



Chapmanslade Parish Council

Parish Council Briefing

Councillor Ian Curtis reports on the PC meeting of 16th October

The meeting considered four planning applications:

PL/2025/06391 - Full planning permission to convert and extend two barns to create a dwelling house with ancillary accommodation including the erection of an outbuilding and associated works at Water Farm, Corsley, BA12 7QD. No objection – although ecology comments regarding more detail on bats and lighting noted

PL/2025/07174 – Householder planning permission for proposed alteration to convert the existing roof space and extension to form family room at 147 High Street, Chapmanslade, BA13 4AP. No objection with a comment regarding lack of information on any statement on energy efficiency of what is a large extension.

PL/2025/07387 - Householder planning permission for a single storey bedroom and kitchen extension to rear of 55 High Street, Chapmanslade, BA13 4AN. No objection with note regarding parking comments from Highways involving the potential removal of part of the public highway.

PL/2025/07610 - Householder planning permission for construction of rear conservatory and external pool at 2 The Grange, Chapmanslade, BA13 4AN. No objection. However the PC noted a new building to the north of the site, and could find no record of a previous planning approval.

Other main items on the agenda:

Telephone Kiosk at junction of High Street and Huntenhull Lane.

The future of the kiosk was the subject of a special parish council meeting held in the church on 6th October. This was well attended by members of the community. The decision from the meeting was to request BT to retain it in full operational order for a further review period to monitor usage; and to continue to pursue with Highways the need for more appropriate safety measures to reduce the risk of collision at the telephone box junction. The Chair contacted BT with this proposal, but they declined on the grounds that it did not meet OFCOM requirements for level of viable usage. A final request for an intervention by Wiltshire Council was also unsuccessful. The telephone box will be removed as part of BT's ongoing programme. The PC is very aware of the disappointment this will cause to some villagers, but the balance was tipped against its retention as it was when previously reviewed in 2019.

Reduction of weight limit along A3098 through Chapmanslade from 18 to 7.5 tonnes.

Plans are now in hand for Highways to change the signage in Wiltshire as a traffic regulation order - with confirmation awaited from Somerset on signage from Lodge Hill. The PC has allocated £5,000 from the

Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL) funding to cover the required 25% of the costs, with the balance coming from Wiltshire Council.

CIL application for Chapmanslade Village Hall Integrated Energy Solution.

The purpose of this project is to future-proof the energy supply to the village hall. It will assure supply of energy even in the event of a major power outage with air source heat pumps and a solar heating system, as well as improving the ambient environment with air conditioning and low-level background heating. The application was for £10,500 being the balance of the unallocated CIL funds. The total cost is estimated at £,40,500with the balance of funding secured. The PC gave its full support - recognising this as a legacy project that would help ensure the future of the most heavily used village meeting place.

Funding for maintenance of St Philip and St James' churchyard.

The PC approved the allocation of f, 1,000 for grass cutting and tree surgery. This follows a

positive letter from the Diocesan Secretary/ CEO thanking the PC for its ongoing support in regard the churchyard and associated development of the facilities for wider community use. He confirmed that Bishop Andrew will soon be advertising for a full-time post for the Cley Hill Benefice (the earlier proposal was for this to be part-time).

Short Street Junction with A3098.

White lining was recently completed, which helps delineate the threshold of the junction with the main road. The recent Warminster Local Highways and Footpaths Improvement Group (LHFIG) will be considering the need for better signage and highway markings in their November meeting. This will also consider the need for double white lines over the bridge at Dead Maids.

The next meeting will be at 7.30pm on Thursday 6th November in the Village Hall - community members are very welcome to attend. All details of meetings and upcoming dates are on the Parish Council website



'A Weekend to Remember'

Frome will commemorate the 80th anniversary of the end of WW2 with a special weekend, bringing the history of Frome between 1939-1945 to all generations via film, music and Festival of Remembrance

The 'Weekend to Remember' begins on the night of Friday 7th November with the Frome Festival of Remembrance at the Memorial Theatre, poignantly itself in the centenary year of unveiling plagues to the fallen of the Great War 1914-1918. All generations will take part with history, original video interviews of past Frome veterans and music led by children, Frome Musical Theatre Company and Frome Town Band.

The evening will finish with a Drumhead Ceremony and Act of Remembrance with Standards of the Royal British Legion, Royal Naval Association and RAF Association.

On Saturday 8th November there will be three war grave walks over the day beginning at 9.45am from the Memorial Theatre. A reading of the Roll of Honour of the fallen of WW2 will take place at the Memorial at 11am. At 2pm in the Assembly Rooms, the premiere of a series of Frome amateur archive films taken during 1939-1945 will be shown. At 7pm, dress up in 1940's costume and pay just f,5 to go to the pictures in what was always known as the Grand Cinema, now Memorial Theatre, for a special showing of the epic 1942 Noel Coward film "In Which We Serve".

The weekend will end on Sunday with the Annual Parade and Act of Remembrance at 10.55am at the Frome Memorial.

October news

Patricia Sharrocks rounds up the October meeting



Our speaker in October was Mike Read who lives in the village. Mike is a keen and accomplished astro photographer who shared some amazing photographs and talked about the wonders of the night sky.

Mike has always been interested in astronomy but his hobby really took off when he moved to Corsley in 2019. He was inspired by the dark skies here and in awe of what you can see there. In 2020 he bought his first telescope. It seems fair to say he's never looked back, but always skywards!

Mike showed us one of his early photographs of Andromeda. The Andromeda Galaxy is the closest large galaxy to our own galaxy, the Milky Way. Even so, it is 2.5 million light years away; it is hard to believe that the light we are seeing this evening began travelling through space all those years ago. In contrast, the light from the sun reaches us in about 8 minutes and light from the moon reaches us in 1.3 seconds!

We were treated to some stunning photographs as Mike talked about the comets and meteors we can sometimes see in the night sky; mid November should be a good time for spotting meteors once our eyes have adjusted to the dark.

Most spectacular of all were the pictures of the Aurora Borealis which Mike had taken in his garden. The brilliant colours might have come straight out of a Northern lights tour brochure - and there they were, glowing over Corsley! How had we missed them? Mike explained that our eyes are not adapted to seeing very

much in the dark, we see shades of grey so we might only see wispy streaks like clouds in the sky when looking for the aurora. To compensate for the dark conditions, a camera can take a longer exposure and collect light for longer, building up a picture of the scene and collecting colours, so a good tip is to look for the aurora through a camera lens. By the end of the evening we, like Mike, were left in awe of what you can see in the sky above.

Our next meeting will be at the Reading Room on November 13th at 7.30 pm. Our speaker will be Caroline Robinson of Champagne Glass, talking about how she developed a business fusing glass to create stunning works of art.



For the October edition of The Bridge, we looked at various companies in Warminster, firms that advertised in the 1911 Chapel Anniversary programme, covering food and clothing. This time, let's look at three men with connections to Corsley and to Whitbourne Chapel itself.

Our first gentleman is J Garrett (with his son), who were coal, coke and wood merchants, with a depot in Emwell Street, Warminster, not far from the Obelisk. They sold 'the best Radstock coals, from the celebrated Kilmersdon, Writhlington and Wellsway Collieries'. If you've walked the available sections of the Frome to Radstock railway line, Kilmersdon should be known to you. If you haven't, but are interested, contact Gill Redman via the Chapel website and she'll give you information. This lovely

walk takes you from Mells to Radstock, so it's a fair trek – but well worth it! For these coal merchants, orders could be placed at Floral Cottage in Warminster, no street name given, or at Sturford Lane in Corsley, no house name given! Some early gravestones at Whitbourne are hard to read now, but one mentions a beloved husband, James Garrett, who died in 1932; could this be our coal merchant from 1911? There are other Garrett graves in the burial ground, Arthur and his wife Elizabeth, a Daisy and an Ann, but details are hard to read.

Our second gentleman is James Randall, whose advert reads 'Poulterer, egg and butter merchant'. His business had been established for over 50 years, but there's no address in the advert; he's another local who was well-known enough not to have to! His personal attention

is given to all orders, which sounds wonderful, given the impersonal nature of modern supermarket queues! There's a gravestone for a James Randall, who died in 1923; he could possibly be our poulterer.

Our final Corsley gentleman is John Pearce, a builder and wheelwright of Corsley (no address again!), who was also a smith, lime merchant, painter, plumber and undertaker. His business, too, was established for over 50 years in 1911; he also made wagons and carts to order 'at moderate prices'. Carriages and light conveyances were also built, in the latest fashion at the lowest rate 'by an efficient staff of men'. Was John Pearce the owner of the Wagon Works on Corsley Heath, in 1911?



There's a John Pearce buried in the Chapel grounds, who was a Deacon of the Chapel and died in 1877; is our advertiser a son or grandson? Len White, a County Councillor and Parish Councillor EMWELL ST. COAL DEPOT.

for a number of years, I think, lived at the Wagon Works in the late 20th century. Whitbourne Chapel's altar table was made by Aaron White, who died in 1931.

In and around 1911, the Chapel had families who intermarried over two or three generations; surnames like Mines, Down, Minty and Heritage crop up on different graves. For example, Aaron White's wife was Eliza Frances Heritage, another Chapel Deacon's surname before 1911. If you're doing your family tree, and names here ring a bell, why not come to the next Sunday Service or Coffee Morning and take a look round..?

Wiltshire Council are resurfacing more roads and saving money thanks to an innovative road recycling scheme

Wiltshire Council are making significant savings and resurfacing more rural roads thanks to an innovative road recycling scheme that breaks up, treats and re-lays the existing road surface.

The project is saving a huge amount of carbon emissions compared to traditional resurfacing and 91% (9,749 tonnes) of the road surface is recycled. Being around 45% cheaper than traditional resurfacing, it means more roads can be treated.

It's particularly good for rural roads used by large agricultural machinery, many of which have evolved from old tracks without proper construction.

The machine removes the existing road surface, pulverises it into small pieces which are mixed with a binder and re-laid onto the road where it can be left to harden over time or be sealed with a new surface layer. All this is done on-site, speeding up the process and minimising disruption.

Councillor Ian Thorn, Leader of Wiltshire Council, said: "We are often told that initiatives to reduce carbon emissions cost too much money, but this is a clear example of how cutting down on emissions also helps to save the council money. This innovative road recycling scheme is a win-win for Wiltshire, as we are able to resurface more rural roads and improve rural connectivity, while also saving money and dramatically cutting carbon emissions. Recycling 91% of the existing road surface and avoiding 220 tonnes of carbon is a clear demonstration that green initiatives can deliver real value for both the environment and the taxpayer."

Beach Missions

I am fortunate to have an iPad for the work I do. I often use it for pleasure and there are lots of webcams on there overlooking seaside

towns. There is an excellent one focussed at Lyme Regis beach, which was created by the Council using imported sand.

I was thrilled this year when, early one morning in August, some of the team from United Beach Missions were marking out an area where they would hold their meetings during the day. It is not as easy to attract children to a Beach Meeting as it was when we used to run them, in

the 1970s. But I was struck by the fact that the visitors on the beach had their backs to the meeting and the vast majority seemed totally uninterested in what was going on and chose not to take their children to join in.

There was literature on display on the wall bordering the promenade, but few stopped to peruse and take a piece of Christian literature. We were holding an Open Air Meeting in Yeovil, back when I was in the Open Air Mission and, at the mention of the Lord Jesus, a young man threw his arms in the air

and said, 'I want nothing to do with that!' The Lord Jesus said, 'He that is not with me is against me', Matt 12:30. Those are pretty condemning words!

> If you are not happy or contented, or wonder sometimes what life is all about, get hold of a copy of John's Gospel to read; it was written for you. When you get to the 20th chapter you will read these words; "And many signs truly did Jesus in the presence of his Disciples, which are not written in this book. But these are written that you might believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that believing you might have life through his



Countryside Matters

After the driest and hottest summer for many years, we did enjoy 82.5 mm of rain in September! Although that small amount of rain did not fill the reservoirs, it certainly helped farmers and horticulturists. Much of the arable crops had already been harvested,

with mixed results, but at least the grass was growing enough to allow the cattle out to graze again and to think about letting the grass in some fields grow on with a view to making silage in October. Thankfully, as I'm writing this that's what the farm are doing right now - it will certainly help our depleted silage store.

Due to the good weather conditions, much of the winter wheat and barley was planted in soil that worked down well and was warm enough for germination; it will soon be showing shoots before the winter sets in. Crops that have become well established in the autumn means that the roots will help prevent soil erosion during heavy rainfall.

Mid October found the woodlands still looking wonderful in their autumn colours. What fun to see children and maybe a few adults kicking up the crisp leaves!

Just be aware that the pheasant and partridge shooting season is upon us, so do

avoid the woodlands if you hear gunshots or the beaters winding their way through the woods, they are only there till the end of January but this sport helps to create pathways and droves for us to enjoy most of the year.

The late autumn colours are enhanced
