





Parish Council Briefing

An 'occasional meeting' was held on 8th April, to consider two planning applications and to discuss a number of other live issues, not least of which was the developing plans for a wind turbine at Thoulstone.

Planning applications

The two planning applications were: 3 Knapps Gate – a grade II listed building application for replacement of a single conservatory block wall in a rear facing conservatory by a aluminium bifold door and other associated minor changes.

High House Farm - creation of a new silage clamp on an existing hard standing. The PC had no objections to either application.

Annual Parish Meeting

This was fully reported in the April Bridge and updates on two issues were discussed: Steiner School (SAF) traffic and the Old School Playing Field (OSPF).

SAF had been approached and were ready and willing to receive a deputation on the traffic issues raised at the APM, particularly the need to drive carefully and respect villagers' safety. In the event, the parishioner seeking PC support at the APM felt that the subject had been sufficiently aired. The fact that SAF were due to leave the site at the end of the Summer term was also a key factor.

As offered at the APM, I met with Malcolm Holley on the OSPF to clarify the PC position and was able to explain that the PC fully supported the Jubilee tree plantation and were committed to ensuring that it thrived

and was adequately maintained. The PC's major concerns were to ensure that it the grass was regularly cut, the thistles were kept at bay and that the northern 'hedge' was brought under control. For the last, the plan had been to use a young offender volunteer group to do this work, but they were unable to respond before the bird nesting season was upon us. This part of the plan will now be delayed until the Autumn, when the potential for laying the trees will be re-assessed. This position was generally accepted.

Longleat Caravan Traffic and badaers

It remains the intention of the PC to seek an alternative scheme for the caravan traffic entering and leaving the Caravan Club site in Longleat's grounds and we are currently waiting for the Caravan Club area management to offer meeting dates. Further public consultation will depend on the outcome of such meetings and subsequent further discussions with Longleat. This could be a long process.

However, as many of you will already be very much aware, another more pressing issue has arisen, affecting the caravan traffic and much more. This is the collapse of the Lane End to Stalls Farm road, about a guarter of a mile beyond High House Farm. This

has been caused by badgers undermining the road which is now the subject of a emergency temporary closure order. In accordance with the Badger Protection Act 1992 interference with a badger sett is a criminal offence and Natural England (NE) have the legal responsibility to issue licences for the kind of work that will be needed to sort this one out. At the time of writing, a licence has been issued which has been reported to me, by NE, to allow temporary repair and re-opening of the road. I have yet to receive Wiltshire Highways interpretation and they currently believe that they have permission only to 'excavate and explore'.

In the meantime, this closure has exposed the number of visitors who, improperly, use this route to get into Longleat; some 150 cars recorded over a two-day period before Easter. We have been working with the Highways department, Longleat and the Caravan Club to get suitable signage up to prevent this traffic using all the back lanes, with all the concomitant safety issues that this presents. At the time of writing more signs were promised.

This closure is also presenting practical and economic difficulties for High House, Longleat and the Caravan site. All are working hard with Highways to deal with the immediate issue and getting the road repaired and re-opened as soon as possible.

Deep Lane closure

This will already be under way by the time the May Bridge appears, but the good news is that Wessex Water have now confirmed the intended working method for replacement of the water main. This will allow through traffic to use the lane before 9.30am and after 3.00pm, locals' access to their property and heavy farm vehicles to use the road by arrangement with Wessex Water.

Affected properties have received letters, sians are out and the closure notice is on the Bridge website.

Thoulstone Wind turbine

This was discussed at the meeting in the context of the pre-planning information provided by Seren Energy, the developer. Fleur de Rhe Philipe joined us for this item and gave us her very strong views against the proposal. The major issue was to ensure that Corsley PC was formally consulted, even though the development site is outside the Parish, and I have now received such confirmation from the Wiltshire Area Development Manager, Mike Wilmott.

The PC will provide a formal view on the proposal once it is received, but an informal conclusion, based on the pre-planning information was against the development.

There is a drop-in 'Community Event' on the 28th April in Chapmanslade Church, between 3.30pm and 8pm, at which the developer will be on hand to make his case. There is well formed and strong minded protest group leading the objections and the community event is your chance to express your own strong personal views directly. The more people that turn up, the better are the chances of the development being stopped. You can see the pre-planning information on the Bridge website. Personally, and unfortunately, I have a pre-booked holiday on that date, but the PC has promised to be at the event en masse and I will be writing to the developer to challenge a few key points in their pre-planning information.

I hope Easter was good to you – the trafficfree silence in Lane End was bliss!



Why not exhibit your home-grown potatoes at the Corsley Show?

Top tips for tatties

The first the thing you should know about growing potatoes is that you can grow them anywhere!

It's fairly common knowledge that potatoes strip the ground of nutrients and so you cannot grow them in the same place two years running, but now there's an alternative – potato grow bags are the answer! Whether you're short on space or just looking to give growing spuds a go, arow baas are for you.

Special potato tubs can have real benefits with their easy access side pockets to reach in and get your potatoes out, or you can

simply buy a bag of compost, cut holes in it to place seed potatoes at different levels and you will always end up with a good crop.

When you choose your seed potatoes make sure they are firm, with no mould or splits. Make sure you know whether you've chosen early or main crop potatoes as they have different harvesting dates. I recommend using Rocket as an early crop and Maris Piper as a main crop.

Once you get them home, lay your seed potatoes out in empty egg boxes or in a crate with plenty of light to encourage good strong healthy shoots to appear on the potatoes. This process is called 'chitting' and should be done approximately 4 weeks before planting into your bags.

If using potato tubs, fill the bottom of the tub so it is in line with the first access pocket then lay some potatoes in, with the shoots upwards, cover them and leave the shoots to arow through. Once the plant has started to form a good stem and leaves above the compost level, fill the tub with more compost until you can only see the top leaves of the plant, repeat regularly until the bag is full. If using a

> bag of compost to grow your potatoes, stand the bag on its end and cut the top and roll it down, put drainage holes in the bottom and place 5

> > tubers in the bottom third of the baa. When they are ready, simply cut the bag open.

Keep an eye out for blight and treat as soon as signs appear to avoid damage to your crop. Blight appears as black spots on the leaves particularly on the underside. This can spread to the stem and eventually the potato tubers if not treated early. Bordeaux Mixture, a mixture of copper sulphate and hydrated lime, is available as a wettable powder, for use as a spray or a dust on both potatoes and tomatoes.

So deal with the mud today and reap a good home grown spud tomorrow!



It's an ill wind that blows nobody any good

Wind turbine proposal

Most people will know by now that a massive wind turbine is proposed 600 metres opposite Barters Plant Centre, Chapmanslade

Many local residents are appalled at the prospect of an industrial wind turbine, with all its associated roads, electric substation, etc., being built on agricultural land so close to their homes. If it goes ahead, it will spoil the views of the countryside, and especially Cley Hill, for miles around. The height of the proposed wind turbine is 87 metres, which is the equivalent of five mature oak trees one on top of the other. There are many other ways in which wind turbines blight residential areas, not least the intrusive noise caused by the blades, which can be heard over a mile away, and the negative impact on house values

A local action group has been formed to oppose this proposal. We have called ourselves the STOP THOULSTONE FARM WIND TURBINE ACTION GROUP. In just three weeks we have over 200 concerned residents supporting us, and, as the word spreads, we hope for many more. We want to make it clear that we are supportive of renewable energy, and clean air, but we are discovering that there are many myths and misconceptions about wind turbines, which makes them a most environmentally unfriendly option. Wind turbines are big business and the wind turbine manufacturers and developers have excellent public relations which misleads many wellintentioned individuals. To provide some balance therefore, we have decided to

submit an article each month to The Bridge which demonstrates one of the aspects of the case against wind turbines, and why there are better alternatives. The first of these articles is set out below

Wind turbines contribute to fuel poverty

Wind Turbines are almost entirely subsidised by a complex yet hidden regime of feed-in tariffs, tax cuts and preferential tax credits which is passed on to customers through higher electricity bills, driving an estimated 50,000 of the nation's most disadvantaged population into fuel poverty each year. The cost to consumers of the Renewables Obligation Scheme, as it is known, has risen from £278 million per year in 2002 to more than £1 billion per year in 2011, a total growth of £7 billion over nine years. Meeting Britain's target for renewable energy by 2020 would require a total investment of some £120 billion in wind turbines and back up. The same amount of electricity could be generated by gas-fired power plants that would only cost £13 billion. In a time of economic austerity this almost defies belief especially when most of the vast profits will go into the pockets of land owners and developers.

The total consumer bill for wind subsidies by 2030 is estimated to amount to a

staggering £130 billion. A recent analysis of UK wind farms revealed that a dozen of the biggest landowners will between them receive almost £850 million in subsidies, a huge amount of funding that will be paid by ordinary families through hidden taxes on their household electricity bills.

Next month, we will explain why wind turbines are neither areen nor carbon friendly!

Phil Jefferson reports on the April meeting of Chapmanslade Parish Council, the Chapmanslade Annual Parish Meeting, and on other parish matters

We had an excellent attendance at our April parish council meeting and at the parish annual meeting that followed it. Many thanks to everyone who came along. We were pleased that Fleur de Rhe Philipe, our Wiltshire Councillor, was able to be with us for the two meetings.

Parish Council

Planning. One application had been received since the last meeting, concerning plans to alter and extend The Old Mill in Mill Lane, and to build a garage. Councillors raised no objection to this application. At the time of writing we are waiting to learn whether the Southcroft application considered at our last meeting has been turned down by the planning officers. If they recommend approval Fleur has confirmed that the application will be considered at a planning sub-committee meeting, which will give the Parish Council and residents the opportunity to make representations to elected members before a decision is reached.

Footpaths. Wiltshire Council has published proposals to divert the footpath that passes through the garden of Dye House Farm. We had looked at the proposed route at an earlier meeting and raised no objections.

Highways matters. Fleur confirmed that Wiltshire Council intends to introduce an

18 tonne weight limit through the village, replacing the currently unenforceable 17 tonne limit. In the longer term a 7.5 tonne limit will be adopted, but this depends on improvements being made to the A350/ A303 junction in South Wiltshire. We urged Fleur to persuade Wiltshire to liaise with Somerset Highways and the Highways Agency when the 18 tonne limit comes into force so that the limit can be adequately signed – and, hopefully, enforced.

Proposed Wind Turbine. The wind turbine proposal, which we had first looked at in March, was discussed briefly. Again, like last month, councillors and members of the public raised differing points of view. By the time you read this you will have had the opportunity to find out for yourself about the proposal by visiting the consultation event in the village. The parish council has purposefully kept a neutral stance until it finds out what your views are. So, we invite you to come along to our May meeting, Thursday 15th May, 7.30 pm at the school, to tell us your views and we will then make up our minds about whether or not we are in favour of the proposal. This is one of the biggest issues we have had to deal with for a number of years and we need to get it right on your behalf. Please contact me, or Minnie our clerk (at julian house@o2.co. uk), if you are unable to attend the meeting but wish to share your views with us.

Annual Parish Meeting

Thoulstone Park. James Hughes-Hallett, the owner of ThouIstone Park, gave a progress report on his plans for an 'eco-sustainable development', which he described as being "a catalyst for changing the way we live by developing a sustainable place which is in harmony with its environment". He added that his vision is "to link together economic, social and environmental sustainability values in the form of a mixed-use, holistically integrated, live-work community that is a culturally enriching location". He listed some of the features he hopes to introduce, including woodlands (large numbers of trees have already been planted) parklands, organic market gardening, gastronomy, commerce, buildings of artistic and architectural significance, leisure facilities and recreational activities. A ten-hole aolf course is also being planned.

It is intended that the park will host a number of events throughout the year; the first one – for 500 people – is planned for three days in August. Mr Hughes-Hallett's plans include the creation of a significant number of employment opportunities and the provision of up to 40 houses, which is perhaps the most controversial part of his vision for the site. In due course we will discover whether or not this meets with the planning authority's approval. We will keep you in touch with developments and you can find out more at www.thoulstonepark.co.uk.

Annual Report. It is the duty of the parish council to report annually to the parish about its work. This year's report was a long one, after a busy and eventful twelve months. Topics raised included last year's Sunrise Festival (this year the venue has moved to Wales), the Barter's Farm housing proposals, the proposals for Thoulstone Park, a number of controversial planning

applications, speedwatch, neighbourhood watch, the possibility of mains gas in the village, public footpaths and highways maintenance. You can read the report. which is posted on the village website www.chapmanslade.ora.uk. There's certainly plenty going on in our parish!

And finally (1) You may not have noticed that the village shop in Dilton Marsh has recently re-opened and later this month its post office is due to re-open, too. If you are in Dilton Marsh, why not visit the farm shop and café at Fairfield Farm College, where young people with learning disabilities are given training to prepare them to be able to live independent lives? It's well worth a visit.

And finally (2) Wiltshire Council is keen to provide each town with a 'campus', with the aim of bringing together a number of services and facilities together to provide fit for purpose, flexible spaces, accessible to everyone in the community. A campus is described as a collection of buildings within a community where the public can access local services, delivered by Wiltshire Council and Wiltshire Police, together with other public sector, voluntary and community groups. The idea behind campuses is to ensure people have better access to improved services that meet local needs. Wiltshire Council also believes this would also allow them to help reduce the amount of money it spends on property through better use of its buildings. Consultation on whether Warminster should have a campus, and what facilities it might contain, is currently being carried out. You can participate in the consultation by visiting http://warminster.ourcommunitymatters.org. uk/warminster-campus. The closing date for responses is 16th May.

Were you among the audience for our play, 'Your King comes to you...' on Palm Sunday? Enacting this particular day in the life of Jesus, and his triumphant entry into Jerusalem on the colt of a donkey, gave us all plenty to think about. For me, the most telling part of the play was the fickleness of the crowds who, a few days later, were shouting "Crucify Him".



The Centenary of the First World War

The Cross is featured on most of our war memorials, both in this country and abroad. Anyone who has visited the war cemeteries of Northern France and Belgium will be in no doubt that the cruciform shape is very powerful. Why?

Firstly, the '1' is crossed out! No more "What's in it for me?" People do die in going to the aid of stricken comrades. They are willing to die for their country. Secondly, here are crossroads! Which direction should we take? Decide! Thirdly, one line touches another – intersection signifies relationship!

The Cross, the death of Jesus Christ, provides the template for our cenotaphs. monuments and tablets. Firstly, "Greater love has no man than this, that a man lay down his life for his friends," said Jesus, who also said that He laid down His own life "for the sheep". Secondly, Jesus decided to travel in a definite direction. There was no other way. Thirdly, in Christ, God touches our humanity. He dies our death, enabling us to live His life. His death was not made futile by 'friendly fire' or the desire to gain a few hundred yards of mud at the cost of thousands of lives. So, in this centenary year of the First World War, let's pay attention to the meaning of the Cross. 'Lest we forget'. Reverend Keith Sobey



Tales from the passenger seat



The other day I had five pupils in a row who all suffered from an appalling inability to concentrate for a reasonable length of time. Not (sadly) unusual in itself, but staying focussed and retaining a reasonable level of concentration whilst driving is pretty essential, especially when a pupil hasn't vet acquired muscle memory to assist in controlling a car. 30 years ago, if I had a pupil who did not concentrate, or who easily got tired, or who would literally forget they were driving (worrying eh?), they would have been the exception. From about 15 years ago, with increasing tendency, this inability to maintain focus on the matter in hand has noticeably become more common. I find myself having to say "concentrate, wake up, pay attention, you're away with the fairies, stop day-dreaming" and so on, far more than Lever used to.

I don't believe it has anything to do with intelligence; the baseline intelligence of people cannot have changed for better or worse within a generation, and anyway, intelligence is not a direct indicator of whether a person will make a good driver. Adam was a top grade maths student and had taken his maths A level privately two years earlier than his contemporaries. Yet in order to drive, Adam was perfectly serious when asking me as he approached various corners "How many degrees round is this corner Steve, so I know how many degrees to turn the wheel...?"

Olive was studying to be a barrister, yet would only be able to know what to do if she had experienced the situation before, and had been told. Thus, when a dustbin lorry reversed from a side road and I had to tell her to stop and to allow room for it to continue reversing in order to straighten up, she was happy that if the same thing happened again, she would know what to do. Initiative and independent thinking were neither Adam's nor Olive's strength. Both passed, but found learning hard.

So, what has changed over the last 15 years or so? I have a private theory! Sugar apparently has the effect of reducing levels of concentration, and affects the attention span of the brain. We have very high levels of sugar in refined and processed foods, and this trend seems to be increasing, albeit we are recently becoming more aware and alert to such things. So firstly, is diet a contributory factor?

Secondly, many younger people are playing computer games, which have an almost immediate mental gratification, whilst also requiring little long term concentration or attention, since the game moves on rapidly to another scene, or ends with a life lost. Short bursts of high activity seems to be the usual game. The games played 30 years ago tended to be slower, longer, more thoughtful perhaps. To make something out of bricks, or to assemble a plastic model took longer and a different style of thought.

So I wonder, in all seriousness, whether a combination of these two factors might be contributing to what I have directly observed?

A view from over the hedge...

Countryside Matters

How lovely our countryside looks, feels and sounds in May! Everything is bursting with fresh growth, the hedgerows are turning green, creating a colourful boundary to the fields, where birds can feed, hide from predators, and build their nests as homes for the next generation.

Most of the migratory birds that breed here have arrived by now, although most Spotted Flycatchers don't join us until mid-May. It is wonderful to see the Swallows back, flying around the farm buildings; although the number of Cuckoos is continuing to decline.

Our hedges also give shelter to both farm animals and our native mammals from the sun, wind and rain. Bees and other pollinating insect are busy in the fields and hedgerows. So many ladybirds have survived the winter and are now enjoying all those aphids.

Love it or hate it, oil seed rape has certainly brought colour into the countryside. Take a walk in our woodlands in early morning or evening to experience the colour and smell of the bluebells; spirits are lifted as we enjoy the beauty that surrounds us.

Farm animals are now enjoying grazing the spring grass, and so their winter guarters (covered yards and barns) are quickly cleaned out and the manure spread on the field as a natural fertiliser. Dirty water (or slurry) is spread over the land, which is then ploughed and worked-down to a good tilth to grow maize.

During May the first cut of silage will be taken. The grass is mown, allowed to dry for 24 hours then picked up by the forage harvester, fed into trailers and taken back to the farm. Here it is put into a clamp, rolled to remove as much air as possible, then covered with thick plastic sheeting and weighted down. This is the start of preparations to feed stock with as much home-produced natural food as possible for next winter

Sadly our lives here in Corsley have been somewhat disrupted by the closure of one of the main artery roads leading into Longleat: this is where the road has collapsed due to badger excavations over the years. People living in the area trying to get to work, school or to carry out their businesses, such as the caravan and safari parks, farming and essential services such fire, ambulance and home care for sick and elderly are finding detours time-consuming and expensive in fuel. It is certainly extremely frustrating for those who rely on the use of this road for their livelihood. As someone involved with caring for animals (domestic, farm and wildlife) all my life, I hope that a solution will soon prevail when human lives and livelihoods are considered a little more important than those of an animal that is no longer an endangered species.

Indecision

There's something you want to change or something new you want to try but, as well as good reasons to go for it, there are reasons to hold back. So you do the jig of indecision: back and forth, in and out, certain then uncertain, then sure again.

Still dreading the potential effect on my clients, I prepared myself for the discussions I had to have with them during which we would work through their feelings and come to a negotiated plan for ending their work with me. It would be hard: I knew I'd have to wait – possibly for months – for the clients to be ready before I could satisfy my own desires and it was entirely possible that they would have many difficult responses to my abandonment of them. That's a lot to face.

But, auess what? Less what a week after I'd made my decision, I had no more London

appointments in my diary! Without my having said a word, my clients had made their own decisions – either to finish because they'd done what they needed to for now or to have an indeterminate break

I was reminded then of a quotation by Goethe a friend once gave me which includes the lines...

The moment that one definitely commits ones self

Then Providence moves too...

...Whatever you can do or dream you can, beain it.

Boldness has genius, power and magic in it.
