



Corsley Parish Council

Parish Council Briefing

John Willcox, rounds up the PC's activity in October

The PC met on 4th October with a full complement of councillors and six members of the public. The Vice Chair, Neil Carpenter, chaired the meeting and regretfully confirmed what had previously been reported to councillors; that the previous Chairman, Mike Butler, had resigned as Chair and also as a Parish Councillor. The Parish Council agreed that at their next scheduled meeting, in December, they should elect a new Chair and, that in the interim, the procedures for the filling of the vacancy should be confirmed.

David Ball reported that he had met with Councillors from Chapmanslade and Maiden Bradley and members of the Maiden Bradley Weightwatchers Group (Lorry weight, not body weight!) to discuss the joint concerns about the HGV traffic that the villages suffer from. This group have penned a joint letter to Wiltshire Council asking for a meeting, which our MP, Andrew Murrison, has agreed to chair to discuss a positive way forward.

Planning

Two planning matters were discussed:

The first being the formal planning application that had been received for the further development of the Bay Tree Close site. Those that attended the Annual Parish Meeting will remember that the Wiltshire Council Project Manager for this development had given a presentation on the proposals. Following considerable discussion, which included input from the members of the public who attended the meeting, the Parish

Council agreed that they would have no objection to the application providing that:

- The new housing is made available to those in the village and with connections to the village (family, work, etc.) as a priority
- The opportunity is taken, now that land is not required for a village hall, to provide a better layout of the development and to ensure that any possible future development of the remainder of the site is accommodated in the best way, i.e. the development is not a computer generated design, along a perfectly straight road, that leaves difficult corners of the site unusable in the future
- As little as possible of the existing hedge fronting the A362 which provides biodiversity, noise abatement and pollution reduction, is removed. This would preferably be achieved by securing a 30mph speed limit through the village in that location, so that a smaller visibility splay is required. Replacement hedge planting along the A362 should also be of more mature and substantial vegetation to recreate privacy and reduce noise to new and existing residents as quickly as possible
- The access creates capacity for the possible future development of the site, but is not designed to provide vehicular access to additional land
- · Foul water and surface water are dealt with in a sustainable manner that creates capacity for the possible future development

- of the site and reduces the amount of land required for these services, considering taking surface water off site and an attenuation pond if needed
- The possible privacy and overlooking of existing dwellings is considered by planning officers using established principles
- · Additional sustainable measures are accommodated in the design such as charging points for cars, or at least the required cabling
- · No street lights are included in the development.

The second planning matter related to a request from Wiltshire Council for a preapplication consultation on land north of the Red Cottages, Corsley Heath (Councillor Oliver Hares left the room whilst this matter was discussed).

The Parish Council declined to make a detailed response to the pre-application request, but instead made the following points:

• The invitation to comment on the preapplication appears to be based on the erroneous assumption that the PC in some way has an interest in the village hall. Beyond being the Custodian Trustee in Charity Law of Corsley Reading Room (the village hall) the Parish Council, whilst obviously being interested in the future of the village hall, do not have an 'interest' in it. It is a registered Charity managed by a body of trustees separate from, and independent to the Parish Council

- A recent (2020) survey in the village has shown that there is little support for anything other than a redevelopment of the current Reading Room on its existing site. In other words, there is no desire in the village for the village hall to move to the area detailed in the pre-application
- The PC has an interest in any potential development in the village and would welcome being in a situation where a formal application is received; the community could then be consulted, the PC can debate in a public forum and appropriate thoughts and comments can then be advised.

Footpaths

A report on the state of the kissing gates and stiles was given. It was agreed that Alice Helliar should complete the survey of gates and footpaths. Provision will be made in the next budgetary cycle for a programme of repairs and maintenance.

Other matters

Councillor Mitchell gave a preliminary report on the issue of horses and road safety. It was agreed that she should continue her research and a further report will be made at a later meeting.

Six Open Doors

Dear Friends,

As I said in last month's letter, the life of a vicar in the time from late August until Christmas is a busy one with lots of remembering. I would imagine that in this period of flux and change, of worry about rising food and fuel prices and the possibility of shortages of day-to-day goods, most of us are a bit twitchy. Then there's the double whammy of warnings about a serious flu epidemic along with the uncertainty of how COVID-19 infection is going to behave when we spend more time indoors in the winter months .We might look back and remember with nostalgia those halcyon days when we didn't have to worry about such things.

It is in times of change and uncertainty that I really appreciate the seasons and festivals of the Church that come around every year and provide a framework, if you like, to hold the worries and uncertainties that are so much part of our lives at the moment. Every year we give thanks to God for all the good things we enjoy at harvest, we remember those with whom we have shared love at All Souls' Day and those who gave, and continue to give, their lives in the service of their country, on Remembrance Sunday. In a few week's time it will be my very favourite season of the Church's year, Advent, when we look back to the great prophets who spoke of a future that for most of them was centuries in its fulfilment. At Christmas we look back at that moment more than 2000 yeas ago when God chose to be born as a vulnerable baby to share at the deepest level the vulnerability as we try to end uncertainty of what it means to be human.

Some might ask what the point is in looking back, in remembering events that we cannot change: footfalls echo in the memory/down the passage which we did not take/towards the door we never opened (T S Elliot). But often, it's when we take the time to remember and reflect that we discern patterns and meaning that, in the maelstrom of day-to-day life, elude us. I came across a lovely description of this the other day, Susan Philips writes "the Christian faith is familiar to me, the Bible my daily bread, and I have witnessed diverse manifestations of God's grace in human life – I lean towards the flutter of the numinous, and I am filled with wonder when I see it, however briefly and incompletely."

This image of the flutter of the numinous (Holy Spirit) is an extraordinary one; like coming upon the delicate beauty of a butterfly. Sometimes we glimpse something of God and recognise it instantly, but often it is only when we allow ourselves the time and space to reflect and remember, that those glimpses are able to seep into our souls to colour and ultimately transform our view of the world. Every single human being on this earth is made in the image of God and as such holds within themselves a spark of the divine. Every single human being is passionately loved by God who comes to each of us in a myriad of different ways.

So as we immerse ourselves in these weeks of remembering, when we struggle to find meaning and purpose in these challenging times, I hope you can find the space to look back and wonder at the mystery of it all, and I pray that you too might recognise the flutter of the numinous in the story of your life.

Memories of Corsley School

Drama Day

David Ball recalls his tenure as Headteacher at Corsley School...

At one Spring Term staff meeting we decided it would be a fun way to bring a topic based on 'The Victorians' to life if we had a Victorian Drama Day for the whole school! One hopefully sunny day in June was chosen as the day when everyone, both children and staff, would dress up in Victorian style clothing and re-enact a typical day in a Victorian school.

A letter was sent out to parents asking them to send their children to school dressed in Victorian style clothing on the big day (list of suggested items of clothing included). For those who usually brought sandwiches for their midday meal suggested items for their lunch boxes were also included and the kitchen that provided school dinners for the school was asked to provide a basic meal of a hunk of bread with cheese or meat, some salad and an apple for pudding. The teachers planned a day of activities for their children based on a Victorian-style curriculum and a special visitor was booked to make an appearance at some time in the morning - the School Inspector!

At that time Wiltshire had a number of 'Subject Advisers' and the adviser for drama was an exuberant larger than life character called Roger Day. He once rang County Hall from a call box on Devizes Green to say that, unfortunately, he was unable to leave the call box at that time and would be late for his meeting that afternoon. When asked what the problem was he said that there were two



lions prowling around outside! This was met with a degree of scepticism, but it turned out that two lions had escaped from a circus on Devizes Green just outside the comprehensive school and Roger had indeed taken refuge in the call box!

When asked if he could play the role of a Victorian School Inspector at the schools Victorian School Day, Roger readily agreed and the time of his arrival and the nature of his 'inspection' was agreed. The big day arrived and after their safe arrival by car and coach the children were formally lined up in their classes on the playground, registers were called and they then followed their teachers into their classroom to begin the day's lessons. Overnight, the classroom furniture had been rearranged into rows of double desks facing a blackboard with slates and chalk for the children to write with and, after a morning prayer, lessons began. In my class we began with a maths lesson, followed by handwriting and a spelling test. Just before 10.30, the oldest class formally lined up on the front path to greet the Inspector. At this moment, the spell was broken somewhat by the appearance of two modern-day visitors with cameras -

they were a New Zealand couple on holiday who just happened to be passing in their car and asked if they could watch what was happening! Roger arrived a few minutes later explaining that he couldn't tether his horse outside the church because a 'strange fourwheeled contraption' was in the way!

Safely back in the classroom, the inspection began and Roger was brilliant as the stern and humourless inspector who certainly put all the

children 'on the spot' with quick-fire questions about a variety of subjects. He departed at lunchtime and, after their 'bread and cheese' lunch, the children had a more relaxing afternoon with a very formal PE lesson on the playground followed by some artwork and ended the day with an assembly led by our Vicar (and Chair of Governors), Dennis Caddy.




Walking through lockdown

Riverside walk

For this mixed grass-and-road walk, I parked in Frome's main car park, where the Cheese and Grain is. If you're intending to shop and/or lunch after the walk, make sure you put enough money into the parking meter, say three hours or more!

Walk back to Bath Street, where the Frome Museum is, and cross the bridge into Willow Vale. There are handsome buildings on the left side of this street, a former mill at Mill House Court and, further on, Barrow's Sack Merchants and Frome Feather Co., with its strange rounded corner. You'll pass Willow Vale House, which looks Georgian to me, and then Riverside Terrace, a row of perhaps Victorian houses with an upstairs wooden verandah along the fronts. Beyond that is a row of possibly-Georgian terraced homes, all with gabled attic windows. This row may once have



been just two houses, with the attic windows providing light for the servants' sleeping quarters, as the row has just two semi-circular stone 'porches'.

Ahead of you is a Mendip Railway (quarry) bridge. Go under that and it'll feel like you're in a rural setting. On your left will be a stone stile and a wooden sign telling you that's the way to Frome's Millennium Green, but opposite the stone stile is the Riverside Path and an open grassy area; go that way. Follow the line of the river curving left and there are benches here should you want to pause for a while.

Eventually, the river track joins a tarmacked path - you're in the right place if the wooden fence at the far side of the path has 'artwork' on. Turn left, with the fence on your left and a row of bungalows will appear on the left, too; their fronts face Rodden Road. You'll go under a lovely two-arch brick and stone railway bridge, with an iron bridge after it. Keep walking and a pedestrian 'flyover' appears, crossing the river. It's part of the Sustrans 24 cycle and walking track; go that way.

Step off the flyover and you'll pass a five-bar metal gate with a paper sign on, about protecting the wildlife area; turn left immediately after the gated area, walking a narrow path fronting a row of modern

a dead end, I think beside what's left of the Carpet Factory, turn right. You'll be on an estate of modern homes with Dixon Health Chiropractors ahead of you. Walk that way and you're in Harris Close. Follow the left bend and ahead of you should be green metal spiked fencing. Again, go straight ahead and you'll see this area is signed as Waters Edge.

Stay with the green metal fencing and you'll find you're back at the gate with the 'wildlife' notice on, while ahead of you is the pedestrian flyover. Use it and turn left at the end, retracing some of the hard path you did earlier. Coming from this angle, the stoneand-brick arched bridge looks interesting and intriguing in its construction, with arches under arches. Pass the bungalows now on your right, but stay on the main path. Next is the wooden 'artwork' fence and gardens on the right, until you pass more 'artwork', this time decorating the end of a building on your right. You can't miss it! There's a cross-tracks here, with a rickety galvanised garage on your

Go straight ahead, still marked as the Sustrans 24 trail. The path curves and splits, but keep going till you see a bin on your right, with steps going uphill beside it. Go that way and you'll be on Frome's Millennium Green.





When you reach the top of the steps, climb more steps going uphill again at your right; they lead to a viewpoint, a semi-circular stoneand-railings structure. On the slope below you are two stubby stone markers, one with a poem by Christina Rosetti and the other with one by Siegfried Sassoon; there's also a tall stone sculpture nearby. The path you're on here leads into North Parade car park.

Once you're there, return to the main car park using Bath Street or by crossing the road and using the exit road from the car park itself.

As you've walked two to three miles, check your car parking ticket and, if you have time, why not walk a bit further, up Cheap Street to The Settle; that's what I usually do for a break when I'm in Frome!

Going, going, gone!

Gareth Wasp from Cooper and Tanner, Standerwick, came along to the Reading Rooms to enlighten a bumper audience (which included 11 lovely guests) as to what happens when the gavel falls in an auction room!

All were met with a glass of wine or lovingly prepared mocktail and nibbles awaited people as they sat down at tables to enjoy the evening.

Gareth has worked for some of the big names such as Sotheby's and observed 'The Massacre of the Innocents' artwork by Rubens selling for £40+ million in 2002, the highest value piece of artwork auctioned in London at the time. He has also followed others such as the TV celebrity Charles Hansen closely from his humble beginnings of selling antiques in pubs, having to sleep with them overnight as he couldn't get any insurance. He was involved in selling the infamous artist Jack Vettriano's 'Singing Butler' as well as the characters from Spitting Image.

Gareth met national fame and hit the headlines in all the national press when he found two Cartier rings, jumbled in with a box of costume brought to him by a lady local to Frome. The 4 carat diamond ring made f,42,000 and the Ceylon Sapphire ring £28,000 at auction. The rest of the box was valued at f, 100!

He explained how the world of antiques and auctions was changing with 65% of the Standerwick bidders being on the internet,

of those 40% had never seen the objects in person before bidding, and that bidders were registered as far afield as China, Hong Kong and Canada. Currently British Modern Art and Digital Art were popular in the sales rooms, people are not wanting 'brown furniture', that diamonds and sapphires are always popular with the price of gold and silver rising in a recession.

Gareth then went on to discuss some of the objects that had been brought in by members discussing dates, uses and values. No one was going to become a millionaire overnight but there were some surprises in the age and importance of some of the items.

A great night was enjoyed by all.



Introducing Bill Parks, Wiltshire Councillor for Warminster North and Rural



I am honoured to have been elected as vour Wiltshire Councillor and would like to thank residents for allowing me four years to represent you.

everyone that all Unitary Councillors in Wiltshire are members of their Area Board; for Corsley and Chapmanslade this is the Warminster Area Board. 

A view from over the hedge...

Countryside Matters

Harvest is home

It was with great relief that by mid October all the crops had been harvested.

It really is a great comfort knowing that there is enough home-produced feedstuffs stored in barns, ricks and sealed pits to take us through the next five to six months.

Although the weather in 2021 has not been ideal, the modern forecasting of weather for

the coming 24 hours, days and weeks allows planning for working the

ground, sowing the seed, spraying and harvesting.

It doesn't stop the headaches when the ground is waterlogged and you cannot get onto the ground to plough or direct drill; the seeds may be eaten by birds and the germination spoilt by poor temperatures or insects.

Farmers are spraying crops far less than 20 or 30 years ago due to concerns with sprays going into the food chain either directly on cereals, fruit or vegetables. Spraying can only be carried out when the plants are dry and there is little wind, ensuring the spray goes directly onto the plant.

Concerns regarding contamination of streams and rivers means that all liquid and solid manures are carefully applied to the soil so that there is sufficient for the land, pasture or arable crop, but not too much that it will

run into water courses and eventually into rivers.

With the world leaders meeting here in UK for COP26 this year, farmers are looking to do their part in reducing carbon emissions by using less fossil fuels where they can.

This means producing more of our own food crops and allowing pockets of land

to re-wild to encourage wildlife for insects, bees, birds and mammals to

multiply.

With the Queen's Platinum Jubilee next year, it would be good to see landowners and farmers planting small plantations of trees to replace those dying of ash die back and Dutch Elm disease.

Volunteers may be needed for clearing ground, purchasing and planting the trees and their

protective sleeves, fencing off suitable areas will also cost time and money but, if we want this countryside to be enjoyed by our children and grand children, then we must act now, before it is too late.

My usual request for November for all those planning any kind of firework party, do let your neighbours know, so that dogs and cats can be kept indoors and horses stabled for the night.


