

Biology: changing the world

The perils of higher education


I am writing this on the day before A level results come out and a large number of pupils, some from our villages, are waiting to see how they have done and whether they

have achieved the grades they need to go to on to university or college. If they do so, they are bound to meet new people, hopefully make new friends and have an active social life (as well as working hard of course!).

New friends bring new ideas, new opportunities and – here's the rub – new infections. I apologise if anyone is unimpressed

with my writing about infections in two consecutive articles, but I try and keep this column topical.

Many people know that there is a higher incidence of glandular fever in students than in the general population. The reasons are complex, but the common name of 'kissing disease' gives the hint of one form of transmission of the virus causing the illness. The normal form of the disease is unpleasant, with fever, a sore throat and fatigue, but otherwise it is not particularly problematic. However, the patient should avoid contact with others as it is highly infectious. Lifelong immunity is acquired during infection, so individuals who were infected as children should not catch the disease later.



carry the bacterium or virus that causes the disease and are perfectly healthy. Only when the bacteria or viruses infect the tissues around the brain or spinal cord (the meninges) does the disease occur.

In August, Public Health England issued an urgent appeal for students starting university or college to be vaccinated. Although the likelihood of contracting

meningitis is low, a new strain of meningitis W causes death in 10% of cases and may lead to other health problems. A new vaccine released last year protects against this strain as well as strains A, C and Y.

The message is simple – if you know someone going to university or college, tell them to get the new MenACWY vaccine, also MMR if they have not already been vaccinated against measles, mumps and rubella, and then enjoy their new social life.



Chairman, Neil Britten, rounds up the activities of the PC and announces a public meeting on the broadband issue

This is a very curtailed 'summer holiday' brief. There has been one occasional meeting of the PC in the last month, primarily to deal with a planning application, but the opportunity was taken to catch up on some key issues and take decisions on the way ahead.

Planning application

16/0257/FUL

Erection of a three-bay detached garage at the old school

This is a replacement for the original application for a two-bay detached garage that had been approved, with conditions restricting the use of the building and its development or disposal as a separate dwelling.

The PC had no objection to the application, subject to the conditions remaining.

Bay Tree Close

This project is progressing and a planning application is anticipated around the end of August. The PC has agreed that the new sewage disposal plans meet previous concerns and Wiltshire have reported good progress in getting agreement for the new footpath between Bay Tree and the Heath.

Wiltshire have recommended that the PC investigate potential additional funding for the project from the Community Area, who have a small 'pot' available for Highway projects. In the present plan the new bus stops are widened areas on the footpaths at the entrance to Bay Tree, but there are no shelters. The possibility of applying for additional funding from the Community Area for shelters will be investigated.

Broadband

BT have provided a quotation for the additional infrastructure needed to extend the Wiltshire funded broadband upgrade to the whole village. A planned public meeting, to be held on the **28th September** was ratified by the PC. This meeting will allow BT to explain their overall plans for Corsley, both the Heath upgrade and the additional improvements for the rest of Corsley, the costs and the detail of how these costs could be met. This will be your opportunity to question BT about any and all broadband matters which concern you and a notice for the meeting is on the opposite page. It will be also be advertised on The Bridge website and by public notice.

The options for funding will be presented at the meeting, along with the involvement needed from the village to make it a



Super harvest

With the arrival of September, fingers are crossed that you've had a successful year with lots of lovely things to harvest from your garden

- Main crop potatoes are ready to harvest when foliage begins to turn and fade. Avoid leaving them for too long as this will increase the risk of damage caused by slugs. Prior to storing your potatoes, allow them to dry off a little in a cool, dark place and then transfer them to a paper bag, hessian sack or something similar
- When harvesting garlic, onions or shallots, carefully loosen the roots from the soil a few days before you harvest them and then lift and lay to dry any crops that you intend on storing
- To store carrots, find a tray and fill it with dry sand. Lay the carrots in the sand, covering them entirely to ensure that all the light has been excluded. Pick the carrots out of the tray as and when you need them!
- When the silk at the top of sweet corn turns a brown/black colour it's ready for harvest. Pick just before you need them and if ripe they should exude a milky, not clear, juice
- Tomatoes will soon be ready, but if you have a few that are not ripening, hang up a banana skin near the unripe ones. The banana skin will release a gaseous plant hormone called ethylene and cause the tomato to ripen quicker
- Apples, pears and plums will be ripening on fruit trees and be very rich in sugar. All the bugs and pests in your garden will love this and will travel up the tree

to reach the sugar. To prevent this from happening, tie grease bands around the trunk of the tree about half way up and this will stop the pests, so they don't ruin your crop.

Chapmanslade Parish Council

Parish Council Briefing

Phil Jefferson reports on the parish council's activities in July and August

The parish council has met twice since my last report, on 7th July and 11th August.

July meeting

A new plan for Chapmanslade?

Residents with a relatively long memory will recall the Chapcap initiative. This involved a series of meetings attended by many village residents, a parish questionnaire which most residents participated in and a number of working groups that tackled some of the issues which were current in Chapmanslade at that time. Chapcap was a hugely successful initiative, which fostered a strong community spirit in the village and brought a number of benefits, some of which remain with us today. The children's play park, a youth club, litter collection, community speedwatch, kerbside recycling and hedge planting are just a few of the developments that grew out of the scheme.

For some time now, and after a false start a few years ago, the parish council has been thinking about revisiting the notion of having a parish plan and, at our meeting, Adam gave a comprehensive presentation on the different types of planning processes that communities can use to best meet their own needs. Adam was assisted by Trevor

Cherrett from the Wiltshire Land Community Trust and representing Community First, who fielded questions from councillors and members of the public.

We agreed that the parish council should make this a priority over the coming months and that the next step would be to raise awareness throughout the parish. revisions to 16/05148/LBC on safety grounds – the track between the church and the school is owned by the church. The school has agreed to take these into account.

16/05260/FUL

53 High Street Proposed single storey rear extension, new detached car port, and new entrance steps from public footpath.

The parish council objected to this application because of concerns about the height of the proposed carport. We were also concerned that the application requested the obliteration of the existing right of way across the front of the property. We regard this section of public highway to be part our village heritage, the legendary village 'bash', and its obliteration as a right of way would, we feel, be detrimental in the long term.

Wiltshire has now approved the planning application but, at the time of writing the approval letter has not appeared on Wiltshire's website so we do not know yet whether any conditions have been applied. However, see the note below on our discussions at the August meeting.

Highways

The parish council is not making much progress in persuading Wiltshire Council that we need a 7.5 tonne limit throughout the village and we are not impressed with their grounds for saying no. We will continue to press our case!

You may have noticed the return of the Speed Indicator Device (SID) to the village recently. Warminster and the surrounding villages share two of these mobile devices and from time to time we will have our share of one of them. Sadly, Wiltshire Council

does not see SIDs as an effective means of calming traffic but the general feeling in those villages that operate Speedwatch schemes is that they serve a useful reminder to motorists when the speedwatch teams are not on duty.

Neighbourhood Watch

Phil Holihead reported on a meeting of coordinators from across Wiltshire he had attended. This had been addressed by the Chief Constable and the Police and Crime Commissioner. The police are experiencing an increasingly challenging time with budgets being cut back but are trying hard to ensure that they maintain their presence in the community. We are grateful for the support we get from Debbie, our PCSO.

Phil reported he is updating the team of village coordinators and discussed the possibility of a messaging system which would link the police's messaging system to our village website. As a precursor to this, Debbie posts her monthly report there and whenever possible we inform you of those alerts we receive from the police which are relevant to our parish.

As you will know, there has been a minor spate of burglaries in the village in recent weeks so vigilance is urged at all times. As I write this, I have learned about a car parked in the High Street which was severely damaged by another vehicle in the early hours of the morning (18/19 August). The offending vehicle, perhaps a lorry or van with a trailer, did not stop even though it too was damaged and left debris on the road surface.

Warminster Area Board

The Warminster Area Board met in our village hall on 30th June. I had the

opportunity of welcoming the five Wiltshire Councillors from the Warminster area to our village and to the village hall. I then gave a presentation which highlighted the 'historical and positive attributes of Chapmanslade' (as Wiltshire Council described it). I thanked the Area Board for their grant contributions and for funds which had provided traffic calming measures. A copy of the presentation is posted on the village website. The village hall committee's request for a grant of £2.304 towards a much-needed dishwasher for the kitchen was agreed at the meeting.

August meeting

We do not normally meet in August but an extraordinary meeting was held on 11th August to consider a number of planning applications.

We raised no objection to the following three applications:

16/06570/FUL

12 Brimhill Rise: proposed extensions to front elevation and over existing garage.

16/06450/FUL

140 High Street: increase in size of existing single storey extension.

16/06460/FUL

Black Dog Cottage 75 Black Dog Hill: erection of single storey extension to the kitchen and a porch around the existing side door entrance to the house.

16/06626/FUL

The Old Kennels 164 Short Street: change of use of land for the siting of three safari tents (tourism business use)

We were joined at the meeting by most of the residents of Short Street, who are totally opposed to this application. They believe that a business venture of this nature is inappropriate for this location: they are

concerned that increased traffic on a narrow and twisting lane would make an existing hazard even more dangerous and they have concerns about drainage issues, too.

The parish council's decision to lodge an objection to the proposal was unanimous. We hope that, if the case officer from the planning department recommends approval, Fleur de Rhé-Philipe, our Wiltshire Councillor, will "call the application in" so that it will be considered at a meeting of the Western Area Planning Committee. It seems that this will depend on whether or not the highways authority expresses concern about the proposal.

16/05260/FUL

53 High Street: proposed single storey rear extension, new detached car port, and new entrance steps from public footpath.

Concerning the requested obliteration of the public highway outside no 53, we were informed that the Secretary of State for the Environment is charged with making a decision. We decided that it would be appropriate to lodge an objection, which the Secretary of State will need to take into account when reaching her decision.

Our next scheduled parish council meeting is due to be held in the village hall on Thursday 8th September. Do come along to the meeting if you can, to speak or maybe just to listen. 





Tales from the passenger seat



There are many myths and misunderstandings about the test that are completely untrue...

"You must not thank other drivers for letting you through a gap" This is nonsense! You can, as long as you don't wobble when doing it. Nod and smile if it is difficult to raise a finger or hand.

"You must run over animals if you are on your test" Er, no! Try to avoid the animal as you would normally, as long as it doesn't cause an accident with another road user.

"You are not allowed to speak to the examiner". Poppycock! Yes you can, although it is probably best not to get into a full blown conversation with the examiner, as talking can, especially at the wrong moment, be a distraction.

"You have to move your head to let the examiner know you are looking in the mirror". Ha Ha! Another common myth. The examiner is watching the pupil's eyes, not the nodding of the head. Moving your head is not of itself a failure, and sometimes it is necessary in order to get a better view of something i.e. a cyclist slightly out of sight behind you. But it is unnecessary to do it for the benefit of the examiner. The examiners are perfectly trained to see the eyes move.

"I am not allowed to talk myself through a difficult situation" Yes you can. If it makes it easier to talk out loud through some elements of the test (a common example

can be counting the exits on a roundabout out loud), then there is no harm in doing so. The examiner is interested in what the pupil actually does, not what they say.

"Examiners have to fail a certain number. of pupils each week". Absolute nonsense. If it was down to a lottery of 'today's the failure day', then all instructors would have the same pass rate because statistically it would all even out, yet we all know there are good and bad in all professions... and pass rates are not all the same! This is invariably an excuse made by people who didn't pass their first test. If the examiners had to fail a certain number of people, then the reverse would also be true, that the examiners would therefore have to pass a required number or percentage of pupils - which would swiftly become ridiculous, since if examiners failed (for instance) the first half of a weeks tests. that means they would have to pass the remaining half that week, even if some of them ran three red lights, took off a wing mirror and pulled out in front of other traffic causing them to brake. It becomes very clear that the ability for the examiner to 'massage the results' would go rapidly and badly wrong. It would, and is, much simpler that if a person on test makes a failure mistake, then fail them, and if they don't, then pass them! The statistics will show up as a truth of actual performance.



A view from over the hedge...

Countryside Matters

Wow what a summer! Lots of outside events have been enjoyed on some lovely sunny days – I hope that the Corsley Show will benefit as well!

Farmers and gardeners are notorious for grumbling about the weather, but the six to eight weeks of having hardly any rain during July and August brought the harvesting of cereal crops forward a few weeks earlier than usual. Bearing a slightly lower yield, the crops were harvested in a dry state, so farmers will receive smaller drying bill.

The turn-round on some of our fields was immediate with direct-drilling of winter feeding crops going straight into the stubble.

Our lanes, roads and motorways are busy with trailers and lorries travelling down to the West Country carrying straw which will be used for feed and bedding in the oncoming months of winter. We are fortunate to be able to buy in straw locally from Salisbury Plain, which helps keep costs down, whereas farmers in the West Country and Wales where less arable crops are grown may have to buy in from as far afield as East Anglia.

The birds are enjoying the grain dropped in the fields and the fruits in the hedgerows. If you go out picking the fruit in the hedgerows, do go along footpaths where you will find berries less contaminated with dust and traffic fumes. Following a shower of rain, you may even find some field mushrooms which appear overnight: get out early and pick them and eat them at their best for breakfast

Sadly, as the clouds bearing a little welcome rain come over the village, the second day of tuberculosis testing is carried out on the farm; the news is not good – eight reactors on the first day, all pregnant cows due to calf in the next few months will now be slauahtered, and there could be more by the end by the end of today.
