



Notice is hereby given that the Wiltshire Council has made an Order to close temporarily to all traffic: A3098 (Part) Tower Hill/Hisomley/Chalcot Lane, Dilton Marsh and Chapmanslade; from its junction with C386 Clydesdale Road/B3099 Tanyard Way in a southwesterly direction to its junction with A36 northbound slip road (Thoulstone).

To enable Wiltshire Council to carry out carriageway resurfacing and associated works.







Parish Council Briefing

The Chairman, Neil Britten, presents his report of the September meeting

A quarterly meeting was held on 1st September, the main items being introductions to the new Longleat CEO and Land Agent, two planning applications, consideration of the Len White trust and an update on the accounts and annual spending.

Longleat

The Longleat Estate has recently made two key senior appointments, Mr Michael Birnie as Land Agent and Mr Bob Montgomery as CEO, both reporting to the Longleat Trust. Both attended the meeting to introduce themselves to the PC and take questions.

Michael Birnie described his recent experience as a Land Agent on an Estate in the Scottish Borders and his farming background. He is responsible for Longleat property, farms, the house and the Caravan Club site. He lives with his wife in Horningsham and works from an office in Stalls Farm. Mr Birnie is the main contact for Longleat traffic issues, though it was accepted that the was shared with the CEO, since large elements of the Longleat traffic streams arise from decisions associated with the attractions.

Bob Montgomery has worldwide experience of commercial presentation of events, most

recently in Lakeland Park, Windsor, but lately also in Canada. He is responsible for Longleat tourism including the Safari Park, hotels and Cheddar Gorge. Longleat has been under going through a culture change which has included a significant number changes to key staff and management attitudes. The major annual revenue earning period has just ended and Longleat is now taking time to review the future and develop more rational plans. He publicised a big event being planned for the Christmas period, entitled a 'Festival of Light' which will involve a spectacular display of very large, static, Chinese light structures, on a 30 acre site in the park, starting in December. This is expected to bring significantly more visitors during the Christmas period than in previous vears.

Questions principally concerned Longleat traffic and its impact on both the village lanes and the main roads. The combination of visitors to the park, Centre Parcs, local agricultural, business and private traffic raise safety concerns and make for very difficult, frustrating situations for both local residents and holidaymakers. Councillors expressed concern over the general yearly increase in the volume of traffic and the consequence of events such as the Festival of Light. Strongly

held views were expressed that Longleat and Centre Parcs should take much more positive steps to manage the entry and exit routes within their own boundaries and not rely on unsuitable narrow lanes. The view was also expressed that Longleat should also takes steps to manage the queues which build up at peak times within the park and not rely on the capacity of public roads. This was particularly an issue in the Picket Post roundabout area. Mr Montgomery reported that steps were already being considered to speed up the processing of customers at the main entrance in an effort to reduce aueuina.

Both Michael and Bob agreed that they would work together with the PC respect to re-open detailed discussions to try and find solutions to the traffic issues in the village and to be the keynote speakers at the 205 Annual Parish Meeting.

Planning Applications

14/7369/FUL

Single storey extension at 111, The Hollow, with ballustrade and new first floor access to flat tiled roof. The PC had no objection.

14/07791/FUL

Revised access to 120 Lyes Green with new splay, gateposts, gate and tarmac drive. Old access to be closed and replaced by post and rail fencing and hedge. The PC had no objection.

Len White Trust

This Trust was set up in 1992 in memory of Len White, a long standing Councillor at local and county level. Its funds, then £1,100, were raised by donations from the family and village residents and its object was to use income from the fund for the benefit of pupils of Corsley School or, if as has happened, the School closed, then for

the benefit of children between the ages of 5 and 11, living in Corsley, for educational purposes as the Trustees think fit. The Trustees are the Parish Councillors.

No payments have been made for some years and the fund had been held within the PC ordinary bank account. The fund now stands at £2,679 and has come into focus after the Auditors recommended that the Trust once again be kept in a separate account. This will be done, whilst at the same time the PC is reviewing the terms of the Trust and the means by which its objects are discharged. This will be discussed in more detail at the December quarterly meeting.

Finance

The PC accounts have been audited and accepted, subject to one or two minor comments and the recommendations concerning the Len White Trust. The 2014/15 budget was reviewed and spending is on track, excepting the allowance for PC courses and training which is as yet unused. At the December meeting decisions will be taken on the level of support for local organisations and the precept bid for 2015/16.

Consultations

In addition to the two recent consultation concerning Green Waste and restrictions on the bus pass scheme, which were publicised in September, a third is now underway offering three cost saving options for the future of the County Fire & Rescue Service structure. Myself and Mike Bird will attend a presentation in early October and will respond to a questionnaire addressed to PCs. I will report on the November Bridge.

Getting to know you!

When you read this letter I probably will have moved house to be with you, but as I write today I sit at my desk surrounded by the detritus of moving and looking forward immensely and with much excitement to coming to be with you all, and to beginning our journey together as people of faith.

It is a disconcerting time though in many ways, a sort of 'in between time' where I am called to loose the bonds of relationships I have formed here and step into the unknown where new relationships and ways of being are waiting to be grown and developed; it is a transitional space both exciting and challenging. I believe God calls all of us to be transitional people in a way, people committed to listening for the whisper of the Holy Spirit and joyfully responsive to His call, people willing to embrace the vulnerability of the unknown and open to the joys and the challenges of new life and new experiences.

I feel very privileged to be called to share this journey with you all in such a beautiful part of the country; the countryside has always been very important to me and both Ian and I are very much looking forward to exploring the footpaths around about with Alfie our Labrador. So it is with the ministry I am called to share with you; I have no mental 'map' of this place, no knowledge of the history and stories that the Cley Hill Villages are rooted in, so it seems to me that the best thing I can do is for a while is to listen and learn. I want to spend time getting to know the story of this place so that I can try to get a feel of how we together can best serve God and neighbour in this locality. All of this of course, will need much prayer; indeed I would go so far as to say that prayer must be the bedrock of our life together.

I leave you with a few words from the Licensing service, which I find very moving, as it brings me face to face with my own human frailty and the enormity of God's grace in calling me and equipping me to serve him as a priest his Church. After the Collect the Bishop says:

'As we now license a new priest to this cure of souls, let us pray for her and for all who share in the ministry of this Benefice that she may be a faithful priest and shepherd, and that they may work together for the building up of God's kingdom in this place.'

I hold all of you in my prayers as we begin this adventure together.



Before the weather turns, plant some

Autumn/Winter colour

At this time of year when the colour fades after the summer season and gaps appear in our gardens, its a great idea to inject some instant colour to liven up the garden again

Here are a few tips on planting with Autumn/Winter colour...

Some plants that do well at this time of year and offer a reasonable amount of colour are; pansies, violas, heathers, polyanthus, hebes, mixed evergreens and cyclamen. They can be used when planting tubs, hanging baskets or even filling in those gaps in your borders.

When planting a basket or tub for winter, avoid using water retaining granules as planters can become water logged. It is a good idea to include a slow-release fertiliser such as Osmocote in the potting media or compost so that the plants get plenty of food over the coming months.

If planting hanging baskets, try using cocoa liners – most winter plants don't trail or grow as vigorously due to the lack of sunlight so you'll see ghastly plastic liners throughout the winter. Cocoa liners serve the same purpose as ordinary liners but look so much better. The birds will appreciate them too as they like to take bit for their winter nests.

Under-planting

Whilst planting tubs and baskets you have the perfect opportunity to plant some spring



bulbs that will pop up through your winter plants. Bulbs such as Tête-à-Tête daffodil, crocus and tulips are ideal for underplanting and will quite happily grow up through other plants and be in flower the following march.

When planting tubs and baskets use a mixture of plants which are in flower and some which are due to flower, to give you a continuous show of colour throughout the Autumn Winter season. Remember that you can use foliage plants as well as flowerina plants to create interest and give different heights, textures and colour to your planters.

To prolong the life of your new colourful display... keep dead heading!

Chapmanslade Parish Council

Parish Council Briefing

Phil Jefferson reports from Chapmanslade Parish Council

Chapmanslade Parish Council has met twice since my last report, on 22nd August and 11th September.

Planning

At our meeting on 22nd August we considered an application to demolish a bungalow at 158 High Street and replace it with 2 four-bedroom semis. We listened carefully to the concerns of local residents and resolved to object to the application, on the grounds that the proposed parking arrangements were inadequate and that the development was out of proportion to the size of the plot. The application has now been withdrawn and it has been replaced by an application to build a single 5/6 bedroom dwelling. We will consider this application shortly.

Our 11th September meeting was well attended and it was good to see several residents who have recently moved into the village joining us.

Barters Farm

Legh Walker, from Barters Farm, came to update us on the proposed housing development. He told us that Aster Homes are no longer his business partner and he is now working with a new sponsor. He has retained the same architect and planning consultant. The original plans for the proposed development are currently being

revised but no major changes are expected, with about 40 dwellings being planned. Legh promised to keep us in close touch with progress and he will make arrangements for one-to-one contact with immediate neighbours over the coming weeks.

Settlement Boundaries Consultation

In planning terms, a settlement boundary is the dividing line, or boundary, between areas of built/urban development (the settlement) and non-urban or rural development (the open countryside). Wiltshire Council is currently reviewing each community's settlement boundary, and as a first step it is consulting on the criteria for defining them. We expressed concern about some of these criteria, feeling that the inclusion of religious buildings, schools and community halls, and particularly site allocations for community and employment uses, would not necessarily be in the best interests of communities. It could end up with more housing development taking place than communities might feel was desirable.

Two new bungalows?

Back in July, Wiltshire Council asked us to agree in principle two two-bedroomed bungalows being constructed at the plot of land at the eastern end of Clearwood View, the idea being that this would free up three bedroomed social housing currently being occupied by retired couples (not necessarily living in Chapmanslade). We looked at this again in September and resolved that we couldn't support the proposal. Wiltshire Council is to be commended on its efforts to free up social housing but we felt that this was not a suitable location for retirement homes. We were concerned that the site is isolated from the rest of the village, there is no footpath and vehicular access from the High Street would be hazardous. We also decided to decline the offer of a housing needs survey in the parish at the present time.

Road safety in the vicinity of Chapmanslade School

We were pleased to welcome Berkeley Basinger-Adams, Chapmanslade School's head teacher, to the meeting. Road safety outside the school continues to be a major issue and he encouraged us to restart the debate in the community about possible solutions. As a first step, Keith Muston and I are due to meet highway engineers from Wiltshire Council on 7th October at the Warminster Area Traffic Group and we will seek further advice from them.

Community speedwatch

Part of the solution to this problem is to slow traffic down and as you know, the aim of community speedwatch is to educate drivers to the fact that speeding in villages such as ours is both dangerous and anti-social. Our team is one of over 100 operating throughout Wiltshire. We have recently been able to put on a number of sessions in the late afternoon rather than simply at the beginning and end of the school day. One

afternoon last month over 500 cars passed through the village in the hour of our check. The drivers of 14 of them will have received a letter from Wiltshire Police two or three days afterwards giving appropriate advice! With more volunteers we could do a better iob. If you could spare an hour or two each month to help make our village a better place please ring Jill Willmot on 01373 832464

Highways

Be aware of possible disruption later this month whilst the A3098 at Tower Hill is resurfaced (see the road closure notice elsewhere in The Bridge). Major road works in Westbury town centre are also planned to take place shortly, also involving road closures. Southcroft residents are concerned about the increasingly dangerous state of the road surface there. We have been promised that it will be resurfaced but, to date, Wiltshire Council have been unable to tell us when.

Neighbourhood Watch

Jill Willmot reported on a county-wide community messaging initiative that Wiltshire Police has recently introduced. Residents signing up with the service will receive free email, text or phone messages about policing and crime matters in their area. Jill urged residents to check out the website www.wiltshiremessaging.co.uk and sign up for the service.

Defibrillator

As part of its outreach programme, The Friends of Frome Hospital has introduced a pioneering Community Defibrillator Scheme by installing a network of publicly accessible defibrillators (AEDs) at strategic continued...

locations across the town. The Friends are now extending the scheme to a number of villages neighbouring Frome and Chapmanslade has been chosen as a possible location for one of them. We are interested in the suggestion but before reaching a decision we will give the matter further thought. We hope that, at our October meeting, we will be given a demonstration on how the defibrillator works. If we go ahead we would be expected to carry out some fundraising to help defray maintenance costs.

and finally...

The school is keen to work with the community to provide and maintain planters at one or more points in the village. They are asking for volunteers to help them. If you would like to help brighten up the village in this way please get in touch with the school on 01373 832367.



Warminster to Africa

We enjoyed a visit from Dr and Mrs Johannes Merz last month. They are both working as anthropologists with Wycliffe Bible Translators in Togo and Benin, West Africa. Johannes is Swiss; his wife, Sharon, comes from Warminster and went to Kingdown School, then Birmingham University and is doing further research in conjunction with Trinity St David University in Wales. They gave us a presentation about their work, and afterwards, at tea, welcomed questions.



Tales from the passenger seat



Politeness and courtesy are rather nice traits that some pupils display in great quantity, whilst others are completely the opposite.

Aaron always drove as though he was late for a meeting, and even when we were in a queue, he would be fidgeting and tapping the wheel with impatience, despite the fact he actually had nowhere to go, the gueue was perfectly normal and the lesson was specifically planned to give him traffic experience. Many times he would be looking round the car in front for an opportunity to overtake it, despite the fact there was no space beyond and he would only gain the length of a car...and all this whilst he was still at a fairly incompetent stage of learning. I had to constantly stop him from trying to tailgate the car in front of us. Even when I had got his judgement up to a reasonable level, he would try to pull out in front of vehicles at a junction or roundabout when there was absolutely no room to do so – he was always in a hurry for no reason. He did pass, but had a few more lessons than he really needed if he had only learned to settle down and be at peace with the situation.

Contrast this with a pupil who was a Buddhist. All lessons were beautifully calm, and her driving in general became a serene experience. Wonderful! Up to a point. The main problem was that actions were just

that teeny bit too serene. All movements were slow and considered, observations were never more than a gentle look around. All traffic, in her mind, would only be approaching slowly, would never appear suddenly and would certainly never be in a hurry; slow movements and actions would be perfectly in order.

For her, I had to instil a degree of speed and, what to her, was totally unwarranted aggression. I had to impress upon her the reality of speeding traffic: getting her to drive above 40mph and, if changing lanes, the need for quick and continuous observation was not an easy task. She was perfectly able to do so, she just did not want to be part of a world that had briskness and fast movements as a necessary and, within reason, a generally normal expectation.

The salvation to this karma was her getting pregnant, and apart from the need to now buckle down and do what I was telling her if she wanted a licence, I was also able to remind her that she would need a licence to drive her toddler to nursery school in due course. Somewhat unwillingly, she forced herself to speed up her movements, and duly passed in a shorter time than if she had not become pregnant.

A view from over the hedge...

Countryside Matters

'Come, ye thankful people, come, Raise the song of harvest home!'

On the evening of 18th September the long spell of dry weather broke with a memorable thunder and lightning storm, lasting for some hours and followed by some steady rain. The Indian Summer seemed to be over.

The very dry early Autumn has given farmers the opportunity to grab an extra crop of grass silage and to leave stock out at night as the temperature has rarely gone below 10-12°. The maize is already being harvested and most farms have seen some of the best crops of maize grown for some years, let's hope that harvest goes well.

The farm is still very busy with calving and one of the most demanding jobs is that of recording each calf as it's born. This involves fixing a metal ear tag in one ear with the registration number of the farm, and then a tag with the calf's own individual ID in the opposite ear. Each calf has all of these numbers recorded, plus the breed of mother and of father, gender (bull or heifer calf), and date on which it was born. A passport is then issued and kept on the farm: if the calf or cow is sold or moved to another holding the passport goes with it. Britain has the best record for traceability of cattle in the world. However, keeping up with all these records on a daily basis can be guite a trial when we are also working a 12-14 hour day in all weatherst

For the sheep farmer it is important that the ewes are in good condition this month as this is the start of the season for rams to be introduced to the flock. A good breeding system is allimportant to farm animals and farmers take great pride in improving their stock each vear.

The farmyards get noisier as the cattle spend more time there, but we do miss the birds swooping down feeding and nesting around the buildings. Many of these birds have flown off to warmer climes: the swifts went in early September, but swallows can linger well into October or even November. Some of the chiffchaffs will stay with us all winter and, along with our resident birds, will soon be joined by Winter's birds. Out in the fields and woodlands we hear the call of the crows, rooks and ravens, and the pheasants are especially noisy as evening draws in. Myths Caroline Le Vine, Counsellor in Corsley

Through the course of my own personal therapy, I've discovered that I believe or have believed in ideas

which hold no truth. I believed, for example, that people were either good or bad. I now believe that everyone has the capacity for both "good" and "bad" behaviour and that, even when the behaviour is "bad", there are reasons for it. This saves me a huge amount of disappointment: when a person I thought beyond reproach did a less-thanperfect thing, it would have baffled and upset me, threatening my world-view. Now, my expectations are more realistic and my disappointments fewer as a result.

How common that particular myth is, I can't say, but I'm sure many of us have somewhere in us the notion that "one day" our lives will be perfect: that we'll know how to deal with any situation, that we'll be loved unconditionally and intuitively by that special person, that there will be enough money, that we'll be happy all the time – whatever the specifics, it will be better somewhere out there in the future. It's a myth – we can't know what the future holds. And your rational thinking mind will doubtless be telling you this right now. It may even be telling me that I'm wrong and that of course you know this not to be true. BUT, what about the other bit of you: the secret, emotional, vulnerable bit? The bit that, like a child, wants to believe in the happy ever after? Maybe that bit doesn't exist for you (counsellor raises eyebrow) or maybe it does and you feel yourself drawn

to your particular myth but catch yourself before you start relying on it as a guarantee. If your myths (or the lack of them!) don't disable you, if they don't set you up for disappointment and bewilderment, that's areat – optimism is important and healthy and can help us create our future. If they are disabling, though; if you find yourself heavy with disappointment or even grief for the way things turn out, maybe there's a myth in there somewhere that's creating unrealistic expectations.
