





Chapmanslade Parish Council

Parish Council Briefing

Councillor Phil Holihead, rounds up the PC's recent activity

Chapmanslade Parish Council hosted the Annual Meeting on 11th April which was the opportunity for villagers to raise matters for the Parish Council to consider. Disappointingly, no members of the public attended and a golden opportunity was missed to formally raise issues such as those that crop up on the village Facebook page. That said, the Parish Council encourages members of the community to raise concerns in the regular monthly meetings, or directly with the Chair or any other Councillors at any time. The Annual Report is on the Parish Council website:

At the Parish Council meeting, members of the public spoke on the war memorial work undertaken by the History Group and 'for' and 'against' the planning applications put before the PC. Councillors agreed a final version of the Chapmanslade Community Emergency Plan – and the setting up of an Emergency Contact Hub that will coordinate a response in the event of a major emergency. This document is available on the parish website. The proposal for updating the village war memorial to add two names of villagers who died in the service of their country during WWII is also progressing. This requires approval from the Diocesan Advisory Committee, as the memorial is on Church land. Hopefully this will be granted in the next few weeks, after which a costing plan will be

put before the PCfor approval.

Three planning applications were considered:

- PL/2023/05349 Erection of 9 dwellings Barters Farm Nursery. The Parish Council felt that the new planning and business case put forward by the developers showed insufficient tangible benefits for the wider Chapmanslade community and, given that the proposal is for unrequired large houses outside the development boundary, upheld its earlier objection to the proposal.
- PL/2023/05142 Sienna's Valley Farm **Appeal.** The Parish Council continues to have grave concerns about the need and scope of the proposed dwelling within the special landscape area and agreed to uphold its earlier objection by making a submission to the Appeals Inspector.
- Pl/2023/08763 Access track land south of 92 High Street. (The PC having previously recorded no objections to the proposal). This is to upgrade an existing track to give access off Huntenhull Lane to the applicant's stables at the rear of 92 High Street now had a number of concerns with updated plans. Significantly, the track has a different access point onto the lane and has expanded from 3m width to 5m width, with the resultant additional earthworks and spoil all having potentially greater impact on the landscape. The PC also had concerns regarding the potential for water run-off from the wider and longer track and the

need for additional drainage which is not addressed in the updated paperwork. All concerns and requests for clarification have been passed to the Planning Department.

Dates of next meeting

The next meeting will be in the Village Hall at 7.30pm on 9th May.

Licensing Act 2003

Corsley Memorial Playing Field Trustees are applying for the grant of a Premises Licence for Corsley War Memorial Playing Field Pavilion, Corsley Heath, Warminster BA12 7PW

The License, if granted, is to enable the following activities to take place:

On Sales of alcohol for consumption on the premises/Sale of alcohol for consumption on the Memorial Playing Field during and after events.

Dear Friends,

We are currently betwixt Easter and Pentecost. You may have heard of each of those festivals perhaps being more familiar with Easter! However, in between Easter and Pentecost there is the Ascension. This special day records the moment when we talk about lesus being raised to heaven. He has spent 40 days being risen and reassuring his disciples, helping them to understand that their connection to him is changing. Before Easter, Jesus was with them in a geographical, physical and timely way, but after the resurrection he is with them in new ways such as in the stories where he suddenly appears! April news

Maggie Wobey rounds up the April meeting and announces some forthcoming events



April's meeting started as usual with a short business meeting and was followed by a talk entitled 'How clean is our River?' by Mike Bull of Friends of the River Frome. The Friends are a voluntary community group working to help improve the state of the River Frome by organising and taking part in litter picks, sampling and testing water from the river, encouraging younger people to invest in the care of the river, working with schools and organising and supporting events to raise the profile of their work, such as The Great Big Green Week.

The voluntary group has considerable professional expertise within the committee, including in the fields of hydrology, landscape design and planning, engineering, ecology, consensus building and communication. Friends of the River Frome started as a litter picking group and removing Himalayan balsam which is an invasive species. The monthly tidy up has removed large piles of rubbish including bikes and shopping trolleys and on one occasion a full dinner service set!

The group have a 10-year strategy relating specifically to the five-mile stretch of the River Frome and surroundings between Blatchbridge and Spring Gardens. Thirty one projects are designed to help the river thrive and be what the community would like, including improving and keeping the ecological quality of the river, protecting walking routes, rewilding and eliminating invasive species such as North American

Signal Crayfish and mink which have had a detrimental impact on river vegetation and species. Water vole and native crayfish have now become locally extinct. The recent appearance of beavers is welcomed as they have helped flood management along the river by building dams, creating ponds, reducing flooding and encouraging other habitats.

Schools are encouraged to participate in a three-week project to look after a group of European eels which are then freed into the Frome to go on their journey to the Sargasso Sea. The children often name their eel and amongst the more common names, Elon Musk is the favourite!

The group help to advise planners on upcoming developments, and have lodged an objection to the Selwood Project which currently has planning in the flood zone area. The flooding at Wallbridge has been exacerbated recently as the retention ponds at the Edmund Park site are not working properly, if at all! Landowners are being asked if they would 'give up' some of their land to act as 'buffers' and hold water particularly in those areas that cannot be farmed very

well. The Environment Land Management scheme offers incentives to farmers to boost sustainable practices including creating hedgerows to prevent fast run-off.



We were shown photos of the effects of flooding and developer activity, decimating well-known footpaths, water meadows and greatly disturbing wildlife. The photos of the pathway by The Retreat indicated the level of developer work.

The group are working with Wessex Water monitoring changes in water quality, creating a baseline of data testing for phosphates, nitrates and metal, farm and animal waste, plant features and fish counts and looking for the eight varieties of pollution sensitive invertebrates. Although microplastics have been found in natural spring water, and therefore most likely in treated water, there is currently no test.

The Europe-wide plan to assess water quality only covers the management of rivers for nature and another for bathing areas but, even then, only coastal areas are included and tested only in the summer months for sea water and sewage. Victorian buildings tend to have shared foul and storm water drains reducing water quality and although more

recent buildings have separate pipework, the amount of 'water' causes problems. Recent reporting notes that between 1 and 74 days of diluted sewage was discharged into rivers. There has been successive failure to improve the infrastructure and one of the solutions would be putting in bigger pipes.

We can help the river clean and water quality as good as possible – don't drop litter, choose eco-friendly detergents, use water wisely, checking mis-connections, leaks and septic tanks: and remember the three Ps in toilets – pee, poo and paper only.

So – how clean is our river? There isn't a definitive answer but the River Frome is not that bad.

Wonderful Walks

A Saturday walk



Warminster's bus service 24 stops at the Clock Tower on Fisherton Street, going into the city, but on Saturdays the United Reformed Church opposite is open, with facilities and a coffee morning, complete with hot snacks and cold. I can't resist! If you're driving to Salisbury, park in the cattle market and walk along the riverside path to Fisherton Mill, then through to Fisherton Street for your elevens.

Afterwards, walk left, back to Fisherton Mill, cross the footbridge and walk on to the wider library footbridge. Use that and you'll be outside the library, facing the Market Square. Take the first crossing here and turn left for the second one. You're now by Timpson's repair shop, with its neat red brick building above the shop frontage. Veer left then ahead, into Castle Street, finding the first turning right, into Chipper Street; go that way. On the left side of the road, there's an

impressive stone building (dated 1913) and its entrance, stating 'Public Library' above the doorway. I crossed to take a photo and stayed on that side, where two young ladies sitting on the doorstep agreed to be in my photo!

Library



You'll reach crossroads next, with a lovely red-brick building dated 1935, ahead on your right. Go straight on into Salt Lane, with this building away to your right and you'll soon see a wooden door there, with the words Fire Station! The whole building was possibly the city fire station in 1935, because there are three huge 'windows' that may once have

been fire-equipment exits. Walk on and your next delight will be the Pheasant Inn. established 1435. There's another crossroads here and once you've crossed to walk ahead, look back to the main façade of the Pheasant Inn. There's a car park next, but on your right will be 'Salisbury Steam Laundry', the words writ large in 'gold' on olivegreen Victorian tiles. At the next crossroads go ahead, still on Salt Lane, with the Five Bells pub on the far corner.

You're now climbing slowly uphill, towards a grassy area with trees. This is Greencroft Open Space, common land from the early days of Salisbury in the 13th

century; locals grazed their animals here, especially sheep, because this part of Wiltshire was given over to sheeprearing and woollen cloth production, then. In the 1500s, the local corporation took over Greencroft; it was used for executions and the burial of plague victims, 1627. Greencroft was the site of 'Swing Riots' against high grain prices, caused by the Corn Laws in 1830: 150 arrested men from all

over Wiltshire were charged, found guilty and transported to the colonies. The trees gracing Greencroft may date to Queen Victoria's Diamond Jubilee in 1897. If the sun's shining, relax and enjoy the setting, looking left to an elegant Georgian, red-brick edifice in the distance, with carved stone urns adorning the roof. When you're ready, head that way and,





once across the road, stand beside the lonely stone porchway and look back to the opposite side of the road. The exquisite cream building there is Vanner's Chequer, the home of Richard Vanner, a tailor here in 1667.

Climb Bourne Hill, where the red-brick building is Wiltshire Council Offices, with an ugly modern Police Station behind; luckily, the cop shop is mostly hidden by trees, especially

in summer! You'll soon see an unmarked entrance on your left into more open land – go that way; this was once part of Vanner's Chequer, private allotments and gardens for local residents. A couple I met here showed me a Spindlewood tree, an essential plant in an area used for the woollen trade, during tailor Richard Vanner's time and after. Follow the narrow path going right, which leads through an old,

isolated four-sided archway and between various trees and bushes. Eventually, you'll emerge onto a road leading downhill left, past another entrance to the Wiltshire Council offices and into St. Edmund's churchyard, which is part of Salisbury Art Centre. Walk diagonally right on the narrow path through the churchyard and you'll be back on Castle Street.

Turn right, keep walking and you'll pass Hussey's Almshouses, built 1794 and

rebuilt 1875. William Hussey was born in 1724 and was the local Independent MP for nearly 48 years; he died in 1813. Cross Castle Street near Tesco, walk on to Timpson's corner shop, turn left and along this row of buildings is Bradbeer's, trading where Debenham's store was. Why not head for the first floor, where the facilities and restaurant are, before returning to your car..?



Countryside Matters

As I write this letter to you in mid April, my neighbour who records the rainfall on a daily basis regularly at 9 each morning has given me the March recording. In March 2024 he recorded 131mm - yet another wet miserable month (which has continued into April).

By the second week of April, the milking cows were out grazing during the daytime, much to the detriment of the grass fields, which may have to be replanted with grass or winter root crop because of the damage done to the ground during the heavy storms when cattle crowd together for shelter. The cows are still being kept in the warm, covered yard at night time. Hopefully the weather will improve soon as first-cut silage making should commence in early May.

Young lambs do not like being outside in this wet, cold weather, they will creep under hedges and any cover and, unless the mother ewe is diligent, the lamb will die within hours from lack of milk and chill. If you do see a lone lamb looking poorly, do contact the shepherd/farmer. Unlike lambs, wild animals such as deer or hare must be left alone as their mothers will return to their young quite naturally.

By the 10th of April I was aware that my robin had hatched two young in my newspaper box and, when leaving the nest, was being very careful not to attract the attention of people and the local cat. A week later and all is well and no doubt they will have flown the nest in the next few days.

On 12th April I saw my first swallows and look forward to seeing the migrating birds returning. Some, like the house martins, swifts and swallows return to the same buildings where they were hatched last year.

Let's hope we hear the sound of the cuckoo

this year – usually heard in woodland or forest area as they call for their mate.

The verges and woodland are again covered in the blue haze of bluebells; sadly, our native bluebell has been replaced in many areas by the Spanish bluebell. The native bluebell is quite delicate in appearance and the flower head droops, whereas the Spanish is a stronger, and a more upright multi-headed flower. Soon, the verges will be full of cow parsley and, in some areas, wild garlic grows; their leaves make a wonderful garlic butter if chopped up finely.

Look out for elderflower growing along the footpaths and bridle paths, (where there's no traffic fumes); it makes wonderful nonalcoholic cordial or 'champagne' which will grace any summer picnic or dining table.

Most walkers and dog owners are aware of blood sucking insects called ticks, found in long grass, please protect yourselves by wearing trousers and boots or wellington boots while out walking and check your clothes when returning home for those nasty little creatures. Check your dog too as they cannot get rid of ticks themselves. Ticks can cause not only discomfort but serious illness (Lyme disease) to humans and dogs.

May is a month when plant fairs, open gardens and agricultural shows abound. It's a great time to get out to support charities, meet up with like-minded people and enjoy seeing some of the best exhibits that the countryside provides. Our local churches has a Rogation Service on a farm on 5th May, open garden and fair and plant sale on 18th May and, of course, The Bath and West Show at Shepton Mallet at the end of the month.


