garden Warblers should all be here. Listen for their songs and calls, especially that of the Cuckoo.

An annual blessing service called Rogationtide takes place on May 5th in our Parish, when everyone is very welcome - casual clothes and welling tons are advisable. Just look out for signs for the Farm.
