

At long last...

A362 repairs and closures

Simon Jasper, the Roads/Parish Steward representative on the Corsley Parish Council, gives us a summary of the meeting held with Atkins and the County Engineer.

The A362 will be closed from 4th

November to 28th November between

Picket Post roundabout and Deep Lane
(Deep Lane will remain open) from 7pm to
6am daily, but not Saturdays and Sundays.

A letter will be sent out to residents on the A362 approximately 3 weeks prior to work commencing. I have asked for this to be extended to residents on either side of the road in the Corsley hamlets and to Little Cuckoos and the Steiner School.

The preliminary drainage work that started on the 29th August, has now been completed.

Preliminary Drainage Project

- Clear the drainage ditch on the north side of the A362 between Picket Post and the bottom of Whitbourne Hill. It was agreed this should go onto a regular observation/5 year cycle for clearance.
- Pipe under road in Whitbourne Springs area to be increased from 100mm to 250-300mm.
- Chamber near Sturford Mead entrance to be increased in size.

Comment: it won't solve the flooding, but it will help.

Major Project

- Between Picket Post and Deep Lane, take off top 50mm and relay with Hot Rolled Asphalt to 50mm. This is top grade and has a life-expectancy of 20 years... if left untouched.
- Where there is damage to the substrate, repair before relaying.
- Signing and white lining included for the area under improvement.

Comment: Leaves the need to re-white the lines from Deep Lane to Lane End and some repair work on the road surface in the area of Lane End. David Button has this on his to do list now the scope of the project is clear.

Diversion


- If you have access to the internet, you can download a copy of the road closure order from www.corsleyandthebridge.co.uk
- Essentially, traffic will be redirected to A361/A36.
- Manned point on A362/A361 junction.
- Residents in the immediate area of the work will be allowed through where reasonable, but it will involve waits and sometimes may not be possible.

Parish Council briefing

Phil Jefferson reports on the September meeting

Planning

There were no new planning applications to consider at our September meeting. However, we looked at the correspondence, five letters in all, we have received from village residents concerning the proposed housing development at Barter's Farm. It would appear that, in general, residents are in favour of some housing development on the site, particularly because of the opportunity this might create for young people to live in the village. The layout and design of the proposed development was commented on favourably, but several residents voiced a concern that too many houses were planned and that our roads would not be able to cope with the increased traffic the estate would generate. Access to the site via Clevhill Gardens was an issue, too. It was also felt that there was a danger that the development might create 'a village within a village'. One resident suggested that a housing complex similar to Imber Court in Warminster might be a welcome addition to the village.

There will be a further opportunity for residents to comment on the proposals when the final planning application is made in due course. Do you feel there is room for further housing development in the village? At what stage do we say we can't cope with any more development? Do let the parish council know.

At the time of writing, some revisions to the Three Horseshoes application have just been submitted. We will consider these and let you know our views next month. You can view the application on Wiltshire Council's website. The reference number for the application is W/10953/FUL.

Public Footpaths

Our extensive network of public footpaths will be inspected by Wiltshire Council in November. This check, which is carried out every five years, will look for wobbly or broken stiles, blocked and overgrown paths, etc., and will help Wiltshire plan its maintenance programme for the coming months. Our footpaths are an important part of our parish heritage and are public highways just as much as A roads and motorways are. If you know of a problem with one of them now or at some time in the future please contact Adam Oakley, who will take it up with Wiltshire Council. Road Safety

Have you spotted our SID yet? After ten years of asking for a Speed Indicator Device (SID) it has finally arrived. It is located on a post near Clearwood View and tells motorists driving into the village if they are exceeding the speed limit. The sign will only be with us for occasional weeks as we share it with other parishes. However, we believe it is a welcome step forward in our efforts to educate drivers to slow down as they drive through Chapmanslade. We really do want to make it a safer village in which to live and work.

Many thanks to everyone who was cooperated in our 'Blitz on Pavement Parking' campaign. The position is much better now, but is still not perfect. Please help to keep our village safe by not parking on our footpaths and please encourage visitors and tradesmen to your property to do likewise.

Road Maintenance

The parish council has been concerned for some time that vehicles, especially larger ones, have been mounting the kerb opposite the farm at Dead Maids rather than waiting to allow oncoming traffic to pass through. We asked Wiltshire Council to deal with this and you probably will have noticed that the hedge has now been cut back, which has had the effect of widening the road. A362 closure

Our thanks to Neil Britten, Corsley's Parish Council Chairman, for providing details of the forthcoming night time closure of the A362 in Corsley for essential maintenance. This will be in November, starting on the 4th, until possibly the 28th. The road will be closed between 7pm and 6am between

the Picket Post roundabout and the Deep Lane junction. Diversions will be clearly signed. The approved route for eastbound vehicles will be to utilise the A361 up to the roundabout with the A36 and then the A36 past Warminster; this will be the opposite for westbound vehicles. The area will be marshalled by the contractors to help to avoid vehicles trying to take alternative routes. Perhaps our High Street and Huntenhull Lane will be busier than usual in November?

Many congratulations to Victoria Hurley for persuading BT to paint the phone box, which recently has been looking very sorry for itself. Whether you like or loathe the phone box - an icon of village life or a road traffic hazard - you've got to admit it's looking very smart now. Thanks Victoria!



Short struck two sixes in a fine 60, before Will Lewis notched 39 not out. The visitors amassed an imposing total of 212.



It's time for the

annual 'spring clean' of your central heating boiler and your chimney

We have had a splendid summer and may not have turned our central heating this autumn yet. So before we do, what better time to ask the chimney sweep to clean your chimney or get your central heating boiler serviced.

By taking simple precautionary measures such as regular servicing by registered engineers/chimney sweeps and having smoke and carbon monoxide alarms fitted, you are helping to ensure that you will be safe from either smoke inhalation or carbon monoxide poisoning.

If you do not already have detectors or alarms fitted, it is relatively inexpensive to do so and they are easily installed.

If you do have alarms, ensure that batteries are correctly fitted, and that the appliance is in date – remember, they do have an expiry date!

How aware are you about Carbon Monoxide poisoning?

What is carbon monoxide- why is it a problem?

Carbon monoxide (CO) is a colourless, odourless, tasteless, poisonous gas produced by incomplete burning of carbonbased fuels, including gas, oil, wood and coal. Carbon-based fuels are safe to use.

It is only when the fuel does not burn properly that excess CO is produced, which is poisonous. When CO enters the body, it prevents the blood from bringing oxygen to cells, tissues, and organs. You can't see it, taste it or smell it but CO can kill quickly without warning. According to the HSE statistics around 20 people die from CO poisoning caused by gas appliances and flues that have not been properly installed, maintained or that are poorly ventilated. Levels that do not kill can cause serious harm to health if breathed in over a long period. In extreme cases paralysis and brain damage can be caused as a result of prolonged exposure to CO. Increasing public understanding of the risks of CO poisoning and taking sensible precautions could dramatically reduce this risk.

What preventative measures can I take against carbon monoxide exposure?

 Ensure that any work carried out in relation to gas appliances in domestic or commercial premises is to be undertaken by a Gas Safe Registered engineer, competent in that area of work.

- HSE strongly advises that gas appliances and/or flues are installed and serviced regularly for safety by a Gas Safe Registered engineer. If you live in tenanted accommodation, your landlord has a legal duty to carry out an annual gas safety check and maintain gas appliances. They must provide you with a copy of the completed gas safety check certificate.
- Always make sure there is enough fresh air in the room containing your gas appliance. If you have a chimney or a flue, ensure it is not blocked up and also ensure that vents are not covered.
- If you plan to install a gas fire in a bedroom, use a Gas Safe Registered engineer; do not use un-flued appliances like paraffin heaters and cabinet heaters.
- Get your chimney swept from top to bottom at least once a year by a qualified sweep.
- If you have appliances that use other fossil fuels, make sure they are serviced and maintained by a competent person.
 For information on competent persons'

schemes, visit the Communities and Local Government website.

HSE strongly recommends the use of audible carbon monoxide (CO) alarms as a useful back-up precaution but they must not be regarded as a substitute for proper installation and maintenance of gas appliances by a Gas Safe Registered engineer. Before purchasing a CO alarm, always ensure it complies with British Standard EN 50291 and carries a British or European approval mark, such as a Kitemark. CO alarms should be installed, checked and serviced in line with the manufacturer's instructions. You can be particularly at risk from CO poisoning when you are asleep, because you may not be aware of early CO symptoms until it is too late. Having an audible CO alarm could wake you and save your life.

These boots were made for walking...

This year's weather has been very good for walking, especially after last year's rain. Unfortunately, due to this footpaths have been badly affected.

Footpaths have also been in the news a lot recently, an accident in West Wilts, sheep savaged by dogs, and as reported in the Frome Standard, "Dog attacks OAP jogger" which was on a footpath near Frome.

Do you enjoy walking, riding or cycling locally? It is also good for your health. There have been a few problems with poor maintenance of footpaths this summer, some overgrown, crops and obstacles across the route, and some stiles/kissing gates in need of urgent repair. You may have noticed the kissing gate down The Hollow, Corsley has been taken away it is now with the Rights of Way team at Wiltshire Council being repaired it will be replaced in conjunction with the landowner renewing the field gate.

We all want to safely use the countryside and the Ramblers Association, Natural England and Rights of Way web that sites can help. There is an easy code of practice:

- Respect other people
- Leave gates and property as you find them
- Leave no trace of your visit.
- Keep dogs under control.

Landowners also have their rights and responsibilities with regard to maintenance of paths, obstructions, pesticides and animals.

The responsibilities for maintenance therefore vary dependent on the situation and it is usually sorted out by discussion with the relevant people. Wiltshire Council is the authority for our parishes, but it is under great pressure especially at this time of the year. In Corsley, with this in mind I am investigating the possibility of a group of volunteers to help with the maintenance of our paths. I would be pleased to hear for anyone who would be interested in getting involved. I already have list of places that need attention, please also feel free to contact me if there you have any queries.

Before the weather turns, plant some

Autumn/Winter colour

At this time of year when the colour fades after the summer season, gaps appear in our gardens; its a great idea to inject some instant colour to liven up our garden again

Here are a few tips on planting with autumn/winter colour...


Some plants that do well at this time of year and offer a reasonable amount of colour are; Pansies, Violas, Heathers, Polyanthus, Hebes, mixed evergreens and Cyclamen. They can be used when planting tubs, hanging baskets or even filling in those gaps in your borders.

When planting a basket or tub for winter, avoid using water retaining granules as planters can become water logged. It is a good idea to include a slow release fertiliser such as Osmocote in the potting media or compost so that the plants get plenty of food over the coming months.

If planting hanging baskets, try using cocoa liners: most winter plants don't trail or grow as vigorously due to the lack of sunlight so you'll see ghastly plastic liners throughout the winter, however cocoa serves all the same purposes as ordinary liners and looks great. Also the birds will appreciate it too as they like to take bit for their winter nests.

Under-planting

While planting tubs and baskets you have the perfect opportunity to plant some spring bulbs that will pop up through your winter



through other plants and be in flower the following march.

When planting tubs and baskets use a mixture of plants which are in flower and some which are due to flower, to give you a continuous show of colour through the autumn winter season. Remember that you can use foliage plants, as well as flowering plants, to create interest and give different heights, textures and colours to your planters.



Parish Council briefing

The Chairmain gives us a précis of the Quarterly Meeting held on 9th September

The quarterly meeting in September considered one planning application, up-dates on the planned A362 repairs, the Steiner School licence and the Little Cuckoos Lease and debated concerns over a particular aspect of footpath rights.

The planning application was for retrospective approval of the Gloworm Cottage stable building, previously built to a design different from the original plan, and for a manège in one of the adjacent fields. The stable stands in a very prominent position at the top of the Hollow and, on the original plan, should have been externally clad in olive green stained timber. The PC objected to the retrospective stable application on the grounds that it was detrimental to the local landscape and recommended that the original design be instated. There were no objections to the ménage.

The A362 repairs.

By the time of this Bridge edition, the long awaited meeting with Longleat (Mr Bradley and his Business Development Director) to discuss Longleat related Corsley traffic issues, and agree solutions, will have taken place. I hope to be able to make a positive report in the November Bridge.

Footpaths were also discussed in relation to the scarce maintenance resources available from Wiltshire Council and the appearance of landowners' signs advising dog walkers to keep their animals on a lead and use "poo bags". After consultation with Wiltshire footpaths officer, the PC was advised that these signs were allowable. As regards maintenance, Wiltshire are encouraging Parishes to try and plug the gaps in maintenance provision by establishing their own husbandry teams. Gill Parkinson has written in more detail on this subject elsewhere in the Bridge.

Two other issues of note were raised at the 9th September meeting; commemoration of the centenary of the start of WW1 and care of the trees on the Old School Playing Field. Other local Parishes are planning commemorative activities, as is Wiltshire, the Church and British Legion. The PC will debate this topic again at the next quarterly meeting and all views are welcome before then. As regards OSPF maintenance, the thistles around the tress have now been cut down and steps are underway to arrange clearance of the grass between the trees and attend to the hedge around the plantation.


We will be having our annual AGM on the 2nd October, where we will be electing new officers for our management committee and reviewing the year gone by.



A view from over the hedge...

Countryside Matters

Autumn came in practically overnight this year...

From the middle of September the daylight hours shortened, temperatures dropped to mid-teens, colder nights meant misty mornings that slowed drivers on their way to work and the weather has been a mixture of sunshine, showers, wind and rain.

We are surrounded by woodlands changing colour, hedges and trees hanging with berries, fruits and seeds, telling us that we must fill up our larders, storerooms, wood sheds, and barns ready for winter.

After 18 months of awful weather, the summer sunshine and good temperatures have helped farmers and gardeners. Most spring-planted cereals have grown well and harvesting has been busy, but enjoyable. Our main home-produce crop (maize) is looking good as it ripens in the field; it will be harvested during October. A specially adapted combine-harvester cuts the whole plant off 6" above ground level, and then the machine chops it into 2" lengths. The maize cobs are crushed, and the mixture is forced out off the combine into waiting trailers that move alongside the combine. Back at the farm the storage-pits have been lined with huge plastic sheets. The maize mixture is tipped in, rolled over many times by a heavy tractor to remove as much air as possible, and salt is spread over it as a preservative. Finally the clamp is covered

with plastic sheeting and weighted down with used tyres.

This autumn will hopefully bring the peace of mind to farmer that they have sufficient home-produced feed in their barns to feed all their stock this winter.

Living in the country you often look at the sky for changes in the weather, the colour of the clouds and how fast they are moving, the colour of the sky, and if you have a good sunset.

This time of year we see the birds preparing for their flight to warmer climates. Swallows and House Martins are lining the wires before heading to Africa – some all the way to Cape Town! Other species, such as Blackcaps and Willow Warblers, slip away unobtrusively. Some Chiffchaffs may stay with us for the winter and can even be seen on some bird tables. Meanwhile, birds that have bred further north are moving down to our warmer climes: look out for geese and plenty of Fieldfares and Redwings.

This year we hope to celebrate our harvest home with the traditional church services and suppers – do join in and celebrate with us.

Neediness

We sometimes hear people being judged for being 'too needy', 'clingy' or 'dependent'. We don't like these traits

in others and it's even harder to accept that we might have needy tendencies ourselves.

Is it possible to turn this around a little, though? What's wrong with being 'needy? Don't we all need love, affection, attention, time spent on us, understanding and so on?

If we're fortunate, we will have learnt some self-reliance from having had a healthy, loving childhood and we will feel generally OK about ourselves although, even then, the needs I referred to persist into adulthood in a more muted way. We are able to meet some of our own needs and don't have to look to others (taking the place of our parents) for every emotional requirement.

Those of us who missed out on getting the attention and affection we needed as children, however, will be engaged in a constant search for it throughout life and will not have had the opportunity to become confident and self-reliant adults. There's a gap. So, we look for something to fill that gap, feeling secretly unloveable and in need. And we display this need by demanding attention, affection, etc., from others. Are we to be condemned, then (by ourselves and others), for simply trying to get what we've always needed? Neediness can seem irrational, irritating and off-putting – it can drive people away (quite the reverse of what the person in need needs!). But if that person can be encouraged to understand what's missing and what drives their behaviour, they can start to repair the damage done and to fill in the gaps in their

self-confidence. And they can stop quietly condemning themselves for their pain as they become more kindly-disposed to these traits and are released from their shame.

Even if you feel that your childhood was quite good enough, you probably have times when you feel vulnerable and needy. But we tend to hide these feelings for fear of being seen as weak and overly-dependent. If we are all able to be more honest about how we feel, we can start to live more freely and authentically. Isn't there a tiny bit of you right now wishing you could be more openly needy sometimes?
