
Events

'Cats-ears' aka 'false dandelion'

An invasive weed to look out for on your property

This year I have been battling a perennial weed in the horses' paddocks, called 'catears' or 'false-dandelion'. I first noticed a few plants last autumn and thought they were just a harmless type of wildflower. Then, in February I noticed that a lot more were beginning to appear, they start off as a flatto-the-ground rosette of leaves; some look slightly furry, some are smooth.

I did some research and discovered that

they are an extremely invasive weed which seeds prolifically and gradually takes over from the grass, especially in any areas where the soil is barer. Worse than

this, it transpires that they are toxic to horses (not cattle or sheep) and, if enough are ingested, they can cause stringhalt, which is an alarming and serious condition in horses.

Once you know what they are, you will see them everywhere. We have found them on our lawn, I see them on verges and in gardens around village and elsewhere. If in doubt, the flower stems are multiple, and are thin, unlike a genuine dandelion which has

one flower on a soft, succulent stem.

Mind the gap

During the wistful first week of September, just before our youngest departed for university, we took a week's holiday in North Cornwall, to revisit a seaside haunt much enjoyed in their childhood. The high-baked summer heat



finally giving way to that more familiar British blend of showery spells and sunny intervals, we eschewed the beaches in favour of the ruined splendour of Tintagel Castle, situated on an almost-island along the headland from our cottage.

Since 2019, the legendary birthplace of King Arthur has been connected to the coast by an elegant suspension bridge, the crossing of which offers giddily magnificent views. Perhaps helpfully, pedestrians can't see the rocks beneath them but for a 40mm gap, halfway across. The bridge is constructed in two sections, each drilled into its own side of the yawning chasm. The inch or two between them is, I learned, both structural and symbolic representing the space between past and present, myth and reality. A lovely touch, I thought.

As we cross the threshold into autumn, with its liturgical mood of gratitude and remembrance, let us rejoice that God bridges the ages in Jesus Christ: connecting us not only to the past events of our salvation but also the future hope of his heavenly kingdom. Whatever changes lie before us, he remains the way, the truth and the life.

Chapmanslade Parish Council

Parish Council Briefing

Councillor Phil Holihead reports on the PC meeting of 11th September

At a short meeting held in the Village Hall on 11th September at which only two members of the public attended, the following items were discussed:

Finance

A favourable report indicating that the Council's accounts were all in order had been received from the external auditors. The Council formally thanked the Clerk for all her hard work to achieve this.

The annual donation to the Village Hall was agreed but any donation to the church was again deferred until the Council receives a plan of what the money is to be used for.

The Village Hall grant application to the Community Fund at the upcoming Warminster Area Board was again given support by the Parish Council. It was noted that the Community Fund was likely to be fully spent at the next Area Board on 9th October, and that Chapmanslade's bid for improved ventilation and heating at the Village Hall would require support. The October PC meeting which clashed with the Area Board has been moved to 16th October to allow councillors to attend the Area Board.

The Council agreed to pay a contract for a three-year extended warranty of the two Speed Indicator Devices.

Costs for reducing the weight limit, improving the road junction at Short Street, and the final invoice for the recently received new footpath gates are hoped to be forthcoming after the Warminster Local Highways and Footpaths Improvement Group meeting which was held on 23th September

(this report was written before the meeting).

Other matters arising

The Council noted that dog-fouling and the leaving of used dog-poo bags in rural spaces, particularly the woods and adjoining fields, was on the increase. The Council has worked hard to retain and upgrade the dogpoo bin at the top of Wood Lane and is as frustrated as anyone that others cannot be provided. The responsibility must therefore be on the individual dog owner to clear up any mess from public places (back lanes, pavements, footpaths, etc.) and for them to either take the poo bag to the bin in Wood Lane or home where it can be placed in the grey bin. Leaving full bags hanging on fences really is quite anti-social and shows a complete disregard for our community and environment.

Despite some previous advertising we're still looking to co-opt two additional Parish Councillors, and the existing Council was tasked with some talent spotting. If you would like to be considered and have a say in how your community runs then please contact the Clerk at

Finally, a reminder that pavement works should be taking place in the village around the October half-term.



September news

Patricia Sharrocks rounds up the September meeting



Corsley WI were delighted to host an evening of history, music and entertainment as many guests joined us for our September meeting.

The evening began with wartime songs

performed by Eleanor Swayz evoking the mood of the period. Our speaker was the 'Stand Up Historian', Crispin Thomas, who provided an insight into the battle of Arnhem, famously known as 'a bridge too far'. Crispin explained that in September 1944, Allied commanders believed that if they could take control of the bridges to the north of the Siegfried Line they would be able to attack the Ruhr, the industrial heartland of Germany, and that the war would be 'over by Christmas'. They decided it was a risk worth taking and launched 'Operation Market Garden' to take control of Arnhem.

Ten thousand airborne troops were parachuted into the area to capture the bridge at Arnhem. But poor weather slowed down reinforcements, radio communication was patchy and intelligence had failed to detect the presence of German armoured divisions nearby. There were very heavy losses as Operation Market Garden failed to reach its objective.

Mike Knight, a Corsley resident, then gave



us a more personal insight into the battle of Arnhem as he recalled his father's memories of the battle. His father, who was born in Chapmanslade, had joined the Territorials in Frome and was then

called up. In 1944 he was part of Operation Market Garden flying from Keevil airfield to Arnhem by glider, landing in a field at about 80mph. After the battle as the Allied forces were forced to withdraw, under cover of darkness he followed a white tape through woodland and across an open field to reach the Rhine which he swam across to escape. This local connection gave us a unique perspective on the events at Arnhem.

It was great to welcome so many people to the Reading Room and we thank you all for your support. The evening raised about f,500, from ticket sales and the generous donations made for refreshments, which was donated to The Royal British Legion.

Next month the subject is astronomy. We will be looking to the skies when Mike Read will be talking about what we can - and can't! - see on a clear night. Corsley Parish Council

Parish Council Briefing

The Clerk, John Willcox, writes on the main issues from the meeting held in September

Following its decision in June to co-opt to fill the vacancies following the local election the Parish Council (PC) had received two applications to become co-opted members. Following consideration the two applicants, Clare Firman-Ford and Martin Travers, were duly appointed.

Three planning applications were considered:

PL/2025/06311 Conversion and extension of redundant agricultural buildings into a dwelling and associated works at stables adjacent to 46, Whitbourne Moor, Corsley, BA12 7OL

PL/2025/06391 Convert and extend two barns to create a dwelling house with ancillary accommodation including the erection of an outbuilding and associated works at Water Farm, Corsley, BA12 7QD

PL/2025/06856 Demolition of existing garage and erection of new garage with pitched roof at High Orchard, Lane End, Corsley, Warminster, BA12 7PG

The PC agreed they would have no objection to any of these applications.

The PC confirmed that they would again make grants/donations to village organisations - see notice detailing the procedure and timescale elsewhere in this edition of The Bridge.

Councillor Helliar presented a detailed update on current Rights of Way issues and it was agreed that further funding would be made available in order that initiatives can be brought to a satisfactory conclusion.

A number of locations of old stiles and kissing gates that would benefit new footpath gates were agreed. This includes the problematic gate at Harpers Farm.

It was agreed that the Parish Council would support a road plainings project on CORY20 as Councillor Carpenter advised that this was now an acceptable surface for the BHS. The decision was taken given the importance of the route, the potential costs of an alternative (chalk or greensand) and potential delays of an alternative. It was agreed that the plainings would need to be stabilised and maintained on the route.

A report on streetscene issues was given by Coucillor Brown. It has been agreed by National Highways that 'Unsuitable for HGV' signs will be installed to either side of Sydnalls Lane off the A362 and the other end of the lane where it meets Longhedge/Knapps gate to prevent HGV traffic from Longleat entering Whitbourne Moor. An application for a traffic count to be fitted on Gevs Hill has been submitted. The Parish Steward was due in the village on the 18th and 22nd of September.

There was considerable discussion on the recent closures of the A362 and the apparent lack of co-operation/liaison between the highway authorities of both Wiltshire and

Somerset and a similar lack between Wiltshire Constabulary and the Somerset and Avon force which lead to traffic chaos in the lanes either side of the A362. It was agreed that the PC would express their concern in the strongest possible terms to the authorities concerned.

A draft Parish Emergency Plan had been circulated. It was agreed that further work should be done before details are circulated within the village.

Councillor Carpenter reported on the ongoing discussions with Selwood Housing on the issue of the differing sewage charges. A further meeting with Selwood Housing was planned for 26th September.

It had been reported that the 'footpath' from the A362 going behind the new homes at Maud Davis Close was almost impassable. This 'footpath' is not actually a right of way and it is understood that negotiations are ongoing to enable access to be formalised. In the meanwhile it was agreed that the path should be cut to enable pedestrian access, Councillor Carpenter agreed to do this.

The next meeting of the PC will be on Monday 3rd November when they meet as the Trustees of The Leonard White Trust (this part of the meeting is not open to members of the public) followed by the scheduled meeting of the PC which it is hoped will start at 7.30 pm.

The plan is to have lots of Hallowe'enthemed fun including best carved pumpkin, marshmallows over the fire pit, spooky stories, lots of lovely homemade food, etc. We're sure it will be very busy, so please let us know if you want to attend.

These events are free as we know that some parents are struggling with the current cost of living crisis. If you could leave a donation it would help ensure the Playing Field can continue to put on these amazing events as our costs are not covered from elsewhere.

By the time this edition of The Bridge is published, the cricket season will have come to an end. Keeping the cricket pitch in good condition with the summer we have had has been extremely difficult and my thanks go

to John, Simon and Young Harry for their amazing work. For those who have been to the Playing Field during the summer you will have seen a lot of holes made by crows. They are after chafer grubs, and this year has seen a real infestation. Chafer bugs eat the roots of the grass and, combined with the hot weather, has meant the field is looking very sorry for itself. For the cricket square, we are trying a biological solution of treating with nematodes. We first tried them five years ago and they seemed to have kept the grubs away until this year.

We also held our first 'Drinks at the Field', held on the last Friday of each month starting at 6 pm. It was an amazing success with lots of villagers bringing their own drinks or making use of the licensed bar and enjoying the canapés provide by the Playing Field. We are hoping that this will become a regular monthly thing with the donations helping us run more events for the community.

I mentioned grants from the Warminster Area Board, won thanks to the support of our councillor, Bill Parks. Bill has also been instrumental in us getting Milestone Infrastructure, who manage the Village Steward Teams for Wiltshire, to come along for a volunteer day. As you know, the Playing Field is looked after by volunteers who do a huge amount of work in keeping it as such a great asset for the village. The team from Milestone came in to spend a day sorting out the fence in the carpark, in return for bacon butties and cake, for which we thanked them very much.

Finally a few other points to share.

As part of the Playing Field's support of the amazing Corsley Fayre, we used the Playing Field tractor to mow the Fayre area (well done IdG) as well as providing a few marquees and some tables. It was a huge effort for all concerned before, during and after the Fayre which reflects the effort the Trustees put in to supporting not just the Playing Field but the orchard and wider community with our resources and their time which I really appreciate as I hope you do too.

Thanks to Mark for looking after the marquee next to the tennis courts. Using the old poles from a marquee whose cover had

been damaged, Mark has been gamely putting up and taking down the tarpaulin cover all summer (based on storm warnings) allowing the tennis club to have covered seating for their children's tennis lessons and tennis club events.

I have submitted a grant application which, if we are successful, will allow us to run a tree-based event every month as the seasons change. Many trees are really struggling with climate change, disease and pests such as squirrels and deer. However they are vital for biodiversity and absorbing the carbon we produce. These events will share some of the amazing knowledge we have in the area to make sure the trees that we have can stay healthy and to support the planting of lots of new trees.



Countryside Matters

What happened to summer? Autumn weather came in so quickly in September!

Rainfall

August	36	.1 mm
September 1st to	19th	80 mm

The rainfall was very welcome to farmers and gardeners, but the evenings were suddenly getting darker much earlier.

The cows are back out grazing, nice fresh grass and already the idea of mowing for grass silage is being considered. Somehow, nature has a way of righting itself; we just have to be patient.

Fortunately, as I write, the temperature is around 19°C so the cows can go out to graze by day and night, saving on precious stored feed.

Already our summer visiting birds swallows, house martins, swifts, etc., have left for warmer climes, now we look out for the clouds of starlings in their murmurations as they seek out their safe area to gather for the night.

Most of the maize harvesting will have been finished by the end of September; then it's all

go - getting manure and slurry on the fields ready for the winter sowing of cereals.

This month, main-crop potatoes will be harvested and stored in a barn under straw until needed. Swede and mangelwurzels can withstand the cold winter weather and will be lifted as needed.

We celebrate our harvest with a supper in Chapmanslade Village Hall on Saturday 4th October. Followed by a Harvest Thanksgiving service in St Margaret's Church on Sunday 5th when everyone is most welcome.

The flocks of sheep are now separated from their lambs, either for the lambs to be sold for breeding or fattening up elsewhere. The ewes will now be given some concentrates and checked for any ailments before being introduced to the rams for breeding.

Now is the time to make sure you have fuel - logs, coal or oil - ordered for the cold winter nights ahead. Remember too, to pick sloes for some warming sloe gin which could be ready around Christmas time. **7udith Helliar**

The 1911 Chapel Centenary programme provides us with an insight into social history, too, through its use of local advertisements to offset the cost of printing. The first advert was for a clothier firm, Lucas Brothers. They were based on Warminster Market Place and were agents for 'Dr Jaeger's sanitary woollen system', whatever that was! They also handled The Cellular Company's shirts and Christy and Co's silk and felt hats. Are Dr Jaeger and the Jaeger company selling woollens today linked, maybe?

There was W. Hillman, too, a Tailor and Costumier on George Street, plus a 'General and Fancy Draper,' owned by E B Jones on the High Street. They sold dresses, jackets and skirts, costumes and 'fancy drapery'. If you know what that means, please contact us at Chapel and explain! This business was

also an agent for 'Pullar's Perth Dye Works', another unfamiliar item.

How about the advert from Hibberd Brothers (opposite), who were 'General Drapers and Ladies' and Children's Outfitters'? They were 'the best house for millinery, hosiery, corsets and underlinen, etc.' This enterprising business had a store on the Market Place, Warminster, another on the High Street of Heytesbury and a third on the High Street at Codford. It sounds unlikely now, but in 1911, both Heytesbury and Codford were on the main A36 road to Salisbury from Bath! At both Codford and Heytesbury they also handled Gents' outfitting and boots. Why not in the town itself? Was it because there was I Mills and Son, 'Practical Bootmakers' on East Street? Their advert suggests that dealing with an experienced firm




hardware as well in 1911! Another food store was Wilson and Kennard, the name now known only by a 'yard' beside The Bell Hotel on the Market Place. Their advert warned readers that cheapness and quality don't go together and getting dividends is simply having one's over-paid monies back!

Town bakers and confectioners included A E Sharp of East Street, who supplied bread and cake and delivered to Corsley and district on Tuesdays, Thursdays and Saturdays. They were the only local makers of 'Bermaline Bread'; please contact us at Chapel if you know what that is! A 'steam bakery' near the Obelisk on Silver Street was owned by E.J. Butcher. They sold bread and cake, but also catered for dinners, teas and luncheons - and supplied tents for such occasions!

There's no evidence that the above business owners were involved at the Chapel, but next month we'll look at three more advertisers, all with major connections to Corsley and to Whitbourne Chapel...

meant saving one's self from disappointment; they had 26 years' 'reputation' in making and selling boots and shoes, so their goods were reliable! That's four clothing stores in one community, but didn't everyone make their own clothes at home before the First World War?

Once people were dressed and shod, they shopped for food. Finding the West End Supply Stores at 1, West Street in Warminster today proved impossible, but it sold general and fancy drapery, toys, stationery, china and
