



Chapmanslade Parish Council

Parish Council Briefing

Councillor Phil Holihead rounds up the PCs meetings in September and October

Parish Council Meetings were held on the 8th September and 13th October.

The September meeting opened with a minute's silence to mark the death of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II and to remember her unstinting service to our country and Commonwealth over 70 years.

Operation London Bridge having been enacted just prior to the meeting the Chair chose to continue with a shortened meeting to clear outstanding planning applications.

Planning

Three applications were considered:

- Thoulstone Farm: PL/2022/05649: The Council objected to this application on the grounds of the proposal having a 30% increase in footprint. The Council continued to be concerned that the overall site was creeping ever further into the agricultural land to the South and that the role of the proposed dwellings remained undefined. There remains a risk that a small hamlet will be created at this site. which is outside the village development area with housing that is surplus to the village requirement and, which will have been built side-stepping the payment of any Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL)
- · Siting of a temporary mobile home on land for a stud at Huntenhull Lane: PL/2022/05299: The Council objected to this application on the grounds that neither a business nor agricultural case had not

- been made justifying the need for the work, and that the proposed menage required significant land work that would leave a visible impact on the site which is within the Special Land Area
- 30 Southcroft: PL/2022/06261: Erection of a single storey dwelling at the rear of 30 Southcroft. The Council supported this proposal but commented that access and turning criteria needed to be reviewed and the provision for water run-off was updated.

In a wide-ranging meeting in October which picked up issues carried over from the previous meeting, the following key points were discussed:

Reports were received on:

- Traffic Group: a Highways Request has been submitted for a topographical survey as the basis for further work to increase road safety and reduce speed in the village. It was noted favourably that a Travel Plan for the village School was being progressed as this is an expectation of Wilts Council for any road works associated with road safety in the vicinity of the school.
- **Dog Bin Wood Lane:** all the permissions and funds are in place for this to be moved. An action was taken for the volunteer group to move this forward.

Finance

· The CIL funds remain unspent, but it was suggested that the ongoing road

- improvements proposals from the Traffic Group could use much of what is in the budget
- A payment to the Earl Haig Fund for a Remembrance Day wreath was agreed
- A payment to the Church for maintenance of the graveyard was agreed.

Roads and pavements

- · Meetings with the MP and the Cabinet member for transport have been ongoing in cooperation with Corsley and Maiden Bradley, the major villages disadvantaged by the decision in 2011 not to implement a Traffic Order reducing weight limits and restricting HGVs in our communities. A request has been sent to Wilts Council proposing a temporary traffic order implementing weight limits and with associated signage to allow impact data to be measured to unpick the stalemate that has existed since 2011
- A request for a slight improvement to street lighting between Cley Hill Gardens and Wood Lane utilising existing telegraph poles was made by a resident to the PC in March 2021 and forwarded to Wilts Council for assessment and funding on the grounds of road safety. Funding was agreed earlier this year, and a plan was produced by Wilts Council lighting contractor. This plan proposed an upgrade in the area to current lighting standards by a significant increase in lighting and new lamp posts. A survey of affected houses along the High Street resulted in the plan being rejected on the grounds of light pollution, and its detriment to the street scene. The PC has instructed Wilts Council to cancel its bid for this work and associated funding.

Jubilee Trees

Six Open Doors

Dear Friends,

I write on the most beautiful autumn afternoon. This morning, waiting for the service to start, I stood in Brixton churchyard and really savoured the scene before me. There is a sense of timelessness about a churchyard, the old tombs sunken and leaning, the big old trees, huge boughed, their leaves imperceptibly fading into autumn glory. The fields behind the church sweeping up to the downs and the autumn sky, and recent graves newly dug, whose occupants still tug at the heart and ever will. Standing there I felt so blessed to be amongst such beauty, and the thought came to me that one day, when I am long retired, I will think of this place, this peace, and remember this very moment.

There is a certain poignancy about autumn is there not, this dying away, that echoes the theme of remembrance that permeates the liturgy of our church life in these last months of the year.

"The past is a foreign country: they do things differently there," wrote L P Hartley in his 1953 novel "The Go-Between." Some might ask what the point is of looking back, in remembering events that we cannot change. Footfalls echo in the memory/down the passage which we did not take/ towards the door we never opened. T S Elliot. But often it is when we take the time to remember and reflect that we discern patterns and meaning that in the maelstrom of everyday life, elude us. Most families will have their own precious memories that are passed down from generation to generation, and most will have old photograph albums full of black and white images, or maybe even faded sepia ones, from an era when photographs were only taken on special occasions.

November brings with it the public remembering of Remembrance Sunday when we commemorate our war dead who gave their lives so that we may live in peace. As the years pass and that lived memory of war fades away, it becomes even more important to gather together to remember and gives thanks, and, however impossible it might seem that it will ever come to pass, to pray for peace. We have remembrance services in Kingston Deverill, Chapmanslade and Corsley churches, and Horningsham's will be a very short act of Remembrance at the war memorial. Do come and take part in this important community event.

November news

Patricia Sharrocks rounds up the September and October meetings



Our September Meeting began with a minute's silence as we remembered Her Majesty the Queen. It seemed a fitting tribute that our speaker for the evening was Dr Veronica Ferguson LVO, Surgeon Oculist to HM The Queen and a racehorse owner.

She spoke of the excitement of big meetings, such as Ascot, and explained how an owner chooses the races to enter in consultation with the trainer. We learned how horses are named; often with a nod to their pedigree, or to something or somewhere of importance to the owner. Her current 'stable star' is called Leapaway, born on 29th February 2012 and bred from a horse called Stowaway.

Veronica's horses are bought as yearlings in Ireland and will not compete in jump races until they are 4-5 years' old. They must get used to people and are backed and broken in, first on a lead rope then with early riding. This pre-training is done near Melksham, then at 3-4 years old they are trained at Sandhill, near Minehead, by Philip Hobbs.

The horses travel all over the country to race meetings. They are fitted with aluminium plates, rather than shoes, for racing. A horse may lose 30-50 pounds during a race, they are weighed before and after a race and there is a gap of 3-5 weeks between races. None of the horses races all year round; some like hard ground and race in summer, those who prefer soft going race in winter. After a rest at the end of a season, exercising begins again three

months before the new season to get fit for racing again.

There is certainly a lot more to horse racing than the shout 'And they're off!'

We had a great speaker in October. Famed for her Chelsea Flower Show win and being a National Flower Show judge, as well as a Denman Lecturer, Anna Stevens travelled from Oxford to spruce up our flower arranging!

She worked quickly and tirelessly, demonstrating lots of different techniques to modernise traditional flower arrangements and produced a great selection of artistic creations that were auctioned off at the end of the evening.

Anna gave us some useful hints and tips: she suggested creating a structure to fill, then filling in with small bits of 'gauze' type fabric to enhance colours and foraging for extra decorations from the garden such as conkers and walnuts. Only two or three types of foliage should be used in any one creation and long leaves can be used to loop into designs. Flower stem ends should be cut and leaves taken off before adding them to a container which is matched to the creation.

We had a great turnout of members and guests who enjoyed wine, nibbles, cake and coffee too! A thoroughly enjoyable evening!

Wonderful Walks

Petticoat Lane and beyond



This walk is at Dilton Marsh, near Westbury. I park at Fairfield College on the main road through the village, because it's my comfort stop later! The College is run for the education of young people with special needs, so every penny spent here benefits the trainees.

Walk from the car park out to the road, cross to the far side and turn right. Look for a lane on the left called Petticoat Lane - where did that name come from, I wonder? Join the lane, opposite the Village Hall, and follow it round left, passing red-brick 'Dividend House' on your right, which looks the same style as the Village Hall; I wonder what 'dividend' the house was named for? Walk on for a while, passing the entrance to Dilton Marsh Social Club on the right, plus a mile post in a hedge on the same side, reading 'London 105 miles'. When the lane levels up and narrows, there's a derelict house on the left. Pass it, go under the railway bridge and you'll reach a wider road.

Turn right and you'll see the road ends abruptly ahead of you, just past Providence Chapel on the right. Pass the Chapel and cross the road - Tower Hill - on the crossing. Ahead of you should be a black waste bin with a narrow tarmac path at its right. Use the path, and you should pass a Polish Fire Engine in a pull-in at your left. Beyond that is 'Bridge House' on the left, with a splendid Georgian façade dating from 1780, though the building behind the façade is centuries older, possibly Tudor.

Immediately after the house is a stream and, running alongside it, is a narrow tarmac path going left. Head that way and the path becomes a mud track under trees. Stay with the track till it climbs uphill towards a road - you'll hear traffic first! - and see road edge



sets of grey metal barriers. Pass through these and there's the metal skeleton of a building on your left, plus a sign saying 'Development Land'. Pass that and you're on another narrow dirt track through more trees. Stay with the track till it crosses water on a wooden bridge, then climbs up to another main road. On it, away to your left, is a roundabout with a van dealership on the far side. Cross the road

barriers. Climb the stile over the barrier and you should be near a roundabout leading to Frome and Chapmanslade, Dilton Marsh and Brokerswood, and Westbury.

You should be on Clydesdale Road. Cross it and you'll see a public footpath sign, plus another narrow tarmac path, with a black post to stop cars using it. Go that way and ahead will be two

> and follow the pavement left until it rounds the bend right, into Tanyard Road. Across the mini roundabout next should be a sign for Providence Chapel, but turn right before the railway bridge, into Fairwood Road. If you're in the right place, there's a noticeboard across the road, which includes a poem dedicated

to Dilton Marsh Railway Station, by Sir John Betjeman.

Walk some distance along Fairwood Road, ignoring footpath signs, plus a field with an ancient rusty tractor in (and two goats!). Finally, maybe half-a-mile on, you'll pass the entrance to Penleigh House and cottage on your right; go under the railway bridge



turn eventually and there's a wooden post with multiple round footpath markers on it. Follow the same hedge left until you come to a path on your right, crossing the field diagonally to a distant hedge. If you're on the correct cross-path, the views left should include Westbury White Horse. When you reach the stile across the field, there should be industrial buildings to your left.

Once over the stile, you're on a footpath between paddocks and fields. Follow it back to Fairfield College, then through to the Post Office, shop and café. After doing this three-mile walk on a midweek morning, I treat myself to jacket potato and a pot of tea lunch here!

and the road bends right. When it straightens up, you'll see a road sign for 'Penleigh', with a footpath sign attached, pointing left onto a path slightly uphill through trees. Go that way and emerge into a huge field.

Stick with the grass track beside the hedge at your left and walk on. Electric cables here may not excite you, but the views beyond them to your right may! The left hedge takes a ninety-degree

A view from over the hedge...

Countryside Matters

Most of the harvest is now complete, with a late cut of silage made in mid October which, although a light crop, will all help to feed the animals this winter. Farmyard manure and slurry have been spread and the winter cereals are now drilled.

Far less ploughing is carried now carried out as direct drilling is considered better for the soil structure, less soil erosion and a quicker turnaround of crops from being harvested and the next crop being sown.

Our thanks have been sung at the Harvest Festivals for all our home grown crops safely now in the barns. A wonderful collection of tinned and dry food were donated and blessed before being taken to the Warminster Food Bank.

Our two villages joined together for a Harvest Supper and was enjoyed by many members of our communities at Chapmanslade Village Hall, especially the film of agriculture during the 20th century.

Our rainfall for the year up to the end of September 2022 is 427cm (634cm in 2021. The lack of rainfall has had huge long-term effect on our crops, trees, ponds and rivers. Storage of rainwater through the winter months is important to gardeners, horticulture and farmers if we want our home produced crops and dairy products.

We are aware of lack of water in large ponds producing fresh fish and a wonderful relaxing country sport of fishing in ponds, lakes and reservoirs.

November on the farm brings the routine of milking, feeding and physical care for the calves and cattle which are now mostly housed. Hedge trimming, planting of new

hedges and trees and drainage and ditch clearing are also carried out during the winter months.

Shepherds are now making sure that breeding sheep now in early stages of pregnancy with next year's lambs are being kept on clean grass and that they are checked for lameness and free of infections picked up from fouled soil. Sadly, some dog owners are not careful enough in removing dog poo from footpaths through farmland, which causes infections in the lungs and intestines in cattle and sheep. Please pick up after your dog to avoid infecting cattle and sheep.

We welcome back our winter migrant bird with some concerns that they may carry with them the dreaded Avian Influenza, but we'll still enjoy the flight of the starlings in their murmurations, the jays and squirrels as they gather hazelnuts and acorns . Thankfully they don't remember where they bury each and every nut they have harvested so, after being buried for a few months, a new shoot will appear - the beginning of future natural woodland.

November is a month of shorter daylight hours, so enjoy your few hours of daylight get out outdoors if you can, tidy up the garden (leaving a few areas untouched as overwintering wildlife will need shelter), plant a few bulbs and enjoy the fresh air.

When out for walks look and listen to bird life, enjoy the views through the trees now bare of leaves. If you see fungi, please be cautious – leave them for others to enjoy as so many of them can be dangerous if eaten unless you have really good knowledge of what you're picking.


