
Brand new affordable-rent bungalows available

Church and **Community** Coffee mornings



Biology: changing the world

What is killing our trees?

Now that spring is here, many of us are delighted to see the deciduous trees coming into new leaf, but not all of them will look healthy...



Trees suffer from disease as do other plants, animals and people. Some of us can remember the devastation caused by Dutch Elm Disease (DED), which started in the 1960s in the UK countryside and is still present today. In this and an earlier epidemic over 60 million UK elm trees were lost to the disease, forever changing the UK landscape. However, there are other major tree diseases putting our country landscape at risk. These include Chalara Ash Dieback (CAD), Sudden Oak Death (SOD) and Horse Chestnut Bleeding Canker (HCBC).

What do these diseases have in common? They are all caused by microorganisms. In the case of DED and CAD, different fungi cause the diseases. SOD and HCBC are caused by different species of the fungus-like pathogen, Phytophthora (another species

of which caused the Irish potato famine), although more recently bacteria have been implicated in HCBC.

Chalara Ash Dieback is spread by fungal spores, often from rotting leaves, and can be spread by wind, animals or people. It was first identified in the UK in 2012 in Fast Anglia and Kent, having been blown over from Europe. One symptom of an infected tree is the loss of leaves on branches, which die back to where the fungus is growing in the wood. It spreads rapidly from tree to tree and infected trees may survive for several years, acting as a source of infection. Plant pathologists have identified the disease in over 90% of ash trees in Denmark, but have also identified one tree (called tree 35) which seems resistant. The genetics of this tree are being examined to understand the disease better and it will be used to cultivate resistant trees

Sudden Oak Death is a big problem in North America, but was first identified in the UK in 2003. It appears to have been introduced on more than one occasion, but the source is not known. Fortunately, Britain's native oaks - the 'English' oak and the sessile oak – are little affected, but larch trees are particularly susceptible. It also affects garden bushes, such as rhododendron, viburnum and camellia. The symptoms are lesions exuding fluid from bark, known as 'bleeding cankers', cracks

in the bark and discoloured leaves. Rapid action to destroy infected trees has limited its spread.

Horse Chestnut Bleeding Canker has similar symptoms to SOD, but may be caused by a bacterium transmitted by an insect, the horse chestnut leaf miner, rather than by windborne Phytophthora spores. This disease is spreading rapidly. The first case was reported in the 1970s and a survey in 2007 revealed that half the horse chestnut trees in Britain showed some symptoms.

What can we do at a personal level? If you see a potentially diseased tree, you can report this to the Forestry Commission at www.forestry.gov.uk/treealert. If you have walked near a diseased tree, you should thoroughly clean you boots or shoes as soon as possible to minimise spreading spores. If there are trees or bushes on your property that look as though they may have an infection, ensure you dispose of leaves and cuttings sensibly - preferably by burning. Given the speed with which these diseases spread we need to be vigilant to minimise permanent change to the UK landscape.



Parish Council Briefing

Chairman, Neil Britten, rounds up the PC's activity in April

Last month was fairly quiet for the Parish Council, with just one meeting since the last edition of The Bridge, convened mainly to consider one planning application, traffic and road safety priorities and the grant application to develop a flower meadow on the Old School Playing Field.

It was agreed unanimously to register no objection to this application. It has now been approved subject to conditions relating to reinforcement of the bank on the south side of Roddenbury View by way of the required excavations and appropriate surfacing of the entrance next to the road.

Traffic and Road Safety

Following the Annual Parish Meeting and the extensive discussions on this topic, the PC considered follow up actions and priorities:

Speed Indicator Devices (SIDS)

For these to work most effectively their location should be changed periodically and the period they are working for should also be variable. Whilst not in use, the devices would need to be securely stored.

Volunteers, at least two, need to be trained in their use, with costs of the order of £170 each. The devices themselves could cost up to £2,500 each and would require ongoing maintenance. If the funding could be identified, this option could be implemented relatively quickly and the Highways Department are supportive.

With respect to funding, the Area Board have supported similar schemes, usually with the requirement for matched funding from the applicant, and there is also a possibility that local businesses may be persuaded to contribute to the costs. There is no current provision in the precept to cover the costs involved, but these other funding options would be investigated further.

Whitbourne Springs

The work to make the Whitbourne Springs/ A362 junction safer is already in the CATG programme. The PC have contributed to the cost of the precursor topographic survey and the final recommendations and CATG approval are awaited. Any implementation will require a further contribution from the PC. Representations will be made to Longleat Estate to discuss potential for their assistance with the funding. If an acceptable funding package can be put together then this project could get into the programme for 2018/2019.

Metro count repeat

A repeat count so soon after the last one was unlikely to get approval from the local authority and positioning of the counters is subject to constraints. Because of the latter, it would be very unlikely that any change of position would generate results significantly different from the previous siting.

Speed Watch

A draft letter to Wiltshire Police, making a case for a speed watch to be done on the A362, was approved. This has now been forwarded

Extension of the 40 mph speed

At the APM there was a strong voice for extending the 40mph speed limit eastwards to the Picket Post roundabout. The PC view was that establishing the case for this would be difficult. The PC would have to initiate a separate survey, at its own cost and from previous experience, it was unlikely that the results would meet the criteria for such a speed reduction. Based on the PC understanding of the history of this stretch the parish is fortunate that the 40 mph limit extended westwards as far as it did.

Other works

These include issues aired at the APM, such as junction re-alignment by virtue of 'moving' white lines at Corsley Heath, re alignment of bus stop kerbs will require CATG approval and also PC contributions. Further consultation with CATG is required before costs can be fully defined and some of this work may be able to be included as part of the Bay Tree Close development.

PC Grants

Creation of wild flower meadow on the Old School Playing Field

The PC had received an application from

a voluntary group to convert the OSPF into a wild flower meadow/nature area. Several discussions have taken place between PC representatives, the applicants and other advisers to assess the viability of the proposal and the detail of the proposal.

The PC were generally supportive of the project, but there was concern that in the first year the project was heavily reliant for some of the key preparatory work on uncommitted resource, with no fall-back position if that resource was unavailable, either voluntary or professional. It is a longterm project and if the initial work is not done properly then future success is unlikely.

The Vice Chair advised that the some of key activities could be done in conjunction with similar activities at High House Farm and that this could reduce costs. It was gareed that the Chair should advise the applicant of the PCs concerns and explore what risk mitigation could be put in place. The application team have been advised to update the PC at the next meeting on 14th May.

Emily has been researching the history of the Stourton Estate, which was bought in 1717 by Henry Hoare I, a partner in Hoare's Bank.

Henry replaced the original Stourton Manor with a grand Palladian villa, renaming it Stourhead. In 1722 his son Henry Hoare II inherited the estate and began to create the landscape as it is today, by damming the river Stour to make the lake, planting trees, and erecting classical architectural temples and monuments. Paths and bridges were built and the views created. Other structures were erected in the grounds including St. Peters Pump and Cottages, a Gardeners Cottage, an Orangery and Gothic Greenhouse. Those buildings and others, including a Turkish Tent and a Chinese Umbrella, have since been demolished.

Emily showed us pictures and drawings of the many alterations and improvements to the house by members of the Hoare family over the years. Wings were added for a picture gallery and a library and later a portico was built. Significant changes were also made to the gardens. The estate was passed to the National Trust in 1947. Eve Tigwell gave the vote of thanks for the fascinating talk.



Ideas to celebrate the 100th anniversary of the cessation of **World War 1**

Every November on the Sunday nearest the 11th, we celebrate Armistice Day across the parishes. This year, Remembrance Sunday falls on Armistice Day itself and marks the centenary cessation of WW1. Not surprisingly, we are planning to mark it in a particularly significant way.

Researching the history of parishioners from Corsley and Chapmanslade who perished in WW1 is already underway, led by Phil Jefferson and Fiona Carruthers. Their research has included several trips to the Wiltshire and Swindon History Centre in Chippenham, as well as examining other military records and speaking to known relatives. In Chapmanslade, residents are busy knitting poppies to form a cascade in the church and to line the High Street. And in both villages, there are plans to plant commemorative trees, one for each of those who lost their lives. The location of the trees is still open to suggestion, so please let us know your thoughts.

Two other ideas are still in their infancy and need your input. The first is to hold a concert with songs, music and other acts representative of the time, to be held either on the Friday or Saturday before Armistice Day. We are encouraging the audience to dress up in clothes reflecting the time - I am sure there must be some clothes dating back to 1918 somewhere in Corsley or Chapmanslade! Again, ideas and suggestions are welcomed.

The other idea came from research done by Corinne Ellam, the great niece of Albert Mines, one of those listed on the honours board in St Margaret's. Mrs Ellam has recommended we consider the 'There but not there' project. 'There but not there' started as an installation comprising seated silhouettes of WW1 soldiers dotted about the pews of a church in Kent in 2016. It represents the communities left desolate in the wake of the war. The project website therebut not there or g. uk shows the silhouettes in situ and I think you'll agree, is very moving. Mrs Ellam has offered to buy one for St Margaret's, representing her great uncle, and we'd like to add more silhouettes to represent all those lost in our community of Corsley. The seated silhouettes cost £42, plus £10 for the name bar, and we are looking for individuals or families prepared to sponsor additional figures. If you have a family member who lost their life or participated in WW1, or simply appreciate the sacrifice made by those who gave their lives, you may like to consider sponsorship in full or in part. In St Margarets there are 17 soldiers whose names appear on the WW1 memorial plaque in the church, so we are looking to raise roughly £800.

Vision West of England

A new vision for visually-impaired people across the West of England

A new organisation in the West of England is being launched in May to provide direct and consistent services to blind and partially sighted people across Wiltshire, Bristol, Bath, South Gloucester and Swindon.

Vision West of England will work closely with key partners including Visionary, other local sight loss charities, national organisations, statutory bodies and most importantly blind and partially sighted people on developina services that respond sensitively and positively to the needs of visually impaired people and those at risk of losing their sight.

The organisation is receiving support and advice from Thomas Pocklington Trust and Wiltshire Sight. There will be two hubs in Wiltshire and Bristol where direct services will be based.

Vision West of England will work with partners towards developing a single point of contact for blind and partially sighted people across this area within the South West region, ensuring that visually impaired people have a voice. It will also work closely with Visionary, the local sight loss membership organisation, to align with their ongoing initiative to develop and provide good practice guidance for the delivery of services across the whole of the UK

Leanne Hubbard, currently CEO of Wiltshire Sight, will take up the post of Interim CEO of



Vision West of England. Speaking about the new organisation, Leanne said:

"Our goal is to provide support for visually impaired people and those at risk of losing their sight, that aims to give them increased choice, improved access to the right services and support that will have a positive impact on their quality of life and independence.

"We will also collaborate with our partners on strengthening our knowledge of the causes of sight loss and how the effects of eyesight problems can be alleviated."

Leanne added: "We will offer a range of services from our two dedicated Hubs for visually impaired people, their families and carers. Those services will include information, advice and support; peer and family support; resources and technology; social activities; advocacy and training.

"I'm very keen to speak to visually impaired people and people from partner organisations about the new organisation and how it will operate. Anyone who has any questions or feedback is welcome to contact me or the team either by email or phone."

Community messaging

Through feedback and working with our local communities, we have developed the use of www.wiltsmessaging.co.uk and are now sending out daily updates thus enabling us to reach as much of our community as possible, as quickly as possible and impart any new crime prevention advice or information about incidents that may affect you in your community that we feel you need to know about

We have received some very positive feedback around this and encourage you to speak to all members of your community and persuade them to sign up to Wiltshire Messaging. It is free and a very good way of keeping all our communities connected.

Crime exceptions

These figures are based on an evaluation of data over a two year rolling period. Using this data we can predict the average figures that may be reported in a specific month, and what are the higher and lower parameters that we may expect. Figures outside of these parameters are classed as 'Crime Exceptions'.

There were 79 recorded incidents throughout March 2018, with 79 of these recorded as crimes. This compares to 74 recorded incidents during the same time period last year. There were no crime exceptions for the month.

Offences of Violence against the Person normally have an average of 9 offences a month, and March showed 7 offences being reported.

Offences of Theft normally have an average of 15.2 offences a month; this is the only crime type to show a rise in March, with 24 offences being reported. When broken down further, we received 14 reports of Non Dwelling Burglary (to a building other than a home, e.g. a shed or commercial property). A number of these incidents saw gardening equipment and power tools such as chainsaws stolen. We strongly advise you to mark your machinery and tools; this not only acts as a deterrent to thieves but also helps the police to reunite stolen property to the rightful owners if it is recovered. Keep a list of tools, together with serial numbers and any identifying marks. You can do this at www.immobilise.com.

Last month, our closing verse had the title 'Missionary'. It made me think of Carrie Beckley, one of the Wycliffe Bible Translators the Chapel supports financially and through prayer.

When Carrie was contacted for this edition of 'Chapel News', her first concern was for the safety of those working with her, as their part of the world suffers serious unrest at times; all I can write is that Carrie's community is in South East Asia.

Carrie grew up in Calne and trained as a primary school teacher, but moved to Cyprus to teach youngsters there. She's always loved languages, so on returning to Britain, she began linguistic, translation and literacy training, plus two years studying at All Nations College. In 1988 she moved to an island in South East Asia, where the people's language had never been written down before. She learned the language and created an alphabet, developing literacy materials so the locals could learn to read and write, and producing simple health booklets with pictures, covering subjects like tropical ulcers and snake bites.

For the past ten years, Carrie's been working alongside the island Church, helping a team of local people translate the

Bible into their own language, which can be understood on neighbouring islands, too. It's hoped the New Testament will be completed and ready for typesetting next

I've met Carrie a couple of times, when she's been in this country, reporting on project progress and visiting family and friends. She's a quiet, smiling lady; nothing about her suggests she's spending her time in a potentially dangerous part of the world, doing a potentially dangerous job that's part of the 'Great Commission' Jesus gave His disciples before He left them and rejoined His Father in heaven – to go into all the world and preach the good news.





A view from over the hedge...

Countryside Matters

After one of the longest, greyest, wettest and coldest winters I can remember, here I am on April 18th hoping that by the time you are reading this in early May, that winter will at last have disappeared

For many involved in farming, the winter of 2017/18 will have been the hardest experienced for years as the stock have been housed for far longer than is usual, increasing the chances of infections breaking out such as pneumonia or freezing to death when allowed outside. Many hours have been spent defrosting pipes, water tanks and water buckets, and creating wind breaks of straw to protect stock from driving snow and rain. Snow clearing of local roads to allow tankers and vehicles to aet in to the farm for milk collection and deliveries of feedstuffs. (pulling a milk tanker half a mile to the main road at 2 o'clock in the morning is no fun, especially as all the previous day's milk was poured down the drain as the tanker was snowbound at the milk depot).

There is great concern on many farms that the winter feedstuff will have run out before the cattle can be allowed to go out of the sheds and barns. At the moment there is little or no Spring grass for cows or sheep, as temperatures have been so low, and many fields are waterlogged or in some cases under water, with the streams and rivers full to overflowing. Spring work on the land has hardly started and where slurry and farmyard manure should be on cereal land ready to be ploughed in, only the desperate have ventured on to the land

We have experienced a long period of spring flowers, snowdrops brightened

up our verges and hedgerows followed by a wonderful show of primroses, wild anemones celandine and violets, all nestling low in sheltered areas, not like our poor daffodils which sadly became beaten by wind rain and snow.

The hedgerows are at last showing signs of greening up which will give shelter and security to birds as they build their nests. Many of our summer birds are up to a month later than normal arriving on our shores, but hopefully we will soon be hearing the chattering of swallows, house martins, Swifts and many more migratina birds, we might be lucky to see osprey flying north after resting and feeding on the lakes at Shearwater and Longleat, and especially lucky to hear the Cuckoo calling it's mate in the woodlands around us

Soon the cattle will be allowed out the lambs will be skipping around, the dawn chorus will be waking us from our slumbers and the farmers will be out with muck spreaders, slurry spreaders, ploughs and seed drills, catching up on all those jobs they have been desperate to get on with for the last month or so.

Join us in Chapmanslade for the Rogation Sunday Service on Sunday 6th May when we gather together to bless the crops growing once again in our lovely countryside - winter will be just a bad memory.
