

How near are we to havin a coronavirus vaccine?

Many of us probably think we have heard enough about COVID-19 and the SARS-CoV-2 virus that causes it. I make no apology for raising it again...

In the March 2020 edition of The Bridge I wrote "Given the number of cases in the UK, flu is currently a more serious problem than COVID-19 in my view. However, this may change. It is still early in the outbreak and microbiologists and medical professionals around the world are on high alert." This certainly has changed over the last few months. Social distancing will help reduce transmission of flu, and - importantly - we also have a vaccine. We do not yet have an approved vaccine against COVID-19.

The rules about social contact and wearing masks in public places put in place to limit the spread will have considerable effect on COVID-19 transmission, if the rules are obeyed. However, to get back to the social behaviour we had in 2019, a vaccine will be needed. Recently a distinguished group of scientists and medics published a memorandum in The Lancet pointing out that herd immunity, in which the disease is not prevalent across the population, can only be achieved by having a vaccine. Several vaccines are now in development. So how are these developed and tested?

At least five different classes of vaccine are being developed, ranging from welltried approaches, such as virus that has been inactivated (as with the current polio vaccine) or attenuated (as with MMR vaccine), to using DNA molecules, for which no currently licensed vaccines exist. The detail of how these are made is beyond the scope of this short article.

Although this is a period of rapid change, as I write this there are 65 vaccines in clinical trials in humans and more than 100 undergoing preclinical investigation in animals. Of those in clinical trials, 35 are being tested for safety and effective dosage in a small number of people (Phase 1), 19 are in expanded safety trials with 100s of people (Phase 2) and 11 are in large scale efficacy tests with a placebo control in groups of several 1000s (Phase 3). A further 6 vaccines have been approved for limited use, but none have yet been approved for widespread use.

During clinical trials, a trial will be paused if one of the subjects becomes ill without satisfactory explanation or if there are health differences between groups being monitored. This is normal practice and the trial can resume or be abandoned depending on the results of an investigation. So far three trials have been paused. One was resumed and the others are awaiting the outcome at the time of writing. In Phase 3 trials the vaccine

developers are looking for a difference in infections between the group receiving the vaccine and the group receiving the placebo; the groups having been matched as much as possible for characteristics such as age, sex, ethnicity, and likely exposure through work and lifestyle. It would, of course, be unethical to deliberately infect individuals.

The World Health Organisation has established a joint venture called COVAX which aims to share successful vaccines on the basis that it is better to ensure that some people get vaccinated in all countries rather than all people get vaccinated in only some countries. Many nations have signed up to this initiative, including the UK. However, the WHO anticipates that it will be at least mid-2021 before a vaccine becomes widely available.

Corsley Parish Council

Parish Council Briefing

Chairman, Neil Britten, rounds up the PC's activity in October

At the time of writing, there have been no remote PC meetings during October, and no planning applications to consider. An update on the Cross Keys application is included below, plus the substance of two communications received by the PC, one from Scottish and Southern Electricity Networks (SSEN) (the local electricity network company) about their free winter support services and the other from Wiltshire on the latest COVID-19 restrictions. I have also included a note about the December quarterly meeting.

Recent planning applications 20/05386/FUL - Cross Keys pub, Lyes Green; conversion of part of first floor to R&R rooms

Wiltshire have approved this application, subject to standard conditions. Their decision report acknowledged neighbours' concerns about the drainage, but stated that "... arrangements of the site, with the foul water connecting up to an existing septic tank... do not fall within the control of planning legislation but that of Building Control, which has the necessary and relevant legislation to control such matters." Although the site is located within a Special Landscape Area (SLA), in which "the impact of development on the open nature and character of this land designation is a prime consideration", the Planning Officer concluded that "...the immediate locality consists of established residential buildings" and "the proposal would not harmfully impact on the surrounding open character of the SLA."

Winter preparations

SSEN, who describe themselves as "the people who look after the wires and cables that bring electricity to communities throughout the north of Scotland and central southern England" have provide a comprehensive package of information offering a free registration service to allow residents to report power issues during the winter and receive priority treatment during planned or unplanned power cuts.

Their offer was accompanied by a very full suite of documents, but the basis is for a 24 hours a day service intended to:

- · Contact you, or a nominated contact, in any need to switch off power to carry out essential maintenance
- Assist with connection to local emergency services
- Liaise with local authorities, emergency services and agencies, like the British Red Cross, to provide extra support to people on their Priority Services Register
- · Provide emergency power supplies for those who use medical equipment/aids reliant on electricity
- · Provide portable generators during prolonged power cuts and safety advice tailored to your needs
- When requested, give advice on how to prepare for a power cut in a format that suits your needs, e.g. braille, text, phone, easy read, audio CD or a language other than English
- · Offer provision to community during severe weather events and prolonged power

- outages, e.g. access to local welfare vehicles help us in our aim to provide meals, drinks, warmth and charging points.
- Give peace of mind. They offer a service where individuals can agree a password to use when dealing with the staff at Scottish and Southern Electricity Networks

Their contact number, free of charge, is 0800 294 3259 and I have passed on full details of their scheme to the PCC and the WI for dissemination amongst their members and on social media. Covid 19 - new restrictions

Following the recent change on COVID-19 restrictions, Wiltshire have published a summary of the new rules. It is recognised that this may well be out of date by the time of publication of this edition of The Bridge, but I have asked the editor to publish it on The Bridge website as well.

New three-tier local COVID-19 restrictions explained

A three-tier system of local restrictions to curb the transmission of COVID-19 has been introduced in England. The new system will see different parts of the country placed under varying restrictions depending on their rates of infection. The restrictions in each tier are:

Medium

- Follow the rule of six if meeting indoors or outdoors
- Pubs and restaurants to shut at 10pm

High

- No household mixing indoors
- Rule of six will apply outdoors
- Pubs and restaurants to shut at 10pm

Very High

• No household mixing indoors or outdoors in hospitality venues or private gardens

- Rule of six applies in outdoor public spaces like parks
- Pubs and bars not serving meals will be closed
- Guidance against travelling in and out of the
- Further measures which may be agreed locally

What tier is Wiltshire in?

Wiltshire is currently in the medium (lowest) tier of the COVID-19 alert levels. This means current restrictions will stay the same. Please help to keep the rate of transmission low by continuing to:

Follow the 'Hands, Face, Space' guidance: wash your hands often and thoroughly, wear a face mask in enclosed spaces and keep two metres apart or one metre+ with a face covering or other protection

Follow the rule of six if meeting indoors or outdoors

Future Meetings

Assuming that current restrictions remain in force, the plan is that this will be a virtual meeting, using Zoom. Dear All,

At the time of writing, we have been joined for nearly a month by my daughter and husband and baby Flora. In fact most things are a source of wonder to this inquisitive little person; her reflection in a dark window, the chickens, the wind, the falling leaves, the light reflecting off some cutlery and, especially, the dog. It's been a sad week for the Tower ringers, as well as for others in the village, having to say their farewells to Marion Moldon or Maz as she was fondly known by all.

Maz started bell ringing about eight years ago and it was not long afterwards that Dick Collins, the incumbent Tower Captain, retired and moved to Essex to be closer to his family. This left a vacancy in the tower which he was finding impossible to fill. Maz made the decision to take up the post because she felt that if it wasn't filled, ringing in Corsley would come to a sad end.

But she had taken on a tough challenge. Dick had recently had the bells surveyed which found the treble bell was severely cracked in many places rendering it unringable and the other five in need of extensive repairs, mainly with bearings and headstocks, as well as all six requiring considerable re-tuning. Maz was determined the tower would not 'fall silent' as so many have - looking through Dove's Tower Guide in the UK there is a large section for towers considered so. She was able to gain particular support from Corsley and the villagers were

very generous towards getting this resolved.

However, the bill started getting into the 10s of £1000s and Maz worked hard, applying to local and national organisations as well as the Diocese to reach the required figure – the bells have now been fully restored, retuned and rededicated and the results could be heard every Wednesday (practice night always proving a light-hearted meeting of ringers) and for the Sunday Service mornings.

On top of this the band was sorely depleted - Maz started a training programme and there are now a number of novices and successful ringers in the tower. We now have no problem in having our own full band for services, weddings and other occasions. We have also come first more than once in branch competitions.

As we all improved, tougher ringing methods were attempted, often six ringers would be fully focussed trying to ring some new method. You might find yourself ringing in the wrong order but could usually put yourself right. If Maz found she had made a mistake you'd just hear this little 'oops', everyone would lose their concentration and start smiling and we'd have to stop ringing and stand our bells. A moments pause followed and then a distinctive voice would say 'Sorry, I think that might have been me'. This was followed by yet more laughter. God bless you Maz, we'll all miss you.

Maz completed her first peal for the rededication of the bells last year in 2 hours 52 minutes and a peal board with the band's names has been completed for display in the ringing chamber to mark the event.

To Maz, ringing had become her life, and she'll be very sorely missed by the tower, her many ringing friends in the Devizes branch and beyond.

Walking through lockdown

The Imber Range path

Lockdown caused changes in all our lives. For me the greatest loss was the freedom to drive miles for daily walks, but being confined to Warminster and the surrounding area has been no hardship.


I've spent many mornings exploring the hills above town, sometimes parking at the pull-in by Cotley Hill roundabout, where the bypass joins the Salisbury road. From there, I go through the kissing gate to my left and begin the long slog uphill on the Imber Range path. At first, the path's steep, muddy, narrow and hemmed in by shrubbery, but the higher I climb, the more open the track becomes and the better the views. Having breathing problems, I sound like a steam train struggling uphill, but the rewards make every gasping breath worthwhile!

The path widens gradually and turns to grass, following the curve of this end of Cotley hill left for a long stretch, before I'm finally on the hill itself. From then on, the views are

the left distance, to Norton Bayant and Sutton Veny across the Wylye Valley straight ahead, and to Cley Hill and Battlesbury Hill to my right.

This isn't a walk for the faint-hearted or those who can't stand full sunshine. Nor is it a good choice in bad weather; I've had occasions when low cloud's obscured the view and the paths! But on a cool clear day, there's nowhere better for views, or for the exhilaration that comes from pushing one's self to a sensible limit.

Once on top of Cotley Hill, admire the views over the Wylye Valley, then turn to study the hills you're now part of. Some of these have ancient settlements on top, hill forts that were once home to communities, 2500 years ago and more. Some include burial mounds at the summit (as on Cley Hill), or on the slopes, where ditches were dug with stone tools and deer antlers, and the removed material piled up to form banks.





On a sunny day there's little shade up there, or shelter from wind and rain. Personally, I don't use maps, so I often get lost, but on these hills, your destination or start point should be visible in some form, from where you are! If you do have a map or app, it will at least tell you which of this range of ancient hills you're actually walking on!

The Imber Range path runs on land mostly Army-controlled. There's no excuse for getting lost, veering into 'no man's land' or becoming part of a mock battle; the paths are well-marked and most of them have signs at crossings. From the top of Cotley Hill, you can aim in almost any direction by following the signposts. Wander from one ancient hill fort to the next, secure in the knowledge that the ground's sufficiently open to see where you are, where you've been and, when you're tired, where you left your car!



Chapmanslade Parish Council

Parish Council Briefing

Councillor Phil Holihead reports on the PC's October meeting

Chapmanslade Parish Council (PC) met virtually on the 8th October with seven members of the public attending. The minutes of the previous meeting were agreed and the following items were discussed:

Northacre incinerator

A member of the public spoke to outline concerns in Short Street regarding the fall-out from the planned incinerator.

Ganders Heath planning application

A member of the public spoke in support of the application to outline the difference between the current retrospective planning application and the previous application which had been dismissed on appeal.

Barters Farm development

A member of the public spoke to query who would be responsible for the ongoing maintenance costs of the drainage system and basin.

Matters arising Councillor vacancies

There are currently three vacancies on the PC and councillors and attendees were encouraged to find volunteers to fill the posts to continue the PC's support to the community. Posts will be advertised on the parish website.

Northacre incinerator 20/06775/WCM

The PC agreed to strongly object to this application on the grounds of:

· toxic pollutants outlined in government air

- quality statistics posed a direct health risk to the parish
- · there was an increased carbon footprint from both the proposed site and increased traffic that was contrary to Wiltshire Council's Climate Emergency and Environmental strategies.

Area Board Boundary Review

The PC felt that there was no impact on the parish from this review.

Virtual meeting with our MP

The PC agreed that this would be a very useful opportunity and that traffic issues should be at the top of the agenda, not least a further attempt to unlock Chapmanslade from the Wiltshire Council imposed deferment of a lower weight limit linked to improvements planned for the A303.

Planning applications 20/07175/FUL 126D High Street

The PC had no objections to this application.

20/07799/FUL Ganders Heath

The PC objected to this application on the grounds that the access and parking requirements at the core of the application were not in place despite the applicant's statements in the application paperwork to the contrary.

20/07952/VAR - Barters Farm variation

The PC supported this application which had taken into account concerns previously outlined by existing boundary property owners and had made rectifications. The PC undertook to query the ongoing responsibility post build for the maintenance of the drainage basin system.

2020/1901/SCREEN - Mendip Council - Proposed solar farm on Lodge Hill

The PC will request Mendip Council undertakes an Environmental Impact Assessment for this site, with particular emphasis on footpaths and the potential impact of construction traffic on Chapmanslade.



A view from over the hedge...

Countryside Matters

With shorter daylight hours and lower temperatures, November brings the countryside into its own lockdown

Some mammals, such as hedgehogs, will have stored enough food in the form of body fat so they can sleep or hibernate until early spring.

Badgers increase their body weight by about 6% during the autumn and will sleep on and off during the winter months, coming out of their setts infrequently.

Squirrels and birds such as jays will have stored nuts, which are high in fats, and will track their winter larder by memory and smell.

We humans are not so clever, expecting the supermarkets to supply our needs 24/7, but I think if any good has come from this Coronavirus pandemic, we are at least appreciating the food on our table - especially the farm-to-table food we still enjoy in England.

Also, I hear many friends now proudly saying that their own garden produce has been laid-down – stored in trays, frozen, bottled, preserved or pickled, just as our parents and grandparents did.

The 5th November Bonfire Night celebrations may be a little subdued this year, but may I remind those who wish to enjoy a family gathering around a bonfire with a few bangers and sparklers, that domestic pets and animals such as horses can be traumatised by these noises if they are close to the sudden, unexpected bangs.

Please warn neighbours of your intention to celebrate with fireworks, whatever the date or time.

October saw most of the harvesting completed on the farms with yields varying, depending on when the crop was planted, whether the dry hot weather suited it or if there was enough rain to keep the plant growing; due to the new safety rules on the use of insecticide sprays some crops, such as oil-seed rape, were decimated by the rather voracious flea beetle.

Some hedges are being cut back before the fields are sown with next year's cereal crops, while other hedges are left for birds to forage seeds, berries and nuts or to give shelter to the sheep and cattle from wind and rain.

Frosts will quickly turn the trees with their fabulous autumn colours to interesting skeletal shapes, but we can still enjoy their sparkly branches, the lovely cobwebs and the sound of fallen leaves crunching under our feet.

Enjoy the sounds of the birds leaving their woodland shelter to forage on grain and cobs left by the combine harvesters and, in the early morning, the call of geese, swans and duck moving from their night-time ponds to their feeding grounds. In the evening you can hear the call of the pheasants as they settle for the night, with their sharp calls warning the flock to be on guard and to find their roosting branches way up in the trees away from foxes.

The countryside has much beauty in these greyer months and it makes getting home to a warm fire and hot drink after a good walk even more rewarding.
