# Your 'village hall'

Secretary, Liz Garrett, reports on the latest happenings at the hall

Thank you to those of you who attended the Festive Fair on Thursday 6th November. This event raised over £500 which will help us with the costs of some redecorating. We sold out early for tickets for the talk by Ned Boulting on Wednesday 19th November, an event hugely enjoyed by all who attended!

In October we were granted £500 by the Warminster Area Board to allow us to install three more infra-red heaters in the main hall. We are grateful for this help from the Area Board. We will be seeking feedback from our users on how well these heaters work, before moving to remove the old electric heaters.

Thanks also to the Parish Council for a grant to cover our fixed costs. Despite this help from grant sources, we must raise monies for other costs such as cleaning, routine maintenance, advertising and repairs.

One thing we have done this year is to lodge the committee minute books and booking diaries for the period 1890 to 2010 with the Wiltshire and Swindon History centre in Chippenham. By doing this we ensure the documents are stored safely. The history centre can allow access to the documents for education purposes, but they will seek our permission before doing so.

# Parish Council Briefing

Councillor Colin Bell reports on the key points from the meeting on Thursday 6th November

Before reporting on the meeting, the Parish Council would like to wish all readers, parishioners and residents of Chapmanslade, Corsley and the surrounding areas a healthy, happy and enjoyable Christmas and New Year. We hope the festive season brings you peace, joy and time well spent with family, friends and neighbours.

The Chapmanslade Parish Council (PC) met at Chapmanslade Village Hall. Councillor Phil Holihead chaired the meeting, with five Parish Councillors present, along with the Clerk, Mrs M House. Three members of the public attended and were warmly welcomed. As per protocol, councillors were invited to declare any conflicts of interest. None were recorded.

Key points from the meeting were as follows:

The meeting opened with an opportunity for members of the public to speak or raise questions linked to the published agenda. No points were raised, and the open session was closed.

Before approving the minutes of the previous meeting (16th October), the Chair addressed correspondence received relating to a query previously raised about a building at 2 The Grange. The Chair confirmed that the minutes accurately reflected the discussion held and that the PC had asked a question of the Wiltshire County Council Planning Officer and that the PC had not made a statement of fact. Councillors noted the new

information provided by the correspondent but agreed the minutes should remain unchanged. The PC's recorded response of 'no objection' also remained unchanged. The minutes were approved and are available on the PC's website.

## **Matters arising**

### **• Short Street junction**

No further updates were available. It was noted that following an accident, a vehicle had recently been found off the road on the perimeter of Thoulstone Park land. No further information about this incident was known.

### **• Village pavements**

Major pavement works in the centre of the village were completed on 28th October, including those outside the Three Horseshoes pub and the school entrance. Remaining agreed works are scheduled, although dates are yet to be confirmed. Markings are already in place for the next phase. A large pothole near the Village Hall entrance (A3098) was reported and will be passed to the Parish Steward.

### **• Resilience and Focus Group**

A member of the PC is planning to attend the next tabletop exercise meeting, the date of which is to be confirmed.

### **• Policy review**

Councillors continue to work through the update of Council policies and plan to finalise these ahead of the next meeting.

**Finance**

The November finance and budget report was reviewed, including expected year-end spending. Payments noted included expenditure for extended warranty cover for the Speed Indicator Devices (SID) positioned at either end of the village. Budget planning for 2026/27 has begun, although at the time of the meeting precept guidance from Wiltshire Council had not yet been received.

A donation request from the South Western Ambulance Charity (SWAC) was discussed. Whilst it was agreed that this is a much respected and valued charity, the PC decided not to donate and that it was down to individual parishioners to decide which charity they support.

No new Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL) requests had been received. Progress on the Village Hall project continues, with the reminder that works must be completed by March 2026.

**Correspondence and updates**

• **Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB) signage**

Two fly-tipping signs have been requested. A potential additional location for fly-tipping signage was discussed. At this time, it was not considered necessary to request signage for other ASB categories.

• **Police presence**

The Police Van will visit the village on Saturday 6th December outside the Three Horseshoes pub. Members of the community are encouraged to drop by, say hello and talk through any relevant matters of concern and/or opportunity.

• **Wiltshire Council Gypsies & Travellers Development Plan Document**

Councillors noted Wiltshire Council’s update and call for sites.

• **Planning**

An amendment to application PL/2025/07387 (55 High Street, single-storey extension) was reviewed. Councillors

agreed no further comments were required beyond the original submission.

**Next PC meeting**

The next meeting will take place on Thursday 11th December at 7.30 pm in the Village Hall. As always, we warmly encourage all members of the Chapmanslade community to join us at future PC meetings. Your voice is important, valued and very much welcomed, and your participation helps ensure the PC continues to represent the ‘voice of the village’ in all matters affecting our community.

# Six Open Doors

Dear Friends in Corsley and Chapmanslade,  
Happy Christmas!

I wonder if this is one of the first Christmas greetings you will have received this year. Unless, of course, that inevitable first, early Christmas card from that frustratingly highly organised friend has already, somewhat prematurely, arrived. Bringing, if you are like me, that brief moment of panic too. Help, how will I get ready in time?

But getting ready of course is what the season of Advent, the run up to Christmas, is all about. The Latin root of the word Advent means Coming or Arrival. It is when we prepare for the Coming. That of course means different things now to different people. For Christians it is a time when we prepare to celebrate the coming, the arrival of Jesus, into our world. God incarnate. For others is it a time to prepare to welcome the mid-winter festival, the coming of the longer days, as the season begins to turn.

For us all, however, Advent is a busy time. Too easily the meaning, and the amazing wonder of the season can become lost amidst the fun happenings and all the preparations. We need sometimes to be reminded that a good Christmas is not about perfection. I love how Gervaise Phinn captures that in his stories of nativity plays when he taught in Yorkshire. As Mary tells Joseph 'I'm having a baby and it's not yours'. Or Joseph unexpectedly exclaims loudly 'Mary has got nits.' It is good to be brought down to earth!

And of course, it is coming down to earth, to the nitty gritty and often messy reality of our world that is, for me, at the heart of the Christmas story and our traditions. Love and light coming into our world. A joyous and profound celebration of God choosing to come and dwell among us. A reminder of that divine loves that just breaks into the ordinary. Despite it all. As Bishop Sarah Mullally, soon to be our next archbishop, said recently "Hope doesn't skip over grief, pain and the messiness of life but enters into it and tenderly tells us that God is with us."

And so, I end with a poem, The Coming, by R S Thomas.

And God held in his hand a small globe. Look he said. The son looked

Far off as through water, he saw a scorched land of fierce colour.

The light burned there; crusted buildings cast their shadows: a bright Serpent,  
a river uncoiled itself, radiant with slime.

On a bare hill a bare tree saddened the sky.

Many people held out their thin arms to it, as though waiting for a vanished  
April to return to its crossed boughs.

The son watched them. Let me go there, he said.

Once again, a happy and blessed Christmas to you all. We'd love you to join us and to celebrate with us at any of our services in Chapmanslade or Corsley,

# November news

Maureen Willcox rounds up the November meeting



**At this month's meeting, members and guests were treated to an interesting and lively talk by Caroline Robinson from Champagne Glass in Warminster.**



Caroline gave us an insight into how she came to set up her business in a special studio at her home in Warminster. Having previously been Head of the music department at Warminster School, Caroline had trained as a music teacher at Nottingham University and worked for 18 years in Warminster, starting as a Prep School music teacher and rising to become Director of Music for the whole school. In this role she had directed West End style shows including well known titles such as Grease and Mary Poppins. Caroline also lead orchestra tours to Europe, BUT despite this successful career she began to wonder if she could keep

working at this level until retirement!

The story of how she got into Glass Fusing began in lockdown when she was furloughed and went on a family trip to Devizes where she spotted and attended a Glass Fusing lesson (socially distanced of course). She was instantly hooked! The rest may become history. She attended as many Glass Fusing classes as she could find until lockdown returned. However, her supportive husband suggested she “buy your own kiln”. Little did he realise this would mean their home would quickly be filled with glass creations! Her early work sold on Etsy but, at the same time, she was holding down a full time job and she questioned whether this would be possible for another 20 years.

In answer to her question, Caroline left her full time job, bought a gazebo and started running her own workshops which she advertised on a website she'd built herself. Her first workshops reinforced her desire to find a way to develop her workshops but also to keep music in her life. This she has done through her voluntary work with the Music Teachers' Association where she is now Head of Operations overseeing conferences and publications.

So why does she love Glass Fusing? Caroline finds it relaxing, creative and rewarding and thinks that it is something in which even those of us who consider ourselves non-artistic can create attractive glassware to be proud of.

What exactly is Glass Fusing? It's decorating



pieces of glass with other pieces of glass!  
Once decorated, the glass has to go into a kiln at 765° to be fused. Despite trouble with the Reading Room's wifi, Caroline very kindly demonstrated some simple techniques to make a small, attractive floral glass picture. She used both Frit and Murrini glass with what are known as "stringers" for the stems of the flowers. Not having a kiln at the Reading Room, she produced "one I made earlier" in true Blue Peter fashion!

By the end of the evening many members expressed an interest in making their own pictures and took away leaflets about Caroline's workshops. Members were also pleased to be able to buy some of the items that Caroline sells at local fairs and at her workshops. We're heading for northern Italy, to picturesque verdant Tuscany, with its vast acreage of flat land given over to crops, its signature pine trees and with most communities built on hilltops. Fabrizio's our coach driver and he's taking us to Siena, once we're comfortable and we've said 'Buon Giorno' to him. Away we go!

Siena's coach park uses the grounds of its hilltop Medieval fortress, built for the Medici family from Florence. Our first 'site' is here, a local church named for Saint Domenico; it's where Saint Catherine of Siena, the Catholic Church's only female Doctor, worshipped as a child. Almost single-handedly, she persuaded the Popes to return to Rome in 1379, after

seventy years at Avignon in France. Her body's buried in Rome, though her head is preserved here. Have a quick look round before we head downhill, via Siena's dark and narrow lanes.

"Look out, everyone!" Sorry, I forgot traffic's using the same lanes as us. "Cars coming – keep in!" Can you see, attached to the stone wall we're passing, a large photo frame?

It means we're in the 'Contrada' (district) of the Dragon. We'll pass through several Contradas as we explore the town. Siena has seventeen such areas today, when it once had eighty, each with its own identity. You'll see there's a huge standard in the Victorian monochrome image here, as well as a



strangely-dressed man. The standard is the 'Palio', so our hero once won the Palio horse race, which takes place in the town centre. I wonder if the Contradas named 'Swan', 'Tortoise' and 'Snail' have ever been successful?!

Ahead of us now is the Piazza del Campo, the ‘Square of the Field’, where Siena’s three hills meet – hence the title of our walk! The building straight ahead is the Town Hall, with its 300-foot-high campanile (bell tower), the Torre del Mangia (Mangia’s Tower), named after its first bellringer.

At the foot of the tower is a grey stone chapel, built to thank God when the plague ended in 1348. We’ll circumnavigate the ‘square’, which is shaped like a scallop shell, and study its construction. Now we’ve reached the far side of the shell from the Town Hall, you can appreciate the downhill beauty of this piazza better. It dates from 1347, with the surface’s red bricks laid in herringbone pattern and divided into nine sections, the number of town councillors then. To gain control of the Palio for a year, our Dragon hero was one of ten Contrada men racing on horseback round the paved outer walkway we’re using today, while spectators crowded behind barriers in the red-brick area, to watch. Spectators still watch from the centre today, or from the buildings behind us, once palazzos (palaces) with tall towers.

Let’s climb uphill from our earlier entrance and head for the Duomo, or Cathedral, next, which crowns the second of the three hills. Whatever you think of ‘religious’ buildings, don’t miss this one, though it’s quite a climb – and an adventure, thanks to the traffic! The Duomo took over 150 years to complete, while the façade took 15 years to do and only covers the lower layer, because there were plans to extend the building; rising costs and the plague put paid to that. Enter the building next, admiring the ‘pavement’ of mosaics, both outdoors and in. These mosaics are



either ‘graffito’ or ‘inlaid’, ‘graffito’ being the older, more precious ones, constructed with large slabs of engraved marble, set into and outlined with black stucco. Later mosaics are ‘inlaid’ in clever, more colourful designs and often geometric; all are cordoned off or covered to prevent damage. When you’ve had enough of floors, find the central apse and cuppola (dome) and study the striking black-and-white striped pillars; they, too, are amazing!

Before we descend to the Piazza del Campo again, find the end wall of the Duomo’s unfinished extension and climb to the top, admiring the views for miles around, before descending and walking downhill again - watching out for traffic, of course. Piazza cafes are never cheap, but rest here and admire this central area in its entirety. Most Italian cakes



are firmer than British sponges, but apple cake's usually a good choice. However, Dorset apple cake is far better, especially with a dollop of clotted cream! Happy Christmas, everyone – and stay active in 2026..!

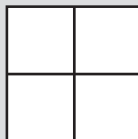

## Public Path Diversion Order (Highways Act 1980, Section 119)

### Wiltshire Council Parish of Corsley, path number 7 (CORY7) and the Somerset Council Parish of Selwood, path number FR/14/24 (part) Diversion Order 2025.

This order is made by Wiltshire Council because it appears to the authority that in the interests of the owner (Longleat) and occupier of the land crossed by the path (High House Farm), it is expedient that the line of the path should be diverted.

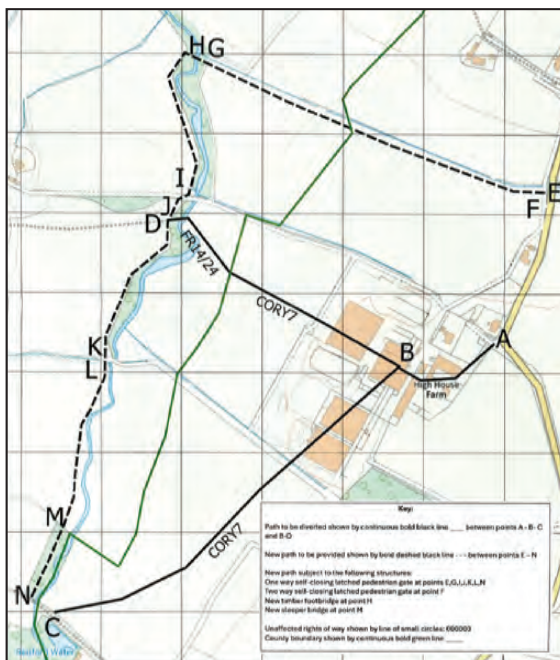
The tenant of the land has agreed to defray any compensation which becomes payable in consequence of the coming into the force of the order and any expenses that are incurred in bringing the new site of the path into a fit condition for use by the public. Both Selwood and Corsley Parish Councils were consulted and Somerset Council consented to the making of the order as required by section 120(2) of the 1980 Act.

#### Description of the existing path

The entire width and length of the public right of way known as CORY7, from point A (at the sharp corner on the road by High House Farm) in a broadly south-westerly and then westerly direction for approximately 140m to point B. Then, one spur of that public right of way leads south-westerly from point B for approximately 540m to point C where it meets CORY47. The other spur of that public right of way from point B leads broadly north-westerly to the Wiltshire/Somerset county boundary, continuing in Somerset along the public right of way known as FR/14/24, across the water course (Redford Water), to point D – the length of B to D being approximately 350m.

#### Description of the new path

The length of the footpath leading from point E via a new pedestrian gate from the road, crossing the cattle track and entering the field via a second pedestrian gate, then leading in a broadly west-north-westerly direction on the southern side of the field boundary and Redford Water, within a 3m fenced-in corridor, the width of the path being recorded as 2m, with a 1m buffer to the ditch/water course. The path then leads across the county boundary and across a cattle track via a new pedestrian gate at point G, crossing Redford Water via a new footbridge accessed via ramps (with a deck width of at least 1m) to point H, the path will then turn and lead in a broadly southerly direction along the field boundary crossing two cattle tracks via new pedestrian gates at point I, J, K and L, then through a small copse, over a new sleeper bridge with a minimum width of 1.1m at point M, to the junction with footpath FR/14/82 at point N via a new pedestrian gate. The footpath will have a recorded width of 2m throughout its length, subject to limitations. The order states that the pedestrian gates will be self-closing and to BS5709:18 (with some exceptions to that standard).
