


Annual subscriptions are £25 for a single membership and £40 for joint membership.

Chapmanslade Parish Council

Parish Council Briefing

Councillor Colin Bell reports on the Parish Council's latest activities

The Chapmanslade Parish Council met at 7.30 in Chapmanslade Village Hall on 12th October. Councillor (Cllr) Phil Holihead chaired the meeting at which five other Parish Councillors were present. This included newly co-opted Cllr Adrian Evans who was congratulated and welcomed to his first meeting. At the start of the meeting, as always members of the public and Unitary Cllr Bill Parks were also warmly welcomed. Plus, in keeping with protocol, Councillors were invited to declare and record any conflicts of interest.

Key points from the meeting were: The first section of the meeting provided members of the public with the opportunity to comment on and raise any questions connected to the published agenda. Cllr Parks commented on the recent Area Board meeting, at which Wiltshire's Police Crime Commissioner attended, Cllr Parks shared that representatives from numerous villages had raised concerns to the Commissioner that greater support was needed for crime prevention in rural areas. Cllr Parks noted that upon receipt of this feedback, the Police Crime Commissioner would respond to village communities with more focused strategies.

Wiltshire Local Plan

Councillors discussed and raised concerns regarding proposed changes to the Wiltshire Local Plan. Concerns related to a lack of clarity connected to housing figures within

rural areas and what it meant for future planning decisions within Special Landscape Areas. This applies to Chapmanslade. The Parish Council's response to consultation on the Wiltshire Local Plan is on the Agenda for the November meeting.

Councillors agreed on the importance of encouraging Chapmanslade parishioners, residents and those of surrounding settlements, to participate in the Local Plan awareness events which will be hosted and delivered by Wiltshire County Council. Councillors are keen to highlight to the community that the closing date for consultation on the Local Plan is 22nd November 2023. Further details connected to the Local Plan are published on the Chapmanslade Parish Council website and on the Chapmanslade Community Facebook page.

Thoulstone Park

Regarding the Thoulstone Park events licence application, which had been discussed at previous meetings, it was noted that the Licencing Authority would be considering this application on 16th October.

Planning application

PL/2023/08222 - Full Planning Permission. Proposed small storage barn on equestrian land at 3 The Grange, Chapmanslade. BA13 4AN.

1. Councillors objected to this retrospective application based on the following

- concerns: The building is outside of the designated settlement development boundary area for the village
- 2. The plans submitted refer to a 'new dwelling'. This lacks clarity as the retrospective planning application form referred to a 'small storage barn' and not a 'new dwelling'
- 3. Councillors questioned the accuracy of the '2018' date that had been recorded on the application form, as the completion build date for this structure.

Enforcement decision/outcome ENF/2022/00805. Land at Black Dog Hill, Chapmanslade – unauthorised residential use of land. It was noted that the site had now been vacated and the owners had moved off the site. The land is now for sale and the Wiltshire Enforcement Officer has now closed the case.

Finance

The Parish Council's financial management, bank reconciliation and Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL) payments and potential expenditure were presented, considered and agreed. Key points from this discussion included:

- 1. A proportion of CIL funding, relating to the Thoulstone Farm development had been received from Wiltshire Council
- 2. The content of the Parish Council's finance and expenditure report, which was circulated prior to the meeting was discussed and agreed. All related finance and accounting documents can be found on the Chapmanslade Parish Council website
- 3. Payments were agreed for the purchase of a new Speed Indicator Device (SID) and the repair of one of the existing SIDs. Councillors agreed that the purchase of a new SID, using funds from a CIL payment, demonstrated the commitment of the Parish Council to responding to the

- previous 'Voice of the Village' consultation and in particular resident's concern connected to road safety and the need to reduce traffic speed through the village.
- 4. In addition, payments were agreed for a donation towards grounds maintenance of St Philip and St James' Church, and a donation towards a British Legion Memorial Poppy Wreath.

Highway safety

Connected to highway safety, Councillors discussed dangerous and excessive speeding plus the high level of fatalities on the stretch of the A36 which runs parallel to Chapmanslade. It was agreed that this continued high level of risk would be highlighted at the next Community Policing Team (CPT) meeting.

Home Energy Plan

Councillors discussed and welcomed the new Scottish and Southern Electric (SSE), Home Energy Plan. This was commended as it provides free extra support during power cuts for vulnerable residents who access SSE utilities. Councillors recognised that this would be of benefit to members of the Chapmanslade village community and that this provision will be highlighted in the Parish Council's Emergency Plan, which is currently under development.

Correspondence

In addition to agenda items, recent correspondence which had been circulated to Councillors was discussed. This included a review of local bus services, and the location of designated Polling Stations. It was noted that there were no changes to the location of Polling Station venues for Chapmanslade. Councillors recognised and congratulated Cllr Oakley on his appointment by Wiltshire Council as a Tree Warden for the Parish. Cllr Oakley shared his plan to link with the designated Tree Warden in our neighbouring village of Corsley. As a Parish Council that

is committed to protecting, preserving and celebrating the biodiversity and natural beauty of our village and its surrounding area, Cllr Oakley's plan was welcomed by all.

This is our third anniversary of walks and we're off to Trowbridge. In its time, our county town was an important market centre, for both cloth and agriculture. While I reached Trowbridge by bus, if you have a car use The Shires car park and walk through the mall; there are loos, beside the Iceland store. I paused at Boswell's café for refreshments, of course, then went out onto Market Street, with the Town Hall opposite, now being redeveloped. Turn left here, into Fore Street and walk through to Starbuck's coffee shop; the narrow alley on its right leads to St. James Church, a playgroup venue these days. I walked round the churchyard and exited onto Church Street. Stay with that and the churchyard wall, pass the junction with Union Street and circle back towards the town centre. Across the street, on the way, you'll pass the Storehouse Food Bank Referral Centre, in what may once have been an

Emmanuel Church.

At the road junction, don't go left into Duke Street but right, and you should end up facing the Post Office; notices say it's closed and the current one is in WH Smith's. Head right here and you should be in Silver Street, leading back towards Market Street and the Town Hall on the left, but before that is a left-



hand turn into Park Road; go that way. On the left, then, will be J D Wetherspoons, housed in a modern building, though the name 'Albany Palace' recalls the town's first cinema, opened here in 1910 by a film pioneer, Albany Ward. Keep walking and enter Trowbridge Park, with

its impressive War Memorial. Turn left and pass the 'Park Club' building, before the huge redbrick St. George's Works. Next is the Park Bandstand. sadly locked away behind iron railings; this was donated to Trowbridge by William Nelson Haden in 1939. in memory of his 'forebears'.

I found Trowbridge Park absorbing; it's a good size, with plenty to occupy the mind – and body. There's an 'outdoor fitness circuit' here,



with bars and ladders, steps and benches dotted about, but I was more interested in the squirrels gathering conkers! Stay on the perimeter path as its circles the central lawns, and you'll reach a 'nature area' on your left, plus a park exit. I didn't use the road beyond, but had a nose (of course!); there are almshouses on the right and Trowbridge Police Station across the throughfare, an imposing design for a modern 'cop shop'.

Band stand

Stay with the park, though, and walk along the rear of the almshouses, passing more 'exercise stands'. Next on your left is a former red-brick mill, which is now homes. Walk on, till you come to a junction of paths, on a slight downhill slope. Take the first track left,

with green railings at your right. It takes you under the road bridge and you'll feel like you're heading out into open country. The river - this is the Biss! - is on your right, while on your left, eventually, is a six-storey, stone-built former mill or similar, which looks derelict. Beside that, the path divides and there's a signpost; take the turning marked

Do you have any relics about, which are a reminder of something that you started and have never finished? I do! I love the accounts in the Bible which tell a narrative in which someone started a job and kept going until it was FINISHED.

Genesis Chapter 1 is a Biblical account of how the heavens and the earth were formed. A recent speaker said that man today is concerned about 'How' God did it, whereas the question we need to ask is 'Why' God did it. The word GOOD comes no less than 6 times in Genesis Chapter 1 in my King James version of the Bible. When I look at the things that God created, I would like to say awesome. A view from over the hedge...

Countryside Matters

A time of remembrance

We are now into our winter routines both at home and in the countryside. Daylight hours are shorter so manual fieldwork starts at daybreak. Checking outdoor wintering stock for ailments, moving them to different fields, moving electric fences to give stock fresh roots to graze or baled silage can only be done in daylight whether it is frosty, driving rain, or even snow.

Some of our best craft work can be seen both on farms and at winter shows where ploughing and hedge laying competitions are available to people of all ages.

Recently, the National Ploughing Match was in Somerset with competitors from all parts of the British Isles competing, some with horses and others with tractors of all types both modern and old competing.

Thanks to King Charles III the art of hedge laying has been encouraged over recent years, again with both old and young learning the art of hedge laying which differs from county to county.

November is a month of remembering our past. Children will learn of Guy Fawkes and his attempt to blow up the Houses of Parliament and, of course, Remembrance Sunday.

I was reminded recently of a small village in Herefordshire who are continuing the memory of the WWI Battle of Verdun. A soldier from the village returned home with an acorn from the battlefield, he planted the acorn on the boundary of the village. Ten years ago, children collected acorns from

the tree and grew them on to saplings. The saplings were planted on both sides of the road (on the edge of fields so that they will not grow to be a hazard to hedge trimmers or overhang the highway).
